LEAGUE NOTES

Halloween promises plenty of tricks and treats across the PFL... The biggest treat will be served in Ohio when unbeaten Dayton hosts a Jacksonville squad that was just knocked from the unbeaten ranks... It is the first of back-to-back games Dayton will play against one-loss PFL squads, with Morehead State waiting for a Week 10 matchup... Speaking of Morehead State, the Eagles return to action and will seek to remain among the one-loss squads while avoiding a Drake trick in Week 9... San Diego returns to PFL play with a cross-country trip to Stetson, the second-straight Florida opponent it will face after hosting Warner in Week 8... The league's two Tar Heel State members will square off in their eighth meeting all time when Campbell travels upstate to Davidson... The league's Week 9 action starts when Butler faces off against Marist in a matchup of the league's two 2-2 squads... Dayton is now one of five unbeaten FCS squads (Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, Harvard and McNeese State) left after eight weeks of play... The PFL's defenses accumulated 28 sacks and 21 turnovers (10 fumbles recovered, 11 interceptions) in Week 8... PFL defenses now have 99 interceptions this season in 79 team games played (1.25 interceptions per game)... Drake linebacker John Hugunin was named the STATS FCS National Defensive Player of the Week, the fourth PFL student-athlete to receive STATS FCS National weekly honors.

Saubert caught three touchdowns to help Drake down previously unbeaten PFL foe Jacksonville, 28-24, Saturday. His three touchdown catches tied the PFL single-game best this season and the first for a Drake receiver since 2003. Saubert caught nine passes for 118 yards – the first 100-yard receiving game by a Drake player this season. In addition, he blocked a punt to set up a Drake drive deep in Jacksonville territory. He helped cap the resulting drive with a nine-yard TD for an early 14-3 lead.

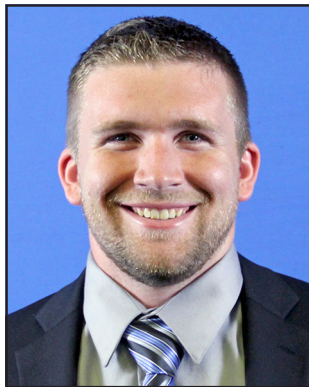

Hugunin recorded a career-high 20 tackles (10 solo) to spark Drake's defense in a 28-24 PFL victory against Jacksonville, Saturday. His 20 tackles were the most by a PFL defender this season and only the 10th time since 2002 a PFL player has recorded 20 or more tackles. Hugunin forced a pair of fumbles in the contest, including one to set up Drake's game-winning fourth-quarter drive. He also was credited with 1½ tackles for loss, all in sacks, one resulting in his other fumble forced.

Will was responsible for nine points in Dayton's 27-24 PFL victory against Butler, Saturday. His two field goals (he also was 3-3 PATs) came on either side of the third-quarter break and trimmed the Flyers deficit to 24-20. Will hit a 44-yarder with 2:22 left in the third and a 28-yard boot with 13:01 left in the game. He also handled kickoff duties and helped keep the PFL's top kickoff return group in check. Four of Will's six kickoffs went for touchbacks and the other two kicks were returned for an 18.5 yard average after Butler entered the game with a PFL best 26.9 yards per return on kickoffs.

KICKOFF CAPSULES

► Butler at Marist, Noon

A battle of two teams with 2-2 PFL marks will kick off Week 9 of PFL action when Butler travels to Marist. The Bulldogs finish up a back-to-back road stretch after falling at Dayton in Week 8. The Red Foxes return home after completing a sweep of the Tar Heel State PFL squads with a win at Davidson in Week 8. Butler quarterback Matt Shiltz rushed for 59 yards and a touchdown, but was more impressive with his arm as his 13 completions covered 319 yards (24.5 yards per completion), including a pair of touchdowns. Marist won its second straight game thanks to freshman wide receiver Juston Christian who caught 11 passes for 157 yards (14.3 yards per reception), including a touchdown. Defensively, the two squads are evenly matched from a yardage point of view. Butler ranks fifth in rush defense (133.9 ypg) ahead of Marist in sixth (137.0 ypg). Butler ranks 10th in pass defense (223.0 ypg) while Marist is 11th (225.1 ypg).

