WEEK 1 PREVIEW

Four teams open the 2012 season, Thursday, followed by six contests – including two against nationally-ranked opposition, Saturday • **BUTLER** will be the lone PFL team on the road for Thursday's opening-night action when it travels to Western Illinois. The young Bulldogs – only seven seniors dot their roster – will be looking to extend a five-game win streak in home openers under head coach Jeff Voris • When **CAMPBELL** hosts Shorter Thursday night it will mark a pair of firsts for the fifth-year program. It will be the Fighting Camels first Thursday game and its first home night game after lights were installed as part of stadium renovations this summer. Campbell boasted the league's top rushing attack last season but lost its two top running backs to graduation • **MOREHEAD STATE** senior quarterback Zach Lewis, the league's top passer in 2011, returns to head the league's top passing attack in its season opener against Southern Virginia. The Eagles own two previous wins against the Knights, including a 49-6 victory – coincidentally – on August 30, 2008 • **VALPARAISO** begins the 2012 campaign at home when it hosts St. Joseph's (Ind.). The Crusaders will look for their first win in the series since 2001 under the lights for just the third time in Brown Stadium history • **DAYTON** will face a stern opening week test when it travels to Illinois State, a team that just missed the FCS Championships last season. Flyers quarterback Will Bardo gained on-the-job training last season, playing all 11 games as a freshman. His sophomore campaign will begin against a Redbirds defense that held opponents below 200 passing yards per game. • **DRAKE** will put the league's longest win streak at risk when it hosts Grand View, Saturday. Senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski returns to lead the Bulldogs after garnering PFL Offensive Player of the Year honors last season. Drake will meet a Grand View team ranked No. 15 in the NAIA and that opened the season with a victory last weekend • **MARIST** begins its campaign with a trip to the east where it will meet Bryant in the second-ever meeting between the two teams. The Red Foxes defense returns six starters from last season, including senior defensive lineman Terrence Fede who led the team with 16 tackles for loss • **JACKSONVILLE** will face the toughest task of the league's 10 teams when it travels northward to meet FCS No. 3 Georgia Southern. The Dolphins offense will have a new look in 2012 with nine offensive starters lost to graduation but the defense, which ranked second among PFL pass defenses, returns eight starters • **DAVIDSON**'s revamped offense showed promise in 2011, finishing the season ranked second in total passing yards. However, it did not translate into wins and losses – something they hope to change in 2012, starting with a home opener against Georgetown. Junior quarterback Jonathan Carkhuff returns after launching a PFL record 556 pass attempts last season, connecting on a PFL record 348 completions • **SAN DIEGO** wraps up the PFL's opening weekend with a trip up the coast to Cal Poly. The Toreros, the PFL preseason favorite, will meet a Mustang team picked fifth in a now 13-team Big West Conference race. The Toreros story last season was defined by sacks – the defense recorded 39 sacks (2nd most in the PFL) while the offensive line surrendered a league-low 13 sacks.

2012 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

PFL BEGINS 20TH CAMPAIGN | The Pioneer Football League begins its 20th season of play when the league's members open the 2012 campaign this weekend. The opening weekend features four teams beginning play with a Thursday contest following by the league's remaining six teams which will open action Saturday. Dayton and Jacksonville will have the toughest tasks in Week 1, each opening on the road against FCS Top 25 competition.

STARTING THE SEASON WITH A STREAK | Drake (4 games), San Diego (3 games) and Davidson (2 games) will open 2012 carrying over win streaks from the 2011 campaign. San Diego is the lone team of the trio to put its streak at risk on the road, beginning 2012 at Cal Poly. Opening at home, Drake will host Grand View while Davidson greets Georgetown in Saturday affairs.

TWO PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2011 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Campbell's Braden Smith and Drake's Zach Bosch were among 117 nominees for the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®, which recognizes the selfless contributions to volunteerism and community service made by college football student-athletes across the nation. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a combined team representing the NCAA® Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA), Divisions II, III, and the NAIA.

