## PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### OFFENSE

**Kevin Hoyng, Dayton** Junior Quarterback  
Coldwater, Ohio (Coldwater HS))

In his first career start, Hoyng complete 12 of 19 passes for 271 yards and one touchdown. He also was the Flyers' leading rusher with seven carries for 57 yards, including a one-yard run for the game's first touchdown. He led the league with 328 yards total offense, averaging 12.6 offensive yards per play, leading Dayton to a 38-0 victory over Division II Tiffin.

### DEFENSE

**Vincent Hinkle, Morehead State** Senior Linebacker  
Louisville, Ky. (South Oldham HS)

Hinkle was credited with 14 total tackles (four solo), including two tackles for loss and a quarterback sack. He also added a pass breakup in Morehead State's 26-25 come-from-behind win at I-AA foe Saint Francis (Pa.).

### SPECIAL TEAMS

**Hutch Parker, San Diego** Sophomore Kicker/Punter  
Dana Point, Calif. (St. Margaret's Episcopal HS)

Parker converted 3-of-4 field goal attempts with field goals from 38, 29 and 22 yards – his lone miss came from 32 yards out – to help San Diego to a home-opening 30-6 victory against NAIA opponent Azusa Pacific. He also added 3 PATs for a team-best 12 points, which also was second among all PFL scorers in week one and tops among kickers. His three field goals were half his total from 2004, where he connected on 6-of-8 attempts.

**NEW COACHES AND COACHING MILESTONES:** Two new head coaches got their careers underway last weekend, Davidson's **Tripp Merritt** and Valparaiso's **Stacy Adams**. Merritt shouldered a loss in his first outing at I-AA VMI. Meanwhile, Adams saw his Crusaders pick up a road victory at Wisconsin Lutheran. Among the old guard, Morehead State's **Matt Ballard** picked up career victory No. 100 as his Eagles posted a come-from-behind victory at St. Francis (Pa.).

**2005 PFL CHAMPIONSHIP:** The 2005 PFL Championship will be hosted by the PFL North champion, Nov. 19. It is the 5th PFL Championship since the beginning of the divisional era in 2000. The PFL North is undefeated in the four previous championships.

**PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATION:** the Pioneer Football League's coaches tabbed Drake and Morehead State to win their respective divisions in the PFL's preseason poll. Drake is picked first for the first time since divisional play began while it is the fourth time in five seasons Morehead State has been chosen as the PFL South winner.

**PFL NORTH POLL RESULTS:** Drake, the 2004 PFL Champion, received five of the nine possible first-place votes in the PFL North. Dayton and San Diego split the four remaining first-place votes and were picked second and third, respectively. Valparaiso and Butler round out the five-team PFL North, the two teams selected in a fourth-place tie.

**PFL SOUTH POLL RESULTS:** Morehead State, the three-time PFL North defending champion, received five first-place votes. Second-place Jacksonville picked up three first-place votes while Austin Peay, which was picked third, claimed one first-place vote. Davidson rounds out the four-team PFL South.

**DRAKE PRESEASON MID-MAJOR PICK, BUT TOUGH ROAD AHEAD:** Drake was the pre-season favorite in the Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Poll and was even picked No. 23 by Street & Smith Magazine. However, the Bulldogs, who continue to improve the strength

of their schedule, scheduled a pair of tough opening dates. The first of those test saw Drake fall with a 52-17 loss at I-AA No. 12 Northern Iowa. This week Drake travels to I-AA Illinois State.

**APSU'S KELLOGG BEGINS ASSAULT ON SCHOOL'S RECORD BOOK:** Austin Peay's **Jesse Kellogg** set the school record for pass attempts with a late fourth-quarter completion at Charleston (W.Va.), his 28th pass attempt on the day. He currently has 839 career pass attempts, pushing him past Brian Baker (1998-01), who had 838 in his injury-interrupted career.

**CONSTRUCTION MADNESS:** Two PFL members are playing away from their friendly confines due to renovations at their on-campus facilities.

**Butler** opened its season at the University of Indianapolis' Key Stadium due to renovations at the Butler Bowl – the first time since 1928 that the Bulldogs have played a home-opener away from the Butler Bowl.

**Drake** will play its entire home schedule away from 79-year old Drake Stadium which is getting a complete facelift which should be completed in time for the school's internationally-known Drake Relays. Drake will host its four home games at high school campuses in the Des Moines area.

**Davidson** will dedicate the newest additions to its football venue, Richardson Stadium, during a halftime ceremony, Saturday. Among the upgraded amenities are expanded stadium seating, and a new press box, weight room and visitors' locker room.

**DAYTON EXTENDS STREAK:** Dayton opened the 2005 season without being shutout – in fact posting a shutout at Tiffin – extending its streak of games without being shutout to 322. The Flyers were last shut out on Oct. 16, 1976, a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

**NFL CONNECTIONS:** San Diego head coach Jim Harbaugh isn't the only person with an NFL connection in the PFL. Davidson freshman Beaux Jones saw his first action at quarterback against Lenoir-Rhyne, Sept. 18, completing 3-of-8 passes for 19 yards. Beaux is the son of former NFL quarterback Bert Jones, who played for the Baltimore Colts from 1973-1981.

Also, former Dallas Cowboy's kicker Billy Cundiff is a Drake alumnus. He was cut prior to the start of the 2005 season, but has three years of experience. Cundiff is in the NFL record books, with seven field goals made in a Monday Night overtime victory at the New York Giants last season.

Dayton's contribution to the NFL resides in Tampa Bay where head coach Jon Gruden, a 1986 grauate, became the second Dayton alumnus to coach a Super Bowl winner (XXXVII). He joined 1953 UD graduate and 1993 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Chuck Noll who won four Super Bowls (IX, X, XII. & XIV) as coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers.
