WEEK 9 PREVIEW

The PFL's two newest members will meet for the second time when **MARIST** makes its first-ever trip to meet **CAMPBELL**. The Red Foxes downed the Camels for their first PFL victory in last season's meeting. Campbell has yet to win at Barker-Lane Stadium this season with its last three home losses coming by less than three points each. Marist will be playing its final PFL road contest this season and its lone PFL win came at Valparaiso in Week 6. Marist owns the league's third-ranked passing offense (236.9 ypg) with quarterback Tommy Reilly (199.1 ypg) manning the helm. Campbell boasts the league's second-ranked rushing attack (179.4 ypg) with three rushers among the league's top 10 📍 **DAYTON** takes its seven-game PFL win streak on the road where it will face **DAVIDSON**, which has not won a home game in 2010. The Flyers are ranked second in both total offense (382.2 ypg) and total defense (319.6 ypg) as the offensive line has allowed the fewest sacks (seven) while the defensive unit has posted the most sacks (25). Davidson has turned to freshman quarterback Jonathan Carkhuff this season and he broke a 37-year old school record with 41 completions (56 attempts) in last week's loss 📍 **JACKSONVILLE** will put its eight-game PFL win streak on the line with a trip to **MOREHEAD STATE**. The Dolphins have won the last four meetings in the series, but the Eagles won the four meetings prior to that streak. Jacksonville has been a team on a mission the last six weeks, averaging 549.7 yards per game, and it has taken over the FCS lead in scoring (43.5 ppg) and offensive yardage (506.0 ypg). Morehead State is ranked third among PFL teams in total offense (338.9 ypg). The game will feature the league's top two quarterbacks in total offense, the Dolphins' Josh McGregor leading the way with 286.2 yards per game followed by the Eagles' Zach Lewis who is averaging 275.0 yards per game 📍 **BUTLER** and **VALPARAISO** will renew the battle for the Hoosier Helmet, which has been contested since the 2006 campaign. The Bulldogs have won the Helmet in three of the four campaigns it has been available. Butler is ranked fourth in total offense, averaging 330.1 yards per game, but has been unable to translate the yardage into points as it ranks eighth in scoring with 16.4 points per game. Valparaiso reached double-digits in scoring for the third time this season with 10 points in last week's loss 📍 PFL fourth-place **SAN DIEGO** will host third-place **DRAKE** in what promises to be league's best game according to relative position in the standings. The Toreros hold the advantage in offense (318.2-297.0) but the Bulldogs own the advantage in defense (322.2-334.9). Defensively, San Diego defensive end Mario Kern leads the PFL in tackles for loss (1.94 pg) and sacks (1.31 pg) while Drake's Dain Taylor is second in tackles for loss (1.88 pg) and third in sacks (1.00 pg).

J.J. Laster, Jacksonville

J.J. Laster carried the ball 11 times for 177 yards to lead Jacksonville past Marist, 56-14, in PFL action, Saturday. His first touchdown run was the Dolphins only play of the drive as he sprinted 71 yards to put JU up 14-0. Laster added a three-yard run to close the second quarter's scoring. He averaged 16.1 yards per carry and led a Jacksonville rushing attack that amassed 433 yards. Laster is the fifth consecutive Jacksonville offensive player to week honors as the Dolphins have averaged 553.6 yards per game during that stretch.

Dewhirst tied the NCAA Division I record with a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown in Jacksonville's 56-14 PFL victory against Marist, Saturday. The interception came in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter and killed a Marist drive that had reached the 14-yard line. It is the second interception returned 100 yards in the FCS this season. He also recorded a pair of tackles and a pass breakup in the contest. It was Dewhirst's third interception this season.

Campbell, 41-23, in PFL action, Saturday. His tackle of C.J. Oates led to a fumble that Dayton recovered at the Campbell 34-yard line and set up the Flyers second score of the quarter. Vercammen's second fumble came on the Camels ensuing drive, his sack of quarterback Daniel Polk stopping the drive at the Dayton 44-yard line and setting up the Flyers third scoring drive of the frame. Vercammen finished with a PFL season-best tying 17 tackles (eight solo) and 1½ tackles for loss, including the quarterback sack.

OFFENSE: Daniel Polk (CAM), Jonathan Carkhuff (DAV), Justin Watkins (DAY), Mike Piatkowski (DRA), Zach Lewis (MOR), Mason Mills (SAN), Kevin Becker (VAL)

BUTLER: Wide receiver Zach Watkins moved into second-place on Butler's career pass reception list with five catches against Morehead State and ended the weekend with 146 career receptions. Linebacker Jordan Ridley recorded 16 tackles against Morehead State, his seventh consecutive game of double-digit tackles, and he now leads the PFL (and is seventh nationally) with 11.75 tackles per game this season. Placekicker David Lang booted a career-long 45-yard field goal against the Eagles.

