WEEK 1 KICKOFF CAPSULES

Thursday, Sept. 3

Pikeville at Campbell, 7 p.m.

Notably: Campbell (5-7, 4-4 PFL) opens a season at home for the second-straight season, opening 2015 with its first-ever meeting against Pikeville. The Camels return 15 starters from last season's team – nine of those on defense. The handful of losses included quarterback Dakota Wolf and a pair of offensive line stalwarts. Defensively, All-PFL selections Ugonna Awwuruonye and Greg Milhouse return to anchor the defensive line. NAIA opponent Pikeville opened its 2015 season with a 32-13 victory against Bluefield, August 27. The Bears return quarterback Sani Warren but saw both its leading rusher and tackler depart.

Valparaiso at Eastern Kentucky, 7 p.m.

Notably: Valparaiso (4-8, 2-6 PFL) opens on the road for the third consecutive year. The Crusaders enter the year seeking answers at quarterback and wide receiver but the losses at those two positions. Valparaiso returns a considerably improved defensive unit, led by Preseason All-PFL linebacker Alex Green, gave up 100 fewer yards per game last season. Eastern Kentucky (9-4, 6-2 OVC) enters the season nationally ranked and was picked to finish second in the Ohio Valley Conference. Quarterback Dy'Shawn Mobley was named the OVC's Preseason Offensive Player of the Year and was one of four Colonels selected to that league's preseason team.

Friday, Sept. 4

Jacksonville at Delaware, 7 p.m.

Notably: Jacksonville (9-2) opens its 2015 campaign with a three-game road trip, starting at Delaware. The Dolphins had five players named to the Preseason All-PFL team, including quarterback Kade Bell, who paced the league's best offense. In addition, defensive back Terrance Bryant and linebacker Grady Redding – two other preseason picks – return to anchor a defensive unit that was the league's best. Delaware (6-6, 4-4 CAA) was picked sixth in that league's preseason poll. The Blue Hens saw three players named to the Colonial Athletic Association's preseason squad, including offensive tackle Ben Curtis and defensive tackle Blaine Woodson, who was the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year last season.

Saturday, Sept. 5

Dayton at Robert Morris, Noon

Notably: Dayton (8-3, 6-2 PFL) opens up on the road for a third consecutive year, this season at Northeast Conference foe Robert Morris. All eyes will be on returning PFL Offensive Player of the Year Connor Kacsor, but fans should also keep an eye on the defensive side of the ball where Preseason All-PFL picks Christopher Beaschler and Nate Sudnick lie in wait. The Colonials (1-10, 1-5 NEC) were picked to finish seventh in the Northeast Conference's preseason poll and return 15 starters from last season's team. RMU returns its top eight tacklers from that squad and they helped hold Kacsor to just 47 yards last season.

Butler at Indiana State, 3:05 p.m.

Notably: For the fourth straight year, Butler (4-7, 2-6 PFL) will open a season on the road, but its 2015 opener will be a stouter test with nationally-ranked Indiana State looming. The Bulldogs enter the year hoping last season's rough-and-tumble year will pay off in 2015. Quarterback Matt Shiltz returns after missing the second half of last season while quarterback Malcolm Weaver returns after starting 2014's remainder. Indiana State (8-6, 4-4 MVFC) was picked sixth in an incredibly deep Missouri Valley Football Conference. The Sycamores saw four players named to that league's preseason squad – three coming from their defensive unit.

Davidson at The Citadel, 6 p.m.

Notably: Davidson (1-11, 0-8 PFL) heads to the Atlantic coast for its season-opener at The Citadel. The Wildcats offense will be spearheaded by wide receiver William Morris who garnered Preseason All-American recognition over the summer after amassing a school record 1,224 receiving yards – the best performance by a PFL wideout since 2008. He is one of 16 returning starters and 50 returning letterwinners that dominate the Davidson roster. The Citadel (5-7, 3-4 SoCon) was picked to finish seventh in the Southern Conference. The Bulldogs feature two preseason All-SoCon picks: offensive lineman Sam Frye and defensive lineman Mitchell Jeter.

Saturday, Sept. 5

Marist at Bucknell, 6 p.m.