► Campbell at Davidson, 1 p.m.

The PFL's version of the Tar Heel State battle takes place in Week 9 when Campbell travels upstate to meet Davidson. Both teams are coming off home losses in Week 9 – the Camels falling to Morehead State while the Wildcats fell to Marist. Campbell saw its special teams and defense chip in the first 14 points in the Week 8 loss as Aaron Blockmon returned a first-quarter kickoff 95 yards for a score to tie the game. Chris Beaty then returned an interception 50 yards for a go-ahead touchdown in the second quarter. Davidson showed off its big play ability against Marist when Taylor Mitchell found William Morris for a 92-yard passing touchdown for an early 10-0 lead. The Camels have seen their season haunted by turnovers, bringing a minus-14 turnover margin into the weekend matchup. Davidson has a minus-five turnover margin entering the weekend.

► Drake at Morehead State, 1 p.m.

Will Drake play spoiler for a second consecutive week when it travels to Morehead State? The Bulldogs handed Jacksonville its first loss of 2015 and now prepares to meet second-place Morehead State. The Eagles moved into second thanks to its first road win of 2015 at Campbell. Drake players snatched the PFL's offensive and defensive honors in Week 8 with tight end Eric Saubert catching three touchdown passes for offensive award while linebacker John Hugunin wrapped up the defensive honor with a 20-tackle performance. It was the first 20-tackle performance by a Drake player since the 2002 season when Eric Papp posted 20 tackles against San Diego. Meanwhile, Morehead State needed Christian Robinson's two fourth-quarter rushing touchdowns – his first touchdowns this season – to escape Buies Creek with a win. The Eagles did not record a passing touchdown in the Week 8 affair, after posting 18 passing touchdowns in its previous five games. Their four rushing touchdowns against Campbell was their most since an Oct. 25, 2014 win at Valparaiso. Defensively, MSU's Justin Grier nabbed his sixth interception this season in Week 8, taking over the FCS and PFL lead.

► Jacksonville at Dayton, 1 p.m.

PFL-unbeaten Dayton plays the first of two games against current one-loss teams when it hosts Jacksonville. The Dolphins fell from the unbeaten ranks with a Week 8 loss at Drake. The Flyers needed 10 fourth-quarter points to down Butler for their 100th PFL victory. Jacksonville was held to 336 offensive yards in the loss, its fewest yards against a Division I opponent since being held to 222 yards at South-eastern Louisiana in Week 1 of the 2014 season. Running back Ulysses Bryant posted his second 100-yard rushing performance in the loss, which included a touchdown that gave JU its largest lead, 24-14. Linebacker Grady Redding finished the Drake contest with a team-best 11 tackles, including two tackles for loss, giving him 5½ tackles for loss this season. Freshman running back Tucker Yinger rushed for just 55 net yards, but 50 of those came on his game-winning touchdown with 7:10 left in the game. He enters the week with 298 all-purpose yards, 167 of those on the ground. Defensive end Nick Surges helped save the day in the fourth quarter, forcing a fumble that stopped a Butler drive deep in Dayton territory and set up the eventual game-winning drive. He then had a sack that pushed the Bulldogs back far enough that a potential game-tying field goal fell short.

► San Diego at Stetson, 1 p.m.

San Diego returns to PFL action with a cross-country trip to Stetson. It will be the second-straight contest against a Florida school for the Toreros, who defeated NAIA foe Warner in Week 8. The Hatters return to DeLand after notching its first road win of 2015 at Valparaiso. San Diego rolled up a season-high 525 offensive yards against Warner, nearly evenly split between rushing (247) and passing (278). Freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence posted his third four touchdown outing of the year, with four different receivers catching a touchdown. Jamal Agnew had an interception and a pass breakup in the win and now has 12 passes defended on the season, second most in the PFL. Stetson's defense held Valparaiso to just 162 yards in the Week 8 win, its fewest yards allowed to an opponent this season. Cornerback Chris Atkins had a hand in that effort with his 34-yard interception return for a touchdown, his 12th career interception. The Hatters offense churned out 34 points with four different players scoring a touchdown and two kickers combining for three field goals, including Grant Amick's 50-yard field goal – the longest made by a PFL player this season.

