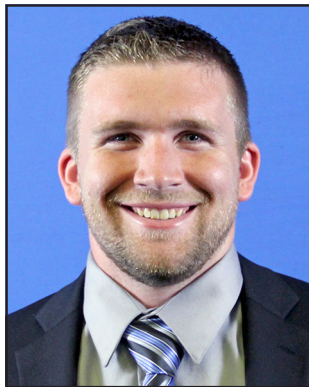

Hugunin had 2½ tackles for loss, including a sack that resulted in a safety, in Drake's 21-18 loss at North Dakota, Saturday. He finished the game with six tackles (four solo) and led a defensive unit that shutout UND in the second half while limiting it 25 rushing yards. Hugunin's safety started Drake's fourth-quarter burst that brought it three points shy of tying the game. He also had a pair of fumbles forced, including one that snuffed out a North Dakota drive and helped Drake flip field position, ultimately leading to his safety.

Bohnert's punting was crucial to help Drake's comeback bid in a 21-18 loss at North Dakota, Saturday. He punted 11 times for a school-record 438 yards (39.8 yards per punt), including a 52-yard boot. Four of his punts ended inside the North Dakota 20-yard line, the most important to start the fourth quarter. Bohnert's 35-yard punt pinned the Bison on their five-yard line and three plays later linebacker John Hugunin's sack in the end zone resulted in a safety. Six of his punts went for more than 40 yards, including a 52-yard punt he uncorked in the fourth quarter. Bohnert also kicked off three times, his on-side kick late in the game being mishandled by UND before going out of bounds.

WEEK 3 KICKOFF CAPSULES

Duquesne at Dayton, 1 p.m.

Following a week off, Dayton returns to action when it hosts Duquesne at Welcome Stadium. The Flyers opened with a Week 1 victory against Robert Morris as redshirt freshman quarterback Alex Jeske took over late in the first half and amassed 203 offensive yards in just 33 minutes to spark off the comeback win. Also helping the cause was linebacker Christopher Beaschler's career-high 18 tackles. Duquesne is off to a 2-0 start after winning at Bucknell for the first time in program history, 26-7, last week. Quarterback Dillon Buechel threw touchdowns to three different receivers while defensive back Abner Roberts had an interception, forced fumble and six tackles.

College Of Faith (Ark.) at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

Valparaiso continues its three-game homestand when it hosts College of Faith (Ark.), Saturday. The Crusaders are seeking answers at quarterback as Scott Stall and Dalton Stokes have shared the duty in the season's first two weeks. Kicker Jacob Newman has been a bright spot, connecting on two field goals in the early going, including a 39-yarder against Sacred Heart in Week 2. College of Faith returns to action after an off week. The Warriors opened their campaign with a 68-0 loss to McKendree, Sept. 5. Due to NCAA Statistics Policy, Saturday's contest is not a countable opponent for Valparaiso and will not be reflected in the NCAA or PFL's standings or statistics.

Drake at South Dakota, 3 p.m.

After nearly pulling off a Week 2 upset, Drake returns to the Dakotas for a Saturday matchup with South Dakota. The Bulldogs defense had a stellar Week 2 performance at North Dakota, allowing just 25 rushing yards to an opponent that had 275 rushing yards in a win at Wyoming. PFL Defensive Player of the Week John Huginun forced two fumbles and his quarterback sack resulted in a safety. Quarterback Andy Rice passed for 237 yards and had a touchdown pass in the loss. South Dakota bounced back from a Week 1 loss at Kansas State with a 27-17 win at UC Davis. Running back Trevor Bouma had a career-high 186 yards and two touchdowns in the win while the Coyotes defense forced four turnovers and had four sacks.

Sacred Heart at Marist, 6 p.m.

Marist left its Week 2 loss at Georgetown with questions at quarterback that it will seek to answer when Sacred Heart visits, Saturday. Sophomore quarterback Michael White made his collegiate debut off the bench at Georgetown and led the team with 201 offensive yards – 177 passing and 24 rushing – while also completing a touchdown pass for the Red Foxes only points. Defensive end John Brennan had seven tackles, including three for loss. Sacred Heart will play its second PFL opponent in as many weeks after posting a 56-3 win at Valparaiso last week. Running back Ose Imeokparia ran for 119 yards and three touchdowns in that win while the defense forced five turnovers, defensive lineman Connor Caeney nabbing a pair of interceptions.

Butler at Taylor, 7 p.m.

A quick strike Butler offense will look to take another step forward when it travels to NAIA foe Taylor, Saturday. The Bulldogs broke out to a 31-0 halftime lead against Franklin in Week 2 as its first four scoring drives consumed less than 2:30 combined. Quarterback Matt Shiltz passed for three touchdowns and ran for another as part of a 272 yard offensive performance. Defensive end Josh Willis led the BU defense with his second consecutive outing with 1½ sacks, finishing with five tackles and a fumble forced. Taylor continues its homestand after posting a come-from-behind 48-42 victory against St. Francis (Ind.) last weekend. The Trojans scored the game's final 35 points as quarterback Everett Pollard tossed six touchdown passes, including all five in the game-ending outburst.

