WEEK 4 PREVIEW

Two more teams begin their PFL slate in an otherwise quiet Week 4 around the league. Only three non-conference games dot the slate. The other five league members take the week off in preparation for the first Super Saturday across the league as all 10 members will square off in league action during Week 5.

The league's lone conference battle will pit unbeaten **Butler** on the road at **Morehead State**. The Bulldogs have not won at Jayne Stadium in the series but ended a five-game losing streak with a victory at the Butler Bowl last season. Both squads won their Week 3 outings, Morehead State picking up a double-overtime road victory at North Carolina Central while Butler won at home against Hanover.

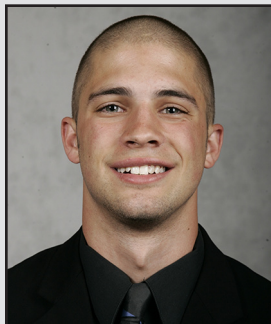
Dayton wraps up the non-conference portion of its schedule when it hosts Duquesne. It is the second straight Northeast Conference opponent for the Flyers, who won at Robert Morris in Week 3. The Dukes downed the Flyers last season in Pittsburgh.

After two consecutive PFL tilts, **Marist** steps away from league action to meet Bucknell of the Patriot League. It is the fifth straight year the two teams have met and the Red Foxes have yet to post a victory. Last season's 21-17 loss to the Bison was the closest decision in the series.

Valparaiso, who return to action after an off week, hosts Carthage in a non-conference tilt. It will be the first meeting — and second all-time — between the two teams since the Crusaders won a 60-0 decision in 1950.

An All-PFL wideout in 2008, Valentino moved behind center and threw two touchdown passes to lead Dayton in a 21-14 victory at Robert Morris, Saturday. He received word of his position change, Tuesday, giving him four days preparation. Despite the limited prep time, Valentino completed 14-of-29 passes for 192 yards and two touchdowns, including the eventual game winner. He also led the Flyers ground attack with 21 carries for 58 yards to finish with 250 yards of total offense.

2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY: A long wait came to and end, Saturday, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at the home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

WELCOME MARIST: For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION: Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

SAN DIEGO'S TRUJILLO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST: For the fourth straight year the USD football program will be represented on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, bestowed annually upon the top player in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Senior quarterback Sebastian Trujillo (Durango, CO) is on the initial list of 20 candidates heading into the 2009 campaign. He follows in the footsteps of quarterback Josh Johnson (2006 & 2007) and wide receiver John Matthews (2008). In final voting, Johnson was 6th in 2006 and 3rd in 2007; Matthews placed 7th last season.

DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY: Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Dayton rebounded in Week 3 to post a 21-17 victory at Robert Morris and extended the nation's longest streak of avoiding a shutout. The Flyers have not been shutout in 367 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. *A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.*

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL: For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
