WEEK 12 PREVIEW

CAMPBELL, fresh off its narrow defeat at Jacksonville in Week 11, travels to **MOREHEAD STATE** which will be playing its second-consecutive home contest. The two squads are evenly matched statistically, Morehead State (338.5 ypg) ranked ahead of Campbell (329.2 ypg) in total offense, while the Camels (357.7 ypg) are ranked just ahead of Morehead State (381.1 ypg) in total defense. Morehead State's Zach Lewis ranks second in passing yardage among PFL quarterbacks, averaging 257.6 yards per game with 14 touchdowns. Campbell has three runners ranked among the league's top six, led by quarterback Daniel Polk who is averaging 51.1 rushing yards per game and has 11 touchdowns on the ground this season. ► **DAVIDSON** will renew an old rivalry when it visits Presbyterian in the first meeting between the two teams since 1988. The Wildcats three victories this season have all come on the road, where they are 3-2 this season. Davidson is one of the league's more disciplined squads, committing just 43 penalties for a PFL low 30.8 penalty yards per game. ► **MARIST** will travel to the nation's capital to face Georgetown in a non-conference tilt. The Red Foxes have not won in Washington, D.C. in seven previous visits. However, the last four meetings have been decided by a total of nine points with the victor winning in the final minute each time. Marist wideout James LaMacchia enters the contest with a league-high 71 receptions, covering 798 yards in 10 games.

◀ Rudell Small, Jacksonville

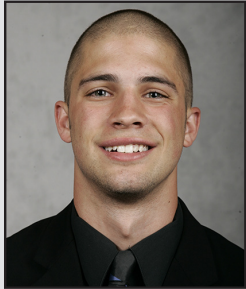
Senior, Running Back, Ocala, Fla.

Small became the Dolphins career touchdowns leader with a three-yard scamper that secured a 31-24 PFL Championship-clinching victory against Campbell, Saturday. He led the Dolphins in both carries (19) and receptions (six) and finished with 157 all-purpose yards. Small's rushed for 114 yards, his sixth 100-plus rushing effort this season.

Godfrey Smith, San Diego ▶

Senior, Wide Receiver, Oakland, Calif.

Smith caught nine passes for 184 yards and three touchdowns in San Diego's 29-15 PFL victory at Davidson, Saturday. His 184 receiving yards are the most by a PFL receiver this season and ranks 23rd among FCS receivers this season. Smith's three touchdown catches were for 15, 55 and 27 yards.



◀ Steve Valentino, Dayton

Senior, Quarterback, Solon, Ohio

Valentino's 25-yard touchdown throw on the first play of the second overtime led Dayton to a 41-34 PFL Championship-clinching victory at Marist, Saturday. He found Luke Bellman in the end zone for the go-ahead touchdown in the second extra period, his second touchdown toss on the day. Valentino finished the day with 311 offensive yards, passing for 227 yards and running for 84 yards. He completed 16-of-30 passes, including 11-of-16 for 123 yards after halftime.

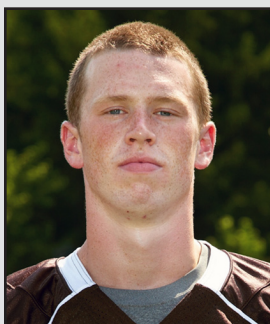


Mario Kurn, San Diego

Junior, Defensive End, Encinitas, Calif.

Kurn recorded 7½ tackles for loss in San Diego's 29-15 PFL victory at Davidson, Saturday. He was just a half tackle shy of the FCS single-game tackles for loss record. Kurn also recorded 3½ quarterback sacks as part of an 11-tackle performance which also included eight solo stops. His effort helped spur a Toreros defensive effort that limited the Wildcats to minus-10 yards rushing on 28 attempts, setting a San Diego record for fewest yards allowed.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Greg Wood, Valparaiso

Sophomore, Punter, Libertyville, Ill.

