WEEK 4 PREVIEW

Two teams whose passing games have outshone their running games will square off when **MOREHEAD STATE** visits **MARIST** to kickoff Week 4 action. The Eagles are ranked ninth in rushing offense (41.0 ypg) but lead the PFL in passing offense (297.3 ypg) behind quarterback Zach Lewis' consecutive four-touchdown outings. The Red Foxes enter the game with the league's 10th ranked rushing office (32.5 ypg) but are third in passing offense (257.0 ypg) with quarterback Tommy Reilly leading the offense (226.0 ypg). 🏈 **JACKSONVILLE** closed out the 2009 campaign with three straight PFL victories, a streak they will take into **DAVIDSON**, which won its 2010 PFL opener in Week 3 at Campbell. The Dolphins will take the league's top-ranked offense (426.7 ypg) on the road where it will square off against a Wild-cats defense that leads the league by limiting opponents to 290.7 yards per game. 🏈 **DRAKE** travels to **VALPARAISO** for the PFL opener for both teams. Both teams enter the game seeking their offensive voice, the Bulldogs are eighth in total offense (251.0 ypg) while Valparaiso is tenth (198.0 ypg). It will be the third consecutive road game for Drake after opening the season at home. 🏈 **BUTLER** begins defense of its co-championship with a trip to **SAN DIEGO**. The Bulldogs offense and defense are both ranked second after three weeks, the offense amassing 422.7 yards per game while the defense has limited opponents to 304.7 yards per game. The Toreros are still seeking their season's first victory and are 0-3 to start a season for the first time since 1980. 🏈 **CAMPBELL** wraps up a three-game homestand when it hosts Georgia State, the newest member of the FCS. Campbell's rushing attack is ranked fourth (139.3 ypg) among PFL members behind the efforts of running back Rashaun Brown and quarterback Daniel Polk who are ranked fifth and eighth among the league's runners. 🏈 **DAYTON** also steps out of conference play when it hosts Central State in the middle game of a three-game homestand. The Flyers feature the league's top scoring attack, averaging 31 points per game. Quarterback Steve Valentino leads the league in total offense, averaging 312.0 yards per game, nearly 20 yards per game more than No. 2 Zach Lewis.

Mantuo carried the ball 34 times but it was his final carry – a three-yard touchdown run – that helped push Davidson past Campbell, 28-27, in PFL action, Saturday. His career-high 181 yards included 23 yards on the Wildcats final drive. Mantuo was not tackled for a loss on any of his carries. His 34 carries are the second most in the FCS this season and his net yardage was seventh most.

Brandon Wingeier, Dayton

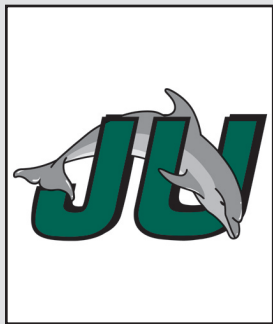
Senior, Defensive End, Newark, Ohio

He finished the game with five tackles, but 2½ were for a loss (11 yards), including 1½ quarterback sacks (seven yards). However, he forced a fumble from quarterback Zach Lewis at the Morehead State 11-yard line to set up Dayton's second touchdown drive.
