GAME STORYLINES

Pioneer Football League champion Dayton will host Missouri Valley Football Conference member Western Illinois in a noon (ET), Saturday, contest at Welcome Stadium.

Dayton (10-1, 7-1 PFL) claimed a share of its 12th Pioneer Football League title, winning the season's first 10 games – accumulating a 12-game win streak dating back to last season – before dropping its season finale at Drake. The Flyers will make their first postseason appearance since moving to the Division I ranks in 1993.

The Flyers become the third different PFL team to receive the league's automatic bid since the league received an automatic bid to the now 24-team tournament beginning with the 2013 championship. Dayton also becomes the second PFL team to host a first-round contest, joining Butler which hosted Tennessee State in the 2013 tournament.

Dayton won the PFL championship despite losing running back Connor Kacsor, the returning PFL offensive player of the year early in the season. In his place, the Flyers have relied on a freshman duo in the backfield – quarterback Alex Jeske and running back Tucker Yinger. Jeske finished the regular season ranked eighth among league passers in both passing yards per game and pass efficiency while Yinger finished fifth in rushing yards per game.

The Flyers defense was middle of the pack in yardage allowed and points allowed but its 27 turnovers forced (19 interceptions, 8 fumbles) helped Dayton lead the PFL in turnover margin (+14, 1.27 per game). In addition, Dayton's defense bent but did not break, allowing opponents to convert just league-leading 68 percent of their red zone opportunities, including only 11 touchdowns in 22 red zone trips. Senior linebacker



Christopher Beaschler led that defensive unit with 9.8 tackles per game (fifth in PFL) while senior defensive back Cameron Stubbs finished the regular season with 16 passes defended (1.45 per game, third in PFL), including six interceptions.

Western Illinois (6-5, 5-3 MVFC) won an at-large bid from the tournament committee after finishing in a three-way tie for third place in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. The Leathernecks played six teams in the tournament field, posting a 3-3 record against those teams. Western Illinois returns to the tournament for the first time since 2010.

The Leathernecks offense is led by senior running back Nikko Watson, a 1,000-yard rusher who is averaging 111.4 yards per game and has 13 touchdowns in 11 games. In the passing game, junior wide receiver Lance Lenoir has 994 receiving yards (90.4 per game) with five touchdown catches. Defensively, Western Illinois sophomore linebacker Brett Taylor has a team-best 123 tackles (11.2 per game).

Napier caught seven passes for a career-high 149 yards as Morehead State won a 20-17 PFL contest at Marist, Saturday. Five of his receptions went for first downs, including two catches for third-down conversions, and he had three catches of more than 30 yards on the day. His third catch of the contest was a 44-yard reception for the game's first touchdown. It was his second straight 100-yard performance and would have been better but he saw a 43-yard reception nullified by a penalty.

Brian Riley, San Diego Junior | Wide Receiver San Diego, California

Riley caught two touchdown passes, including the eventual game-winner in San Diego's 28-27 PFL victory against Butler. His game-winning catch went for 25 yards and helped give San Diego a 28-21 lead. Riley's first touchdown catch was a 24-yarder that put the Toreros ahead 14-0 in the first quarter. He finished the game with six catches for 139 yards, all six receptions resulting in a San Diego first down. Riley had two catches of more than 30 yards in the contest.

John Hugunin, Drake Senior (RS) | Linebacker Oswego, Illinois

Hugunin did a little bit of everything to help Drake end its 2015 campaign with a 27-17 PFL victory against Dayton, Saturday. With Drake leading 21-7 late in the third quarter, Dayton drove inside the Drake 30-yard line before Hugunin's interception ended the drive at the 18-yard line. He finished with a game-high 12 tackles (five solo) to become Drake's all-time leading tackler with 417 career stops. Hugunin also had a tackle for loss and a pass breakup to lead a Drake defense that held Dayton below 300 yards for the first time since Week 5.

