LEAGUE STORYLINES

Dayton has clinched its first appearance in the NCAA Division I Football Championship (owns the head-to-head tiebreaker with San Diego in case of a tie) and now seeks sole possession of its 12th PFL Championship (it claimed a share with its Week 11 win) when it travels to Drake... The Flyers, whose 12-game win streak now is the longest in the FCS, enter the regular season's final week as one of only two FCS teams without a loss this season (McNeese State)... Drake will seek to put a mark on Dayton's clean slate in a game played at Drake Stadium where it is 4-0 this season, the Bulldogs also have won the last two meetings in the series... San Diego lurks in the background with one loss and will host Butler seeking a share of the PFL title if Dayton falls, the Toreros are 5-0 at home this season... Morehead State will seek to cap its best season since 2007 (winning overall record and third in PFL race) when it travels to Marist, which has won its last three home games... Davidson travels to Stetson seeking to end a long PFL losing streak while Stetson will seek its second PFL win this season... Valparaiso looks to match last season's 2-6 PFL mark when it heads to Jacksonville which seeks to match last season's 9-2 overall record.

Raymond caught a 17-yard game-winning touchdown pass from Austin Gahafer with 2:45 left in Morehead State's 36-29 PFL victory against Valparaiso, Saturday. He caught two touchdown passes and threw another in the contest. He threw a 20-yard pass to Gahafer early in the second quarter to give the Eagles their first lead. Raymond then was on the receiving end of a 44-yard pass from Gahafer to extend the lead to 28-17 in the third quarter. He finished the day with six receptions for 88 yards and two touchdowns. It is the second time Raymond has thrown a pass this season and both have gone to Gahafer for touchdowns.

Shiltz threw two touchdown passes, including the game-winner to lead Butler past Drake, 20-13, in Saturday PFL action. After Drake took a 13-10 lead late in the third quarter, Shiltz needed just two passes to push Butler back ahead. A 56-yard strike to John Hall ended the third quarter and he opened the fourth with a 14-yard touchdown pass to Marquess Martin-Hayes for a 17-13 lead. Shiltz amassed 287 offensive yards, rushing for 60 and completing 19-of-28 passes for 227 yards without an interception.

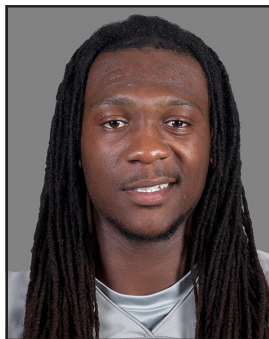

After Morehead State took the lead, Grier's interception on the ensuing drive came just after Valparaiso entered Eagles territory. Grier's earlier interception stopped a Valparaiso drive at the Morehead State 35-yard line and set up a Morehead State scoring drive. Grier's two interceptions and two pass breakups came with seven tackles (six solo).

Behr's two field goals helped Jacksonville secure a 20-14 PFL victory at Campbell, Saturday. He connected on a 32-yard field goal in the first quarter for a 10-0 JU lead. Later, Behr hit a 38-yard field goal for a 20-7 Jacksonville lead with 1:15 remaining in the game. He connected on both his PATs to finish with eight of JU's 20 points. Behr also handled kick-off duties, averaging 56.8 yards on five kickoffs.

KICKOFF CAPSULES

Davidson at Stetson, 1 p.m.

Davidson will take a 500-mile trip south to face Stetson in the seventh meeting all-time between the two teams. Davidson seeks to end a five-game losing streak that it saw extended with a home loss to San Diego last weekend. The Hatters picked up a home win in a non-conference tilt against in-state foe Ave Maria. Davidson's defense recorded nine tackles for loss and six sacks in the effort against San Diego with defensive lineman Boo Jordan notched three sacks in four tackles – San Diego had allowed just 12 sacks entering the weekend. Wildcats receiver William Morris had six receptions for 68 yards moving further into 3,000-yard territory. He enters the final weekend with 3,094 career receiving yards in 227 receptions – both second among FCS active career leaders. Stetson had its way with Ave Maria, posting program records for rushing yards (353), rushing touchdowns (six) and points scored (60). Quarterback Ryan Tentler had a team-best 93 rushing yards in that outing and finished the game with 231 total offensive yards. Defensive back Eric Martin notched his team-leading fourth interception against Ave Maria, but returned this one 30-yards for his first pick-six of the 2015 season.