Notably: Marist (4-7, 4-4 PFL) heads into the Keystone State for a matchup with longtime foe Bucknell. The Red Foxes hope a settled offensive picture will lead to a surprise 2015 after being picked seventh in the PFL preseason poll. Four Marist players were named to the PFL's preseason team, including fifth-year seniors Matt Tralli at wide receiver and Demetrius Williams at defensive end. Bucknell (8-3, 4-2 PL) finished second in the Patriot League last season, its best finish since 1997, and was picked to repeat that finish in 2015. The Bison had a league-high six players named to the preseason team, including wide receiver Will Carter and running back C.J. Williams.

Morehead State at James Madison, 6 p.m.

Notably: Morehead State (4-8, 3-5 PFL) will jump right into the fray when it travels to nationally-ranked James Madison. The Eagles will see quarterback Austin Gahafer run the offense for a third consecutive year after amassing 5,270 yards in his first two seasons. Meanwhile, the MSU defense will have its three leading tacklers returning, including linebacker Luke Keller. James Madison (9-4, 6-2 CAA) reached the FCS Playoffs in head coach Everett Withers' first season. The Dukes are picked to finish second in the Colonial Athletic Association this season behind tight end Dean Cheatham and offensive lineman Mitchell Kirsch, who were both Preseason All-CAA selections.

Webber International at Stetson, 7 p.m.

Notably: Stetson (5-7, 3-5 PFL) looks to build on last season's two-win improvement over its rookie campaign. What does 2015 have in store? Preseason All-American and returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year Donald Payne will certainly have plenty to say after setting a PFL record with 175 tackles last season. The Hatters also see quarterback Ryan Tentler and running back Cole Mazza return to lead a maturing offensive unit. Webber, ranked in the NAIA national poll, opened 2015 with a 48-21 victory against Arizona Christian, Friday. Running back Darius Page ran for 206 yards and three touchdowns in the win.

William Jewell at Drake, 7 p.m.

Notably: Drake (7-4, 6-2 PFL) opens 2015 at home when it hosts Division II William Jewell. The Bulldogs return 16 starters from last season's team that finished third in the PFL, eight on each side of the ball. The Drake defense battled Jacksonville for the title of the league's best defensive unit, holding opponents to a league-best 318 yards per game. Defensive back Brad Duwe and linebacker John Hugunin each return after earning second-team All-PFL honors last season to anchor the unit. William Jewell (5-6, 5-3 GLVC) will see running back Tre Mask return after being named to the NCAA Division II All-Freshman Team last season.

San Diego at San Diego State, 8 p.m.

Notably: Preseason PFL favorite San Diego (9-3, 7-1 PFL) will close the league's opening week on the biggest stage when it meets Mountain West foe San Diego State at Qualcomm Stadium – home of the NFL's San Diego Chargers. The Toreros return 13 starters from last season's PFL Championship squad, including cornerback Jamal Agnew, who led all FCS defenders in passes defended. Offensively, running back Jonah Hodges returns to pace the Torero offense, which has been searching for a new signal caller during its preseason sessions. San Diego State (7-6, 5-3 MWC) was picked to win the Mountain West's West Division and saw four players named to that league's preseason team. Foremost among that quartet is running back Donnel Pumphrey, who rushed for a program-record 1,867 yards last season.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety **Donald Payne** was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton recordsetting running back **Connor Kacsor** was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM |

Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL TIEBREAKER | The PFL's automatic qualifier tiebreaker remains untouched for the 2015 season. Beginning in 2014, the league began including a "Strength of Victory" and "Strength of Schedule" – both based on conference games only – to help determine its representative in the FCS Championship. The complete PFL tiebreaker is available online at pioneer-football. org/tiebreaker.

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season. Stetson safety Donald Payne, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, set the PFL's record for single-season tackles (175) and led all FCS defensive players in tackles per game (14.6).

PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM | Twenty-nine Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named to the preseason All-PFL squad. Sixteen First-Team All-PFL honorees return for the 2015 season. In addition, 12 Second-Team All-PFL selections and one honorable mention recipient from the 2014 All-PFL squads were elevated to the 2015 preseason squad.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | Defending champion San Diego again received the coaches' nod to win the 2015 PFL title, but the coaches also predicted an exciting race. The top three teams in the preseason poll were separated by just three points. San Diego received seven of a possible 10 first-place votes and 89 of a maximum 100 points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Dayton received three first-place votes and was ranked second with 87 points. Drake gained the remaining first-place vote and was third with 86 points.
