WEEK 7 PREVIEW

It will be an early wake-up call for **SAN DIEGO** which will face a noon, eastern time (8 a.m., PT) kickoff against **MARIST**. The Toreros have won all five previous meetings between the two teams, but all of those contests took place in San Diego, including last season's 17-10 USD win. Marist recovered from a week five shutout with 51 points in a win at Valparaiso last week, as five different players scored a touchdown. San Diego dropped a narrow 21-20 decision to league-leading Dayton last week, quarterback Mason Mills completing 27 passes for 221 yards 🏈. A matchup of 2009 PFL co-champions will occur when **DAYTON** travels to **BUTLER**. The two squads are a different ends of the standings entering the week - Dayton is unbeaten in league play while Butler posted its first PFL win at Davidson last week. Quarterback Steve Valentino continues to lead the Flyers offense, completing nine passes for 189 yards in last week's win at San Diego. Butler shuttled its two quarterbacks - Andrew Huck and Matt Kobli - in and out of last week's win, the duo combining to complete 18 passes for 170 yards 🏈. **DRAKE** will make its first-ever trip to **CAMPBELL**. Drake suffered its first PFL loss at Jacksonville last week and returns to the east coast for the second consecutive week. Campbell had Week 6 off but will enter this week's game seeking its first home victory in 2010. Drake wideout Drew Blackmon made an impression at Jacksonville, catching nine passes for 158 yards. Campbell running back Rashaun Brown carried the ball 20 times in their win at Butler two weeks ago and leads the Camels with 68 carries this season 🏈. **DAVIDSON** will make the trip across the Appalachians to meet **MOREHEAD STATE**. Davidson's lone victory this season has come on the road, a one-point win at Campbell in Week 3. Morehead State will be playing only its second home contest this season, winning its only other home outing against St. Francis (Pa.) in Week 2. Linebacker Peter Kidwell recorded the Wildcats first interception this season against Butler last week. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis remains ranked second among PFL passers, averaging 286.6 yards per game, and returns to action following the Eagles off week 🏈. **JACKSONVILLE** takes the league's best offense on the road to square off against **VALPARAISO**, who host at Brown Field for the fourth time in five weeks. The Dolphins posted 490 offensive yards last week against Drake, falling just shy of their fourth consecutive 500-yard offensive performance. Jacksonville running back Rudell Small rushed for 124 yards against Drake. Valparaiso's offensive has battled inconsistency all season and was held to a solo touchdown against Marist in a home loss last week. Crusaders quarterback Nate Goergen is averaging 116.7 yards per game in six appearances this season.

McGregor opened the game's scoring with a career-long 39-yard touchdown run, but was sacked five times and finished the game with just three net yards rushing. He later added a 33-yard touchdown pass to Rodney Sumter to close the first half's scoring.

His 36-yard field goal was the third quarter's only points and moved San Diego to within one point, setting up the fourth-quarter dramatics.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM THE PFL:

CHAMPIONSHIP RACE: Current league co-leaders Dayton and Jacksonville will not meet each other this season due to the PFL's eight-game league schedule. It is the second season the Flyers and Dolphins will not meet one another. However, next season the two teams will resume their series as their game will rotate back into the league slate.

BUTLER: The Bulldogs won for the first time at Richardson Stadium and also posted their season's first PFL victory in the process. Butler is now 9-1 in its last 10 October contests. Wideout Zach Watkins needs one reception to reach third place on Butler's career receptions list, he currently has 136 pass receptions. Quarterback Matt Kobli rushed for a pair of touchdowns, finishing with 10 carries and 62 yards.

CAMPBELL: Campbell is one of three teams (Davidson and Valparaiso the others) without a home victory this season. The Camels running game posted back-to-back 250-plus yardage outings prior to its week off, and ran the ball a school-record 56 times in their Week 5 victory against Butler. Running back Rashaun Brown leads the team with 68 carries with quarterback Daniel Polk right behind him with 64 carries.