Off Week: Valparaiso

Valparaiso will take its off week in Week 9 after back-to-back home games. The Crusaders scored just 14 points in each of those two home outings, falling to Butler and Stetson. Valparaiso running back Jarrett Morgan's one-yard touchdown run with 38 seconds left against Stetson was the team's first rushing touchdown this season. Linebacker Alex Green's 16-tackle effort against Stetson was the season-best for any Crusader tackler and he ranks second among league defenders with 81 tackles (11.6 per game).

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.

DAYTON FIRST TO RECORD 100TH PFL WIN | Dayton became the first PFL squad to record 100 conference wins when it defeated Butler in Week 8. The Flyers won their 100th PFL contest in their 131st PFL outing – a .763 conference win percentage. Head coach Rick Chamberlin – in his 41st season as a player, assistant coach or head coach at Dayton – has been on the sideline for all 100 wins, including 45 victories in eight seasons as head coach.

DRAKE NEARS 600TH ALL-TIME VICTORY | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up win No. 599 with a PFL victory against Jacksonville in Week 8. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau.

BUTLER'S SHILTZ AMONG QB RUSHING LEADERS | Butler quarterback Matt Shiltz is the PFL's leading rusher among quarterbacks this season and ranks 10th among all FCS quarterbacks with 73.3 yards per game. Shiltz also returned to the NCAA's listing of FCS leaders in yards per carry, ranking ninth among all rushers (second among quarterbacks) with 6.84 yards per carry.

PROLIFIC GAHAFER PACING MOREHEAD STATE | Morehead State junior quarterback (and Butler's Shiltz) ranks ninth among FCS signal callers in points responsibility, with 126 points after seven weeks. He has had a hand in 21 of the Eagles' 25 touchdowns – 17 passing, 3 rushing and 1 receiving. Gahafer had a hand in MSU's first 17 touchdowns, a streak that ended when Rob Harden scored from two-yards out on the opening drive of a Week 6 win against Butler.

PFL GOING PICK CRAZY | Through Week 8, PFL defenses have recorded 99 interceptions in 79 games – most of any FCS league with the Colonial in second with 78 INTs in 84 games. Seventeen PFL defenders have two or more interceptions this season. Morehead State's Justin Grier leads the way with six interceptions.

MORE PASS DEFENSE CRAZINESS | In the Week 7 FCS statistics leaders, four PFL defenders lead the way in interceptions per game. Grier leads all FCS defenders with six interceptions in seven games (0.86 pg). San Diego's Devyn Bryant, Jacksonville's Dallas Jackson and Dayton's Cameron Stubbs are each tied for second with five interceptions in seven games (0.71 pg).

DRAKE'S HUGUNIN 4TH PFL PLAYER TO EARN STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Drake redshirt senior linebacker John Hugunin became the fourth PFL player to earn STATS National FCS Player of the Week honors, picking up the defensive award after his Week 8 effort against Jacksonville. He recorded a career-high 20 tackles (fourth most in a FCS single game this season), 10 solo, with 1 1/2 sacks and forced two fumbles. One of the fumbles set up the Bulldogs' winning touchdown drive in the fourth quarter, and the other came off one of his sacks.

FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY LIST | Campbell's Hunter Somerville, Dayton's Danny Leach and Marist's John Brennan were each named a semi-finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The NFF will announce 15 finalists on Oct. 29, and each of them will receive a \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOSH JOHNSON BACK IN NFL | San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson returned to a NFL roster in Week 4 when he was signed by Indianapolis. He was with the Colts for two weeks before being picked up by Buffalo prior to Week 6. He has been in the NFL since the 2008 season.

2015 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | San Diego freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence was named STATS National FCS Freshman Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 7. He finished the game with his first career 300-yard performance against a Drake defense that had not allowed a 300-yard passer this season. He completed 22-of-33 passes with no interceptions and two touchdowns against the Bulldogs.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three tackle-for-loss effort. Behind his effort, Campbell recorded nine sacks for minus-61 yards and held Drake to 154 total yards while recording their first-ever win in the series.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFAER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Dayton record-setting running back Connor Kacsor was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.
