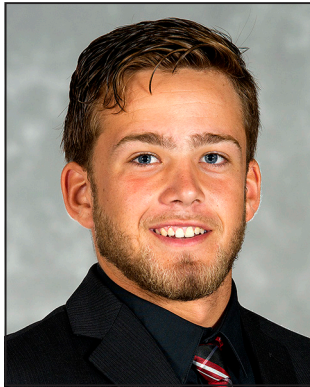
LEAGUE NOTES

Dayton - one of three remaining undefeated FCS teams (Harvard & McNeese State) - has an opportunity to clinch the 2015 PFL Championship when it hosts Marist in Week 11... If Dayton wins one of its two remaining games, it also would clinch the league's automatic bid to the Division I Football Championship (owns the head-to-head tiebreaker against San Diego)... Marist hopes to thwart the Flyers and extend their own four-game win streak... San Diego makes its second cross-country trip in a three-week span, this time to visit Davidson after the Toreros traveled to Stetson in Week 9... The PFL's Bulldog Battle will be held in Indianapolis this season when Drake travels to Butler for the 25th meeting between the two teams... Jacksonville heads up Interstate 95 to face a Campbell squad that will close out its 2015 slate with a home contest... Morehead State will seek a bounce-back outing when it travels to Valparaiso in a series that has seen the two teams combine for nearly 74 points per game (Morehead State averaging 48 points to Valparaiso's 26)... Stetson steps out of PFL play for the week to host Ave Maria in an in-state battle.

White led Marist to touchdowns on each of its first four drives to start the game. He completed 13-of-18 passes for 234 yards (18 yards per completion) as five of his completions went for more than 20 yards. White also was the Red Foxes leading rusher with 50 yards on five carries.

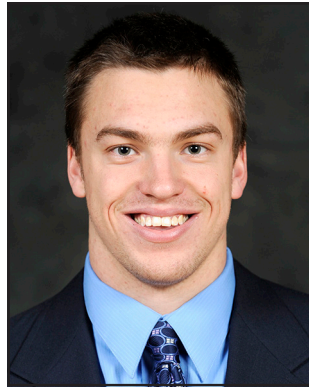

Leach may have single-handedly kept Dayton among the ranks of the FCS unbeatens with two interceptions in a 20-15 PFL victory at Morehead State. His first interception came in the Flyers end zone on the fourth quarter's second play and his 17-yard return helped set up Dayton's eventual game-winning drive. Then, with the Flyers clutching that lead, Leach intercepted a pass to end Morehead State's final drive and secure the win. He finished with seven tackles (six solo), including a tackle for loss. That tackle for loss was part of a sequence that bogged down the Eagles opening drive deep in Dayton territory and forced a field goal.

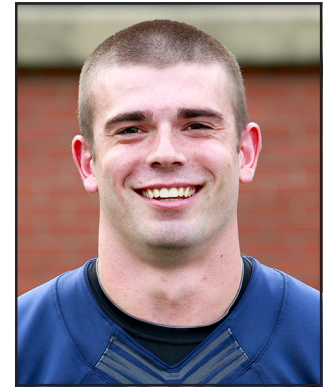

After opening up with a punt downed at the 13-yard line, he followed that with consecutive punts that forced Valparaiso to start at its 1, 2 and 3-yard line. Akialis finished the day with a punt out-of-bounds at the Crusader 10-yard line. Valparaiso did not score on the drive following any of his punts.

Dickens became the second PFL returner with a 100-yard kickoff return this season in Marist's 49-14 PFL victory against Stetson, Saturday. It was the longest kickoff return in Marist history and the program's first kickoff return for a touchdown in 11 seasons. Dickens' 100-yard return came with 1:43 left in the first half and helped the Red Foxes take a 35-14 lead into halftime. He also had a 16-yard kickoff return in the first quarter that led to a Marist touchdown on the ensuing drive.

KICKOFF CAPSULES

San Diego at Davidson, Noon

San Diego makes its second cross-country trek in three weeks when it travels to North Carolina for a meeting with Davidson. The Toreros kept the pressure on league-leading Dayton by holding on for a home victory against Campbell last week. The Wildcats return home after suffering a road loss at Jacksonville. San Diego leaned on its defense and special teams in the win as the offense was held to 332 yards, its third-lowest total this season. Defensive end Jonathan Petersen had 2½ tackles for loss and two sacks to pace a Torero defensive unit that finished with nine tackles for loss and three sacks. Petersen had a sack and fumble forced that set San Diego up at the Campbell 35-yard line and led to a touchdown late in the second quarter. Kicker Daniel McManus did the rest, hitting a 50-yard field goal on the next San Diego possession for a 23-21 halftime lead. Davidson returns home after a 12-point outing at Jacksonville in Week 10. Wide receiver William Morris caught his seventh touchdown pass of 2015 and reached the 600-yard mark for the season and passed the 3,000-career yard mark. He became just the sixth PFL receiver to record 3,000 career receiving yards. Kicker Trevor Smith added two field goals to the tally, hitting from 22 and a season-long 43 yards and now has made four consecutive field goals.

