LEAGUE NOTES

Dayton enters Week 10 with an opportunity to take control of its own destiny in the 2015 PFL Championship race... The Flyers travel to Morehead State where a Dayton win would leave just one one-loss team in the league – a San Diego side it defeated earlier this season – with two PFL weekends remaining... Dayton has won the last six meetings against Morehead State, but the Eagles are unbeaten at Jayne Stadium this season (3-0) after a triple overtime victory in Week 9... San Diego returns home and will look to keep the pressure on the Flyers when it hosts a Campbell squad that has won its last two road contests... If Morehead State and San Diego each win it would create a three-way tie for the title that may not be resolved until the regular-season's final weekend...A surging Marist squad has won its last three PFL outings and stays home to host Stetson... The Hoosier Helmet will be on the table when Valparaiso travels down Interstate 65 to face in-state foe Butler... Jacksonville returns home after dropping both ends of its back-to-back road trip to host Davidson... Dayton enters Week 10 as one of only two FCS teams with a double-digit win streak, its 10-game win streak trailing only Harvard's 22-game win streak... In Week 9, the PFL saw two more rushers join the 200-yard club – Drake's Conley Wilkins (205 yds) and Campbell De'Shawn Jones (201 yds)... San Diego quarterback Anthony Lawrence's 453-yard performance was the best in the PFL this season... In addition, San Diego Brian Riley (177 yds) and Marist's Juston Christian (171 yds) set the league's top two receiving yardage marks during the Halloween weekend.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE



Justin Cornwall, Morehead State
Senior | Slot Receiver
Cincinnati, Ohio

Cornwall caught three touchdown passes, including one in overtime, to help Morehead State secure a 38-35 triple-overtime victory against Drake, Saturday. He caught 10 passes for 134 yards with touchdown receptions of 19, 14 and 25 yards. Cornwall's 25-yard touchdown catch came on the Eagles only play of the second overtime, helping force a third extra period. Ealier, his 14-yard TD receipt gave MSU a 21-14 halftime lead. Cornwall also had a 30-yard reception on 3rd-and-10 to keep a Morehead State scoring drive alive in the second quarter. It was the most receiving yards allowed by the Drake defense this season.



De'Shawn Jones, Campbell Junior | Running Back Greensboro, North Carolina

Jones rushed for a school-record 201 yards as Campbell downed Davidson, 39-9 in PFL action Saturday. He also set the Campbell single-season rushing record, ending the game with 946 yards with two games remaining in the campaign. Jones had 19 carries in the contest, with three touchdown runs of 51, 59 and two yards in the win. He now has five touchdown carries of 50-plus yards this season. It was the most yards allowed to a single rusher by the Davidson defense this season.

Luke Keller, Morehead State
Senior | Linebacker
Lucasville, Ohio

In just his third game back, Keller posted a PFL season-best $4\frac{1}{2}$ tackles for loss in Morehead State's 38-35 triple-overtime victory against Drake, Saturday. Just three games into his return after being cleared from a potential career-ending blood infection, he notched his career high in sacks. Keller finished with 14 tackles (eight solo) and also had two sacks and a pass breakup.




Christian Searles, Dayton Sophomore | Cornerback Chicago, Illinois

Searles intercepted a pass in the end zone to keep Jacksonville off the board in the first half of Dayton's 31-14 PFL victory against Jacksonville. The only interception in the contest, it came with Jacksonville on the Dayton five-yard line with under a minute left in the first half and helped secure a 24-0 Dayton halftime lead. He also recorded seven tackles (five solo) in the contest and had 42 yards on four punt returns.

Sean Smith, Dayton Freshman | Punter Avondale, Pennsylvania

Smith took over the PFL's punting lead in Week 9, averaging 43.8 yards per punt in Dayton's 31-14 win against Jacksonville, Saturday. Four of his punts were downed inside the 20-yard line, with his two shortest punts (35 and 36 yards) each downed inside the 10-yard line. The Dolphins managed just one yard on punt returns against him while the other four punts were downed. Jacksonville's averaging starting position after Smith's punts was its own 12-yard line. Smith is averaging a league-best 42.7 yards per punt in league play this season.

KICKOFF CAPSULES

Davidson at Jacksonville, 1 p.m.

Davidson travels down the Atlantic Coast to square off against Jacksonville. The Wildcats return to the road after dropping both games of its two-game homestand, including a loss to Campbell last week. The Dolphins return home seeking an end their own two-game losing streak after falling at Dayton last week. Davidson was held to a season-low three yards rushing in the loss to Campbell. Quarterback Taylor Mitchell completed 18 passes for 160 yards including a 41-yard touchdown connection with William Morris. Jacksonville also could not get its ground game going at Dayton, finishing with a season-low 36 yards. Backup quarterback Rylan Wells entered the loss at Dayton with five minutes remaining in the third quarter and completed 11-of-18 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns in his first significant action this season (he had two pass attempts entering the season). Linebacker Grady Redding finished with 14 tackles and now leads JU with 62 total tackles.

