### Saturday, Oct. 18

#### 🏈 San Diego at Butler, Noon

**Location:** Indianapolis, Ind. (Butler Bowl)

**Series:** SAN leads 14-5      **Streak:** SAN, two wins

**Last Meeting:** San Diego def. Butler, 42-14 (2013)

**Notably:** San Diego visits Butler for the first time since 2009 in the 20th meeting between the PFL members. The two teams share two common opponents - Jacksonville and Stetson - with both 1-1 against the two foes. Butler returns home after posting a 1-1 record during its two-game road trip, suffering a loss at Campbell last week. San Diego brings a three-game win streak into the matchup, including a win at Marist that was its most recent road trip.

#### 🏈 Morehead State at Dayton, 1 p.m.

**Location:** Dayton, Ohio (Welcome Stadium)

**Series:** DAY leads, 14-5      **Streak:** DAY, five wins

**Last Meeting:** Dayton def. Morehead State, 42-14 (2013)

**Notably:** Dayton plays home for the first time since Sept 20 when it hosts Morehead State. The Flyers are unbeaten in two tries at Welcome Stadium this season and will face a Morehead State team it has averaged 41.5 points against in the last two meetings. The Eagles return to the road for the first time since Sept. 20 after posting a 1-1 mark during its two-game homestand. In Week 7, Morehead State saw its rushing game outgain the passing game (216-144) for the first time in 12 games dating back to a Sept. 28, 2013 contest against Davidson.

#### 🏈 Drake at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

**Location:** Valparaiso, Ind. (Brown Field)

**Series:** DRA leads 18-3      **Streak:** DRA, 10 wins

**Last Meeting:** Drake def. Valparaiso, 23-10 (2013)

**Notably:** Valparaiso continues its three-game homestand when it hosts Drake, Saturday. The Crusaders own two wins in a season for the first time since 2008 and will seek its first PFL win this season. The Bulldogs enter the game seeking to keep pace with the league leaders following an impressive contest that saw it amass 606 offensive yards while its defense allowed only 163 yards.

#### 🏈 Davidson at Campbell, 4 p.m.

**Location:** Buies Creek, N.C. (Barker-Lane Stadium)

**Series:** DAV leads, 4-2      **Streak:** CAM, one win

**Last Meeting:** Campbell def. Davidson, 47-14 (2013)

**Notably:** The league's two North Carolina teams meet for the seventh time when Davidson travels to Campbell. The Camels are off to their best PFL start after downing defending league champion Butler last week. Davidson will finish off a two-game road trip seeking its first road win after a loss at Drake last week.

#### 🏈 Jacksonville at Stetson, 6 p.m.

**Location:** DeLand, Fla. (Spec Martin Stadium)

**Series:** JAC leads 1-0

**Last Meeting:** Jacksonville def. Stetson, 45-24 (2013)

**Notably:** Jacksonville continues its five-game road trip with a visit to Stetson for the second meeting between the Sunshine State squads. The Hatters are winless at home (0-3) this season but return to DeLand after nearly pulling off an upset in San Diego last week. Jacksonville makes the shortest trip during its road trip seeking to remain atop the PFL standings. Last season's meeting turned on 21 unanswered second half points by Jacksonville.

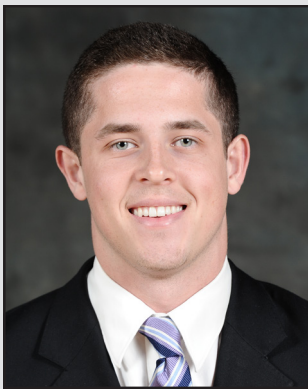
## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

### Kade Bell, Jacksonville

Junior (RS) | Quarterback | Fleming Island, Fla.

Bell threw for all six touchdowns in Jacksonville's 45-26 PFL victory at Morehead State, Saturday. His six touchdown passes fell one shy of both the PFL and Dolphins record. Bell completed 26-of-42 passes for 441 yards and was picked off just once. He got Jacksonville on the board midway through the second quarter, tossing his 50th career TD pass to Andrew Robustelli. Bell would go on to throw touchdowns to five different receivers, including passes that went for 46, 50 and 63 yards.

### Zach Elias, Dayton

Senior | Safety | Loveland, Ohio

Elias recorded a fumble forced and recovered as well as an interception in Dayton's 31-21 PFL victory at Marist, Saturday. He paced an impressive seven-turnover outing by the Flyers, one shy of the PFL record. Elias started his day with a first-quarter interception he returned 21 yards to the Marist four-yard line and set up the first Dayton touchdown. He then added a third quarter fumble strip and pickup to end a potential Marist scoring drive inside the Dayton 20-yard line. In between, he recorded six tackles (four solo) and broke up a pass.

Will had the kicker's dream day, kicking four extra points and a field goal as well as returning a fumble recovery for a touchdown in Dayton's 31-21 PFL victory at Marist, Saturday. Following a Dayton touchdown, Will kicked off, recovered a fumble forced by Colin McManamon and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown that put Dayton ahead 28-14. In his conventional kicker role, he connected on all four PATs and his 25-yard field goal added insurance points in the fourth quarter.
