Kacsor posted his fifth career 200-yard rushing performance, leading Dayton to a come-from-behind 24-13 victory against Duquesne, Saturday. After fumbling early in the game as Duquesne built a 13-3 lead, he scored three second half touchdowns (22 carries, 150 yards in the final 23 minutes) to account for all of the comeback effort. Kacsor carried the ball 40 times for 244 yards and added 28 yards on a reception for 272 all-purpose yards.

Calhoun's 69-yard sprint with 3:33 left in the game led Marist to a 34-27 victory against Sacred Heart, Saturday. It was a big-play kind of day, as the first of his three touchdowns came on a 75-yard reception in the second quarter, giving Marist a 14-0 lead. Calhoun finished with eight carries for 117 yards and two scores while adding two receptions for 79 yards and a TD for 196 all-purpose yards.

WEEK 4 KICKOFF CAPSULES

► **Campbell at Butler, Noon**

Campbell and Butler come into their PFL opener after much different Week 3 results. The Camels could not overcome three turnovers in a Week 3 loss to Presbyterian. Running back Jared Joyner finished with 102 all-purpose yards and caught the game's first touchdown at Presbyterian after entering the game with just 83 all-purpose yards. The Fighting Camels defense recorded seven tackles for loss against the Blue Hose, defensive tackle Greg Milhouse registering a tackle for loss as part of a six-tackle outing. The Bulldogs picked off five passes and shutout Taylor for the final 49 minutes in a Week 3 win. Safety Isaak Newhouse had two interceptions for 29 yards in returns to highlight a five-tackle outing. Quarterback Matt Shiltz accounted for four touchdowns in the contest, running for two and passing for two more as part of 371-total offensive yard effort. Shiltz is third among all rushers with 237 yards this season.

► **Jacksonville at Marist, Noon**

Fresh of its home-opening victory in Week 3, Marist will open PFL play by hosting Jacksonville, Saturday, at Tenney Stadium. The Red Foxes played big in front of its largest home crowd (3,629) since 2008, pulling off a victory against Sacred Heart. Running back Macellus Calhoun, a PFL Co-Offensive Player of the Week, ran for a 69-yard touchdown in the closing minutes to secure the win. Defensive end Landon Moore helped out by forcing a pair of fumbles and recording 3½ tackles for loss in a 10-tackle outing. The Dolphins return to action after their Week 3 bye, seeking to improve on their first 2-0 start since the 2001 season (started 4-0 that year). Wide receiver Andy Jones has been JU's go-to man early in contests, scoring the first touchdown in the season's first two games and has 253 receiving yards. Linebacker Grady Redding had 11 solo stops in the Week 2 win at Newberry to lead a defense that gained four turnovers.

► **Davidson at Morehead State, 1 p.m.**

Davidson travels to Morehead State with both squads seeking a good start to their PFL slate. Davidson returns to action after its Week 3 bye and seek their first win this season after losing to Catawba in Week 2. The Wildcats ground game has accounted for more than half the team's yardage with running back Jeffrey Keil amassing 143 yards and two touchdowns in the season's first two outings. Davidson's defense has been spread evenly with eight players recording 10 or more tackles in the first two weeks. Meanwhile, the Eagles are headlined by the "Austin Gahafer Show" as the junior signal-caller has had a hand in all 10 touchdowns MSU has scored this season. He ranks fifth among FCS quarterbacks in points responsibility (60 pts) and is tied with Butler's Matt Shiltz. Cornerback Eric Pugh has been busy through three weeks, leading the PFL with 33 tackles after a seven-tackle outing in the Week 3 win against Kentucky Christian.

