Is a "Trap Week" ahead for unbeaten Dayton and Jacksonville? One week before Jacksonville travels to Dayton, both teams will face stout tests in Week 8... Dayton, which seeks to become the first PFL team to reach 100 conference wins, returns home to face a one-loss Butler squad that still has designs on the league title... Jacksonville begins a two-game road trip at a Drake squad that is unbeaten at home this season... Meanwhile, Stetson travels north for its first-ever meeting at Valparaiso, the Hatters seeking their first road win while the Crusaders seek their first win at Brown Field in 2015... A Marist trip to Davidson will start the day as Marist ends a three-game road trip over four weeks, including two trips to North Carolina... Morehead State heads across the Appalachian Mountains for a meeting with Campbell - the Eagles seeking to stay atop the league's standings while the Camels seek to rebound from a loss in their last home outing... San Diego steps out of conference play to host Warner, putting its 3-0 mark at Torero Stadium on the line... Freshmen dominated the PFL's Weekly Awards, winning both the Offensive (San Diego's Anthony Lawrence) and Special Teams (Jacksonville's Emoni Williams) honors while a junior won the Defensive award (Butler's Josh Willis)... In fact, six of this week's nominees were freshmen, including three of the seven nominees for the league's offensive award.

Williams returned a kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown to help Jacksonville overcome Edward Waters, 49-28, in nonconference action, Saturday. The 88 yard return was just the capstone of an impressive outing that saw the freshman kick returner amass 152 yards on three returns. Williams opened the game with a 51-yard return, broke off the 88-yard touchdown in the second quarter and finished the day with a 13-yard return on a short field. It is the second-most kickoff return yardage in the PFL and one of the top 25 efforts this in the FCS this season.

KICKOFF CAPSULES

► Marist at Davidson, 1 p.m.

Marist returns to action after its off week and completes a three-game roadtrip at Davidson. The Red Foxes began their road trip at San Diego, Sept. 26, then travelled to Campbell, Oct. 10, before this week's contest – a total of nearly 8,500 miles round trip. The Wildcats return home after traveling to Indianapolis last week where they suffered a 38-7 loss to Butler. **Marist** has won all eight trips it has made to North Carolina, posting 4-0 marks against Davidson and Campbell. Wide receiver Matt Tralli moved to within three receptions of the Marist all-time record, entering the break with 173 career catches. Meanwhile, free safety Zach Adler is nearing the Marist interceptions record, picking off his 17th career pass to move within one of the record. **Davidson** was held to a season-low 37 rushing yards at Butler while its 201 passing yards tied a season best. Quarterback Taylor Mitchell completed 16-of-28 passes for 201 yards, but was sacked five times, losing 30 yards. The Wildcats entered the game with just nine sacks allowed in their first five games.

► Jacksonville at Drake, 2 p.m.

Unbeaten Jacksonville begins a two-game road trip that will provide its sternest test in PFL play this season when it travels to Drake. The Dolphins improved their best-ever start to 6-0 with a nonconference win against intra-city foe Edward Waters. The Bulldogs suffered their second PFL loss this season and second shutout this season at San Diego. **Jacksonville** meets Drake one week before its Week 9 showdown with fellow unbeaten Dayton. Wide receiver Ulysses Bryant led the Dolphins in rushing (75 yards) and receiving (119 yards) in last week's win, tying his career best in receiving yards while also catching two touchdowns. Freshman Emoni Williams was named the PFL's Special Teams Player of the Week, becoming the third PFL player to return a kickoff for a touchdown. **Drake** begins a stretch where it will play its final four games against teams ahead of it in the standings, giving it the opportunity to play spoiler down the stretch. The Bulldogs amassed just 274 offensive yards in the loss at San Diego, falling to 0-4 in games where they do not record 300 offensive yards. Drake punter Cam Bohnert averaged 41.5 yards on eight punts on the West Coast and now has punted a league-most 46 times this season, averaging 39.3 yards per boot.