Wood boomed nine punts for 433 yards and set the PFL single-season punting average record in Valparaiso's 37-15 loss at Morehead State, Saturday. His 48.1 yards per punt average is the best single-game effort in the PFL this season. Wood placed two punts inside the 20 and saw two find the end zone for touchbacks. His first punt of the day went 71 yards from the Valparaiso 29-yard line to the Morehead State end zone. Three of his nine punts went for more than 50 yards. Wood's 43.6 yards per punt average this season breaks the 12-year old record previously held by Butler's Shawn Wood (43.19 yards per punt) in 1998.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM THE PFL:

BUTLER: Butler was limited to a touchdown in its season-ending loss at Drake. Wide receiver Zach Watkins caught eight passes for 84 yards at Drake and moved into fourth-place on Butler's receiving yards list with 1,950 yards and is second in career receptions (174) at Butler. The Bulldogs defense held eight of its 11 opponents to less than 200 passing yards this season. Linebacker Jordan Ridley led Butler with 15 tackles at Drake, including three tackles for loss, and added an interception.

CAMPBELL: Campbell faced its first ranked opponent and fared well, taking Jacksonville to the wire before falling. The Camels held the lead four times against the Dolphins, controlling the ball for 33 minutes and converting 10 of 17 third-down opportunities. Tight end Mike Stryffeler caught five passes for 59 yards and a touchdown that gave Campbell a 24-21 lead with nine minutes remaining in the game.

DAVIDSON: Wildcats quarterback Jonathan Carkhuff completed 16 passes against San Diego and currently has with 180 completions this season, placing him fifth on Davidson's single-season list. Wideout Lanny Funsten finished with 118 yards on six receptions – his third 100-yard effort in the last five games. Davidson returns to the road for its season finale and the road has been kind to the Wildcats with all three victories coming away from Richardson Stadium.

DAYTON: Dayton escaped for the second consecutive week, this time in double overtime at Marist. The Flyers clinched a share of their 11th PFL Championship in the PFL's 18th season. Cornerback Matt Pflieger's interception in the second overtime sealed the win and championship. Steve Valentino completed his career with a 19-2 record as a starting quarterback, rolling up 311 total offensive yards against Marist.

DRAKE: Drake held on for a victory against Butler, giving it a seven-win campaign for the fourth time in the last seven seasons. The Bulldogs finished third in the PFL race for the second consecutive year, with both losses this season coming to each of the league's co-champions. Free safety Mike Ratelle intercepted two passes, including one with 39 seconds remaining that sealed the victory, he also had eight tackles. Quarterback Cody Seeger made the start in the season-finale, replacing Mike Piatkowski who missed the game due to a head injury.

JACKSONVILLE: Jacksonville's come-from-behind victory against Campbell gave it a share of its second PFL Championship. It was the Dolphins first 10-win campaign. Return specialist Colby Walden returned a kickoff 82 yards for a touchdown to give Jacksonville its first lead of the contest. Defensive lineman Rolando Fines had 10 tackles and his sack forced a fumble on Campbell's final play of the game. The Dolphins extended their overall win streak to nine games and their PFL win streak to 11 games.

MARIST: Marist pushed Dayton to the limit, but fell in double overtime. The Red Foxes finished 1-5 at Tenney Stadium but the five losses came by a combined total of 27 points. Quarterback Tommy Reilly set Marist single-game records for pass completions (35), attempts (51) and yards (417). He also set the school record for passing yards in a season (2,247) with one game remaining. Free safety Rory Foley led the Marist defensive effort with 10 tackles against Dayton.

MOREHEAD STATE: Morehead State snapped a two-game losing streak with a victory against Valparaiso. The Eagles tallied 609 yards total offense, its greatest output since a 679-yard effort against Austin Peay in 2005. Quarterback Zach Lewis recorded his fifth 300-yard performance this season, finishing with 317 passing yards against Valparaiso. Running back Desmond Cox recorded a season-best 124 rushing yards. The Eagles defense harassed the Crusaders for 12 tackles for loss, seven sacks, three fumbles forced and nine pass breakups.