Dayton at Morehead State, 1 p.m.

Unbeaten Dayton puts its 10-game win streak on the line when it travels to upstart Morehead State. The Flyers' 8-0 start following a win against Jacksonville is their best in 14 seasons and their 10-game win streak is one of only two FCS win streaks of 10 or more games. The Eagles' 4-1 PFL start is their best five-game conference mark since 2007 and they own a six-game win streak at Jayne Stadium. Dayton quarterback Alex Jeske completed 20-of-23 passes for 180 yards, his 87 pass completion percentage the best in the PFL this season (minimum 15 passes) and third best in the FCS this season. In addition, freshman running back Tucker Yinger rushed for a career-high 122 yards in the win. Morehead State's triple-overtime victory against Drake may have been costly as quarterback Austin Gahafer left in the fourth quarter after suffering an injury. Backup Jack Sherry stepped in and completed 6-of-9 passes for 95 yards and two touchdowns, including a 25-yard touchdown to Justin Cornwall in the second overtime. Cornwall caught 10 passes, including three for touchdowns in the victory, he now has a PFL-best 11 touchdown receptions this season.

Stetson at Marist, 1 p.m.

Stetson heads northward for a meeting against a surging Marist squad. The Hatters return to the road after suffering a loss to San Diego that saw it allow a season-most 644 yards. The Red Foxes downed Butler for their third straight win to move above .500 on the season. Stetson did not commit a turnover in its loss to San Diego and is 0-2 all-time when not committing a turnover. Hatters quarterback Ryan Tentler rushed for 105 yards against San Diego and moved past the 1,000 career rushing yard mark. Safety Donald Payne, just a junior, is second among the NCAA's career active leaders list with 381 total tackles (behind Drake senior linebacker John Hugunin). Payne has averaged 12.29 tackles per game during his three-year career. Marist has intercepted six passes (22 passes defended) during its three-game win streak and has held opponents to 14 points or less in all three wins. Wide receiver Juston Christian caught just five passes but amassed 171 yards for a PFL single-game best 34.2 yards per reception. Safety Alex Spiess was the latest Red Foxes defender to record an interception. Six different Marist players have recorded an interception during its current win streak.

Valparaiso at Butler, 1 p.m.

The 10th anniversary of the Hoosier Helmet will see Valparaiso travel down Interstate 65 to Butler. Since the creation of the Hoosier Helmet Trophy, Butler has won seven of the nine meetings in the series and leads the all-time series 48-25. The Bulldogs return to the Butler Bowl after dropping both games of its back-to-back road games, including a loss at Marist last week. Butler did not gain a first down via a rush in the contest after being held to a season-low 44 rushing yards, but had 17 passing first downs as they accumulated 318 offensive yards. Quarterback Matt Shiltz completed 23-of-50 passes for 263 yards, completing passes to six different receivers, but none for touchdowns. Valparaiso returns to action after its off week and seeks to end a threegame losing streak. The Crusaders were held to a season-low 162 offensive yards in their last outing – a loss to Stetson. That outing saw Valparaiso score its first rushing touchdown this season when Jarrett Morgan found the end zone with 38 seconds remaining in the game.

Campbell at San Diego, 3 p.m.

Two of the PFL's top rushing offenses square off against two of the league's top rushing defenses when Campbell travels cross-country to San Diego. The Camels enter the game as the PFL's top rushing offense, averaging 182.3 yards per game in league action. The Toreros rushing offense is second in the PFL with 155.8 yards per game. Both those efforts will be put to the test in Saturday's meeting as San Diego (2nd, 85.6 yards per game) and Campbell (3rd, 91.7 ypg) are among the league's top rush defenses. Camels running back De'Shawn Jones rushed for a school-record 201 yards against Davidson, also surpassing the Campbell career rushing mark when he ended the game with 946 career rushing yards. San Diego puts its 21-game home win streak against PFL teams on the line, the Toreros last lost at home to a PFL squad came Oct. 9, 2010 to Dayton. Torero freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence pieced together the second-best passing performance in San Diego history with 453 yards against Stetson last week. It sparked a 644-yard offensive performance by the Toreros, which included a 177-yard receiving performance by Brian Riley. Both Lawrence's and Riley's efforts are the best in the PFL this season.

