LEAGUE NOTES

Dayton took control of the PFL Championship race in Week 5 with its one-point win against San Diego... The Flyers seek to remain unbeaten in PFL play and improve to 6-0 overall (its first 6-0 start since 2005) with a trip to Valparaiso... Jacksonville also remained unbeaten in PFL play and overall, improving to 5-0 for the first time in program history... The Dolphins step out of PFL play for a nonconference tilt against intra-city foe Edward Waters, seeking to improve to 6-0... Drake travels to San Diego in a meeting between 2-1 squads seeking to stay at one loss with six weeks remaining in the regular season... Davidson snapped a 15-game overall losing streak in Week 6 and now turns its eyes to ending its 19-game PFL losing streak against a Butler squad that fell on the road last week... Campbell heads south to face Stetson to continue a series that has seen the road team win each of the first two contests... PFL defenses have racked up a FCS-leading 78 interceptions this season with the top three spots on the FCS interceptions list held by PFL defenders... Jacksonville made big moves in both FCS polls this week, breaking into double-digit vote totals in both the STATS FCS Poll and the FCS Coaches Poll.

His five touchdown tosses went to five different receivers and was part of a 23-for-40, 247-yard performance. It is the second straight week a PFL signal caller has thrown five touchdown passes, a mark that is fourth-best in the FCS.

KICKOFF CAPSULES

► Campbell at Stetson, 1 p.m.

Campbell travels to Stetson in a contest where both teams seek to bounce back from losses. Campbell dropped a 13-10 decision to Marist at home in Week 6 in a contest it allowed 347 yards – both its PFL losses have come when allowing 300-plus yards. Stetson remained winless in PFL play with a 41-14 loss at Jacksonville, its second straight 14-point offensive outing. Camels running back De'Shawn Jones notched his third 100-yard rushing outing this season – with 101 yards on 16 carries against Marist – and leads the PFL with 639 rushing yards (ranks second with 106.5 yards per game). Linebacker Jake Barr had a team best 12 tackles in the contest and is the only Campbell defender ranked among the league's top 20 in tackles (6.5 per game). The Hatters were done in by turnovers in their loss, seeing five giveaways turned into 20 points. Stetson defensive back Donald Payne leads all PFL tacklers with 11.8 tackles per game and has 5.5 tackles for loss (1.1 per game) this season. Meanwhile, quarterback Ryan Tentler has averaged 159.0 passing yards per game, but has four touchdowns against seven interceptions this season.

► Davidson at Butler, 1 p.m.

Davidson travels to Butler for the first meeting between the two teams since 2012. Davidson ended a 15-game losing streak with a 14-7 overtime victory against Kentucky Wesleyan last week. The Wildcats finished with just 220 offensive yards, quarterback Taylor Mitchell accounting for 138 yards (20 rushing, 118 passing). Defensive lineman Thomas Sykes was a PFL Co-Defensive Player of the Week after his game-saving end-zone interception in overtime. Butler dropped a 34-21 decision at Morehead State, but returns to the Butler Bowl where it is unbeaten this season in two tries. Bulldogs quarterback Matt Shiltz rushed for 120 yards (as part of a 401-yard offensive yard outing) at Morehead State for the team's first 100-yard rushing performance this season. Butler's defense has pulled in 13 turnovers this season, including nine interceptions. Cornerback Taylor Wilson nabbed the most recent pickoff and tacked on a 43-yard return against Morehead State.

► Edward Waters at Jacksonville, 1 p.m.

Jacksonville steps out of conference play and puts its unblemished record on the line in the Jacksonville Football Classic – an intricacy matchup against NAIA foe Edward Waters. The Dolphins improved to 5-0 for the first time in program history thanks to quarterback Kade Bell's five-touchdown performance which earned him PFL Offensive Player of the Week honors. Strong safety Dallas Jackson helped the cause with two interceptions – his first two this season – giving Jacksonville a league-best 11 pickoffs this season. Edward Waters enters the game seeking its season's first win (0-5 this season). Running back Ray Dukes leads the Panthers with 347 yards (69.4 ypg) and three touchdowns.

► Dayton at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

PFL front-runner Dayton seeks its best start since 2005 when it travels to Valparaiso. Dayton stands 5-0 for the first time since 2007 after a narrow 13-12 victory against San Diego last week. The Flyers won without the services of FCS-leading rusher Connor Kacsor as backup Tucker Yinger stepped in and caught two passes for 82 yards, including the Flyers' only touchdown. Linebacker Jack Crain was named the PFL's Co-Defensive Player of the Week after a massive 16-tackle outing that moved him into the No. 2 spot among league tacklers (10.6 per game) behind only Stetson's Donald Payne. Valparaiso returns home after dropping a 34-7 decision at Drake to split its two-game road trip. Quarterback Ryan Clarke completed 21-of-47 passes for 165 yards and the team's only touchdown in the loss. The Crusaders did record two interceptions in the contest with defensive back J.J. Nunes and defensive end Cody Cotton joining a list of five Valparaiso players with an interception this season.