BUCHANAN WATCH LIST INCLUDES SAN DIEGO'S OLIARO | San Diego junior defensive end **Blake Oliaro**, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, has been named to the 2012 Buck Buchanan Award Watch list, presented by The Sports Network. Oliaro finished the season ranked fourth among FCS athletes with 1.36 sacks per game (15 sacks in 11 games) and was ranked 10th nationally with 1.77 tackles for loss per game (19.5 total). The Buchanan Award annual recognized the FCS "Defensive Player of the Year" and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

2011 PFL PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | All four PFL Players of the Year return for the 2012 campaign. Drake quarterback **Mike Piatkowski** returns after earning PFL Offensive Player of the Year honors and leading the league in pass efficiency (151.4). San Diego defensive lineman **Blake Oliaro**, the league's Defensive Player of the Year, led the league in sacks (15.0) last season as a sophomore. San Diego wide receiver **Brandon White** was the PFL's Freshman Offensive Player of the Year after posting 561 receiving yards last season. Drake linebacker **Travis Merritt** also returns after earning PFL Freshman Defensive Player of the Year honors following a 66-tackle campaign last season.

PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM | The Pioneer Football League's coaches preseason All-PFL team selected 29 student-athletes for 30 positions. San Diego had six selections, including junior Kenny James who earned the nod at both running back and return specialist. Drake saw five players receive preseason recognition.

ALL-PFL HONOREES RETURN | Nineteen members of the 2011 All-PFL squads return to their teams in 2012, including 12 first-team selections and seven second-team honorees. San Diego and Drake, the 2011 PFL co-champions, each return four All-PFL selections from last season. All 10 PFL teams had at least one player selected to the preseason squad.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | San Diego and Drake, the defending Pioneer Football League co-champions, were picked to finish first and second, respectively, in the league's preseason coaches' poll. San Diego (79 points) received eight of a possible nine first-place votes. Drake received 71 points and one first-place vote. Jacksonville was picked to finish third with 65 points. Dayton picked up the remaining first-place vote and 56 total points to finish fourth in the preseason poll. Campbell rounded out the poll's top half with 45 points for fifth place. Marist (6th, 42 points), Butler (7th, 34), Morehead State (8th, 27), Davidson (9th, 20) and Valparaiso (10th, 11) rounded out the PFL Preseason Poll.

PFL RECEIVES FCS CHAMPIONSHIP AUTOMATIC BID IN 2013

PFL WILL BECOME ONE OF 11 AUTOMATIC QUALIFIERS

Beginning in 2013, the Pioneer Football League will gain access to the Division I Football Championship through an automatic bid as a result of the NCAA Board of Directors approving a budget that will allow expansion of the tournament to 24 teams that season.

The championship's 2013 expansion will be the second this decade. The bracket grew from 16 to 20 teams in 2010, its first expansion since 1978.

The PFL will join 10 conferences currently awarded an automatic bid. They will be placed into the 24-team bracket by the NCAA Football Championship selection committee along with 13 at-large qualifiers. The committee will select its eight national seeds which will receive first-round byes. The remaining 16 teams will then be placed in the bracket with an emphasis on geographical proximity.

"Having the Pioneer Football League champion automatically qualify for the FCS Playoffs is hugely important to our teams," said PFL commissioner Patty Viverito. "This opportunity seemed a distant hope just one year ago, but will become a reality when the FCS bracket expands to 24 teams in 2013."

The Pioneer Football League, which began with four members upon its inception in 1991, will expand to 12 members in 2013. It is the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference.

The PFL is a truly national conference with members on each coast and throughout the nation's heartland. The league still retains four of its charter members – Butler University, the University of Dayton, Drake University and Valparaiso University, plus the University of San Diego (joining in 1992) – which were joined in 2001 by Davidson College, Jacksonville University and Morehead State University. Campbell University joined the PFL in 2008, its first season of intercollegiate football. Marist College, which joined prior to the 2009 season, further extended the league's footprint into the northeast. The league will add Mercer University and Stetson University in 2013, improving the league's representation in the southeast.
