Notably: Pioneer Football League champion San Diego will face Big Sky Conference member Montana in the first round of the 2014 NCAA Division I Football Championship, the NCAA Division I Football Championship committee announced Sunday. San Diego will play a 4 p.m. (ET), Saturday contest in Missoula, Montana.

San Diego (9-2) claimed the PFL's championship for the third time in the last four seasons, posting a 7-1 mark in league action. It will be the Toreros first trip to the Division I Football Championship and second-ever by a PFL member after the league received an automatic bid to the now 24-team tournament beginning with the 2013 championship.


Torero's running back Jonah Hodges is one of the best ground-gainers in the FCS this season, ranking second in all-purpose yardage (159.7 ypg) and 19th in rushing yardage (108.5 ypg). San Diego owns the FCS' eighth-ranked red-zone offense, converting on 90.2 percent of its opportunities. Kicker David Last has contributed a perfect 12-of-12 field-goal conversion rate to that effort, the only FCS kicker without a miss this season.

Montana (8-4) finished tied for second in the Big Sky Conference and received an at-large bid. The Grizzlies are one of three Big Sky teams in the championship, joining No. 4 national seed Eastern Washington and Montana State. It will be Montana's 23rd appearance in the championship, which they have won twice (1995 and 2001).

The Grizzlies own the nation's best turnover margin, a +1.33 rate that includes 23 turnovers gained while committing only 7 turnovers. Zack Wagenmann leads that defensive effort with 5 fumbles forced, but also has 18.5 tackles for loss and 13.5 sacks this season. He ranks fifth among FCS defenders in both fumbles forced (0.42) and sacks (1.13 per game).

Lehman threw two touchdowns and led Valparaiso to a 27-13 PFL victory against Davidson, Saturday. He completed 26-of-33 passes for a season-best 78.8 completion percentage and 284 yards. Lehman's 20-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Cassara gave Valparaiso a 17-7 lead it would not relinquish. He added an 8-yard pass in the fourth quarter to extend the Crusaders lead.

Acree recorded 3½ tackles for loss, including two sacks, in Drake's 27-15 PFL victory at Stetson, Saturday. He had six tackles (four solo) in the contest, with the bulk of those coming behind the line of scrimmage. Acree finished with two of the three sacks on Stetson quarterback Ryan Tentler and also stopped running back Cole Mazza for a loss twice and for no gain once.

Kyle Pignatiello, Dayton

Senior | Punter | Tipp City, Ohio

Pignatiello averaged 44.3 yards on six punts to help Dayton secure a 19-14 PFL victory against Campbell, Saturday. On Dayton's next to last possession, ahead by just five points and backed up on its 15-yard line, he boomed a career-best 74-yard punt to flip the field and pin Campbell deep in its own end. It was one of four punts Pignatiello placed inside the opponent's 20-yard line and one of four that went for more than 40 yards.

SAN DIEGO IN THE DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

SAN DIEGO RETURNS TO POSTSEASON | San Diego returns to the postseason for the third time in program history. The Toreros previous NCAA postseason experience came in 1973 when it played in the Division III Championship and fell to eventual national champion Wittenberg in that four-team championship, 21-14. Since then, San Diego played in and won the 2005 PFL Championship game, 47-40, against Morehead State. The next year they won the 2006 Gridiron Classic – a postseason event between the Northeast Conference and Pioneer Football League champions – by a 27-7 count against Monmouth.

THE ROAD TO FRISCO | This is the second consecutive year the PFL regular-season champion has received an automatic bid into the Division I Football Championship. Last season, the championship expanded to 24 teams with 11 automatic bids and 13 at-large berths. Butler was the first PFL team to earn a Division I Football Championship berth, hosting and falling to Tennessee State, 31-0, in the first round.