SAN DIEGO: The Torero defense set a single-game record by holding Davidson to minus-10 yards on 28 attempts. San Diego recorded eight sacks in the game, led by defensive end Mario Kurn who had 11 tackles, 7½ tackles for loss and 3½ sacks to earn national recognition from both College Sporting News and The Sports Network. Wideout Godfrey Smith caught nine passes for 184 yards and three touchdowns, finishing the season with 1,024 receiving yards.

VALPARAISO: Punter Greg Wood set the PFL single-season record for punting average (43.6 yards per punt), booming nine punts for 433 yards at Morehead State, including a career-best 71-yard punt. Defensive back Eli Crawford recorded his 12th career interception and returned it 45 yards for a touchdown.

DAYTON JOINS JACKSONVILLE IN NATIONAL POLLS: Dayton entered both the FCS Coaches and Sports Network/Fathead.com Polls, joining Jacksonville which had been ranked in both polls the past two weeks. It is the first time in PFL history two teams have been ranked among the top 25 in both polls.

DAYTON IN THE RANKINGS: Dayton entered the FCS Coaches Poll at No. 25 and the Sports Network/Fathead.com Poll at No. 24. The Flyers has been receiving votes in both polls throughout the season, but broke through after clinching a share of their 11th PFL title, Saturday, in a double-overtime thriller at Marist. It is the third season the Flyers have received national poll recognition, also being ranked in The Sports Network Poll during both 1996 and 1997 campaigns.

JACKSONVILLE IN THE RANKINGS: Jacksonville continued its climb up both polls. The Dolphins entered their fourth week in the Sports Network/Fathead.com Poll, moving up two spots to No. 20. Jacksonville entered its third week in the FCS Coaches Poll and moved up three spots to No. 21. The Dolphins won a share of the 2010 championship following its come-from-behind victory against Campbell, Saturday. It was Jacksonville's second PFL crown, the first won in 2008.

KURN EARNS NATIONAL HONORS: San Diego's Mario Kurn earned The Sports Network Co-Defensive Player of the Week and was named to the College Sporting News All-Stars list, Nov. 15, after his impressive performance against Marist, Nov. 13. Kurn recorded 7½ tackles for loss and was just a half tackle shy of the FCS single-game tackles for loss record. Kurn also recorded 3½ quarterback sacks as part of an 11-tackle performance which also included eight solo stops.

LANGHORST, TAYLOR RECEIVE NATIONAL HONORS: Dayton's Devon Langhorst earned The Sports Network Co-Defensive Player of the Week and was named to the College Sporting News All-Stars list, Nov. 8, after his impressive performance against Drake, Nov. 6. He recorded the most sacks in a single-game this season, finishing with 4.5 sacks – giving him credit for a part in each of the Flyers' six sacks on the day. Langhorst finished the day with 11 total tackles and five tackles for loss. Drake's Dain Taylor also was named to the College Sporting News All-Stars list after recording a safety, blocked kick, 3.5 sacks, four tackles for loss and 12 total tackles against Dayton in the same contest.

DEWHIRST SIXTH PFL ATHLETE TO RECORD 100-YARD INT RETURN: Jacksonville's Jordan Dewhirst became the sixth PFL athlete to return an interception 100 yards for a touchdown, accomplishing the feat against Marist, Oct. 23. He is the first to do so since the 2008 season when Morehead State's David Hyland accomplished the feat against Campbell.

SPEAKING OF PICK-SIXES: Nine PFL defenders have returned an interception for a touchdown this season. However, the nine come from just three schools – three from Jacksonville for four touchdowns, one touchdown each by five Drake defenders and one touchdown by a San Diego defender. Jacksonville's Jordan DeWhirst has scored twice on interceptions this campaign. Here is the current list of pick-sixes (in chronological order) this season:

CUNDIFF NAMED TO MIDSEASON ALL-PRO LIST: Former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff – the first PFL player to be named All-PFL four times – was named to Peter King's NFL Midseason All-Pro squad. King noted Cundiff's field goal accuracy and his kickoff prowess in the honor. Through Week 9 of the NFL campaign, Cundiff has converted 14-of-17 field goals and all 19 PATs this season. He also has 22 touchbacks on 39 kickoffs this season, averaging 72.5 yards per kickoff.