CAMPBELL: Campbell led going into the fourth quarter at Dayton, but could not hold on and suffered its first road loss this season. Quarterback Daniel Polk finished with 261 total offensive yards, but did not rush for a touchdown as he threw for a career-high 187 yards. The Camels finished the game with a season-high 344 offensive yards. Defensive back Jared Hart finished the game with a team-best 11 tackles (eight solo).

DAVIDSON: Davidson quarterback Jonathan Carkhuff broke a 37-year old school record with 41 completions (56 attempts) in the loss to Drake, Saturday. His 41 completions are tied for the most in the FCS this season and his 56 attempts are fourth most among FCS quarterbacks. Wide receiver Lanny Funsten caught 10 of those passes for 102 yards.

DAYTON: Wide receiver Justin Watkins became the Flyers career receiving yardage leader, catching seven passes for a season-best 127 yards and finishing the game with 2,058 career yards. Return specialist Gary Hunter returned four kickoffs for 102 yards and he remained ranked 14th nationally in kickoff return average (29.04). The Flyers clinched their 34th winning season in the last 35 years.

DRAKE: Drake returned two interceptions for touchdowns against Davidson. Defensive end Dain Taylor returned his interception 36 yards for a second-quarter score and cornerback Mike Lahart added a 40-yard interception return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. The Bulldogs held Davidson to minus-five yards on 18 carries as Taylor also recorded a sack for the seventh straight game.

JACKSONVILLE: Jacksonville won its sixth-straight contest while also running its PFL win streak to seven games and its home win streak to eight games. The Dolphins crossed the 500-yard mark for the fifth time in its last six games. Running backs J.J. Laster (177 yards) and Rudell Small (168 yards) became the first Jacksonville tandem to rush for 100 yards in the same game since 2004. The Dolphins defense has recorded a touchdown in each of its last two outings.

MARIST: Wideout James LaMacchia is now the Red Foxes all-time leading receiver in both yardage (2,019) and receptions (148), adding the yardage mark with 66 receiving yards against Jacksonville. Free safety Rory Foley became Marist's career tackles leader, dragging down 12 Eagles to finish the game with 284 career tackles. Marist has been held below 300 yards total offense in five games this season.

MOREHEAD STATE: Kicker Rainer Duzan kicked a game-winning field goal for the second time in his career. Sophomore Zach Lewis recorded his fourth 300-yard passing game this season, completing 29 passes (47 attempts) for 307 yards and a touchdown against Butler. Linebacker Tony Bachman led the Eagles defense with 15 tackles and returned a fumble 48 yards to set up a Morehead State touchdown.

SAN DIEGO: Sophomore quarterback Mason Mills led the Toreros to their second-consecutive PFL win, completing 25 passes for a career-high 327 yards and three touchdowns. Wideout Godfrey Smith caught 10 of those passes for 151 yards and a touchdown. Kicker Stanley Shurson scored 12 of the team's points, making three of his four touchdowns, two from 34 yards and another from 36 yards.

VALPARAISO: Quarterback Eric Lemon threw his first collegiate touchdown while completing 18 passes for 194 yards. He touchdown passes went to wideout Kevin Becker, who made his first collegiate TD reception. Punter Greg Wood continued his fine display this season, booting four punts for an average of 43.5 yards against San Diego.

JACKSONVILLE ENTERS NATIONAL RANKINGS: With its current six-game win streak, Jacksonville has entered the FCS national rankings at No. 24 in The Sports Network/Fathead.com FCS College Football Poll. They are the first PFL team to be ranked in the FCS Top-25 national polls in league history.

DAVIDSON'S JUSTIN WILLIAMS ENTERS PFL RECORD BOOKS: Davidson all-purpose runner Justin Williams became the PFL's career kick-return yardage leader, Saturday. In his three-plus year career he has amassed 2,536 kick-return yards on 116 returns. He now holds both records previously held by Butler's Justin Campbell who recorded 2,512 yards on 110 returns from 2001-04.

DEWHIRST SIXTH PFL ATHLETE TO RECORD 100-YARD INT RETURN: Jacksonville's Jordan Dewhirst became the sixth PFL athlete to return an interception 100 yards for a touchdown, accomplishing the feat against Marist, Oct. 23. He is the first to do so since the 2008 season when Morehead State's David Hyland accomplished the feat against Campbell.

CHAMPIONSHIP RACE: Current league co-leaders Dayton and Jacksonville will not meet each other this season due to the PFL's eight-game league schedule. It is the second season the Flyers and Dolphins will not meet one another. However, next season the two teams will resume their series as their game will rotate back into the league slate.

PROLIFIC QUARTERBACKS: Jacksonville quarterback Josh McGregor continues to lead all FCS signal-callers with 22 touchdown passes this season, averaging a touchdown for every 11.22 attempts. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis is 13th in touchdown passes, completing 14 touchdown passes and is averaging a TD pass for every 18.64 attempts. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk enters the week ranked fourth among FCS quarterbacks in scoring with eight touchdowns.

