WEEK 5 PREVIEW

CAMPBELL, fresh off a winless three-game homestand, returns to the road with a road contest at **BUTLER**, which returns home after suffering its first shutout since the 2007 season. Last season's meeting between the two teams went to the wire, the Bulldogs winning by a one-touchdown margin. Campbell's Rashaun Brown rushed for 133 yards in last week's loss, but Daniel Polk has a PFL-best seven rushing touchdowns. Butler quarterback Andrew Huck is averaging 183.0 passing yards per game and has six touchdowns, but the Bulldogs have scored just six red zone touchdowns (13 attempts) this season. 🏈 **DAYTON** looks to remain unbeaten at Welcome Stadium this season when it hosts winless **VALPARAISO**. The Flyers are 3-0 at home this season following its Week 4 victory against Central State. The Crusaders narrowly lost its PFL opener against Drake last week and will look to snap its 10-game PFL losing streak. The Flyers used a 292-yard rushing attack to win against Central State, eight different runners recording a carry. Valparaiso was undone by a pair of missed PATs in a two-point loss to Drake, but the Crusaders offense is still struggling, averaging just 188 yards per game. 🏈 **MARIST** will make its season's first road trip, heading to the Midwest for a matchup with **DRAKE**, which returns home after a three-game road trip. The Red Foxes were 1-2 during their season-opening homestand at Tenney Stadium, but lost to Morehead State, last week, in their PFL opener. The Bulldogs went 2-1 on their recent road trip, narrowly winning at Valparaiso in their PFL opener last week. Quietly, Marist wideout James LaMacchia leads the PFL receiving corps in both receptions (9.3 pg) and receiving yards (92.3 pg). Drake quarterback Cody Seeger made his first collegiate start at Valparaiso, and completed 15 passes for 106 yards. 🏈 The lone matchup of PFL unbeaten teams sees **SAN DIEGO** travel across the country to meet **JACKSONVILLE**. Both teams won their PFL openers in convincing fashion, the Dolphins winning by 27 at Davidson while the Toreros posted their first shutout since the 2006 campaign in a victory against Butler. San Diego defensive end Mario Kurn leads the FCS in both tackles for loss (3.0 pg) and quarterback sacks (2.38 pg) and is making an early case for defensive player of the year honors. Jacksonville quarterback Josh McGregor leads all FCS passers with 13 touchdown throws after tossing six at Davidson last week. 🏈 **MOREHEAD STATE** will step out of conference action and will visit Georgia State in the Georgia Dome. The Eagles have gotten three consecutive four-touchdown efforts from quarterback Zach Lewis and are 2-1 in those three games. They visit a Georgia State team that escaped a visit to Campbell with a three-point win.

McGregor threw for all six touchdowns in Jacksonville's 42-15 PFL victory at Davidson, Saturday. He was 26-of-41 passing (no interceptions) for a career-high 405 yards. McGregor's 84-yard touchdown toss to Elliott Finkley in the second quarter is the fourth-longest pass play in the FCS this season. He also is the first FCS quarterback to throw more than four touchdowns in a single-game this season. In addition, McGregor's 405 passing-yard effort is the fourth-best single-game performance in the FCS.

2010 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

NEWS AND NOTES FROM THE PFL:

BUTLER: Wide receiver Zach Watkins caught seven passes at San Diego and now has 130 career catches, moving him into fourth on the Bulldogs career receptions chart. Butler has lost both of its night games this season – at Youngstown State and San Diego – and has been outscored 55-7 in those contests.

CAMPBELL: Rashaun Brown became the first Campbell running back to break through the 100-yard barrier, finishing with 19 carries for 133 yards against Georgia State. Also, running back C.J. Oates reached the 1,000 career yard mark and currently has 1,029 career yards. Quarterback Daniel Polk has rushed for seven touchdowns this season, the most by an FCS quarterback this season.

DAVIDSON: Kicker Ben Behrendt kicked a career-long 48-yard field goal, four shy of the school record, against Jacksonville. The Wildcats are off this week before hosting Butler next week.

DAYTON: Wide receiver Nick Collins has caught a pass in 25 consecutive games, including a 10-yard reception against Central State. Defensive end Devon Langhorst posted a career-high 10 tackles against Central State, leading a defensive unit that limited CSU's Josh Anderson, who averaged 122.3 yards per game entering the contest, to six yards.

DRAKE: The Bulldogs ended their three game road trip with a victory at Valparaiso, finishing the trip with a 2-1 record. Drake won the time of possession battle 36:18 to 23:42, courtesy 52 carries by seven different runners. Quarterback Cody Seeger carried the ball 17 times while running backs Pat Cashmore (10 carries) and Tom Kostek (11 carries) also reached the double-digit carry mark.

JACKSONVILLE: The Dolphins offense racked up more than 500 yards offense for the second consecutive game. The wide out duo of Josh Philpart (9 receptions, 107 yards) and Elliott Finkley (3 receptions, 121 yards) became the first JU receiving duo to record 100 yards each since the 2007 season.

MARIST: The Red Foxes scored four touchdowns on plays covering more than 50 yards against Morehead State. Running back Calvin McCoy opened Marist's scoring with a 76-yard first quarter run. Freshman quarterback Chuckie Looney connected on a 54-yard "Hail Mary" pass to end the first half. Then quarterback Tommy Reilly threw fourth-quarter touchdowns of 61 and 69 yards to Michael Rios in the fourth quarter.

MOREHEAD STATE: The Eagles won for the first time when traveling by plane, when they downed Marist in Week 4. Quarterback Zach Lewis has thrown for more than 300 yards in each of his last three games, tacking on four touchdowns each time. The Eagles offensive line did not surrender a sack at Marist.