► Stetson at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

Stetson makes the long trek northward to face Valparaiso in the first-ever meeting between the two teams. The Hatters were held to two Grant Amick field goals in a loss to Campbell last week. The Crusaders saw four turnovers turned into 17 points in a loss to Dayton. **Stetson** has played the league's toughest schedule to date, meeting both unbeaten – Dayton and Jacksonville – along with two-win squads Campbell and Drake. The Hatters defense, led Saturday by defensive back Donald Payne's 17-tackle outing, met the league's top individual rusher for a second straight week and came out ahead in the battle. Stetson held Campbell running back DeShawn Jones to 44 yards after he entered the game with 639 rushing yards. **Valparaiso** scored two touchdowns in a game for only the second time this season. Saturday freshman wideout Jean Rene was on the receiving end of both Crusaders touchdowns – his only two catches on the day and he had three touchdowns on 15 receptions this season. Defensive end John Guilford had 3½ tackles for loss against Dayton and his eight tackles for loss leads Valparaiso and ranks third among PFL tacklers.

► Morehead State at Campbell, 4 p.m.

Morehead State will head across the Appalachian Mountains for the fourth time this season to face Campbell in a battle of two-win PFL squads. The Eagles return to action after their off week as one of three PFL teams with one loss, tied for third with a 2-1 record. The Camels recorded their second PFL win, leveling their record at 2-2 on the road at Stetson last week. **Morehead State** quarterback Austin Gahafer has thrown three or more touchdowns in five consecutive games and its tied with Jacksonville's Kade Bell with 17 touchdown throws this season. Cornerback Justin Grier intercepted two passes in MSU's last game – one in the end zone and the second to end Butler's final drive – and is tied for the PFL lead with five interceptions this season. **Campbell** turned up the defense in the second half to launch its come-from-behind effort. The Camels defense held Stetson to 38 offensive yards in the second frame, and finished the game with 11 tackles for loss and five sacks – bringing their league-leading totals to 56 TFLs and 28 sacks. Defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye is ranked second in the PFL with five sacks and seventh in tackles for loss (7.0)

► Butler at Dayton, 6 p.m.

Dayton seeks its 100th PFL victory when it hosts Butler at Welcome Stadium, Saturday. The Flyers posted their 99th PFL victory in their 130th game, with a Week 7 win at Valparaiso. The Bulldogs improved to 2-1 in league play (one game behind Dayton) with a win at Davidson last week. **Butler** spread the ball out against Davidson with five different players scoring a touchdown, including three players recording their first career touchdowns. The Bulldogs have quietly become the PFL's top scoring team, averaging 30.5 points per game, scoring at least two touchdowns in every game this season. Quarterback Matt Shiltz leads that offense as the PFL's leading rusher among quarterbacks (454 yards, 75.7 per game) and ranking second in total offense (297.2 ypg) behind Jacksonville's Kade Bell. **Dayton** is making due without running back Connor Kacsor who was lost for the season due to an injury before a Week 6 contest after leading the FCS in rushing through five weeks. The Flyers backfield is now composed of freshman running back Tucker Yinger and freshman quarterback Alex Jeske the duo combining for 258 of Dayton's 342 offensive yards against Valparaiso. Senior kicker William Will made three field goals in that Week 7 win and leads all PFL kickers in field goals made (11) and points scored (52, 8.7 ppg).

► Warner at San Diego, 9 p.m.