THREE IN FOUR | With its 2014 crown in hand, San Diego has won three of the last four PFL championships. It is the Toreros sixth PFL title all-time, tied for second-most in PFL history with Drake and behind Dayton's 11 PFL titles. All six of San Diego's titles have been won since the 2005 season, an impressive six titles in 10 seasons.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL AWARDS WEEK STARTS MONDAY | The Pioneer Football League will begin announcing its awards Monday. The league's major award winners will be announced that day followed by the 2nd All-PFL Teams, Tuesday. The Academic All-PFL team and the league's Scholar-Athlete of the Year will round out the awards, Wednesday.

SAN DIEGO CLAIMS 2014 PFL TITLE | San Diego scored a touchdown on the final play of the game to defeat Valparaiso, 32-27, Saturday and win the 2014 Pioneer Football League Championship and the league's automatic qualifying spot in the 2015 NCAA Division I Football Championship. It is San Diego's third PFL title in four years and sixth title all-time.

JACKSONVILLE WITHDRAWS FROM 2014 PFL RACE | The Pioneer Football League and Jacksonville University jointly announced the Jacksonville football team will not be eligible for the 2014 conference championship, Nov. 14. Jacksonville voluntarily withdrew from championship contention and postseason play for 2014 as a result of its internal review of compliance matters regarding the PFL's financial aid rules. The process is ongoing and final resolution of the matter is not expected before Spring 2015.

THREE PFL ALUMNI ON NFL ROSTERS | Marist alumnus **Terrence Fede**, the 2013 PFL Defensive Player of the Year, was named to the Miami Dolphins' active 53-man roster. Fede, a 7th round pick in the 2014 NFL Draft, recorded his first tackle as a professional against Oakland, Sept. 29. Drake alumnus and 12-year NFL veteran **Billy Cundiff** is in his second year as a member of the Cleveland Browns. San Diego alumnus **Josh Johnson** is in his seventh NFL campaign, joining the San Francisco 49ers and former San Diego head coach Jim Harbaugh in 2014.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton senior running back **Donald Payne** has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, for the FCS' top defensive player. Payne was named the national freshman of the week after Stetson's return to football in 2013 and hasn't looked back since then, filling the stats sheet in incredible ways at the Pioneer Football League school. He has 150 tackles in 10 games after a recent four-game run in which he has collected over 20 tackles three times.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton senior running back **Connor Kacsor** has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, for the FCS' top offensive player. Kacsor currently leads the PFL and is second in FCS football in rushing yards per game (148.0) His 301 yards against Georgetown in the season opener is the best in Division I this season, and he is the only FCS player with three rushing performances of 200 yards or more this season.

BUTLER'S SCHRADER NAMED TO RICE AWARD WATCH LIST | Butler freshman running back **Sam Schrader** has been named to the Jerry Rice Award Watch List, for the FCS' top freshman player. Schrader, of Mishawaka, Indiana, is the PFL's top freshman running back, with 526 yards (75.1 ypg) and eight touchdowns in seven conference games. He ranks sixth among FCS freshmen in rushing (60.4 ypg) and seventh in scoring (6.6 ppg). Schrader rushed for 193 yards against Stetson, Oct. 4, and had a four touchdown performance against Morehead State, Nov. 1.

2014 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

THIRTEEN NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAMS | Thirteen Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named to the 2014 Capital One Academic All-District® teams as selected by the College Sports Information Directors Association, Thursday. Seven of the league's 11 members had one student-athlete recognized on the teams. A complete list of the PFL student-athletes selected is available on the PFL website.

BELL EARNS NATIONAL WEEKLY HONOR | Jacksonville junior quarterback Kade Bell was named National Co-Offensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network after his Week 11 performance. He threw six touchdown passes in a PFL win at Davidson, completing 20-of-24 passes with no interceptions for 417 yards, giving him a 313.38 pass efficiency rating on the day – third best in the FCS this season. It is the second consecutive week the PFL has had an athlete named to The Sports Network honors.