Drake at Butler, 1 p.m.

The 23rd edition of the PFL's "Bulldog Battle" takes place in Indianapolis when Drake travels to Butler. It will be the 25th meeting all-time between the two foes, Drake holding a 16-7-1 advantage. Drake returns to action after its off week following a Week 9 triple-overtime loss at Morehead State. Butler snapped a two-game losing streak with its home win against Valparaiso last week and has a 4-0 record at the Butler Bowl this season. Drake's 35-point effort at Morehead State in Week 9 was its second-highest offensive output of the year, but was not enough. DU surrendered more than 21 points for the seventh time in nine games, falling to 2-5 in those contests. Junior running back Conley Wilkins had a career-high 201 yards on 31 carries in the loss and now has 746 rushing yards this season. Butler needed just 310 offensive yards to pick up its win last week as its average starting field position was its own 42-yard line. Quarterback Matt Shiltz made the most of the short fields he was given, running for two touchdowns and passing for two more in the win. Meanwhile, the BU defense returned two interceptions for touchdowns, Isaac Newhouse and Jordan Massey each posting 14-yard interception returns.

Jacksonville at Campbell, 1 p.m.

Jacksonville heads up Interstate 95 this weekend to face Campbell. The Dolphins bounced back from consecutive road losses, downing Davidson at home. The Camels gave San Diego a battle until falling short in its fourth loss by four points or less this season. Jacksonville has had to work with quarterback by committee in its last two outings. Starter Kade Bell threw eight passes in the first quarter before leaving following a sack late in the period. Backup Rylan Wells came on and performed admirably, completing 18-of-24 passes for 318 yards and four touchdowns. He now has completed 69 percent (29-of-42) of his passes for 572 yards (19.7 yards per completion) and six touchdowns in two weeks off the bench. Campbell had San Diego on the ropes as it converted its two interceptions – one each by Jack Ryan and Chris Beaty – for a 14-7 lead after the first quarter. But the Camels scored just 13 points the game's remainder and saw a potential game-winning drive thwarted by an interception at the San Diego 2-yard line with 1:05 left. Still, wide receiver Aaron Blockman caught five passes for a career-high 115 yards in the win, the third-most receiving yards by a Camels receiver in program history.

Marist at Dayton, 1 p.m.

Marist has the opportunity to play spoiler in Week 10 when it hosts league-leader Dayton. The Red Foxes bring a four-game win streak into the matchup with the offense posting a season-high 49 points in a win against Stetson last week. The Flyers have been a come-back team this season, posting their sixth win when trailing at halftime – this time victimizing Morehead State. While Marist scored a season-high 49 points, its defense had the highlight-reel day with 16 tackles for loss, including eight sacks – it is tied for most tackles for loss in a single game by a PFL team this season (Drake vs. Stetson). Wide receiver Matt Tralli caught a school-record three touchdowns in the win after entering the week with only one touchdown reception this season. Dayton turned the signal calling over to Alex Jeske on its seventh drive of the season and has had little reason to regret the move as the redshirt freshman has led Dayton to a 9-0 record. He completed 9-of-14 passes on third down for six conversions and a score at Morehead State. Safety Danny Leach's second two-interception outing of the season was a big factor in keeping Dayton unbeaten in Week 10, his four interceptions are sixth in the PFL this season, despite playing in just six games this season.

Morehead State at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

If recent history is a guide, Morehead State's trip to Valparaiso will be an entertaining one. The two teams have combined to average nearly 74 points per game (Morehead State averaging 48 points to Valparaiso's 26) since 2010, including last season's 48-47 MSU victory that required a touchdown in the final seconds to determine the result. This year, both teams enter the contest following a loss. Morehead State fell at home to league-leading Dayton while Valparaiso lost the Hoosier Helmet at Butler. Morehead State quarterback Austin Gahafer returned to action after leaving his Week 9 outing late in the fourth quarter. He completed 27-of-46 passes for 323 yards but had just one touchdown versus three interceptions – after entering the game with just six interceptions in his previous 353 pass attempts. Valparaiso played a nip-and-tuck offensive contest with Butler, being out-gained by a narrow 310-298 margin. However, the field position battle loomed large as the Crusaders average starting position was their own 17-yard line, versus the Bulldogs starting at their own 42-yard line. Running back Jake Hutson and quarterback Ryan Clarke each ran for a touchdown – the second and third rushing touchdowns of the season (out of 15) for Valparaiso.

Ave Maria at Stetson, 3 p.m.

