Making his first collegiate start, Seewald tied a Valparaiso record with five touchdown throws in a 49-24 victory against NAIA foe Trinity International, Saturday. He opened the game with a 61-yard touchdown toss on the first play from scrimmage. It was the first completion in a day that saw Seewald complete 22-of-29 passes for 345 yards. On the Crusaders third touchdown drive, he completed all four of his pass attempts, amassing 62 yards on the five-play drive. Seewald's final pass completion salted the game away with a 14-yard touchdown pass. He is one of seven FCS quarterbacks to throw five touchdowns in a game this season and the first in the PFL.

Collins had three tackles for loss in Davidson's 38-12 victory against Division II Livingstone, Saturday. He finished the day with seven tackles (four solo), a quarterback sack and a fumble recovery to help Davidson's defense post a shutout through nearly 45 minutes. Collins' lone sack helped extend that scoreless start, pushing Livingstone out of field goal range early in the third quarter and ultimately leading to a turnover on downs.

Smith averaged 50 yards on six punts in Dayton's 34-20 loss at FCS foe Duquesne, Saturday. He had four punts of 50-plus yards on the day, including a 61-yard bomb on his fifth punt, late in the third quarter. Three of Smith's punts ended inside the Dukes 20-yard line. Dayton netted 49.5 yards on his six punts as Duquesne attempted just two returns that totaled three yards.

📍 Morehead State at Drake, 1 p.m.

Setting the Scene: A week after each team won its first contest of 2016, Morehead State travels to Drake for the first game of the 2016 PFL race. The Eagles have never won at Drake Stadium, coming closest to victory in 2012 when they lost a 28-25 decision. Last season, Morehead State won a 38-35 triple-overtime thriller that saw the teams combined for 882 offensive yards.

Morehead State Matchup to Watch: Quarterback Austin Gahafer enters the PFL opener only ranked fourth in passing yardage (211.0 ypg), well off his pace of previous years. Against Drake he will face a defensive unit that is ranked among the bottom three in both sacks and pass defense efficiency.

Drake Matchup to Watch: Running back Conley Wilkins has rumbled for four touchdowns in the season's first three games, the fifth most scored in the PFL through three weeks. He will square off against a Morehead State defense that has allowed a league-high 11 rushing touchdowns this season and ranks among the league's bottom three in rushing defense.

📍 Davidson at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

Setting the Scene: The opportunity to start the PFL campaign with a win awaits both Davidson and Valparaiso when they meet Saturday. The Wildcats have lost its last five PFL openers and the Crusaders have dropped their last two lid-lifters. Last season's contest turned into a barn-burner that was decided when Valparaiso scored the game's final two touchdowns, including the game-winner with 1:55 left in the game.

Davidson Matchup to Watch: Defensive lineman Boo Jordan leads the PFL in both sacks (3½) and tackles for loss (5) after the season's first three weeks. Behind him is linebacker Tony Collins, who nabbed PFL Defensive Player of the Week honors after posting three tackles for loss. Altogether, the Wildcats defense has forced a league-best 10 turnovers this season. Will they be able to wreak havoc against a Crusaders offensive line that has allowed 24 tackles for loss and 10 sacks this season?

Valparaiso Matchup to Watch: Quarterback Jimmy Seewald impressed in his first collegiate start, earning PFL Offensive Player of the Week honors after a five-touchdown outing against Trinity International. In his first three outings he has proven to be one of the league's top passers, ranking second in pass efficiency (149.6) while throwing a PFL best seven touchdowns. He matches up with a Davidson defense ranked among the bottom three in pass defense while allowing a league-high 70 completions.

📍 Butler at Campbell, 6 p.m.

Setting the Scene: A pair of 2-1 squads will face off in North Carolina when Butler travels east to meet Campbell. It is the second consecutive year the two teams will meet to open their respective PFL campaigns. Butler scored a touchdown with 37 seconds remaining to claim a 25-24 victory last season in Indianapolis.

Butler Matchup to Watch: Running back Duvante Lane leads the PFL with six touchdown runs this season while rushing for 202 yards in three games. He paces a Bulldogs running game that leads the PFL with 11 rushing touchdowns this season while averaging 213 yards per game (third in the PFL). Campbell's defense owns the PFL's third ranked run defense (113.7 yards allowed per game) and has amassed 21 tackles for loss (seven sacks) this season.

Campbell Matchup to Watch: Running back De'Shawn Jones has amassed a PFL-best 274 rushing yards in three games and his five touchdown runs are second most in the league. He leads the PFL's top-ranked run offense (280.7 yards per game) that has scored nine touchdowns. The Camels will square off against the PFL's stingiest run defense in a Butler unit that has allowed just 84.7 rushing yards per game and a league low 2.59 yards per carry.

📍 Dayton at San Diego, 7 p.m.

Setting the Scene: Possibly the game to watch in the PFL happens in its opening week when defending PFL co-champions Dayton and San Diego meet on the West Coast. Last season's meeting was a defensive battle with neither team reaching 300 offensive yards and only scoring one touchdown each. Dayton fended off San Diego's final drive when it held a 4th-and-1 run from its own 28-yard line for no gain to seal a 13-12 victory with 1:17 left.