BUTLER'S SCHRADER NAMED NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK | Butler running back **Sam Schrader** was named The Sports Network's Freshman of the Week, Nov. 3, for his Week 10 performance against Morehead State. He finished the day with 13 carries for 162 yards and four touchdowns, but it was his second-quarter performance that stood out. Schrader had four carries for 82 yards but it was his three touchdowns that helped catapult Butler to a 35-23 lead en route to the 62-52 PFL win.

PAYNE SETS PFL TACKLE RECORD | Stetson safety **Donald Payne** broke a 12-year old PFL record with 27 tackles at Campbell in Week 10. He broke the record previously held by San Diego's Andy Guzinski, who recorded 26 tackles against Dayton during the 2002 season. Payne's outing came just two weeks after he recorded 21 tackles in a Week 8 contest against Jacksonville, which was the first 20-tackle outing in over two years. He is the only PFL tackler with two 20-tackle performances since 2002.

PAYNE NAMED NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK | Stetson safety Donald Payne also was named The Sports Network's Co-Defensive Player of the Week, Nov. 3. Payne's PFL record 27 tackles meant he had a hand in stopping more than one-third of Campbell's 79 offensive plays in the contest.

KACSOR NOTCHES 3RD 200-YARD OUTING | For the third time in 2014, Dayton running back **Connor Kacsor** ran for more than 200 yards, recording 232 yards against Morehead State in Week 8 action. There have been 19 200-yard performances in the FCS this season and Kacsor is the only back with three such performances and the only runner with a 300-yard effort this season.

DOLPHINS' BELL RECORDS LEAGUE'S FIRST 6 TD OUTING | Jacksonville quarterback **Kade Bell** became the first PFL quarterback to throw six touchdowns in a game, turning the trick at Morehead State in Week 7. He also had a five touchdown performance in Week 5 at Butler. He joins Eastern Washington's Vernon Adams as the only quarterbacks to compose a pair of four-plus touchdown performances this season.

SAN DIEGO'S HODGES JOINS 200-YARD CLUB | San Diego running back **Jonah Hodges** joined the PFL's 200-yard rushing club with a 273-yard effort against Stetson in Week 7. He posted 17 carries and had two touchdowns in the Toreros win. It was the third 200-yard rushing performance by a PFL running back this season and second best in the FCS this season, behind Dayton running back Connor Kacsor's 301-yard performance in Week 2.

FIVE-OT THRILLER BETWEEN DAVIDSON-DAYTON | Dayton and Davidson got off to a slow start but raced headlong into and through overtime before Dayton escaped with a 54-48 victory in five overtimes, Oct. 4. The Flyers led 13-7 after three full quarters but both offenses exploded in the fourth quarter, combining for 34 points en route to a 27-27 tie. The Flyers and Wildcats scored 48 points in extra time, before Dayton's **Connor Kacsor** scored in the fifth overtime and UD's Tom Fanning intercepted a pass on Davidson's ensuing drive. It was the longest game in the FCS since Sept. 10, 2011 when Towson and Coastal Carolina went five overtimes. It also broke the PFL record of three overtimes set by Campbell and Davidson, Oct. 29, 2011.

KACSOR STRIKES AGAIN | Earlier this season, Dayton running back **Connor Kacsor** posted what remains a FCS best 301 yards in a Week 2 contest against Georgetown. He backed that up in Week 6 with a 213-yard performance against Davidson – the ninth best rushing performance this season. He joins St. Francis (Pa.)'s Khairi Dickson as the only runners to post two Top 10 totals this season. Kacsor also ran the ball 47 times in the win against Davidson, the only rusher to post more than 40 runs in the FCS this season.

DAVIDSON'S CASEY NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Davidson linebacker **Dan Casey** was one of four FCS student-athletes and 22 across all levels of

college football named to the 2014 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, Sept. 23. One of the most prestigious off-the-field-honors in college football, the award pays tribute to a select group of student-athletes who have worked to positively impact the lives of others.

DAYTON SCORING STREAK HITS 431 | Dayton continues one of the more remarkable streaks in college football – a NCAA record 431 consecutive games without suffering a shutout. The last team to blank Dayton was Marshall by a 9-0 score on Oct. 16, 1976. San Diego owns the PFL's second longest such streak at 163 games.