Stetson steps out of PFL play this week as it hosts in-state NAIA foe Ave Maria. The Hatters surrendered eight sacks in its Week 10 loss at Marist. It has been a recurring theme for Stetson this season which has allowed a league-high 35 sacks this season, including four games of four or more sacks. When quarterback Ryan Tentler got into the open field, he was a dangerous presence with four of his runs beyond the line of scrimmage resulting in gains of 10 or more yards. He finished with 226 total offensive yards (34 rushing, 192 passing) despite seven sacks and 59 yards lost on those sacks. Ave Maria will bring a 4-6 record into the matchup after a loss to NAIA No. 21 Point University last week. The Gyrenes are 2-3 on the road this season, losing their last two road excursions. Quarterback Clayton Uecker has eight touchdown tosses (out of 24 touchdowns) and 1,089 yards passing in eight games this season.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

FCS-BEST 16 PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO COSIDA ACADEMIC TEAMS |

Sixteen Pioneer Football League student-athletes were recognized on the CoSIDA Academic All-District Teams™, Nov. 5. The PFL's 16 selections tied with the Missouri Valley Football Conference for most of an Division I Football conference, two more than the Big Ten Conference. Nine of the league's 11 members had at least one player named to the teams, Dayton leading the way with five selections. San Diego, Stetson and Valparaiso each had two players chosen while Campbell, Davidson, Drake, Marist and Morehead State had one each.

FLYERS JOIN CRIMSON WITH DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN STREAK | Dayton enters Week 11 as one of only two FCS teams with a double-digit win streak. The Flyers 10-game win streak trails only Harvard's 22-game win streak among FCS teams. Dayton's last loss came Nov. 8, 2014 to Drake.

DRAKE NEARS 600TH ALL-TIME VICTORY | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up win No. 599 with a PFL victory against Jacksonville in Week 8. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau.

TWO PFL TACKLERS LEAD NCAA ACTIVE CAREER LIST | Drake senior linebacker John Hugunin and Stetson junior safety Donald Payne are ranked first and second on the NCAA's Active Career Leaders List for total tackles. Hugunin has recorded 394 career tackles and his 9.85 tackles per game ranks fourth in the FCS. Payne, who owns a career 12.19 tackles per game that leads the FCS, has 390 career tackles.

BUTLER'S SHILTZ AMONG QB RUSHING LEADERS | Butler quarterback Matt Shiltz is the PFL's leading rusher among quarterbacks this season and ranks 14th among all FCS quarterbacks with 60.7 yards per game. Shiltz also returned to the NCAA's listing of FCS leaders in yards per carry, ranking 23rd among all rushers (second among quarterbacks) with 5.87 yards per carry.

SHILTZ, GAHAFAER PROLIFIC POINTS PRODUCERS | Butler senior Matt Shiltz and Morehead State junior Austin Gahafer ranks 9th and 12th, respectively, among FCS signal callers in points responsibility. Shiltz, averaging 17.3 points per game, has had a hand in 26 touchdowns (15 passing, 10 rushing and 1 receiving) or 156 of Butler's 263 points this season. Gahafer has been responsible for 146 of Morehead State's 253 points with 24 touchdowns (20 passing, 3 rushing, 1 receiving) and a two-point conversion.

PFL GOING PICK CRAZY | Through Week 10, PFL defenses have recorded 116 interceptions in 99 games – the most of any FCS league with the Colonial in second with 105 INTs in 107 games. Fifteen PFL defenders have three or more interceptions this season. Morehead State's Justin Grier leads the way with seven interceptions.

DAYTON FIRST TO RECORD 100TH PFL WIN | Dayton became the first PFL squad to record 100 conference wins when it defeated Butler in Week 8. The Flyers won their 100th PFL contest in their 131st PFL outing – a .763 conference win percentage. Head coach Rick Chamberlin – in his 41st season as a player, assistant coach or head coach at Dayton – has been on the sideline for all 100 wins, including 45 victories in eight seasons as head coach.

DRAKE'S HUGUNIN 4TH PFL PLAYER TO EARN STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Drake redshirt senior linebacker John Hugunin became the fourth PFL player to earn STATS National FCS Player of the Week honors, picking up the defensive award after his Week 8 effort against Jacksonville. He recorded a career-high 20 tackles (fourth most in a FCS single game this season), 10 solo, with 1 1/2 sacks and forced two fumbles. One of the fumbles set up the Bulldogs' winning touchdown drive in the fourth quarter, and the other came off one of his sacks.

FOUR PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY LIST | Campbell's Hunter Somerville, Dayton's Danny Leach and Marist's John Brennan were each named a semi-finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The NFF will announce 15 finalists on Oct. 29, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive

end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOSH JOHNSON BACK IN NFL | San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson returned to a NFL roster in Week 4 when he was signed by Indianapolis. He was with the Colts for two weeks before being picked up by Buffalo prior to Week 6. He has been in the NFL since the 2008 season.

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | San Diego freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence was named STATS National FCS Freshman Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 7. He finished the game with his first career 300-yard performance against a Drake defense that had not allowed a 300-yard passer this season. He completed 22-of-33 passes with no interceptions and two touchdowns against the Bulldogs.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three tackle-for-loss effort. Behind his effort, Campbell recorded nine sacks for minus-61 yards and held Drake to 154 total yards while recording their first-ever win in the series.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFAER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.
