ST. THOMAS CLINCHES PFL TITLE, INELIGIBLE FOR FCS PLAYOFFS

St. Thomas, in its second season as a Division I program, clinched the 2022 PFL Championship outright with its win against Butler, Nov. 19. They are the ninth different program to win a PFL title in the league's 30 seasons. However, as a reclassifying institution – moving from Division III to Division I – the Tommies are ineligible for the FCS Playoffs due to NCAA rules.

DAVIDSON CLAIMS PFL AUTOMATIC BID

Davidson claimed the PFL's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I Football Championship with its win against Dayton in Week 12. The Wildcats become the second PFL team to make an FCS Playoff appearance in three consecutive seasons, joining San Diego (2016-19).

WILDCATS DO RUN RUN

Davidson's offense owns four of the FCS' 400-yard rushing days in 2022, including two of the top three spots thanks to a 498-yard rushing performance against Butler and a 467-yard day against Morehead State. The Wildcats are averaging an FCS-best 350.5 rushing yards per game – 24.8 yards per game more than second-ranked Montana State (325.7 yards per game).

PFL AWARD CALENDAR

The 2022 Pioneer Football League awards will be announced Nov. 28-30. The 2022 PFL Major Award winners will be released Monday, Nov. 28, followed the next day by its 30th All-PFL Teams. The league's 30th Academic All-PFL team and its Scholar-Athlete of the Year will be announced Wednesday, Nov. 30.

VALPARAISO'S DAWSON RUSHES PAST 1,000 YARDS

Valparaiso's Aaron Dawson became the first PFL runner to surpass 1,000 rushing yards in the Beacons' victory at Marist, Nov. 12. His 1,187 rushing yards is 12th most in the FCS and included five 100-yard rushing outings and one 200-yard effort this season. Dawson is the fourth player in Valparaiso history to run for 1,000 yards and is second all-time in yardage.

FLYER'S CHISHOLM HITS 1,000-YARD MARK FOR THIRD-STRAIGHT SEASON

Dayton running back Jake Chisholm hit the 1,000 yard mark in the Flyers game against Davidson, finishing the season with 1,064 rushing yards. He is the first Flyers running back to record 1,000 rushing yards in three consecutive seasons. Chisholm has 3,276 career rushing yards, ranking ninth among active FCS running backs.

BUTLER'S ZURAK, PRESBYTERIAN KIBBY EARN FEDEX WEEK 10 HONORS

Butler kicker Luka Zurak and Presbyterian wider receiver Dominic Kibby were among four athletes recognized on Week 10's FedEx Ground FCS National Players of the Week by Stats Perform. Zurak was the National Special Teams Player of the Week after booting a 56-yard walk off field goal in Butler's victory at San Diego. Kibby, the National Freshman Player of the Week, had seven receptions for 212 yards and three touchdowns against Dayton.

DAYTON REACHES 700-WIN PLATEAU

With its 52-28 victory against Presbyterian, Nov. 5, Dayton became the ninth current FCS program to reach the 700-win plateau. They joined a group that includes Yale, Harvard, Penn, Princeton, North Dakota State, Dartmouth, Delaware, and Lehigh.

BUTLER NOTCHES PROGRAM WIN NO. 600

Butler, which has won three-straight games for the first time since 2017, posted its 600th all-time win with an Oct. 29 victory against Morehead State. They became the 31st current FCS team to record 600 victories.

MARIST'S PARADY GETS 150TH MARIST VICTORY, ON HUNT FOR 150TH FCS WIN

Marist head coach James Parady picked up his 150th Marist victory in the Red Foxes' Week 9 home victory against Presbyterian. He is four wins to record 150 career FCS victories. Since the FCS was created in 1978, only 14 head coaches have won 150 or more FCS games, including five active head coaches (see list, page 7). FCS wins are only counted for head coaches when their program is listed as a Division I FCS program by the NCAA.

SAN DIEGO'S SCORING STREAK PASSES 250 GAMES

With Dayton's consecutive game scoring streak ending this season, San Diego took over as the longest scoring streak in the PFL. The Toreros have scored in 252 games, with their last shutout loss coming at the hands of Dayton during the 1999 season.

