The league's top matchup features San Diego traveling to Dayton in the lone battle between league unbeaten, San Diego winning last season's meeting in California en route to the PFL Championship... Butler faces a stern task to stay unbeaten when it travels to Morehead State - last season's meeting saw Butler escape with a 62-52 victory in Indianapolis... Jacksonville stays home for the second straight week and hosts fellow Sunshine State opponent Stetson... Other PFL action will see Valparaiso travel to Drake in a matchup of 1-1 PFL squads while Marist heads to Campbell... Davidson steps out of conference play to host Division II Kentucky Wesleyan... Dayton and Jacksonville are each 4-0 entering the weekend, two of a group of nine FCS teams still unbeaten overall... Jacksonville seeks its first 5-0 start in program history while Dayton looks for its first 5-0 start since 2005 (finished 9-1 that season with its lone loss coming at home to San Diego).

Clarke tied a school record with five touchdown passes as Valparaiso won a 42-35 PFL contest at Davidson, Saturday. His five touchdown tosses are tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season and the most by a PFL passer this season. Entering the game with just nine career completions, he completed 18-of-32 passes for 244 yards. His fifth touchdown toss was the game-winner as he found wide-out Griffin Norberg for a 12-yard touchdown pass with less than two minutes remaining in the game.

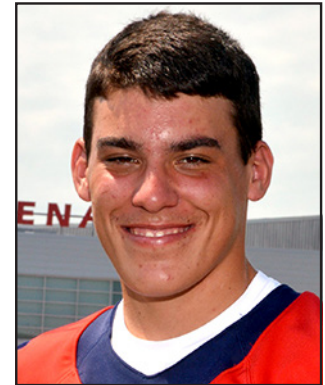

Smith came up big in the fourth quarter to help Dayton improve to 4-0 with a 27-14 PFL victory at Stetson, Saturday. He punted eight times in the contest, averaging 41.1 yards per punt. Two of his punts went for more than 50 yards, once when Dayton was pinned on its own 17-yard line in the third quarter. The other was a 50-yard punt that began a game-ending sequence that kept Stetson bottled up on its own end of the field after scoring early in the fourth quarter. Stetson returners averaged just 3.9 yards per return on his punts.

KICKOFF CAPSULES

📍 Kentucky Wesleyan at Davidson, 1 p.m.

Davidson continues its homestand when it hosts Division II Kentucky Wesleyan. The Wildcats were seven minutes shy of ending their long losing streak, but surrendered two touchdowns in that final span in a loss to Valparaiso. Quarterback Taylor Mitchell connected twice with wideout William Morris for touchdowns, including a go-ahead score with 7:16 left in the game. Mitchell finished with 19 completions for 196 yards and three touchdowns, while Morris had 114 yards on eight receptions. Kentucky Wesleyan enters the game after picking up its season's first win in a 35-7 victory against Central State. Quarterback Dalton Oliver has 1,076 passing yards and eight touchdowns in four games this season. It will be the end of a five-game, season-opening road trip for the Wildcats.

📍 San Diego at Dayton, 1 p.m.

The PFL's marquee matchup in Week 6 features San Diego (2-0 in PFL) travels to Dayton (1-0 in PFL). Dayton's is off to a 4-0 start overall for the first time since 2007 and seeks a 5-0 mark for the first time since 2005. San Diego brings a nine-game PFL win streak into the meeting, a streak that dates back to its first PFL game last season. It will be a matchup of freshman quarterbacks between the two league co-leaders. The Toreros have leaned on quarterback Anthony Lawrence this season and he has nine touchdown throws while completing 65.5 percent of his passes, but was held to one touchdown throw in the win against Marist last week. The Flyers fourth win this season was its first in wire-to-wire fashion as they downed Stetson. Dayton saw running back Connor Kacsor stymied but quarterback Alex Jeske stepped up with a three-touchdown passing performance as he completed 15-of-23 passes for 223 yards.

📍 Butler at Morehead State, 1 p.m.

Two of the league's top scoring passing attacks will square off when Butler travels to Morehead State. Butler returns to action after its off week while Morehead State returns home after a narrow loss at unbeaten Jacksonville. Last season, this matchup saw the teams combine for 114 points and 16 touchdowns, Butler winning a 62-52 decision after scoring 28 points off Morehead State turnovers, including an interception returned for a touchdown as well a punt return for touchdown. This season, the Bulldogs are the league's third ranked passing offense, averaging 240.2 yards per game, and are third in the league with 10 passing touchdowns. Meanwhile, the Eagles are second in passing offense (289.8 yards per game) but a league-best 15 of its 17 touchdowns have coming in the passing game. Butler's Matt Shiltz and Morehead State's Austin Gahafer – the two quarterbacks in this matchup – are ranked second and third in total offense, respectively, but Shiltz is the league's top rushing quarterback (320 yards), which may be a difference maker.

📍 Valparaiso at Drake, 2 p.m.

Valparaiso seeks its first-ever win at Drake Stadium against Drake in a Saturday matchup between teams with 1-1 PFL marks. The Crusaders won the front-end of its back-to-back road trip in a see-saw affair at Davidson and a win Saturday would also move them above .500 in league play for the first time since 2003. Drake returns home after suffering a narrow defeat on the road at Campbell and looks to avoid falling below .500 in league play since losing the opening game of the 2013 season. Valparaiso quarterback Ryan Clarke was named the PFL's Offensive Player of the Week after a five-touchdown performance in the win at Davidson. But it was return specialist Jarrett Morgan's game-tying 89-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter that helped turn the game's momentum. Drake entered last week's meeting at Campbell having allowed just 10 sacks in its first four games but saw quarterback Andy Rice sacked nine times in the loss. However, the Bulldogs defense is second in the league with 16 sacks, with defensive lineman Mack Marrin owning a team-best three sacks.