Campbell at Presbyterian, 7 p.m.

Campbell has opened a season 2-0 for the first time since relaunching its program in 2008 and will seek a third-straight win when it visits Presbyterian, Saturday. The Fighting Camels defense held Chowan to eight rushing yards and posted six sacks in last week's 35-3 victory. Safety Carlos Merritt led that defensive effort with six tackles and an over-the-shoulder first quarter interception. Campbell quarterbacks Kameron Bryant and David Salmon each threw two touchdowns in the win. Presbyterian opens its home schedule after dropping back-to-back road contests at FBS foes to start the year. The Blue Hose's offense was held to 112 yards in a 34-10 Week 2 loss at Charlotte with running back Darrell Bridges 69-yard rushing effort leading the way.

Kentucky Christian at Morehead State, 7 p.m.

Morehead State opens its home schedule when it hosts NAIA foe Kentucky Christian, Saturday. Quarterback Austin Gahafer was the PFL and STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after a 447-yard passing performance in a narrow 43-40 loss at VMI, Saturday. His 620 passing yards in the opening two weeks leads the PFL. Cornerback Eric Pugh had a busy weekend against the Keydets, making a career-high 18 tackles (14 solo). Kentucky Christian ends a season-opening three-game road trip with Saturday contest. The Knights lost a Duquesne to being the year and dropped a 52-3 decision to Reinhardt last weekend. Kentucky Christian has 481 offensive yards in its first two weeks and has allowed 1203 yards.

Off Weeks

Davidson

Davidson's offense made headway in a Week 2 35-21 loss to Division II Catawba with a balanced attack that amassed 362 yards. Running back Jeffrey Keil carried the ball 19 times for 121 yards and two touchdowns in the loss. Defensive back Myles Atkins led the Wildcats defense with 10 tackles and an interception. Davidson returns to action when it travels to Morehead State next week.

Jacksonville

Jacksonville held on for a narrow 17-14 escape against Division II Newberry in Week 2. The Dolphins defense captured three second half interceptions to help nurse a 17-7 third quarter lead. Linebacker Grady Redding had 11 tackles and a sack to pace that defensive effort. On the offensive side, wide receiver Andy Jones posted his second straight 100-yard receiving outing with seven catches for 135 yards and a touchdown at Newberry. Jacksonville concludes its three-game road trip when it travels to Marist in Week 4.

San Diego

San Diego scored 21 points in the fourth quarter to down Division II Western New Mexico, 45-21, in its home opener. Redshirt freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence, who made his first collegiate start, completed 20 passes for 254 yards and four touchdowns, including two in the fourth quarter, to spur the Torero offense. Cornerback Devyn Bryant had two interceptions in the win along with three tackles and a pass breakup. San Diego travels to Valparaiso to open PFL play in Week 4.

Stetson

Stetson fell victim to penalties, turnovers and big plays in a 57-14 loss at Mercer last weekend. The Hatters threw three first half interceptions that it saw turned into 21 points as Mercer needed just 13 offensive players to score five second quarter touchdowns. Quarterback Ryan Tentler completed eight passes for 163 yards and a touchdown while backup signal caller Blake Blattsmier completed 11 passes for 88 yards and ran for the Hatters other touchdown. Stetson returns to action when it visits Drake in a Week 4 PFL opener.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFAER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a 22-yard field goal in Week 1.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety **Donald Payne** was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton record-setting running back **Connor Kacsor** was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL TIEBREAKER | The PFL's automatic qualifier tiebreaker remains untouched for the 2015 season. Beginning in 2014, the league began including a "Strength of Victory" and "Strength of Schedule" – both based on conference games only – to help determine its representative in the FCS Championship. *The complete PFL tiebreaker is available online at pioneer-football.org/tiebreaker.*

2015 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season. Stetson safety Donald Payne, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, set the PFL's record for single-season tackles (175) and led all FCS defensive players in tackles per game (14.6).

PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM | Twenty-nine Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named to the preseason All-PFL squad. Sixteen First-Team All-PFL honorees return for the 2015 season. In addition, 12 Second-Team All-PFL selections and one honorable mention recipient from the 2014 All-PFL squads were elevated to the 2015 preseason squad.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | Defending champion San Diego again received the coaches' nod to win the 2015 PFL title, but the coaches also predicted an exciting race. The top three teams in the preseason poll were separated by just three points. San Diego received seven of a possible 10 first-place votes and 89 of a maximum 100 points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Dayton received three first-place votes and was ranked second with 87 points. Drake gained the remaining first-place vote and was third with 86 points.
