### Saturday, Nov. 22

#### Morehead State at Charlotte, Noon

**Location:** Charlotte, North Carolina (Jerry Richardson Stadium)

**Series:** CHA leads, 1-0

**Last Meeting:** Charlotte def. Morehead State, 61-17 (2013)

**Notably:** Morehead State heads across the Appalachians to meet FBS foe Charlotte. The Eagles defense stiffened in a Week 12 win, holding Stetson to 18 points – the fewest points it has permitted this season. Meanwhile, the MSU offense topped 40 points for the fifth time this season, improving to 4-1 in those contests.

#### 🏈 Campbell at Dayton, 1 p.m.

**Location:** Dayton, Ohio (Welcome Stadium)

**Series:** DAY leads, 3-0

**Last Meeting:** Dayton def. Campbell, 41-23 (2013)

**Notably:** Campbell will seek to end a three-game PFL losing streak when it travels to Dayton. After scoring 28 or more points in its first four PFL games, the Camels have been held to 24 or fewer points in their last three PFL outings. Dayton boasts the PFL's second-best scoring offense (35.4 ppg), with its 21 points in a winning effort against Butler the fewest points its scored in a PFL game this season.

#### 🏈 Drake at Stetson, 1 p.m.

**Location:** DeLand, Florida (Spec Martin Stadium)

**Series:** First Meeting

**Notably:** Stetson seeks its first .500 mark since 1951 when it hosts Drake in the first meeting between the two teams. Stetson sophomore defensive back Donald Payne has 111 tackles in his last five games, an average of 22 tackles per game, and leads the PFL with 17.1 tackles per game. On the other side of the field, Drake boasts the PFL's top team defense, limiting opponents to a league-best 280 yards per game thanks to a PFL best pass defense holding teams to 176 yards per game.

#### 🏈 Davidson at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

**Location:** Valparaiso, Indiana (Brown Field)

**Series:** DAV leads, 7-1

**Streak:** DAV, two wins

**Last Meeting:**

**Notably:** Davidson will trek to Valparaiso for the final PFL contest of 2014. Davidson will seek to end the season on a high note after tough outings in its last two weeks. The Wildcats have recorded an interception in four consecutive games, doubling its total of the first seven games. Valparaiso returns home after seeing a win at San Diego denied on a last-second score. The Crusaders offense has rolled up more than 320 yards in each of its last four games and scored 110 points.

#### Cal Poly at San Diego, 7 p.m.

**Location:** San Diego, California (Torero Stadium)

**Series:** CP leads, 3-0

**Last Meeting:** Cal Poly def. San Diego, 38-16 (2013)

**Notably:** San Diego meets Cal Poly in a tune up for the Division I Football Championship. The Toreros have won eight straight overall and 10 straight at Torero Stadium. The latter streak is the sixth-longest streak in the FCS. San Diego has scored 81 points in its last two games, but surrendered 55. They will face a Cal Poly side that has scored 28 or more points in every game this season.

Williams 44-yard "Hail Mary" touchdown at time expired catapulted San Diego to a 32-27 PFL victory against Valparaiso and the 2014 PFL Championship. He finished the game completing 19-of-33 passes for 263 yards and four touchdowns. Williams completed passes to seven different receivers and three receivers caught touchdowns. He also had 10 carries for 54 yards in the contest.

His first interception came in Morehead State's end zone, killing a Stetson drive that reached the Morehead State 7-yard line with MSU leading 20-18. Grier's second pickoff came with the game in hand and he returned it 40 yards. He also had five tackles (four solo) and broke up a pass.