► **San Diego at Valparaiso, 1:30 p.m.**

Preseason PFL favorite San Diego will be wary when it travels to Valparaiso in the PFL opener for both squads. San Diego escaped with a 32-27 victory last season when its Hail Mary was caught at Torero Stadium. In addition, they travel to Brown Field where the Crusaders held PFL foes to 17 points per game in 2014. The Toreros turned to redshirt freshman Anthony Lawrence at quarterback in a Week 2 win against Western New Mexico. Lawrence finished with four touchdown passes in the win, including two in the fourth quarter as San Diego came back for the win. Cornerback Devyn Bryant had two interceptions in the Week 2 contest and is one of seven defenders with two interceptions entering PFL play. Valparaiso scored 86 points in what ultimately amounted to an exhibition contest against College of Faith (Ark.) in Week 3. Nine Crusader touchdowns came on the ground with Jake Hutson rushing for four scores; Valparaiso does not have a rushing touchdown this season. Linebacker Alex Green brings a team-best 16 tackles and two tackles for loss into PFL action.

► **Stetson at Drake, 2 p.m.**

Stetson and Drake finished 2014 facing one another in DeLand, Florida. Now just more than 10 months since that meeting, the two teams meet to open the 2015 PFL race. Drake returns home after back-to-back trips to the Dakotas, first to face North Dakota and then a Week 3 meeting against South Dakota. Running back Conley Wilkins was called upon to lead the Bulldogs at South Dakota and carried the ball 16 times for 59 yards and has 232 rushing yards through three weeks. Strong safety Caz Zyks might have the most interesting name in college football, but he also led Drake with seven tackles at South Dakota after only registering five tackles in the season's first two games. Stetson returns to the field after its Week 3 off week. The third-year Hatters were hampered by three interceptions in a Week 2 loss at Mercer as three players saw time under center. Safety Donald Payne finished the contest with 13 tackles, 11 solo, and three tackles for loss. He enters the PFL-opening weekend with 23 tackles (14 solo).

► **Kennesaw State at Dayton, 6 p.m.**

Dayton is off to its best start in seven seasons after downing Northeast Conference members Robert Morris and Duquesne in its first two games. The Flyers stay at Welcome Stadium in Week 4 to host first-year program Kennesaw State. Running back Connor Kacsor, a PFL Co-Offensive Player of the Week, posted his fifth career 200-yard rushing performance in the win against Duquesne. He is second among FCS running backs at 158 yards per game, behind Stony Brook's Stacey Bedell (163.0 yards per game). Defensively, cornerback Cameron Stubbs was the league's Defensive Player of the Week after nabbing a pair of interceptions – the first interceptions against Duquesne quarterback Dillon Beuchel in 2015. Kennesaw State enters the game unbeaten with wins against East Tennessee, Edward Waters and Shorter. The Owls have amassed over 1,000 rushing yards in those three games with quarterback Trey White posting a team-best 257 yards and four touchdowns along with 352 passing yards.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

RAISE THE CURTAIN | The PFL regular-season race begins in Week 4 with five games on the schedule. Seven teams have claimed a share of the PFL crown with Dayton winning a share of 11 titles, including six solo championships.

DRAKE NEARS 600TH WIN | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up Win No. 596 in the opening weekend against William Jewell. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau, joining Dayton which has 651 all-time wins.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFAER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety **Donald Payne** was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton record-setting running back **Connor Kacsor** was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involve-

ment and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL TIEBREAKER | The PFL's automatic qualifier tiebreaker remains untouched for the 2015 season. Beginning in 2014, the league began including a "Strength of Victory" and "Strength of Schedule" – both based on conference games only – to help determine its representative in the FCS Championship. *The complete PFL tiebreaker is available online at pioneer-football.org/tiebreaker.*

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season. Stetson safety Donald Payne, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, set the PFL's record for single-season tackles (175) and led all FCS defensive players in tackles per game (14.6).

PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM | Twenty-nine Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named to the preseason All-PFL squad. Sixteen First-Team All-PFL honorees return for the 2015 season. In addition, 12 Second-Team All-PFL selections and one honorable mention recipient from the 2014 All-PFL squads were elevated to the 2015 preseason squad.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | Defending champion San Diego again received the coaches' nod to win the 2015 PFL title, but the coaches also predicted an exciting race. The top three teams in the preseason poll were separated by just three points. San Diego received seven of a possible 10 first-place votes and 89 of a maximum 100 points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Dayton received three first-place votes and was ranked second with 87 points. Drake gained the remaining first-place vote and was third with 86 points.