HATTERS THROUGH THE AIR

Meanwhile, Stetson finished the regular season ranked No. 8 among FCS teams with 295.9 passing yards per game. The Hatters 444-yard performance against Louisiana Christian is the 17th-best passing performance in 2022 while its 426 yards against Davidson ranks 23rd. Stetson quarterback Brady Meitz is No. 20 among FCS passers with 254.8 passing yards per game.

EAGLES ARE BIRDS OF PREY

Morehead State finished the regular season with eight blocked kicks in 2022, with an FCS-best six blocked punts and two blocked field goals. Jihad McCall leads the nation with four blocked kicks while teammate Cooper Krezek had three blocked kicks.

**PRESEASON TEAMS**

The Pioneer Football League named 35 student-athletes to its Preseason All-PFL Teams, including 13 returning First Team All-PFL selections.

Returning players named to the league's 2021 All-PFL Teams were placed automatically on the 2022 Preseason All-PFL team in order of head coaches voting.

DAYTON'S CHISHOLM NAMED AN NFF CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST

The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame named Dayton running back Jake Chisholm as one of 15 finalists for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy, Oct. 26. The trophy, sometimes referred to as "the Academic Heisman," recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. The 15 finalists will each receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments®. Chisholm is the eighth Flyers football student-athlete to earn an NFF Post-Graduate Scholarship.

THREE PFL ATHLETES ADDED TO STATS FCS AWARD WATCH LISTS

Valparaiso freshman defensive lineman Kevin Spelman, Butler quarterback Bret Bushka, and San Diego defensive lineman Muhindo Kapapa were added to the Stats Perform FCS Awards Watch Lists, Oct. 19. Spelman is one 25 freshman named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List, presented to the FCS Freshman of the Year. Bushka joined a group of 20 additions to the Walter Payton Award Watch List which recognizes the FCS Offensive Player of the Year. Kapapa was among a list of 21 athletes added to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, presented annually to the FCS Defensive Player of the Year.

DAYTON SCORING STREAK ENDS

With its shutout loss at Butler, Oct. 8, Dayton saw its consecutive game scoring streak end at 501 games. The Flyers streak dated back to Oct. 16, 1976, when they fell 9-0 to Marshall. The streak lasted 16,971 days and spanned the administrations of nine U.S. Presidents.

HATTERS HIT THE ROAD, FINALLY

With its trip to Dayton in Week 7, Stetson became the final team in the FCS – or in NCAA Football for that matter – to play a road game in 2022. The Hatters opened the season with a four-game homestand that included their PFL opener against Morehead State. Stetson was slated to open its road schedule in Week 5 at San Diego, but Hurricane Ian prevented their departure and resulted in the game being canceled. A Week 6 game against Marist extended the homestand and the Hatters took their off week last week, meaning this weekend's game at Dayton is their road opener.

ST. THOMAS' GLENNA, BUTLER BULLDOGS EARN FEDEX WEEK 6 HONORS

St. Thomas defensive back Luke Glenna was one of four athletes recognized by Stats Perform as FedEx Ground FCS National Players of the Week for Week 6 college football games through Saturday. In addition, Butler was named the FCS National Team of the Week. Glenna doubled up his previous career high with 22 tackles in the Tommies' biggest win to date in two FCS seasons – 27-16 over Davidson. The Bulldogs posted their first shutout win since 2010, ended a seven-game losing streak against Dayton, and halted the Flyers' NCAA record streak of scoring points in 501 consecutive games.

MOREHEAD STATE'S HAZLETT, DAYTON'S WEBSTER EARN MONTHLY AWARD

The Fred Mitchell Award recognized Morehead State's Nathan Hazlett and Dayton's Sam Webster on its September list of 29 placekickers. Hazlett was 4-of-4 on field goals, with his longest kick going for 41 yards, and 11-of-11 on PATs during the month. Webster went 5-for-5 on field goals, with a longest kick of 42 yards, and was 7-of-7 on PATs in September.