Morehead State at Marist, 1 p.m.

Morehead State seeks sole possession of third place in the PFL standings when it hosts Marist, which is seeking to edge its way into third place. The Eagles insured their best finish since 2007 with last week's win at Valparaiso. The Red Foxes saw their four-game win streak stopped by a loss at league-champion Dayton. Morehead State quarterback Austin Gahafer enters the final week needing just 23 yards to become the second signal-caller to record 3,000 passing yards in a season. His 2,977 yards this season includes a PFL best 23 touchdown tosses, he also has three rushing scores and has caught two touchdown passes this season. Cornerback Justin Grier's two interceptions at Valparaiso gave him a program-record nine interceptions, a total that also leads all FCS defensive players. Marist running back Marcellus Calhoun nearly single-handedly pulled his team back into the loss at Dayton, scoring three second half touchdowns as part of a 156-yard rushing performance. Free safety Zach Adler had a fumble recovery against Dayton, no small feat against a Flyer team that has surrendered just 12 giveaways this season, and tied for the team lead with eight tackles.

Valparaiso at Jacksonville, 1 p.m.

Valparaiso faces a tall task as it seeks to end a five-game losing streak when it travels to face Jacksonville which has not lost a home game this season. The Crusaders posted their second-highest point total (29) in last week's loss to Morehead State. The Dolphins defense held an opponent to 14 points or less for the fifth time this season, defeating Campbell. Quarterback Scott Staal set career-highs in completions (32) and passing yards (337), more than doubling his totals in both categories in his fourth outing this season. Cornerback A.J. Bradley had a hand into two turnovers, forcing a fumble that was recovered and led to a touchdown and later intercepting a pass. Jacksonville quarterback Rylan Wells made the start at Campbell and completed 11-of-20 passes for 115 yards in his first start this season. The Dolphins defense picked off four passes in last week's win, Brandon Roe and Armani Sampson each picking off a pass to join Andrew Hooks' two picks. Jacksonville is tied with Dayton for most interceptions entering the final week, each team picking off 19 passes.

Dayton at Drake, 2 p.m.

Dayton seeks its first unbeaten season since 1996 when it travels to Drake, which will seek to play the spoiler's role. The Flyers bring their FCS-best 12-game win streak into the contest, which they extended with a narrow victory against Marist last week. The Bulldogs return home after a one touchdown loss at Butler that kept it at 599 all-time wins. Drake has won the last two meetings and three of the last four in the series, including last season's 34-30 thriller in Dayton. Flyers running back Tucker Yinger posted a 237-yard performance last week that was the best effort by a first-year player and 12th best this season in the FCS. Meanwhile, cornerback Christian Searles nabbed his fourth interception this season, his 50-yard return pushing him to 124 interception return yards (31.0 per return) this season. Drake's defense continues to be led by John Hugunin who posted 12 tackles at Butler and had a fumble recovery. It was the 15th time he has had a hand in turnover or near-turnover this season (one interception, three fumbles recovered, nine fumbles forced). Offensively, quarterback Cody Thibault started and made his fifth appearance this season, while running back Tyler Updegraff made his third appearance and rushed for a career-best 79 yards in the Butler contest.

Butler at San Diego, 4 p.m.

San Diego looks to cap its fourth straight one-loss PFL campaign when it hosts Butler which enters the game seeking to stay above .500 in PFL play with a win. The Toreros posted their fifth-straight win at Davidson last Saturday, scoring more than 30 points for the fourth consecutive game. The Bulldogs takes a two-game win streak on the road after a win against rival Drake. San Diego is unbeaten (5-0) at Torero Stadium while Butler is just 1-4 on the road this season. Butler quarterback Matt Shiltz has carried the load for his team this year, ranking second among PFL signal callers with 299.7 yards of total offense in PFL action. No small part of that total is his 369 rushing yards (52.7 per game) that ranks seventh in the league and includes six rushing touchdowns. Safety Isaak Newhouse recorded his sixth interception against Drake and had a fumble forced. He is second among league defenders in interceptions this season. San Diego quarterback Anthony Lawrence has impressed in his first season under center, posting a 151.5 pass efficiency rating that leads the PFL and ranks 16th among FCS quarterbacks. Sophomore safety Colton Giorgi added 10 tackles (seven solo) to help hold Davidson to 228 offensive yards (48 rushing) and leads San Diego with 62 tackles this season.