Dayton Matchup to Watch: The Flyers offense has seen its production decrease in each of its first three games, dwindling to just 201 yards at Duquesne in Week 3. Dayton's has run the ball 119 times this season, second only to Campbell (147) in attempts. However, Dayton is averaging just 2.87 yards per carry. That run game faces a Torero defense that has allowed 4.76 yards per carry, and permitted a pair of 100-yard rushers in a Week 2 matchup at Cal Poly.

San Diego Matchup to Watch: Quarterback Anthony Lawrence has not thrown an interception in his first 50 pass attempts this season, while completing 32 of those passes. He led the PFL in pass efficiency (153.5) as a freshman after throwing 23 touchdowns. However, one of his six interceptions last season came against Dayton and led to the game's first points. The Flyers already own five interceptions in 2016 with sophomore linebacker David Leising nabbing a PFL best three interceptions.

📍 Jacksonville at Stetson, 7 p.m.

Setting the Scene: The PFL's Sunshine State battle will help cap the opening week of league play when Jacksonville makes the trip to Stetson. The Dolphins have had the better of the first three meetings in the series, including last season's 41-14 victory in Jacksonville. Stetson was done in by five turnovers in that loss, which Jacksonville turned into 21 points.

Jacksonville Matchup to Watch: Wide receiver Prince Gray has only six receptions in two games, but has amassed 172 yards this season. His 28.67 yards per catch leads the PFL and ranks third among FCS wideouts. Gray's total includes the league's longest catch-and-carry this season, a 78-yard touchdown catch last week. He may have to make the most of his opportunities against a Stetson defense that has allowed just 25 pass completions and a 40 percent pass-completion rate in its first two games.

Stetson Matchup to Watch: For three seasons Stetson's defense has been defined by safety Donald Payne. However, in 2016 he has been called upon less as Jeb Boudreaux has become the dominant tackling force, leading the Hatters in tackles (20) and tackles for loss (5). Will he and the rest of the Hatters defense (with a combined 19 tackles for loss) be able to find their way past a Dolphins offensive line that has not allowed a sack this season and only 10 tackles for loss?

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

RAISE THE CURTAIN | The PFL regular-season race begins in Week 4 with five games on the schedule. Seven teams have claimed a share of the PFL crown with Dayton winning a share of 12 titles, including six solo championships.

MOREHEAD STATE'S HUTCHINSON NAMED FCS CHAIRMAN | Morehead State Director of Athletics Brian Hutchinson will serve as chair of the Division I Football Championship Committee in 2016-17. Hutchinson, who has served as Morehead State's director of athletics since 2004, is in his fourth year on this national committee, and becomes the first Pioneer Football League athletic director to serve as chair.

THREE PFL ALUMNI BEGIN 2016 ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS | A trio of Pioneer Football League alumni began the 2016 NFL season on active rosters. Marist alumni Terrence Fede (Miami Dolphins) and Jason Myers (Jacksonville Jaguars) and San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson (New York Giants) each continued their professional careers. In addition, Jacksonville alumnus Andy Jones was a member of the Dallas Cowboys practice squad.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson senior defensive back Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. Payne, the two-time defending PFL Defensive Player of the Year, returns as the eighth leading tackler in all NCAA football with 412 career tackles. His 243 career solo tackles ranks third among all active players entering the 2016 season.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFFER TAPPED FOR STATS FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Morehead State senior quarterback Austin Gahafer has been listed on the STATS FCS National Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Louisville, Ky., native is coming off a prolific 2015 season when he was named Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year. Gahafer needs only 1,738 passing yards to set the Morehead State career record and just 2,717 yards to break the PFL career mark.

DAYTON'S WILL NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton senior placekicker William Will has been named to the Watch List for the Fred Mitchell Award, which goes to the top kicking specialist at the FCS, NCAA Division II, Division III and NAIA levels. It is the third straight season Will has been named to the Mitchell Watch List. A two-time First Team All-PFL pick, Will's 84 points were the most in the PFL last season. He also led the league in field goals per game (1.42), field goal percentage (73.9% (17 of 23) and was one of three kickers in the PFL who was perfect on PAT's (33 of 33).

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Drake senior tight end Eric Saubert, Stetson senior defensive back Donald Payne and Dayton junior return specialist Christian Searles were the Pioneer Football League student-athletes named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Teams.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 165 nominees from across the country for the 25th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Sean Horan (Butler), Nate Casey (Davidson), Taylor Coleman (Drake), Cameron Gibson (Marist) and Devyn Bryant (San Diego) were nominated for the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

2015 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | For the second consecutive season both of the league's Players of the Year return. Stetson safety Donald Payne, a two-time PFL Defensive Player of the Year, returns after finishing second among all PFL defenders in tackles per game (11.5) and tackles for loss per game (1.36). Morehead State quarterback Austin Gahafer, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league with 291 completed passes for 3,244 yards and 24 touchdowns last season.

2016 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM | Thirty Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named to the preseason All-PFL squad. Fourteen First-Team All-PFL honorees return for the 2016 season. In addition, seven Second-Team All-PFL selections and nine honorable mention recipients from 2015 were elevated to the 2016 preseason squad.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | Defending champion San Diego again received the coaches' nod to win the 2015 PFL title, but the coaches also predicted an exciting race. The top three teams in the preseason poll were separated by just three points. San Diego received seven of a possible 10 first-place votes and 89 of a maximum 100 points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Dayton received three first-place votes and was ranked second with 87 points. Drake gained the remaining first-place vote and was third with 86 points.

PFL'S 24TH CAMPAIGN | The 2016 season marks the 24th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2016 NCAA FCS Championship.
