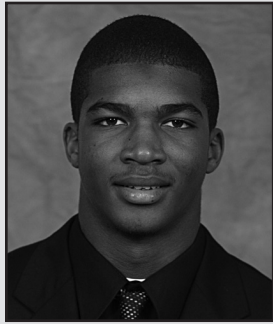

## WEEK 6 PREVIEW

**DAVIDSON** returns to action following an off week when it hosts **BUTLER**, which hits the road following its first back-to-back losses since the 2008 campaign. The Bulldogs have not won in three previous visits to Richardson Stadium. The last three meetings in the series have been decided by 12 points or less. Davidson has relied on running back Kenny Mantuo this season and he has 71 carries for 339 yards and three touchdowns in four games. Butler linebacker Jordan Ridley leads the Bulldogs defense with a league-best 58 tackles in five games 🏈 **DRAKE** and **JACKSONVILLE** square off in a battle of two of the league's remaining three unbeaten teams. Drake won last season's meeting in Des Moines, 45-38, but Jacksonville won the last time the two teams played in Florida, 41-9, in 2008. Jacksonville has rolled up three consecutive games of 500 or more yards and leads the PFL with 464.6 yards per game. Drake just held Marist to 77 yards and is the league's top-rated defense, holding opponents to 294.4 yards per game 🏈 **MARIST** will make its second trip westward when it visits **VALPARAISO**, as both teams seek their season's first PFL victory. The game could be a pass-heavy affair as the Crusaders rank ninth in rushing (41.0 ypg) followed by the Red Foxes in 10th (31.8 ypg). Marist linebacker Tyler Ramsey is second among PFL tacklers with 9.5 tackles per game in four outings. Linebacker Matt Heinen leads Valparaiso with 7.2 tackles per game (8th in PFL) 🏈 **DAYTON** makes the big trip out west with a visit to **SAN DIEGO**, which returns home after a coast-to-coast trip to Jacksonville in Week 4. San Diego's offense has emerged in recent weeks, scoring more than 24 points in each of its last three games, but the Toreros are just 1-2 in those games. Dayton's boasts the league's top-ranked scoring offense (37.2 ppg) and the league's top-ranked scoring defense (20.8 ppg) after five weeks. Kicker Nick Glavin leads Dayton in scoring and is second among all PFL scorers, averaging 7.2 points per game with 24 PATs and four field goals. The Toreros have turned to Mason Mills who has made the last three starts at quarterback and has completed 63.5 percent of his passes and throw four touchdowns.

Philpart caught six passes for 180 yards as Jacksonville defeated San Diego, 35-28, in PFL action, Saturday. He caught an 80-yard pass for his only touchdown in the second quarter, the eighth-longest pass play in the FCS this season. Philpart's 180 receiving yards were the seventh-most in a single FCS game this season. He became Jacksonville's career reception leader during the contest, finishing the day with 115 career receptions.

### James Vercammen, Dayton

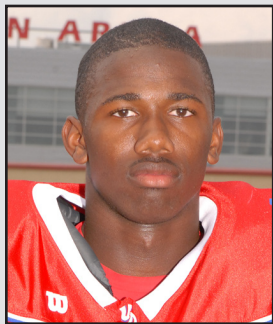
Senior, Flyer, Bloomfield Hills, Mich.

### Gary Hunter, Dayton

Freshman, Cornerback, Detroit, Mich.

Hunter returned a kickoff 82 yards for a touchdown in Dayton's 48-14 PFL victory against Valparaiso, Saturday. The return followed a Valparaiso game-tying touchdown in the first quarter, effectively turning the game's momentum and jump-starting a run of 35 consecutive Dayton points. Hunter finished the game with three kickoff returns for 123 yards (41.3 yards per return). It is the first kickoff return for a touchdown by a Dayton player since the 1998 season and the first by a freshman since the school's "modern era" that began in 1920.

# 2010 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

## NEWS AND NOTES FROM THE PFL:

**BUTLER:** Butler saw its eight-game home win streak snapped with the loss to Campbell, it was the longest in the PFL at the time. Wide receiver Zach Watkins needs six receptions to move into third-place on the Bulldogs career pass reception list. Sophomore punter Michael Wilson booted a 71-yard punt against Campbell, falling one yard shy of the program record set against Morehead State in 2007. He averaged 48.2 yards per punt on four tries.