Off Week: Campbell

Campbell closed its 2015 campaign with a home loss to Jacksonville. The Camels saw running back De'Shawn Jones break the school record for rushing yards, his 82-yard effort pushing him over 1,000 yards. His 1,079 yards this season also helped him break the career record with 1,991 yards after his junior campaign. Defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye had seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack. His 6.5 sacks this season ranks fifth among PFL defenders and his 9.0 tackles for loss are 18th most.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

FLYERS CLINCH SHARE OF 12TH PFL TITLE | Dayton clinched a share of its 12th PFL title with last Saturday's win against Marist. It is the Flyers first title since 2010 and seventh since 2000.

DAYTON TO PLAY IN NCAA FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP | The Flyers also clinched the PFL's automatic bid to the 2015 Division I Football Championship. It will be Dayton's first appearance in the championship and they are the third different team to earn the league's automatic bid since it became available in 2013. Dayton was a regular in the NCAA's Division III Championships (2-time champion, 3-time runner-up) prior to divisional reorganization in 1992 which led to the creation of the Pioneer Football League in 1993.

SELECTION SHOW SUNDAY | Dayton will discover the opponent for its first-ever NCAA Division I Football Championship contest during the 11 a.m. (ET), Sunday Selection Show, available on ESPNU and the WatchESPN App.

FLYERS ALONE IN FCS WITH DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN STREAK | Dayton enters Week 11 as the only FCS team with a double-digit win streak. The Flyers 11-game win streak trails extends back to a Nov. 8, 2014 loss to Drake – this week's opponent.

FCS-BEST 16 PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO COSIDA ACADEMIC TEAMS | Sixteen Pioneer Football League student-athletes were recognized on the CoSIDA Academic All-District Teams™, Nov. 5. The PFL's 16 selections tied with the Missouri Valley Football Conference for most of a Division I Football conference, two more than the Big Ten Conference. Nine of the league's 11 members had at least one player named to the teams, Dayton leading the way with five selections. San Diego, Stetson and Valparaiso each had two players chosen while Campbell, Davidson, Drake, Marist and Morehead State had one each.

DRAKE SEEKING 600TH ALL-TIME VICTORY | Drake entered the 2014 campaign with 595 victories in the 121 years of the program's history – five shy of reaching 600. The Bulldogs picked up win No. 599 with a PFL victory against Jacksonville in Week 8. Drake is seeking to become only the 17th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau.

DAYTON FIRST TO RECORD 100TH PFL WIN | Dayton became the first PFL squad to record 100 conference wins when it defeated Butler in Week 8. The Flyers won their 100th PFL contest in their 131st PFL outing – a .763 conference win percentage. Head coach Rick Chamberlin – in his 41st season as a player, assistant coach or head coach at Dayton – has been on the sideline for all 100 wins, including 45 victories in eight seasons as head coach.

DRAKE'S HUGUNIN 4TH PFL PLAYER TO EARN STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Drake redshirt senior linebacker John Hugunin became the fourth PFL player to earn STATS National FCS Player of the Week honors, picking up the defensive award after his Week 8 effort against Jacksonville. He recorded a career-high 20 tackles (fourth most in a FCS single game this season), 10 solo, with 1 1/2 sacks and forced two fumbles. One of the fumbles set up the Bulldogs' winning touchdown drive in the fourth quarter, and the other came off one of his sacks.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOSH JOHNSON BACK IN NFL | San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson returned to a NFL roster in Week 4 when he was signed by Indianapolis. He was with the Colts for two weeks before being picked up by Buffalo prior to Week 6. He has been in the NFL since the 2008 season.

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | San Diego freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence was named STATS National FCS Freshman Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 7. He finished the game with his first career 300-yard performance against a Drake defense that had not allowed a 300-yard passer this season. He completed 22-of-33 passes with no interceptions and two touchdowns against the Bulldogs.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three

tackle-for-loss effort. Behind his effort, Campbell recorded nine sacks for minus-61 yards and held Drake to 154 total yards while recording their first-ever win in the series.

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFFER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season.