San Diego steps out of conference play when it hosts a NAIA Warner squad that will make the cross-country trip from Lake Wales, Florida. The Toreros pitched their first shutout since 2013 (24 games) in a PFL win against Drake. The Royals bring a five-game losing streak into the meeting after falling to Belhaven (Miss.) last week. San Diego quarterback Anthony Lawrence was named the STATS FCS Freshman of the Week after composing his first 300-yard against a Drake team that had not allowed a 300-yard passing performance this season. Meanwhile, the Toreros defense held Drake to 274 offensive yards, including just 61 rushing yards, as it posted 12 tackles for loss and six sacks in the game. Nine different tackles notched a TFL, including Jonathan Peterson, who had a team-best 2½ tackles for loss. It was a rare outburst by the USD defense which had just nine sacks and 27 tackles for loss entering the affair. Warner quarterback D.J. Davis is averaging 181.9 total offensive yards per game and has four rushing touchdowns, five passing touchdowns and eight interceptions this season.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.

DAYTON AIMING FOR 100TH PFL WIN | Dayton seeks to become the first PFL squad to record 100 conference wins when it hosts Butler in Week 8. The Flyers won their 99th PFL contest against Valparaiso in their 130th PFL outing – a .762 conference win percentage. Head coach Rick Chamberlin – in his 41st season as a player, assistant coach or head coach at Dayton – has been on the sideline for all 99 wins, including 44 in eight seasons as head coach.

BUTLER'S SHILTZ AMONG QB RUSHING LEADERS | Butler quarterback Matt Shiltz is the PFL's leading rusher among quarterbacks this season. He also was the leader among FCS quarterbacks in yards per carry prior to Week 7, but fell out of the rankings prior to Week 8 as he did not meet the NCAA minimum of 10 rushes per game (he has 56 carries in 6 games). Still his 8.11 yards per carry would lead all FCS quarterbacks and rank fifth among all FCS rushers.

PROLIFIC GAHAFER PACING MOREHEAD STATE | Morehead State junior quarterback ranks third among FCS signal callers in points responsibility, with 120 points after six weeks. He has had a hand in 20 of the Eagles' 21 touchdowns – 17 passing, 2 rushing and 1 receiving. Gahafer had a hand in MSU's first 17 touchdowns, a streak that ended when Rob Harden scored from two-yards out on the opening drive of a Week 6 win against Butler.

PFL GOING PICK CRAZY | Through the season's first four weeks, PFL defenses have recorded 86 interceptions in 68 games – most of any FCS league with the Colonial in second with 73 INTs in 75 games. Ten PFL defenders have two or more interceptions this season. Dayton's Cameron Stubbs, Morehead State's Justin Grier and San Diego's Devyn Bryant leading the way with five interceptions each.

MORE PASS DEFENSE CRAZINESS | In the Week 7 FCS statistics leaders, three PFL defenders lead the way in interceptions per game. Bryant, Stubbs and Grier lead the FCS with 0.8 INTs per game. They are joined by five other players to give the PFL eight defenders in the FCS Top 30 in interceptions per game (at least 0.50 INTs per game).

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | San Diego freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence was named STATS National FCS Freshman Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 7. He finished the game with his first career 300-yard performance against a Drake defense that had not allowed a 300-yard passer this season. He completed 22-of-33 passes with no interceptions and two touchdowns against the Bulldogs.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three tackle-for-loss effort. Behind his effort, Campbell recorded nine sacks for minus-61 yards and held Drake to 154 total yards while recording their first-ever win in the series.

FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY LIST | Campbell's Hunter Somerville, Dayton's Danny Leach and Marist's John Brennan were each named a semi-finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The NFF will announce 15 finalists on Oct. 29, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOSH JOHNSON BACK IN NFL | San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson returned to a NFL roster in Week 4 when he was signed by Indianapolis. He was with the Colts for two weeks before being picked up by Buffalo prior to Week 6. He has been in the NFL since the 2008 season.

2015 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

DRAKE NEARS 600TH WIN | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up Win No. 598 with a PFL victory against Valparaiso in Week 6. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau, joining Dayton which has 651 all-time wins.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFFER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton record-setting running back Connor Kacsor was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season. Stetson safety Donald Payne, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, set the PFL's record for single-season tackles (175) and led all FCS defensive players in tackles per game (14.6).
