🏈 Campbell at Marist, Noon

Location: Poughkeepsie, N.Y. (Tenney Stadium)

Series: MAR leads, 4-1 **Streak:** MAR, two wins

Last Meeting: Marist def. Campbell, 55-28 (2013)

Notably: Marist will host Campbell in the Week 9 kickoff, in a series that home teams have not fared well in. The road team has won each of the last four meetings in the series. Campbell is off to its best PFL start in program history and will look to pull even with Jacksonville (which is out of PFL play this week). This is a matchup of the two lowest scoring teams in the PFL, with Campbell averaging just 20 points per game while Marist has scored only 13.1 points per game.

🏈 Stetson at Davidson, 1 p.m.

Location: Davidson, N.C. (Richardson Stadium)

Series: DAV leads, 3-2 **Streak:** STE, one win

Last Meeting: Stetson def. Davidson, 26-13 (2013)

Notably: Davidson will seek to change its luck when Stetson visits for the first time since 1956. The Wildcats seek their first PFL win this season, but have three losses by eight or fewer points in four PFL contests. Davidson is one of three PFL teams to throw just seven interceptions this season, averaging nearly 44 passes between interceptions. Meanwhile, Stetson ranks third among PFL teams with 10 interceptions, picking off a pass every 20 pass attempts.

🏈 Jacksonville at Limestone, 1 p.m.

Location: Gaffney S.C. (The Reservation)

Series: First Meeting

Notably: Jacksonville steps out of conference play in Week 9, traveling northward to face first-year Division II foe Limestone. Jacksonville enters the week as the FCS' 19th-ranked offense, averaging 455.3 yards per game, after back-to-back 500-yard weeks in PFL play.

🏈 Valparaiso at Morehead State, 1 p.m.

Location: Morehead, Ky. (Jayne Stadium)

Series: MOR leads, 16-3 **Streak:** MOR, seven wins

Last Meeting: Morehead State def. Valparaiso, 42-28 (2013)

Notably: Valparaiso will seek a win at Morehead State for the first time since 2006 when the squads meet Saturday. Morehead State has won seven straight meetings overall and three straight at Jayne Stadium. While Morehead State will have the edge offensively (398.4 ypg vs. 336.4 ypg), Valparaiso will hold the defensive edge (398.1 ypg vs. 506.7 ypg).

🏈 Butler at Drake, 2 p.m.

Location: Des Moines, Iowa (Drake Stadium)

Series: DRA leads, 15-7-1 **Streak:** BUT, one win

Last Meeting: Butler def. Drake, 24-14 (2013)

Notably: The Bulldog Battle will be reignited for a 24th time when Butler travels to Drake. While Butler won last season's meeting between the two teams, Drake has won the last eight games (dating back to 1994) played between the two teams at Drake Stadium. In addition, Drake puts its 19-game PFL home win streak on the line. This matchup will feature the PFL's top two sack squads, Butler leading the league with 19 sacks with Drake second with 17 sacks.

🏈 Dayton at San Diego, 9 p.m.

Location: San Diego, Calif. (Torero Stadium)

Series: DAY leads, 15-6 **Streak:** DAY, one win

Last Meeting: Dayton defeated San Diego, 45-38 in 20Ts (2013)

Notably: The Week 9 nightcap will pit the league's two preseason favorites as Dayton makes the trek westward to face San Diego. Both teams have won four straight entering this week's matchup. Dayton ranks second in both total offense (399.2 ypg) and defense (232.2 ypg) entering the weekend while San Diego ranks seventh offensively (362.7 ypg) and fourth defensively (360.3 ypg).

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Connor Kascor, Dayton

Senior | Running Back | Leo, Indiana

Kascor ran for four touchdowns on just 10 carries to carry Dayton past Morehead State, 41-7, in Saturday PFL action. In the first half he amassed 167 rushing yards on eight carries, including touchdown runs of 52, 11 and 63 yards. Kascor was on the field for just two plays in the second half, but one was a 61-yard rushing touchdown to give Dayton a 35-0 lead. Prior to Saturday's contest, Dayton did not have an offensive play for more than 50 yards, Kascor had three such plays – each going for a touchdown.

◀ Jamal Agnew, San Diego

Sophomore | Cornerback | San Diego, California

Agnew defended five passes, including a pair of interceptions, in San Diego's 27-21 PFL victory at Butler, Saturday. His first interception came in the end zone on Butler's first drive, denying a touchdown that would prove critical. Agnew's second interception stopped a Butler drive at the San Diego 27-yard line in the fourth quarter. He also had three tackles (all solo) in the contest.

Drew Orsmeth, Drake ▶

Senior | Cornerback | Lake in the Hills, Illinois

Orsmeth's 39-yard interception return for a touchdown provided insurance in Drake's 17-9 PFL victory at Valparaiso, Saturday. He also had a pair of fourth-quarter tackles in the contest. Orsmeth also amassed 113 all-purpose yards, all on returns (46 kick return, 28 punt return and 39 interception return).

Brandon Behr, Jacksonville

Sophomore (RS) | Placekicker | Fleming Island, Florida

Behr connected on three field goals and three extra points in Jacksonville's 30-7 PFL victory at Stetson. He opened the game's scoring with a 41-yard field goal then added kicks from 23 and 37 yards. Behr's 12 points were second most by any PFL player in Week 8 also handled kickoff duties, averaging 63.8 yards on six boots with four going for touchbacks.