► Drake at San Diego, 5 p.m.

The PFL's lone matchup of one-loss teams features Drake traveling to San Diego. Drake bounced back with a 34-7 home win against Valparaiso, but is winless on the road this season. Running back Conley Wilkins ran for two touchdowns and caught another in the win and leads the PFL in scoring (48 points) and scoring average (9.6 ppg) this season. Linebacker John Hugunin recorded his first career interception in the contest but it is just the fourth interception recorded by the Bulldogs defense, only Campbell (1 interception) has fewer this season. San Diego returns home after suffering a narrow 13-12 loss at Dayton to fall from the unbeaten ranks. It returns to Torero Stadium where it is 23-2 since 2011, including a 2-0 mark this season. Freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence owns a 132.5 pass efficiency rating entering the contest, completing 61.3 percent of his passes for 10 touchdowns and 906 yards. Defensive back Devyn Bryant has four interceptions – with a pick off in three of his five games this season.

Off Week: Marist

Marist will take Week 7 off after posting the only road win by a PFL team in Week 6, edging Campbell by a 13-10 margin. The Red Foxes break comes amid a three-game road trip which started at San Diego in Week 5, then to Campbell and ends in Week 8 at Davidson. Wide receiver Matt Tralli moved to within three receptions of the Marist all-time record, entering the break with 173 career catches. Meanwhile, free safety Zach Adler is nearing the Marist interceptions record, picking off his 17th career pass to move within one of the record.

Off Week: Morehead State

Morehead State enters its off week with a 2-1 record after a 34-21 homecoming victory against Butler. The Eagles will use the week to prepare for a Week 8 meeting at Campbell. Quarterback Austin Gahafer had a three-touchdown day for the fifth consecutive game and enters the break with 17 touchdowns passes this season and his 135.7 pass efficiency rating is best in the PFL. Linebacker Luke Keller, the Eagles leading tackler last season, returned after missing the season's first five games and recorded nine tackles. He missed the season's start due to a medical issue that threatened to end his career. Cornerback Justin Grier intercepted two passes in the game – one in the end zone and the second to end Butler's final drive.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.

BUTLER'S SHILTZ AMONG QB RUSHING LEADERS | Butler quarterback Matt Shiltz is the PFL's leading rusher among quarterbacks this season. He also is the leader among FCS quarterbacks in yards per carry with 8.63 yards per dash this season, which also ranks fourth among all FCS rushers.

DAYTON'S KACSOR AMONG FCS RUSHING LEADERS | Dayton redshirt senior running back Connor Kacsor became the first FCS rusher with two 200-yard outings this season. He followed his FCS-best 244-yard outing against Duquesne with a 229-yard effort against Kenesaw State that came on a FCS-best 44 rush attempts. However, he missed a Week 6 contest against San Diego. Despite the lost game, Kacsor ranks second among all FCS runners in yards per game (151.5) and ranks among the FCS top 20 in total yardage (11th, 606) and rushing touchdowns (15th, 6).

PROLIFIC GAHAFFER PACING MOREHEAD STATE | Morehead State junior quarterback ranks third among FCS signal callers in points responsibility, with 120 points after six weeks. He has had a hand in 20 of the Eagles' 21 touchdowns – 17 passing, 2 rushing and 1 receiving. Gahafer had a hand in MSU's first 17 touchdowns, a streak that ended when Rob Harden scored from two-yards out on the opening drive of a Week 6 win against Butler.

PFL GOING PICK CRAZY | Through the season's first four weeks, PFL defenses have recorded 78 interceptions in 59 games – most of any FCS league with the Colonial in second with 61 INTs in 64 games. Ten PFL defenders have two or more interceptions this season. Dayton's Cameron Stubbs and Morehead State's Justin Grier leading the way with five interceptions each.

MORE PASS DEFENSE CRAZINESS | In the Week 6 FCS statistics leaders, three PFL defenders lead the way in interceptions per game. Stubbs leads the FCS with 1.0 INTs per game followed by Grier (0.83) and San Diego's Devyn Bryant (0.80). They are joined by four other players to place seven PFL defenders in the FCS Top 10 in interceptions per game.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three tackle-for-loss effort. Behind his effort, Campbell recorded nine sacks for minus-61 yards and held Drake to 154 total yards while recording their first-ever win in the series.

FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY LIST | Campbell's Hunter Somerville, Dayton's Danny Leach and Marist's John Brennan were each named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The NFF will announce 15 finalists on Oct. 29, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

DRAKE NEARS 600TH WIN | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up Win No. 597 with a PFL-opening victory against Stetson in Week 4. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau, joining Dayton which has 651 all-time wins.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFFER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes

for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton record-setting running back Connor Kacsor was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season. Stetson safety Donald Payne, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, set the PFL's record for single-season tackles (175) and led all FCS defensive players in tackles per game (14.6).
