
De'Shawn Jones, Campbell Senior | Running Back Fayetteville, North Carolina

Jones scored three consecutive touchdowns to lead Campbell past Bluefield, 59-7, Saturday. The PFL's returning leading rusher, he got 2016 off to a quick start with 16 carries for 142 yards. Jones was one of only seven FCS players to rush for three touchdowns in Week 1 action and nearly scored all three on consecutive Campbell drives. His three touchdown runs included a 74-yard burst that extended Campbell's lead to 28-0 early in the second quarter.

Hughes returned an interception for Valparaiso's lone touchdown in a 50-13 loss to No. 8 Illinois State, Saturday. His 30-yard interception return for a score came late in the second quarter and helped the Crusaders close to within 24-10. Hughes was one of only four FCS defenders to return an interception for a touchdown in Week 1 and it was his first career touchdown. He also had nine tackles (one shy of his career high), including six solo stops, and added a pass breakup in the contest.

Sanders opened the scoring with a punt return for a touchdown in Campbell's 59-7 victory against Bluefield, Saturday. His punt return came at the end of Bluefield's first possession as he returned a punt 55 yards for the score. Sanders averaged 21.2 yards on five punt returns and also had a 16-yard return on the opening kickoff. He was one of five FCS players to score a punt return touchdown in the opening weekend.

Simpson became the first Valparaiso kicker since 2008 to boot two 40-plus yard field goals in a game. He also averaged 53.0 yards on his four kickoffs.

Robert Morris at Dayton, 1 p.m.

Dayton will look to finish its season-opening homestand with an unblemished record when it hosts Robert Morris. The Flyers opened the campaign scoring the first 31 points in a 31-19 victory against Central State. Quarterback Alex Jeske notched his 10th career win after passing for a career-high 276 yards, throwing for two touchdowns and running for another. Defensively, the Dayton secondary looks like it will continue to cause nightmares as safety David Leisring ended the day wit a pair of interceptions and seven tackles. Robert Morris begins a two-game road trip after opening its 2016 schedule with a 14-7 loss to Alderson Broaddus.

Valparaiso at Sacred Heart, 1 p.m.

After its season-opening road trip to Illinois State, Valparaiso stays on the road with a Week 2 matchup with Sacred Heart. The Crusaders scored 13 points on nationally-ranked Illinois State, six coming defensive back Kellan Hughes and seven courtesy kicker Jake Simpson. Hughes earned PFL Defensive Player of the Week honors after his pick-six against the Cardinals while also amassing nine tackles. Simpson, a PFL Co-Special Teams Player of the Week, showed off his leg in Normal, Illinois, hitting field goals from 45 and 43 yards along with an extra point. It was the first time since 2008 a Valparaiso kick hit a pair of 40-yard field goals in a game. Sacred Heart will look for a second-straight win against the PFL after a Week 1 road win at Stetson.

Davidson at Kentucky Wesleyan, 2 p.m.

Davidson continues its season-opening two-game road trip when it travels to Division II Kentucky Wesleyan. Wildcats wide receiver Jaris Scott was a fan of the big play in the game at Georgetown, scoring on a 56-yard catch and carry to get DC on the board. He later added a 69-yard reception that was the longest in the PFL during Week 1, but Davidson could not convert on the opportunity that catch provided. Defensively, safety Ryan Leak was busy with six tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup in the contest. Kentucky Wesleyan opens its home slate after suffering a 50-29 loss at Delta State in opening-week action.

Campbell at Chowan, 6 p.m.

Campbell got its season off to a running start and now takes to the road with a contest at Division II Chowan. The Camels got 2016 started thanks to return specialist Trey Sanders, a PFL Co-Special Teams Player of the Week, who returned a punt 55-yards for a season-opening score. Running back De'Shawn Jones took over in the second quarter, scoring all three of his touchdowns in the frame, earning PFL Offensive Player of the Week honors. The league's leading rusher in 2015, Jones amassed 142 yards on 16 carries against Bluefield. While scoring was at the forefront of the Week 1 win, freshman linebacker Ray Miller began his career with an 11-tackle outing that included a team-best 2½ tackles for loss. Chowan opens its home schedule after eking out a 14-13 road win against Fayetteville State.

Georgetown at Marist, 6 p.m.

Marist continues its season-opening two-game homestand when it hosts Georgetown. The Red Foxes will look to rebound from its season-opening loss, which came in front of 3,363 fans at Tenney Stadium – the sixth-largest crowd in facility history. Marist was done in by an uncharacteristic six turnovers, including two inside the Bucknell five-yard line that denied scoring opportunities. Wideout Juston Christian caught seven passes for 89 yards to pace the Red Foxes offense. Kicker Mike Maccarone averaged 40 yards on four punts and converted a 37-yard field goal in the contest. Georgetown is looking to improve to 2-0 after opening its campaign with a victory against PFL member Davidson in Week 1.

VMI at Morehead State, 6 p.m.

Morehead State will turn its attention to a Week 2 matchup against VMI after a loss at nationally-ranked James Madison to begin the campaign. Week 1 highlights for the Eagles included wide receiver Jake Reymond becoming the program's all-time leader in receptions and ending the game with 205 career catches. MSU's lone touchdown came thanks to the legs of freshman running

back Trevor Jones, who scored on one of his four carries. Quarterback Austin Gahafer moved into third on the PFL all-time passing attempts list, ending the game with 1,413 career passes. The Eagles will face a VMI squad that was within two points after three quarters at FBS foe Akron before falling 47-24.

Franklin at Butler, 6:30 p.m.