Off Week: Drake

Drake gets its week off in Week 10 before returning to action against Butler. The Bulldogs enter the break after playing in a triple-overtime loss at Morehead State. Junior running back Conley Wilkins had a career-high 201 yards on 31 carries in the loss. Senior linebacker John Hugunin forced his ninth fumble in the loss, he is one shy of the FCS single-season record set by Alabama A&M's Robert Mathis (currently with the NFL's Indianapolis Colts) in 2002. He also has 393 career tackles after a 15-tackle performance at Morehead State.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

FLYERS JOIN CRIMSON WITH DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN STREAK | Dayton enters Week 10 as one of only two FCS teams with a double-digit win streak. The Flyers 10-game win streak trails only Harvard's 21-game win streak among FCS teams. Dayton's last loss came Nov. 8, 2014 to Drake.

DRAKE NEARS 600TH ALL-TIME VICTORY | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up win No. 599 with a PFL victory against Jacksonville in Week 8. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau.

TWO PFL TACKLERS LEAD NCAA ACTIVE CAREER LIST | Drake senior linebacker John Hugunin and Stetson junior safety Donald Payne are ranked first and second on the NCAA's Active Career Leaders List for total tackles. Hugunin has recorded 394 career tackles and his 9.85 tackles per game ranks fourth in the FCS. Payne, who owns a career 12.29 tackles per game that leads the FCS, has 381 career tackles.

BUTLER'S SHILTZ AMONG QB RUSHING LEADERS | Butler quarterback Matt Shiltz is the PFL's leading rusher among quarterbacks this season and ranks 12th among all FCS quarterbacks with 65.1 yards per game. Shiltz also returned to the NCAA's listing of FCS leaders in yards per carry, ranking 20th among all rushers (second among quarterbacks) with 5.99 yards per carry.

PROLIFIC GAHAFER PACING MOREHEAD STATE | Morehead State junior quarterback ranks 10th among FCS signal callers in points responsibility, with 138 points. He has had a hand in 23 of the Eagles' 30 touchdowns – 19 passing, 3 rushing and 1 receiving. Gahafer had a hand in MSU's first 17 touchdowns, a streak that ended when Rob Harden scored from two-yards out on the opening drive of a Week 6 win against Butler.

PFL GOING PICK CRAZY | Through Week 8, PFL defenses have recorded 106 interceptions in 89 games – most of any FCS league with the Colonial in second with 95 INTs in 96 games. Fourteen PFL defenders have three or more interceptions this season. Morehead State's Justin Grier leads the way with seven interceptions.

MORE PASS DEFENSE CRAZINESS | Among the FCS statistics leaders, four PFL defenders lead the way in interceptions per game. Grier is one of three FCS defenders with seven interceptions in eight games, a FCS best 0.88 int/per game. Nine PFL defenders are ranked among the FCS Top 20 in interceptions per game.

DAYTON FIRST TO RECORD 100TH PFL WIN | Dayton became the first PFL squad to record 100 conference wins when it defeated Butler in Week 8. The Flyers won their 100th PFL contest in their 131st PFL outing – a .763 conference win percentage. Head coach Rick Chamberlin – in his 41st season as a player, assistant coach or head coach at Dayton – has been on the sideline for all 100 wins, including 45 victories in eight seasons as head coach.

DRAKE'S HUGUNIN 4TH PFL PLAYER TO EARN STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Drake redshirt senior linebacker John Hugunin became the fourth PFL player to earn STATS National FCS Player of the Week honors, picking up the defensive award after his Week 8 effort against Jacksonville. He recorded a career-high 20 tackles (fourth most in a FCS single game this season), 10 solo, with $1\,1/2$ sacks and forced two fumbles. One of the fumbles set up the Bulldogs' winning touchdown drive in the fourth quarter, and the other came off one of his sacks.

FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY LIST | Campbell's Hunter Somerville, Dayton's Danny Leach and Marist's John Brennan were each named a semi-finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The NFF will announce 15 finalists on Oct. 29, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOSH JOHNSON BACK IN NFL | San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson returned to a NFL roster in Week 4 when he was signed by Indianapolis. He was with the Colts

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | San Diego freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence was named STATS National FCS Freshman Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 7. He finished the game with his first career 300-yard performance against a Drake defense that had not allowed a 300-yard passer this season. He completed 22-of-33 passes with no interceptions and two touchdowns against the Bulldogs.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three tackle-for-loss effort. Behind his effort, Campbell recorded nine sacks for minus-61 yards and held Drake to 154 total yards while recording their first-ever win in the series.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

DAYTON'S KACSOR NAMED TO FCS OFFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST Dayton recordsetting running back Connor Kacsor was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Year Watch List. Kacsor is the reigning Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year after rushing for 1,547 yards last season as a junior.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM |

Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.