STETSON'S ENSLEY, VALPARAISO'S KAPLAN EARN FEDEX WEEK 4 HONORS

Stetson's Ja'Veon Ensley was named the FedEx Ground FCS National Defensive Player of the Week and Valparaiso's Mason Kaplan earned FedEx Ground FCS National Freshman of the Week honors, presented by Stats Perform, Sept. 26, following Week 4 action. Ensley had a breakout day, punctuated by a pick-six, in Stetson's 38-26 PFL victory against Morehead State. He led Stetson with eight tackles (four solo), 1.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions, a pass breakup, and a blocked punt. Kaplan was responsible for three touchdowns in Valparaiso's 28-21 PFL victory against San Diego. He completed 4-of-6 passes for 102 yards and two touchdowns and ran 12 times for 44 yards and a touchdown.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced Wednesday the 156 semifinalists for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award. The NFF will announce 12-14 finalists on Oct. 26, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 2022 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class Presented by Fidelity Investments. Five PFL student-athletes were among the 37 FCS semifinalists: Davidson's Bradyn Oakley, Dayton's Jake Chisholm, Marist's Mike Arrington, St. Thomas' Seth Bickett, Stetson's Ethan Hull.

PFL'S 30TH CAMPAIGN

The 2022 season marks the 30th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams – tied for most in league history – each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2021 NCAA FCS Championship.

MARIST'S PARADY SEEKS 150TH FCS VICTORY

Entering the 2022 season, Marist head coach James Parady needs six wins to record 150 career FCS victories. Since the FCS was created in 1978, only 14 head coaches have won 150 or more FCS games, including five active head coaches (see list, page 7). FCS wins are only counted for head coaches when their program is listed as a Division I FCS program by the NCAA.

DAYTON'S CHAMBERLIN NOTCHES 100TH CAREER WIN

Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin picked up his 100th career victory – all at Dayton – with the Flyers' 22-20 victory at Robert Morris. In his 15th season at Dayton, he is the third Flyers football coach to reach 100 career wins, joining College Football Hall of Fame members Harry Baujan and Mike Kelley.

BUTLER, PRESBYTERIAN HELMED BY NEW HEAD COACHES

Butler and Presbyterian made coaching changes during the offseason. Butler named Mike Uremovich as its head coach to take over for Jeff Voris who helmed the Bulldogs for 16 seasons. Presbyterian turned to Steve Englehart as its head coach to follow Kevin Kelley who led the program during the 2021 season. Uremovich was the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Temple prior to his move to Indianapolis. Englehart was a head coach at both Florida Tech and Rose-Hulman for a combined 13 years prior to joining the Blue Hose's staff.

TOREROS STREAKING AMONG PFL OPPONENTS

San Diego enters the 2022 campaign with two of the FCS' longest active win streaks between FCS programs. The Toreros have won 15 consecutive games against Marist, which is ranked the third active longest streak. San Diego also own a 14-game win streak against Morehead State.

DAVIDSON'S HAMMOND NAMED TO BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST

Davidson junior defensive lineman Jonathan Hammond was one of 35 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision named to the Stats Perform 2022 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List in August. Hammond led the PFL and in sacks (9.5) while amassing a team-high 64 total tackles, including 13.0 tackles for loss.

DAYTON'S CHISHOLM NAMED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

Dayton redshirt senior running back Jake Chisholm was one of 35 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) players named to the Stats Perform Walter Payton Award Watch List. The two-time Flyer co-captain was a Second Team Stats Perform FCS All-American last year as an all-purpose runner after finishing second in FCS football in all-purpose yardage (163.9 ypg). He also led FCS in rushing attempts per game (23.5) and touchdowns per game (1.8).

THE PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Three PFL student-athletes were recognized on the three Preseason All-America Teams released in August. Dayton's Jake Chisholm was a second team honoree as selected by Stats Perform and HERO Sports. Davidson's Jonathan Hammond picked up a third team honor from Stats Perform and a fourth team nod from Phil Steele Magazine. He was joined on the preseason list by teammate Coy Williams, who was a third team pick by HERO Sports.