Hale's interception of a two-point conversion helped San Diego secure a 28-27 PFL victory against Butler, Saturday. It was his second special teams play that kept Butler from scoring in the contest. Earlier, he blocked a field goal attempt at the end of the second half to preserve San Diego's 14-7 halftime lead. He also had six tackles (all solo) and a pass breakup in his normal cornerback position.

Smith's career-long 47-yard field goal with 1:24 left in the game helped Davidson post a 20-17 PFL victory at Stetson, Saturday. The field goal ended Davidson's 23-game PFL losing streak that dated back to the 2013 season. He also connected on a 36-yard field goal in the second quarter as Davidson built a 10-0 halftime lead. Smith finished the game with eight points (2-2 PATs) and also managed kick-off duties for the Wildcats.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

FLYERS CLINCH SHARE OF 12TH PFL TITLE | Dayton clinched a share of its 12th PFL title with its Week 11 win against Marist. It is the Flyers first title since 2010 and seventh since 2000. They have won a share of the title in 12 of the PFL's 23 seasons.

TOREROS GRAB SHARE OF 7TH LEAGUE CROWN | San Diego clinched a share of the PFL regular-season title with its regular-season ending win against Butler. The Toreros lone loss during the 2015 season came at Dayton. It is the fourth time in the last five seasons San Diego has claimed at least a share of the PFL title.

DRAKE JOINS 600-WIN CLUB | Drake's season-ending victory against PFL co-champion Dayton pushed it into the 600-win club. Drake became only the 18th active FCS program to reach the 600-win plateau, joining a select group that includes Dayton.

DAVIDSON ENDS LONG PFL LOSING STREAK | With Trevor Smith's 47-yard field goal in the closing minutes, Davidson downed Stetson to end the 2015 campaign. The win ended the Wildcats' 23-game PFL losing streak, which dated back to a Nov. 10, 2012 victory against Valparaiso.

PFL AWARDS WEEK STARTS NOV. 30 | The league begins its "Awards Week," Monday, with the presentation of the league's annual awards. The 23rd edition of the All-PFL squads will be presented Tuesday followed by the 23rd Academic All-PFL teams and the second Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.

FCS-BEST 16 PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO COSIDA ACADEMIC TEAMS |

Sixteen Pioneer Football League student-athletes were recognized on the CoSIDA Academic All-District Teams™, Nov. 5. The PFL's 16 selections tied with the Missouri Valley Football Conference for most of a Division I Football conference, two more than the Big Ten Conference. Nine of the league's 11 members had at least one player named to the teams, Dayton leading the way with five selections. San Diego, Stetson and Valparaiso each had two players chosen while Campbell, Davidson, Drake, Marist and Morehead State had one each.

DAYTON FIRST TO RECORD 100TH PFL WIN | Dayton became the first PFL squad to record 100 conference wins when it defeated Butler in Week 8. The Flyers won their 100th PFL contest in their 131st PFL outing – a .763 conference win percentage. Head coach Rick Chamberlin – in his 41st season as a player, assistant coach or head coach at Dayton – has been on the sideline for all 100 wins, including 45 victories in eight seasons as head coach.

DRAKE'S HUGUNIN 4TH PFL PLAYER TO EARN STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Drake redshirt senior linebacker John Hugunin became the fourth PFL player to earn STATS National FCS Player of the Week honors, picking up the defensive award after his Week 8 effort against Jacksonville. He recorded a career-high 20 tackles (fourth most in a FCS single game this season), $10 \operatorname{solo}$, with $1 \, 1/2 \operatorname{sacks}$ and forced two fumbles. One of the fumbles set up the Bulldogs' winning touchdown drive in the fourth quarter, and the other came off one of his sacks.

MARIST PAIR REPRESENT PFL IN NFL | Marist alumni Terrence Fede and Jason Myers are representing the Pioneer Football League on NFL opening-week rosters. Fede, a defensive end with the Miami Dolphins, had six tackles in Week 1 action. Myers, a kicker with the Jacksonville Jaguars, hit a game-winning 28-yard field goal in Week 2.