**CAMPBELL:** Campbell won its third consecutive road contest, and fourth in program history at Butler. The Camels rushed for more than 250 yards for the second consecutive week, their 270-yard effort in Indianapolis ranking as the third-best total in program history. Following a week off, the Camels will host Drake for the first time in Week 7 after traveling to Des Moines each of the last two meetings.

**DAVIDSON:** The Wildcats return to action following their off week. Davidson will enter the week as the league's most-disciplined program with just 13 penalties for 72 yards (18.0 yards per game). Meanwhile, the Wildcats opponents have had trouble avoiding laundry patrol, with 24 penalties for 191 yards (47.8 yards per game). Davidson has hurt its own cause in its first four games, losing nine turnovers while gaining just two, a league-worst turnover margin of minus-1.75 per game

**DAYTON:** Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin has been a part of 315 of Dayton's 615 wins all-time – 26 as a player, 268 as an assistant coach and 21 as head coach. Sophomore running back Taylor Harris rushed for three touchdowns in Dayton's victory against Valparaiso, but needed just 60 net yards to score the 21 points. His longest run, a 19-yard dash, scored the Flyers first touchdown.

**DRAKE:** Drake hits the road for the fourth time in five weeks with a trip to Jacksonville. Sophomore quarterback Michael Piatkowski needs just 65 passing yards to reach the 3,000-yard career mark. He returned to action against Marist after missing the previous week due to a concussion, he completed a career-high 29 passes for 266 yards. However, it was the defense that impressed in Week 5, limiting Marist to 77 yards total offense, including minus-21 on 23 rushing attempts.

**JACKSONVILLE:** The Dolphins will host Drake with a PFL-best six-game home win streak on the line. ran its streak of 500-yard outings to three with a 522-yard performance against San Diego. The Dolphins have rolled up 1,573 yards of offense in the last three weeks – more than 66 FCS teams have amassed in their entire seasons to date. JU enters Week 6 ranked fourth in total offense (464.6 yards per game) among all FCS programs.

**MARIST:** Senior wide receiver James LaMacchia became the Red Foxes all-time receptions leader, finishing the game with 165 catches. He needs 81 receiving yards to become the program's reception yardage leader. Junior wideout Michael Rios blocked two field goals at Drake and now had five career blocked kicks. For the second consecutive year, Marist finishes the season's first four games with a 1-3 overall mark and 0-2 in PFL action. Last season, the Red Foxes won six consecutive games starting with game No. 5.

**MOREHEAD STATE:** The Eagles will take Week 6 off after a flurry of offensive in the previous four weeks. After being held to 152 yards by nationally-ranked James Madison to begin the season, the Eagles have averaged 400.75 yards per game in their last four outings. Sophomore Zach Lewis has been the primary reason for the outburst, with 1433 passing yards and 13 touchdowns in five games this season.

**SAN DIEGO:** San Diego rallied from a 35-7 deficit to get within a touchdown at Jacksonville, 35-28, before time expired. Junior running back Phil Morelli carried the ball 19 times for 103 yards and two touchdowns in the loss. Senior free safety Fred Obi returned an interception 73 yards to set up San Diego's final touchdown drive. Freshman return specialist Sam Hoekstra averaged 32.3 yards on his six kick returns.

**VALPARAISO:** Nate Goergen's 58-yard pass to Sean McCarty for a game-tying touchdown in the first quarter at Dayton was Valparaiso's longest play from scrimmage this season. Punter Greg Wood averaged 46.7 yards per punt at Dayton, including five punts of more than 50 yards. The effort moved the sophomore kicker into the top 25 among punters with an average of 41.32 yards per punt.

**PROLIFIC QUARTERBACKS:** Jacksonville quarterback Josh McGregor continues to lead all FCS signal-callers with 17 touchdown passes this season, averaging a touchdown for every 9.76 attempts he makes. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis is right behind McGregor, completing 13 touchdown passes – all in his last four outings – and is averaging a TD pass for every 14.30 attempts. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk has his own claim to a top spot, his seven touchdown carries are still the most by a FCS quarterback this season.

## TRIO NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST:

Dayton defensive end Brandon Wingeier, Drake offensive lineman Dan Blinton and Marist nose tackle Terrence Turner were among the 121 semifinalists for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy, endowed by Healthsouth, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame Announced, Sept. 30. Nominated by their schools, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, the award comes with a 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship.