DAVIDSON PICKED TO WIN PFL

Davidson, which won its first PFL title in Spring 2021 followed that by winning a share of the Fall 2021 title. The Wildcats received eight of the 11 first-place votes and received a second-place vote from two other coaches. San Diego, which shared the Fall 2021 title with Davidson, was picked to finish second and received the three remaining first-place votes and was picked second on five other ballots.

Davidson received 98 of the maximum 100 points possible, with coaches unable to vote for their own team. San Diego followed with 91 points – making those two teams the clear frontrunners. St. Thomas and Dayton round out the top four with 78 and 72 points, respectively.

RECORD-BREAKING 663 NAMED TO 2021 PFL ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

For the third time in Pioneer Football League history, it named more than 600 student-athletes to its annual academic honor roll. The league recognized a record-breaking 663 student-athletes to the Fall 2021 PFL Academic Honor Roll. The 663 student-athletes recognized broke the previous record of 634 set during the Spring 2021 season. Three PFL members set individual records for student-athletes recognized: Davidson (68), Marist (68), and Valparaiso (60). In addition, the University of Dayton led all league members with 70 student-athletes recognized, one of eight programs to have 60-plus individuals named to the PFL Academic Honor Roll.

48 PFL ATHLETES PLAYING WITH A DEGREE IN HAND

In August, the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame released a list of 3,113 student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and will be playing college football this fall while pursuing additional diplomas. This season marks the fifth year the NFF has compiled the list of graduated players. Click the link above for the full list of graduates.

Forty-eight PFL student-athletes from seven member institutions were included on the list this season: Stetson (13), Valparaiso (9), Morehead State (8), Butler (7), Marist (6), St. Thomas (3), and Dayton (2).

SIXTY-FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO HAMPSHIRE SOCIETY

Sixty-four student-athletes from eight PFL member institutions were recognized on the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame's 2021 Hampshire Honor Society. The Hampshire Honor Society is comprised of college football players from all divisions of the NCAA, NAIA and sprint football who each maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers. An elite group of 1,574 players from 315 schools qualified for membership in the Society's 16th year. With this year's class included, Dayton has seen 166 student-athletes recognized in the Hampshire Honor Society all time, second only to Brown's 180 student-athletes.

Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin picked up his 100th career victory – all at Dayton – with the Flyers' 22-20 victory at Robert Morris. He is the third Dayton football coach to reach 100 career wins, joining College Football Hall of Fame members Harry Baujan and Mike Kelley... Butler's victory against St. Thomas (Fla.) was head coach Mike Uremovich's first victory at Butler. It also was the Bulldogs' first season-opening win since 2018... Valparaiso won a fall season opener for the first time since 2008 with its victory against Indiana Wesleyan, which was ranked No. 9 in the NAIA preseason poll... San Diego won its eighth consecutive game against Division III La Verne, extending the FCS' longest active win streak... There was one 100-yard rushing performance in the league during Week 1: Valparaiso's Aaron Dawson rolled up 147 rushing yards against Indiana Wesleyan... A trio of athletes posted 100-yard receiving efforts: Butler's Tyler Adams went for 143 yards against St. Thomas (Fla.); Stetson's Quinton Lane notched 130 yards against Concordia (Mich.); and San Diego's Vance Jefferson finished with 107 yards against La Verne... In the special teams ranks, Valparaiso kicker Brian Bartholomew's career-long 50-yard boot against Indiana Wesleyan was one of two 50-yarders in the FCS during the opening week.