DAVIDSON: The Wildcats hit the road for their next two games, heading west to face Morehead State and then Drake. Davidson joined Colgate as the last two teams to nab an interception in 2010, the Wildcats Peter Kidwell picking off Butler quarterback Matt Kobli. Return specialist Justin Williams needs 118 kick return yards to become the PFL's career kick return yardage leader.

DAYTON: Flyers wide receiver Justin Watkins needs 93 yards to become the program's all-time leading receiver by yardage. Dayton is one of just two FCS programs – Delaware the other – to have a member of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team (Dan Prindle) and a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy (Brandon Wingeier). The Flyers defense has had a player named the PFL's "Defensive Player of the Week" in three of the last four weeks.

DRAKE: The Bulldogs rallied from a 30-7 halftime deficit before falling 39-34 at Drake. Quarterback Mike Piatkowski passed for a pair of touchdowns and ran for another in the loss. Piatkowski became the 10th player in program history to surpass the 3,000-yard career passing mark. Drake played without the services of two-time All-PFL back Steve Platek who missed the game due to injury.

JACKSONVILLE: Jacksonville won its fourth consecutive game this season, downing Drake 39-34 for its seventh consecutive home win. It is the longest home win streak in program history and it is just the fourth time the Dolphins have pieced together a four-game win streak. Wide receiver Elliott Finkley became the ninth Jacksonville receiver to record 1,000 yards in their career.

MARIST: Marist picked up its season's first PFL victory with a 51-7 victory at Valparaiso. The 44-point margin of victory was the Red Foxes largest since a 60-0 win against Canisius during the 1998 campaign. Six different players scored touchdowns in the victory and four different running backs accounted for five touchdowns. Wideout James LaMacchia enters the weekend with 1,994 career receiving yards and needs 26 yards to become the program's all-time receiving leader.

MOREHEAD STATE: Morehead State entered its off week with a bad taste in its mouth following a 37-10 loss at Georgia State in Week 5. The Eagles were held to 280 total offensive yards after averaging 441 yards per game in its last three outings. Sophomore quarterback Zach Lewis is ranked fifth in passing yards per game (286.6 ypg) and is the FCS' top-ranked sophomore quarterback. Southern Utah's Brad Sorensen is the second-ranked sophomore quarterback, ranked 10th overall (267.33 ypg).

SAN DIEGO: San Diego makes its first trip to Marist seeking its season's first road victory. The Toreros defense has picked off seven passes this season, second most in the PFL. San Diego's special teams unit also is doing a good job on kickoff coverage, ranking second in net kickoff average (41.4 net yards per kick) and tied for the league lead in kickoff average (63.5 yards per kick).

VALPARAISO: The Crusaders offense posted a season-best 358 yards against Marist last week. Quarterback Nate Goergen completed 25 passes for 205 yards and a touchdown in the loss, including a 13-yard touchdown pass to Antonio Lovelace.

PROLIFIC QUARTERBACKS: Jacksonville quarterback Josh McGregor continues to lead all FCS signal-callers with 18 touchdown passes this season, averaging a touchdown for every 11.16 attempts he makes. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis is seventh in touchdown passes, completing 13 touchdown passes – all in his last four outings – and is averaging a TD pass for every 14.30 attempts. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk enters the week ranked third among FCS quarterbacks in scoring with seven touchdowns, trailing Missouri State's Cody Kirby (nine) and Appalachian State's DeAndre Pressley (eight).

TRIO NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST:

Dayton defensive end Brandon Wingeier, Drake offensive lineman Dan Blinton and Marist nose tackle Terrence Turner were among the 121 semifinalists for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy, endowed by Healthsouth, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame Announced, Sept. 30. Nominated by their schools, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, the award comes with a 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship.

DAVIDSON'S BEHM, DAYTON'S PRINDLE NAMED TO ALL-STATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:

Davidson junior linebacker John Behm and Dayton junior offensive lineman John Prindle were each named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the two organizations announced, Wednesday. They were two of only 22 football student-athletes selected by the organization to receive the honor, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. A total of 112 players across all collegiate levels of the sport were nominated for the award by sports information directors on behalf of their teams, the most ever in the 19-year history of the program. From the nominations, a special selection committee named 22 college football players from across the country to the 2010 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a combined team representing the NCAA® Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA), Divisions II, III, and the NAIA.