THREE PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO CAMPBELL LIST | Jacksonville quarterback **Kade Bell** became the second PFL quarterback to throw five Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named among 167 candidates for the 2014 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments®. Campbell's Adam Lutz, Dayton's Will Bardo and San Diego Troy McClelland were each named to the semifinalist list, Sept. 25.

PFL TEAMS PITCH CLEAN SLATE IN WEEK 4 | Pioneer Football League members went unbeaten in six nonconference tilts during Week 4 action. That winning six pack included two victories against Ivy League squads (Princeton and Penn) and one against a Northeast Conference foe (Robert Morris).

VALPARAISO ENDS 9-GAME SLIDE | Valparaiso ended a nine-game losing streak with a victory at Division II William Jewell, Sept. 20. It also was the Crusaders first nonconference victory since Sept. 12, 2009 – a 15-game stretch between nonconference victories.

DAVIDSON'S MORRIS RUNS FOR 208 | Davidson wide receiver **William Morris** posted a 16-reception, 208-yard performance at VMI, Sept. 13. The 16 receptions are the most in the FCS this season while his 208 receiving yards were third most. It is the 21st 200-yard receiving performance in the PFL since 2002 and first this season.

DAYTON'S KACSOR SECOND TO TOP 300 RUSHING YARDS | Dayton running back **Connor Kacsor** became the second PFL runner to record 300 rushing yards in a game, piling up an FCS-best 301 yards against Georgetown, Sept. 6, in Welcome Stadium. It was the 55th 300-yard performance in FCS history and was a Dayton program record. The senior from Leo, Indiana, had just 14 yards in the first quarter but ran for 287 yards, including a 43-yard touchdown, in the game's final 45 minutes.

EAGLES' GAHAFAER THROWS FIRST 5 TD OUTING | Morehead State quarterback Austin Gahafer put together the PFL's first five-touchdown performance of 2014, in a 49-36 win against NAIA foe Pikeville. The PFL saw five five-touchdown efforts in 2013, but none occurred prior to Week 7 (Oct. 12).

NEW SIGNAL CALLERS ABOUND | New quarterbacks will be at the helm of six of the PFL's 11 programs in 2014. Butler, Campbell, Davidson, Marist, San Diego and Valparaiso will each be under new leadership on the field. Dayton and Drake each return a senior under center with **Will Bardo** and **Andy Rice**, respectively. Morehead State (**Austin Gahafer**) and Stetson (**Ryan Tentler**) each used a freshman quarterback in 2013 that returns for their sophomore campaigns in 2014. Jacksonville junior **Kade Bell** rounds out the list of returning quarterbacks.

WELCOME NEW HEAD COACHES | Two new faces will join the PFL's head coaching fraternity in 2014 with **Rick Fox** taking over duties at Drake while **Dave Cecchini** grabs the reins at Valparaiso. Fox was as an assistant coach for six seasons under former head coach Chris Creighton, who took the head coaching position at Eastern Michigan.

Cecchini became Valparaiso's 17th head coach after four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Lehigh.

PFL TIEBREAKER MODIFIED | The PFL automatic qualifier tie-breaker was modified during the league's August presidents council meeting. In 2014, the league will no longer use computer rankings to determine its automatic qualifier. Instead, the league will use a "Strength of Victory" and "Strength of Schedule" – both based on conference games only – to help determine its representative in the FCS Championship. *The complete PFL tiebreaker is available online at pioneer-football.org/tiebreaker.*

PFL ADDS SIXTH MAJOR AWARD | In addition to the change in the league's tiebreaker procedure, the league's presidents voted to add a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The Scholar-Athlete of the Year will be selected as part of the league's Academic All-PFL squad voting in November.

Butler rounds out the league's top four with two first-place votes and 77 points. Drake picked up one first-place vote and was picked fifth with 73 total points.