## DAVIDSON'S BEHM, DAYTON'S PRINDLE NAMED TO ALL-STATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:

Davidson junior linebacker John Behm and Dayton junior offensive lineman John Prindle were each named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the two organizations announced, Wednesday. They were two of only 22 football student-athletes selected by the organization to receive the honor, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. A total of 112 players across all collegiate levels of the sport were nominated for the award by sports information directors on behalf of their teams, the most ever in the 19-year history of the program. From the nominations, a special selection committee named 22 college football players from across the country to the 2010 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a combined team representing the NCAA® Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA), Divisions II, III, and the NAIA.

**DAYTON'S VALENTINO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST:** Dayton quarterback Steve Valentino, the 2009 PFL "Offensive Player of the Year," has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List by the Sports Network. Last season was Valentino's first as quarterback after spending a year as a receiver. He led the Flyers to a 9-1 record while under center and led all PFL players in total offensive yards (281.6 yards per game) and all PFL quarterbacks in rushing yards (722). The Payton Award annual recognizes the FCS Offensive Player of the Year and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

**DAYTON'S VERCAMMEN NAMED TO BUCHANAN WATCH LIST:** Coming off a record-setting year on defense, Dayton defensive back James Vercammen was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by the Sports Network. A 2010 co-captain, Vercammen set a PFL record with 134 total tackles in 2009, 25 more than the next closest athlete. The Buchanan Award annual recognized the FCS "Defensive Player of the Year" and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

## THREE FORMER PFL ATHLETES START SEASON ON NFL

**ACTIVE ROSTERS:** Former San Diego wideout John Mathews became the third former PFL athlete to start the 2010 NFL season on an active roster when he was signed, Saturday, by Jacksonville to replace injured wide receiver Jarett Dillard. Mathews spent the preseason with the Jaguars before being waived during final cuts. He joined former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff and former San Diego quarterback Josh Johnson on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend. Cundiff was named Baltimore's starting kicker after winning the job during the preseason. Johnson is Tampa Bay's No. 2 quarterback behind starter Josh Freeman.

**DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG:** Entering the 2010 season, the Flyers have not been shutout in 377 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 8.

**MARIST NEARS 150TH ALL-TIME VICTORY:** Marist needs three victories in 2010 to record the program's 150th victory. They are among a wide-ranging number of victories by PFL members. Leading the group is Dayton – in its 103rd season – entered the year with 612 wins. At the other end is Campbell, which enters its third season of football in 2010 with four victories to its credit. (See *PFL All-Time Victories*, page 7)

**DAYTON PICKED TO WIN PFL:** Ten-time Pioneer Football League Champion Dayton was tapped as the favorite in the league's pre-season coaches' poll. The Flyers received four first-place votes and 71 points. Also receiving first-place votes were second-pick Butler (two first-place votes) and third-pick Jacksonville (four first-place votes). Only eight points separated the top three teams in the 2010 poll, listed below:

# 2010 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

**NEW SIGHTS AWAIT AT PFL SCHOOLS:** A building boom of sorts overtook the league's members over the summer with Butler and Jacksonville renovating their football facilities while Valparaiso added lights to Brown Stadium. Butler is completing renovations to its seating area and press box at the Butler Bowl, matching updates to its playing surface in 2005. Jacksonville has installed a new AstroTurf playing surface at D.B. Milne Field, replacing the natural turf that was the field's surface since 1998. One year after installing its own artificial surface, Valparaiso has added lights at Brown Stadium and will play its first-ever game under the lights when it hosts St. Joseph's (Ind.), Sept. 18.



## 2010 NCAA INFORMATION TO KNOW

### **NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP EXPANDS, CHANGES LOCATIONS:**

In 2010, 20 teams will qualify for the NCAA Division I Football Championship.

It is the first time since 1987 the NCAA Division I Football Championship has been expanded – then from 12 teams to 16 teams. In addition 10 of the 14 FCS conferences will receive automatic bids into the tournament – the Big South and Northeast Conferences gaining automatic berths. Entering 2010 there are 124 programs competing in football at the Division I FCS level.

**PFL COULD RECEIVE AT-LARGE BID IN 2010:** While the PFL did not receive a automatic qualifying spot into the 2010 championship, the league could still receive what would amount to an automatic at-large bid. Under criteria established by the championship committee, the PFL champion could receive an automatic at-large bid if it meets three criteria. First, it must win eight games against Division I opposition. Secondly, it must win two games against opponents from the 10 automatic qualifying conferences. Finally, it must finish the season ranked among the top 20 in the polls as calculated by the championship committee.

**DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE:** Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