📍 Marist at Campbell, 6 p.m.

Marist continues its coast-to-coast road trip when it visits Campbell. The Red Foxes remained winless in league play with a three-point loss at San Diego last weekend, which followed a four-point loss to Jacksonville. Campbell has scored 24 points in each of its first two PFL contests, but is just 1-1 in league play after a victory against Drake. Turnovers have been Marist's downfall this season with opponents turning its 13 giveaways turning into 80 points. The Red Foxes defense has forced 10 turnovers but they have only scored 28 points off those turnovers. Campbell boasts the PFL's top ranked rushing offense (183.8 ypg) and rushing defense (91.6) at nearly the halfway point. On the offensive side, running back DeShawn Jones ranks second in the league with 107.6 yards per game. Defensively, Campbell is third in the league with 37 tackles for loss – a stark improvement over a year ago with it currently 28th nationally after finishing 113th in the category (50 TFL in 12 games) last season.

📍 Stetson at Jacksonville, 6 p.m.

Jacksonville seeks its first-ever 5-0 start to a campaign when it hosts Stetson. The Dolphins will seek that 5-0 start at D.B. Milne Field where it owns a seven-game win streak – tied for the seventh longest home win streak in FCS. Stetson faces an unbeaten FCS squad for the second consecutive week after falling to Dayton in Week 5. Jacksonville narrowly escaped its home-opener last weekend with a victory against Morehead State. The Dolphins rode the running back tandem of Jamal Adjahmah and Ulysses Bryant to the win. Adjahmah amassing a career-high 164 yards on 14 carries, while Bryant finished with 207 all-purpose yards, including 114 rushing yards. The Hatters had success stopping FCS-leading rusher Connor Kacsor last weekend, but surrendered three passing touchdowns in a loss to Dayton. Defensive back Donald Payne amassed 16 tackles, including two for loss, to lead an effort that held Kacsor to a season-low 61 yards.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three tackle-for-loss effort. Behind his effort, Campbell recorded nine sacks for minus-61 yards and held Drake to 154 total yards while recording their first-ever win in the series.

DAYTON'S KACSOR LEADING FCS RUSHERS | Dayton redshirt senior running back Connor Kacsor became the first FCS rusher with two 200-yard outings this season. He followed his FCS-best 244-yard outing against Duquesne with a 229-yard effort against Kennesaw State that came on a FCS-best 44 rush attempts. Kacsor leads all FCS runners in yards per game (151.5) and ranks among the FCS top 10 in total yardage (4th, 606) and rushing touchdowns (t-7th, 6).

PROLIFIC GAHAFAER PACING MOREHEAD STATE | Morehead State junior quarterback ranks second among FCS signal callers in points responsibility, with 102 points after five weeks. He has had a hand in all 17 of the Eagles' touchdowns – 14 passing, 2 rushing and 1 receiving.

PFL GOING PICK CRAZY | Through the season's first four weeks, PFL defenses have recorded 61 interceptions in 48 games – most of any FCS league with the Big Sky and Colonial tied for second (49 INTs in 62 and 54 games, respectively). Leading the way is Stetson's Eric Martin, who tied a PFL record with three interceptions in a Week 4 loss at Drake, the most by any FCS defender this season. It is one of eight multi-interception outings this season – a category led by Dayton's Cameron Stubbs who has picked off two passes in back-to-back games.

MORE PICK CRAZINESS | In the Week 4 FCS statistics leaders, Dayton's Cameron Stubbs leads the subdivision with 1.0 interceptions per game. He is one of six PFL players ranked in the Top 15 with three or more interceptions. In addition, San Diego's Jamal Agnew is ranked fourth among FCS defenders with 2.0 passes defended per game, a year after leading the subdivision with 2.1 passes defended per game last season.

FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY LIST | Campbell's Hunter Somerville, Dayton's Danny Leach and Marist's John Brennan were each named a semi-finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The NFF will announce 15 finalists on Oct. 29, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

DRAKE NEARS 600TH WIN | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up Win No. 597 with a PFL-opening victory against Stetson in Week 4. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau, joining Dayton which has 651 all-time wins.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFAER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton record-setting running back Connor Kacsor was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM |

Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season. Stetson safety Donald Payne, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, set the PFL's record for single-season tackles (175) and led all FCS defensive players in tackles per game (14.6).

PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM | Twenty-nine Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named to the preseason All-PFL squad. Sixteen First-Team All-PFL honorees return for the 2015 season. In addition, 12 Second-Team All-PFL selections and one honorable mention recipient from the 2014 All-PFL squads were elevated to the 2015 preseason squad.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | Defending champion San Diego again received the coaches' nod to win the 2015 PFL title, but the coaches also predicted an exciting race. The top three teams in the preseason poll were separated by just three points. San Diego received seven of a possible 10 first-place votes and 89 of a maximum 100 points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Dayton received three first-place votes and was ranked second with 87 points. Drake gained the remaining first-place vote and was third with 86 points.