SAN DIEGO: The defense shutout Butler, 24-0, for the Toreros first shutout since a 37-0 victory at Drake in 2006. Running back Phil Morelli returned from a foot injury to lead San Diego with 100 yards on 21 carries, including a pair of touchdowns. Defensive end Mario Kurn had seven tackles but recorded five in the backfield, including three sacks and leads all FCS tacklers in tackles for loss (3.0 pg) and sacks (2.38 pg).

VALPARAISO: After being held to two touchdowns in its first three games, the Crusaders offense broke out for 19 points in its PFL opener against Drake. Valparaiso also is one of the league's more disciplined squads, having committed just three total penalties in its last two contests and moving into second for fewest penalties this season.

PROLIFIC QUARTERBACKS: Jacksonville quarterback Josh McGregor leads all FCS signal-callers with 13 touchdown passes this season, averaging a touchdown for every 10.5 attempts he makes. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis is right behind McGregor, completing 12 touchdown passes – all in his last three outings – and is averaging a TD pass for every 11.8 attempts. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk has his own claim to a top spot, his seven touchdown carries the most by a FCS quarterback this season.

2010 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

DAVIDSON'S BEHM, DAYTON'S PRINDLE NAMED TO ALL-STATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Davidson junior linebacker John Behm and Dayton junior offensive lineman John Prindle were each named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the two organizations announced, Wednesday. They were two of only 22 football student-athletes selected by the organization to receive the honor, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. A total of 112 players across all collegiate levels of the sport were nominated for the award by sports information directors on behalf of their teams, the most ever in the 19-year history of the program. From the nominations, a special selection committee named 22 college football players from across the country to the 2010 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a combined team representing the NCAA® Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA), Divisions II, III, and the NAIA.

DAYTON'S VALENTINO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST: Dayton quarterback Steve Valentino, the 2009 PFL "Offensive Player of the Year," has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List by the Sports Network. Last season was Valentino's first at quarterback after spending a year as a receiver. He led the Flyers to a 9-1 record while under center and led all PFL players in total offensive yards (281.6 yards per game) and all PFL quarterbacks in rushing yards (722). The Payton Award annual recognizes the FCS Offensive Player of the Year and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

DAYTON'S VERCAMMEN NAMED TO BUCHANAN WATCH LIST: Coming off a record-setting year on defense, Dayton defensive back James Vercammen was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by the Sports Network. A 2010 co-captain, Vercammen set a PFL record with 134 total tackles in 2009, 25 more than the next closest athlete. The Buchanan Award annual recognized the FCS "Defensive Player of the Year" and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Campbell's Charles Fiore, Davidson's John Behm, Dayton's Dan Prindle and Drake's Ben Morrison have each been named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) announced this summer. They were among a record 121 student-athletes nominated for the teams which recognize those college football players who stand out for the positive influence they have in their communities.

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Entering the 2010 season, the Flyers have not been shutout in 377 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 8.

MARIST NEARS 150TH ALL-TIME VICTORY: Marist needs three victories in 2010 to record the program's 150th victory. They are among a wide-ranging number of victories by PFL members. Leading the group is Dayton – in its 103rd season – entered the year with 612 wins. At the other end is Campbell, which enters its third season of football in 2010 with four victories to its credit. DAYTON PICKED TO WIN PFL: Ten-time Pioneer Football League Champion Dayton was tapped as the favorite in the league's pre-season coaches' poll. The Flyers received four first-place votes and 71 points. Also receiving first-place votes were second-pick Butler (two first-place votes) and third-pick Jacksonville (four first-place

THREE FORMER PFL ATHLETES START SEASON ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS: Former San Diego wideout John Mathews became the third former PFL athlete to start the 2010 NFL season on an active roster when he was signed, Saturday, by Jacksonville to replace injured wide receiver Jarett Dillard. Mathews spent the preseason with the Jaguars before being waived during final cuts. He joined former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff and former San Diego quarterback Josh Johnson on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend. Cundiff was named Baltimore's starting kicker after winning the job during the preseason. Johnson is Tampa Bay's No. 2 quarterback behind starter Josh Freeman.

votes). Only eight points separated the top three teams in the 2010 poll, listed below:

NEW SIGHTS AWAIT AT PFL SCHOOLS: A building boom of sorts overtook the league's members over the summer with Butler and Jacksonville renovating their football facilities while Valparaiso added lights to Brown Stadium. Butler is completing renovations to its seating area and press box at the Butler Bowl, matching updates to its playing surface in 2005. Jacksonville has installed a new AstroTurf playing surface at D.B. Milne Field, replacing the natural turf that was the field's surface since 1998. One year after installing its own artificial surface, Valparaiso has added lights at Brown Stadium and will play its first-ever game under the lights when it hosts St. Joseph's (Ind.), Sept. 18.

2010 NCAA INFORMATION TO KNOW

NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP EXPANDS, CHANGES LOCATIONS: In 2010, 20 teams will qualify for the NCAA Division I Football Championship. It is the first time since 1987 the NCAA Division I Football Championship has been expanded – then from 12 teams to 16 teams. In addition 10 of the 14 FCS conferences will receive automatic bids into the tournament – the Big South and Northeast Conferences gaining automatic berths. Entering 2010 there are 124 programs competing in football at the Division I FCS level.

PFL COULD RECEIVE AT-LARGE BID IN 2010: While the PFL did not receive a automatic qualifying spot into the 2010 championship, the league could still receive what would amount to an automatic at-large bid. Under criteria established by the championship committee, the PFL champion could receive an automatic at-large bid if it meets three criteria. First, it must win eight games against Division I opposition. Secondly, it must win two games against opponents from the 10 automatic qualifying conferences. Finally, it must finish the season ranked among the top 20 in the polls as calculated by the championship committee.

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