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOSH JOHNSON BACK IN NFL | San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson returned to a NFL roster in Week 4 when he was signed by Indianapolis. He was with the Colts for two weeks before being picked up by Buffalo prior to Week 6. He has been in the NFL since the 2008 season.

SAN DIEGO'S LAWRENCE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | San Diego freshman quarterback Anthony Lawrence was named STATS National FCS Freshman Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 7. He finished the game with his first career 300-yard performance against a Drake defense that had not allowed a 300-yard passer this season. He completed 22-of-33 passes with no interceptions and two touchdowns against the Bulldogs.

CAMPBELL'S AWURUONYE EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Senior defensive lineman Ugonna Awuruonye was named STATS National FCS Defensive Player of the Week after his performance against Drake in Week 5. He finished the game with three sacks, tying a school record and tied for fourth-most in the FCS this season, as part of a 10-tackle (3 solo), three

MOREHEAD STATE'S GAHAFER EARNS STATS NATIONAL FCS HONOR | Junior quarterback Austin Gahafer's was named STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week after his performance at VMI in Week 2. The junior signal-caller's 447 passing yards were the most in the PFL since his 458-yard outing at Valparaiso in 2013. Gahafer completed 35-of-62 passes for four touchdowns. He also caught a 23-yard touchdown pass that gave Morehead State a 40-33 lead in the fourth quarter. Gahafer becomes the first PFL player this season and first since Jacksonville's Kade Bell in Week 11 last season to earn national recognition.

STETSON'S PAYNE NAMED TO STATS FCS DEFENSIVE AWARD WATCH LIST | Stetson junior safety Donald Payne was one of 22 players named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. The Fayetteville, Georgia, native recorded a PFL record 174 tackles – a FCS best 14.5 per game – during his sophomore campaign.

TWO NAMED TO FRED MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Two Pioneer Football League kickers were named to the Fred Mitchell Award Watch List, Thursday. Davidson sophomore kicker Trevor Smith and Dayton senior placekicker William Will were among 41 Division I FCS, Division II, III, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) collegiate place-kickers that were nominated by their colleges for excellence on the football field and in the community.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. Stetson junior defensive back Donald Payne was a first-team selection, Dayton running back Connor Kacsor was a second-team selection and Davidson wide receiver William Morris picked up a third-team nod.

SIX PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2015 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM |

Six Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 197 nominees from across the country for the 24th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Butler's Matt Shiltz; Davidson's Christopher Woods Jr.; Dayton's Patrick Nuzzolese; Drake's John Hugunin; Marist's Zach Quarles; and San Diego's Devyn Bryant were each nominated for the honor. For 24 years the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® has served as one of the most coveted and prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. The award recognizes players whose charitable involvement and community service contributions stand out among all other student-athletes participating in the sport.

JACKSONVILLE INELIGIBLE IN 2015 | The Pioneer Football League concluded its review of Jacksonville University's football program's use of financial aid in July. In addition to the self-imposed penalties presented by Jacksonville, the PFL imposed a one-year ban on postseason play for the 2015 season, which also will preclude the program from being eligible for the league's regular-season title. Jacksonville's wins and losses during the 2015 season will count toward the determination of the league champion, but they will be listed at the bottom of the league's standings tables.

PFL ADDS SEVENTH MAJOR AWARD | This past summer league's presidents voted to add a Special Teams Player of the Year Award to its postseason accolades. The new honor will be selected as part of the league's All-PFL squad voting in November.

2014 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | The league's returning depth is highlighted by the return of both its 2014 Players of the Year. Dayton running back Connor Kacsor, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league in rushing yards (1,547) and touchdowns (17) while ranking fifth among FCS running back in yards per game (140.6) last season. Stetson safety Donald Payne, the returning PFL Defensive Player of the Year, set the PFL's record for single-season tackles (175) and led all FCS defensive players in tackles per game (14.6).

PFL'S 23RD CAMPAIGN | The 2015 season marks the 23rd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2015 NCAA FCS Championship.