WEEK 2

It was another five-win week across the PFL in Week 2, highlighted by Presbyterian head coach Steve Englehart picking up his first victory with the Blue Hose in a 21-13 win against Virginia-Lynchburg... Valparaiso nearly pulled off the PFL upset of the season with a narrow 28-21 loss at Illinois State in what was the Beacons' closest margin of defeat to a Missouri Valley Football Conference member... Dayton put points on the board for the 499th consecutive game in a loss at Youngstown State, extending its all-division record and moving to within a game of 500... Stetson moved to 2-0 with a win against Louisiana Christian – it is only the second time since the Hatters restarted their program (2013) they have opened a season 2-0... Joining Presbyterian and Stetson in the win column were Butler, Davidson, and St. Thomas – all five PFL wins came in home contests... St. Thomas wide receiver Shawn Shipman had the league's lone 100-yard rushing performance, amassing 151 yards against Michigan Tech... There were three 100-yard receiving performances in Week 2, led by Stetson's Nazeviah Burris' 180-yard effort against Louisiana Christian... Dominic Kibby (Presbyterian) and Quinton Lane (Stetson) each posted 107-yard receiving outings... Stetson's Brady Meitz' 444-yard passing performance was the first 400-plus passing day in the league since Presbyterian's Ren Hefley put together 544 yards at Valparaiso last season.

WEEK 3

Three homestanding PFL teams picked up victories in Week 3 with Dayton and Morehead State winning their home openers while Davidson won a home game for the second-straight week... Dayton scored in its 500th consecutive game in a rout of visiting Kentucky State, extending its NCAA all-divisions record... Davidson stretched its home win streak to nine games, the seventh longest active win streak in the FCS... Stetson's Brady Meitz became the first PFL quarterback to surpass 1,000 passing yards in 2022, with his 253-yard outing against Princeton pushing him to 1,047 passing yards in three games – he is ranked fourth among FCS quarterbacks... Morehead State's James Louis' 127-yard rushing performance was the lone 100-yard outing in Week 3 and the third such outing in the PFL this season... San Diego's Vance Jefferson put together a 104-yard receiving day at UC Davis, his second 100-yard effort of 2022... Davidson's Aaron Maione and Dayton's Jake Chisolm became the first PFL players to score three touchdowns in a game this season, each doing so in their respective home wins.

The 2022 PFL race got underway with four games during Week 4 and homestanding Stetson and Valparaiso picking up wins while Marist and Davidson each won road outings... Stetson's Ja'Veon Ensley was named the FedEx Ground FCS National Defensive Player of the Week and Valparaiso's Mason Kaplan earned FedEx Ground FCS National Freshman of the Week honors, presented by Stats Perform... Valparaiso continued to be the beacon of close games with its seven-point victory against San Diego, the 11th time in 19 games it has played a game decided by seven points or less... The Stetson-Morehead State game was a wild affair with four blocked kicks, three interceptions, two fumbles, seven sacks, and 13 tackles for loss between the two defenses. Morehead State had three blocked kicks (two punts and a field goal) alone in the game, while Stetson recorded all three interceptions... Marist won its first-ever game against Drake on its sixth trip to Des Moines, Iowa... Davidson's Jayden Waddell (104 yards) notched the Wildcats' first 100-yard rushing performance despite Davidson leading the PFL and all FCS programs with 1,446 rushing yards in 2022... St. Thomas' Gabriel Abel also enjoyed a 104-yard rushing day in the Tommies victory against Lincoln (Calif.)... Darke's Ian Corwin passed for a career-high 350-yards against Marist... WEEK 5

Davidson posted its first shutout since the 2019 season, Dayton and St. Thomas opened PFL play with victories, and Morehead State leveled its PFL record with a home win... Davidson's shutout of Butler was its first in 31 games dating back to a blanking of West Virginia Wesleyan during the 2019 season... Morehead State freshman Jihad McCall blocked his fourth punt of 2022 against Presbyterian and is one shy of the FCS single-season record. Morehead State leads the FCS with five blocked kicks this season... Marist hosted St. Thomas in front of 4,632 fans – the second largest crowd in the history of Tenney Stadium... There were only five 100-yard rushing performances in the season's first four weeks, but Week 5 saw six rushers surpass 100 yards... Davidson's Dylan Sparks posted a PFL season-high 180 yards in the shutout victory of Butler... St. Thomas' Hope Adebayo rolled up 132 yards at Marist... PFL Offensive Player of the Week Jake Chisolm went for 131 yards and two touchdowns in a win against Drake... Davidson's Coy Williams also broke through for 109 yards against Butler...