DAYTON'S VALENTINO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST: Dayton quarterback Steve Valentino, the 2009 PFL "Offensive Player of the Year," has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List by the Sports Network. Last season was Valentino's first at quarterback after spending a year as a receiver. He led the Flyers to a 9-1 record while under center and led all PFL players in total offensive yards (281.6 yards per game) and all PFL quarterbacks in rushing yards (722). THREE FORMER PFL ATHLETES START SEASON ON NFL

ACTIVE ROSTERS: Former San Diego wideout John Mathews became the third former PFL athlete to start the 2010 NFL season on an active roster when he was signed, Saturday, by Jacksonville to replace injured wide receiver Jarett Dillard. Mathews spent the preseason with the Jaguars before being waived during final cuts. He joined former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff and former San Diego quarterback Josh Johnson on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend. Cundiff was named Baltimore's starting kicker after winning the job during the preseason. Johnson is Tampa Bay's No. 2 quarterback behind starter Josh Freeman.

Offensive Player of the Year and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

DAYTON'S VERCAMMEN NAMED TO BUCHANAN WATCH

LIST: Coming off a record-setting year on defense, Dayton defensive back James Vercammen was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by the Sports Network. A 2010 co-captain, Vercammen set a PFL record with 134 total tackles in 2009, 25 more than the next closest athlete. The Buchanan Award annual recognized the FCS "Defensive Player of the Year" and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Entering the 2010 season, the Flyers have not been shutout in 377 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 8.

MARIST NEARS 150TH ALL-TIME VICTORY: Marist needs three victories in 2010 to record the program's 150th victory. They are among a wide-ranging number of victories by PFL members. Leading the group is Dayton – in its 103rd season – entered the year

with 612 wins. At the other end is Campbell, which enters its third season of football in 2010 with four victories to its credit. (See *PFL All-Time Victories*, page 7)

DAYTON PICKED TO WIN PFL: Ten-time Pioneer Football League Champion Dayton was tapped as the favorite in the league's pre-season coaches' poll. The Flyers received four first-place votes and 71 points. Also receiving first-place votes were second-pick Butler (two first-place votes) and third-pick Jacksonville (four first-place votes). Only eight points separated the top three teams in the 2010 poll, listed below:

NEW SIGHTS AWAIT AT PFL SCHOOLS: A building boom of sorts overtook the league's members over the summer with Butler and Jacksonville renovating their football facilities while Valparaiso added lights to Brown Stadium. Butler is completing renovations to its seating area and press box at the Butler Bowl, matching updates to its playing surface in 2005. Jacksonville has installed a new AstroTurf playing surface at D.B. Milne Field, replacing the natural turf that was the field's surface since 1998. One year after installing its own artificial surface, Valparaiso has added lights at Brown Stadium and will play its first-ever game under the lights when it hosts St. Joseph's (Ind.), Sept. 18.



2010 NCAA INFORMATION TO KNOW

NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP EXPANDS, CHANGES LOCATIONS:

In 2010, 20 teams will qualify for the NCAA Division I Football Championship.

It is the first time since 1987 the NCAA Division I Football Championship has been expanded – then from 12 teams to 16 teams. In addition 10 of the 14 FCS conferences will receive automatic bids into the tournament – the Big South and Northeast Conferences gaining automatic berths. Entering 2010 there are 124 programs competing in football at the Division I FCS level.

PFL COULD RECEIVE AT-LARGE BID IN 2010: While the PFL did not receive a automatic qualifying spot into the 2010 championship, the league could still receive what would amount to an automatic at-large bid. Under criteria established by the championship committee, the PFL champion could receive an automatic at-large bid if it meets three criteria. First, it must win eight games against Division I opposition. Secondly, it must win two games against opponents from the 10 automatic qualifying conferences. Finally, it must finish the season ranked among the top 20 in the polls as calculated by the championship committee.

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