After an impressive start to its campaign, Butler turns to its home opener against Franklin in Week 2. The Bulldogs posted 25 points at Indiana State in its season opener. Butler ended the game with leads in time of possession, first downs and rushing yards – thanks to the effort of running back Anthony Scaccia who carried the ball 13 times for 77 yards and two touchdowns. The Bulldogs defense also did its part, holding Indiana State to 3-of-13 on third down attempts. Linebacker David Starkey led the defensive unit with 12 tackles, a sack and two forced fumbles. Franklin enters the game ranked No. 19 in the Division III polls after opening its season with a 43-39 victory against Thomas More.

Jacksonville at Liberty, 7 p.m.

First-year head coach Ian Shields will take a revamped Jacksonville squad into its season-opener at Liberty. The Dolphins were idle in Week 1 as they assimilated 46 freshmen into the roster. Jacksonville will turn to running back and Preseason All-PFL choice Ulysses Bryant, who will look to continue his climb up the Jacksonville record book where he ranks second in rushing yards (2,478). On the defensive side of the ball, linebackers Grady Redding and Justin Horton will share the leadership load. Redding was a Preseason All-PFL pick after ranking fourth in the league with 5.8 solo stops per game. Liberty opened its season with a 36-13 loss at FBS foe Virginia Tech.

Drake at South Dakota State, 7 p.m.

Drake will have the toughest task in the PFL during Week 2 when it faces nationally-ranked South Dakota State. The Bulldogs will look to shake off the effects of a home-opening loss to Quincy. Drake tight end Eric Saubert got his season off to a strong start, leading all Drake receivers with seven catches for 95 yards and a touchdown. Running back Conley Wilkins amassed a league-best 242 all-purpose yards, including 168 yards on seven kickoff returns (24.0 yards per return). South Dakota State returns home after nearly stunning FBS No. 13 TCU, leading 24-21 in the first half before bowing by a 59-41 margin.

Warner at Stetson, 7 p.m.

Stetson is another PFL squad with a two-game homestand to open 2016 and enters its Week 2 affair against Warner seeking its first win. The Hatters were so close to a win against Sacred Heart, surrendering a lead in the fourth quarter. It was Stetson's first season-opening loss since he program was restarted in 2013. The Hatters had five first-time starters on the field against the Pioneers, including sophomore quarterback Gaven DeFilippo who completed 22-of-38 passes for 225 yards and a touchdown in his debut. Garrett Mulling and Dom Coluccio made their first starts on the offensive line while Shane Parton and Colby Duncan started defensively. Warner, out of the NAIA, opened its season with a Week 1 victory against Union College.

San Diego at Cal Poly, 9:05 p.m.

San Diego opened 2016 with a shutout victory against Division II Western New Mexico and now turns its attention to FCS foe Cal Poly. The Toreros shutout win gives it the last two shutout victories in the PFL, its previous shutout was a 27-0 victory against Drake on Oct. 17, 2015. Defensive end Jonathan Petersen led that defensive unit with a PFL best three tackles for loss and two sacks in the week as part of a five-tackle performance. Running back Jonah Hodges supplied the offense with two touchdowns as part of a 16-carry, 106-yard effort. The Toreros travel to a Cal Poly squad that put a scare into FBS foe Nevada, forcing overtime with a 14-point fourth quarter before falling 30-27.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson senior defensive back Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. Payne, the two-time defending PFL Defensive Player of the Year, returns as the eighth leading tackler in all NCAA football with 412 career tackles. His 243 career solo tackles ranks third among all active players entering the 2016 season.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFER TAPPED FOR STATS FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Morehead State senior quarterback Austin Gahafer has been listed on the STATS FCS National Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Louisville, Ky., native is coming off a prolific 2015 season when he was named Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year. Gahafer needs only 1,738 passing yards to set the Morehead State career record and just 2,717 yards to break the PFL career mark.

DAYTON'S WILL NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton senior placekicker William Will has been named to the Watch List for the Fred Mitchell Award, which goes to the top kicking specialist at the FCS, NCAA Division II, Division III and NAIA levels. It is the third straight season Will has been named to the Mitchell Watch List. A two-time First Team All-PFL pick, Will's 84 points were the most in the PFL last season. He also led the league in field goals per game (1.42), field goal percentage (73.9% (17 of 23) and was one of three kickers in the PFL who was perfect on PAT's (33 of 33).

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Drake senior tight end Eric Saubert, Stetson senior defensive back Donald Payne and Dayton junior return specialist Christian Searles were the Pioneer Football League student-athletes named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Teams.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

| Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 165 nominees from across the country for the 25th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Sean Horan (Butler), Nate Casey (Davidson), Taylor Coleman (Drake), Cameron Gibson (Marist) and Devyn Bryant (San Diego) were nominated for the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

2015 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | For the second consecutive season both of the league's Players of the Year return. Stetson safety Donald Payne, a two-time PFL Defensive Player of the Year, returns after finishing second among all PFL defenders in tackles per game (11.5) and tackles for loss per game (1.36). Morehead State quarterback Austin Gahafer, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league with 291 completed passes for 3,244 yards and 24 touchdowns last season.

PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM | Thirty Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named to the preseason All-PFL squad. Fourteen First-Team All-PFL honorees return for the 2016 season. In addition, seven Second-Team All-PFL selections and nine honorable mention recipients from 2015 were elevated to the 2016 preseason squad.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | Defending champion San Diego again received the coaches' nod to win the 2015 PFL title, but the coaches also predicted an exciting race. The top three teams in the preseason poll were separated by just three points. San Diego received seven of a possible 10 first-place votes and 89 of a maximum 100 points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Dayton received three first-place votes and was ranked second with 87 points. Drake gained the remaining first-place vote and was third with 86 points.

PFL'S 24TH CAMPAIGN | The 2016 season marks the 24th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2016 NCAA FCS Championship.