THREE FORMER PFL ATHLETES START SEASON ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS: Former San Diego wideout John Mathews became the third former PFL athlete to start the 2010 NFL season on an active roster when he was signed, Saturday, by Jacksonville to replace injured wide receiver Jarett Dillard. Mathews spent the preseason with the Jaguars before being waived during final cuts. He joined former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff and former San Diego quarterback Josh Johnson on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend. Cundiff was named Baltimore's starting kicker after winning the job during the preseason. Johnson is Tampa Bay's No. 2 quarterback behind starter Josh Freeman.

WEEK TEN HONOREES BY COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

Three PFL players earned Performer of the Week honors as selected by the College Football Performance Awards, which are based on objective, scientific methodologies. McGregor also was named the group's "Quarterback of the Week." Jacksonville's Colby Walden was named the National Kick Returner of the Week. San Diego's Mario Kurn (defensive lineman) and Godfrey Smith (wide receiver) earned national honors at their positions. Honorable mention recognition was awarded to eight players this week: Butler's Jordan Ridley (linebacker), Davidson's Ellis Martin (defensive lineman), Drake Mike Ratelle (linebacker) and Ty Moorehead (linebacker), Morehead State's Rainer Duzan (kicker), Jerome Raymond (defensive lineman) and Keaton May (linebacker).

DAVIDSON'S JUSTIN WILLIAMS ENTERS PFL RECORD BOOKS:

Davidson all-purpose runner Justin Williams became the PFL's career kick-return yardage leader, Saturday. In his three-plus year career he has amassed 2,741 kick-return yards on 127 returns. He now holds both records previously held by Butler's Justin Campbell who recorded 2,512 yards on 110 returns from 2001-04.

DAYTON-JACKSONVILLE NOT ON 2010 PFL SLATE: Current league co-leaders Dayton and Jacksonville will not meet each other this season due to the PFL's eight-game league schedule. It is the second season the Flyers and Dolphins will not meet one another. However, next season the two teams will resume their series as their game will rotate back into the league slate.

TRIO NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST:

Dayton defensive end Brandon Wingeier, Drake offensive lineman Dan Blinton and Marist nose tackle Terrence Turner were among the 121 semifinalists for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy, endowed by Healthsouth, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame Announced, Sept. 30. Nominated by their schools, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

DAVIDSON'S BEHM, DAYTON'S PRINDLE NAMED TO ALL-STATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:

Davidson junior linebacker John Behm and Dayton junior offensive lineman John Prindle were each named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the two organizations announced, Wednesday. They were two of only 22 football student-athletes selected by the organization to receive the honor, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. A total of 112 players across all collegiate levels of the sport were nominated for the award by sports information directors on behalf of their teams, the most ever in the 19-year history of the program. From the nominations, a special selection committee named 22 college football players from across the country to the 2010 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a com-



2010 NCAA INFORMATION TO KNOW

NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP EXPANDS, CHANGES LOCATIONS: In 2010, 20 teams will qualify for the NCAA Division I Football Championship.

It is the first time since 1987 the NCAA Division I Football Championship has been expanded – then from 12 teams to 16 teams. In addition 10 of the 14 FCS conferences will receive automatic bids into the tournament – the Big South and Northeast Conferences gaining automatic berths. Entering 2010 there are 124 programs competing in football at the Division I FCS level.

PFL COULD RECEIVE AT-LARGE BID IN 2010: While the PFL did not receive a automatic qualifying spot into the 2010 championship, the league could still receive what would amount to an automatic at-large bid. Under criteria established by the championship committee, the PFL champion could receive an automatic at-large bid if it meets three criteria. First, it must win eight games against Division I opposition. Secondly, it must win two games against opponents from the 10 automatic qualifying conferences. Finally, it must finish the season ranked among the top 20 in the polls as calculated by the championship committee.

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