WEEK EIGHT HONOREES BY COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS: No PFL players received national performer of the week honors from the College Football Performance Awards, which which are based on objective, scientific methodologies. Honorable mention recognition was awarded to nine players this week: Drake's Mike Piatkowski (quarterback), San Diego's Mason Mills (quarterback), J.J. Laster (running back), Jacksonville's Rudell Small (running back), San Diego's Godfrey Smith (wide receiver), Dayton's James Vercammen (linebacker), Butler's Jordan Ridley (linebacker), Morehead State's Mark Hall (linebacker) and Jordan Dewhirst (defensive back). THREE FORMER PFL ATHLETES START SEASON ON NFL

ACTIVE ROSTERS: Former San Diego wideout John Mathews became the third former PFL athlete to start the 2010 NFL season on an active roster when he was signed, Saturday, by Jacksonville to replace injured wide receiver Jarett Dillard. Mathews spent the preseason with the Jaguars before being waived during final cuts. He joined former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff and former San Diego quarterback Josh Johnson on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend. Cundiff was named Baltimore's starting kicker after winning the job during the preseason. Johnson is Tampa Bay's No. 2 quarterback behind starter Josh Freeman.

outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of In-tuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, the award comes with a 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship.

DAVIDSON'S BEHM, DAYTON'S PRINDLE NAMED TO ALL-STATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:

Davidson junior linebacker John Behm and Dayton junior offensive lineman John Prindle were each named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the two organizations announced, Wednesday. They were two of only 22 football student-athletes selected by the organization to receive the honor, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. A total of 112 players across all collegiate levels of the sport were nominated for the award by sports information directors on behalf of their teams, the most ever in the 19-year history of the program. From the nominations, a special selection committee named 22 college football players from across the country to the 2010 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a com-

bined team representing the NCAA® Football Championship Sub-division (I-AA), Divisions II, III, and the NAIA.

DAYTON'S VALENTINO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST: Dayton quarterback Steve Valentino, the 2009 PFL "Offensive Player of the Year," has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List by the Sports Network. Last season was Valentino's first at quarterback after spending a year as a receiver. He led the Flyers to a 9-1 record while under center and led all PFL players in total offensive yards (281.6 yards per game) and all PFL quarterbacks in rushing yards (722). The Payton Award annual recognizes the FCS Offensive Player of the Year and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

DAYTON'S VERCAMMEN NAMED TO BUCHANAN WATCH LIST: Coming off a record-setting year on defense, Dayton defensive back James Vercammen was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by the Sports Network. A 2010 co-captain, Vercammen set a PFL record with 134 total tackles in 2009, 25 more than the next closest athlete. The Buchanan Award annual recognized the FCS "Defensive Player of the Year" and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Entering the 2010 season, the Flyers have not been shutout in 377 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 8.

MARIST NEARS 150TH ALL-TIME VICTORY: Marist needs three victories in 2010 to record the program's 150th victory. They are

among a wide-ranging number of victories by PFL members. Leading the group is Dayton – in its 103rd season – entered the year with 612 wins. At the other end is Campbell, which enters its third season of football in 2010 with four victories to its credit. (See *PFL All-Time Victories*, page 7)

DAYTON PICKED TO WIN PFL: Ten-time Pioneer Football League Champion Dayton was tapped as the favorite in the league's pre-season coaches' poll. The Flyers received four first-place votes and 71 points. Also receiving first-place votes were second-pick Butler (two first-place votes) and third-pick Jacksonville (four first-place votes).

NEW SIGHTS AWAIT AT PFL SCHOOLS: A building boom of sorts overtook the league's members over the summer with Butler and Jacksonville renovating their football facilities while Valparaiso added lights to Brown Stadium. Butler is completing renovations to its seating area and press box at the Butler Bowl, matching updates to its playing surface in 2005. Jacksonville has installed a new AstroTurf playing surface at D.B. Milne Field, replacing the natural turf that was the field's surface since 1998. One year after installing its own artificial surface, Valparaiso has added lights at Brown Stadium and will play its first-ever game under the lights when it hosts St. Joseph's (Ind.), Sept. 18.

2010 NCAA INFORMATION TO KNOW

NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP EXPANDS, CHANGES LOCATIONS:

In 2010, 20 teams will qualify for the NCAA Division I Football Championship. It is the first time since 1987 the NCAA Division I Football Championship has been expanded – then from 12 teams to 16 teams. In addition 10 of the 14 FCS conferences will receive automatic bids into the tournament – the Big South and Northeast Conferences gaining automatic berths. Entering 2010 there are 124 programs competing in football at the Division I FCS level.

PFL COULD RECEIVE AT-LARGE BID IN 2010: While the PFL did not receive a automatic qualifying spot into the 2010 championship, the league could still receive what would amount to an automatic at-large bid. Under criteria established by the championship committee, the PFL champion could receive an automatic at-large bid if it meets three criteria. First, it must win eight games against Division I opposition. Secondly, it must win two games against opponents from the 10 automatic qualifying conferences. Finally, it must finish the season ranked among the top 20 in the polls as calculated by the championship committee.

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
