Next Up in Crusader Basketball: The Valparaiso University men's basketball team opens Horizon League play in front of a national television audience Friday afternoon as the Crusaders make the short jaunt to Chicago to face off with UIC on ESPN. Valpo has won the last 15 meetings in the series with the Flames.

Last Time Out: Alec Peters needed just 33 seconds to reach the 2,000 point milestone for his career on Wednesday night at the ARC, scoring the game's first basket, and the Crusaders never trailed in an 80-61 victory over Chicago State. Peters finished with 15 points and 14 rebounds, while Shane Hammink paced the Crusaders with 22 points.

Head Coach Matt Lottich: Matt Lottich is in his first season at the helm of the Valparaiso University men's basketball program in 2016-17 after being named the 22nd head coach in program history on April 7. Lottich previously served as an assistant coach for the last three seasons, helping Valpo earn 78 victories - including a school-record 30 last season - and a pair of Horizon League regular season titles.

Series Notes: UIC leads the all-time series against the Crusaders, 29-25, but Valpo owns a 16-3 advantage in the series since joining the Horizon League. In fact, the Crusaders have won 15 consecutive meetings with the Flames and haven't lost to UIC since February of 2009. Last season saw Valpo claim a pair of victories over the Flames, winning 75-47 at the ARC and 73-55 in Chicago. Alec Peters averaged 13.5 points and eight rebounds in the pair of wins, while Vashil Fernandez tallied 14 points, 22 rebounds and 12 blocks over the two victories.

...and the @HorizonLeague

- Valpo was picked to win the Horizon League in preseason polling, earning 35 of the 39 first-place votes.
- The Crusaders have not finished worse than their preseason projection in the last six years.
- Senior Alec Peters was named the league's Preseason Player of the Year, Valpo's first league preseason player of the year since Lubos Barton (2001-02, Mid-Con).
- Senior Shane Hammink joined Peters as a preseason All-League choice, earning a spot on the Second Team.

...looking back at last year

- The 2015-16 Crusader squad won a school-record 30 games, finishing the year 30-7.
- Valpo claimed the Horizon League regular season title by going 16-2 in league play, winning the league by three games.
- The Crusaders were the first Horizon League team to win the league title by at least three games since 2009-10.
- The regular season title was Valpo's fourth in a five-year span, a feat accomplished only by Butler and Xavier previously within the league.
- Valpo set new Horizon League records in league-only play for scoring margin, rebounds, rebounding average and rebound margin.
- The Crusaders received an automatic bid into the NIT and were awarded a 1 seed as one of the First Four Out of the NCAA Tournament.
- Valpo defeated Texas Southern, Florida State and Saint Mary's at the ARC to advance to the semifinals at Madison Square Garden in New York City.
- The Crusaders beat BYU in a thriller at MSG before falling in the championship game of the NIT to George Washington.
- Vashil Fernandez led the nation in blocked shots, was named National Defensive Player of the Year and repeated as Horizon League Defensive Player of the Year.
- Alec Peters was an AP Honorable Mention All-American and earned a spot on the All-Horizon League First Team for a second straight year.
- Bryce Drew repeated as Horizon League Coach of the Year.

...notes from Chicago State

- The Crusaders never trailed in the win, as they limited CSU to just 3-of-26 shooting to open the game - pulling out to a 20-point lead late in the first half.
- Alec Peters fell short of scoring 20 points for the first time this season, finishing with 15 points. He did dish out a season-high four assists and pulled down a game-best 14 rebounds for his seventh double-double of the campaign.
- Shane Hammink led the Crusaders in scoring for the second time this season, finishing with 22 points on 8-of-11 shooting from the floor. The senior also handed out five assists while committing just one turnover.
- Lexus Williams tied his season high and finished one shy of his career high with a game-best seven assists. As a team, the Crusaders handed out 23 assists on 27 made field goals.
- With fellow freshman Jaume Sorolla traveling back from Spain, freshman Derrik Smits made his first career start and tallied seven points, three rebounds and a blocked shot.
- Valpo shot 51.9% (27-of-52) from the floor for the game, finishing above the 50% mark for just the second time this year. The Crusaders also connected on 9-of-19 (47.4%) of their 3-point attempts.
- The Crusaders finished with a season-high 23 assists on their 27 made field goals.

...notes from Santa Clara

- The Crusaders had a streak of 20 consecutive non-league home victories snapped. Valpo's last home loss outside of league play came to New Mexico in December of 2014.
- The game was Valpo's first overtime affair at the ARC since falling to Mercer in triple overtime in November of 2013.
- Peters finished with 35 points in a career-high 50 minutes, not coming off the floor for a single second. The senior was 12-of-28 from the floor and made a season-best six 3-pointers. He also grabbed 13 rebounds for his sixth double-double of the year.
- Hammink joined Peters in playing the entire 50 minutes on Thursday night. The senior matched his career high for the third time this season by scoring 23 points, doing so on 8-of-12 shooting.
- The Crusaders were limited to just four second-chance points on six offensive rebounds and four bench points.

...looking ahead

- The Crusaders return home next weekend to host Oakland on Friday, Jan. 6 (an ESPN2 broadcast) and Detroit Mercy on Sunday, Jan. 8 (an American Sports Network broadcast).

...on the road

- Valpo enters this season having posted a winning record in true road games three of the last four years, after having not done so the previous 10 seasons.
- Last year, the Crusaders posted a 12-4 record in true road games - including an 8-1 mark on the road in Horizon League play.
- This year's team had just three true road games on the slate during non-league action and posted a 1-2 mark in those games, losing at Oregon and Kentucky while winning at Missouri State.

@UICFlamesMBB

- The Flames enter Horizon League play with a 7-6 mark on the season and are 5-2 at the UIC Pavilion this year.
- UIC has won three of its last four games, with its only blemish in that stretch an overtime loss to city rival Loyola.
- Preseason All-League honoree Dikembe Dixon is sidelined due to injury. Tai Odiase leads the Flames' active players with 12.5 points, 6.6 rebounds and 2.4 blocks per game.

Peters 2K

- Alec Peters needed just 33 seconds to score against Chicago State, becoming the second player in program history to reach 2,000 career points, joining Bryce Drew - who reached the mark Feb. 23, 1998 against UMKC.
- While Peters needed 118 games to reach the milestone as compared to 115 for Drew, Peters reached the mark in 3,669 minutes while Drew reached 2,000 points in 4,025 minutes of action.
- Peters and Drew both scored their second 1,000 points in exactly 50 games.
- Peters also became just the 11th player in Horizon League history to reach the 2,000-point milestone for his career.

Peters' Hot Start

- 13 games into the season, Alec Peters has scored at least 20 points in all but one game and is averaging 25.5 points/game - good for second nationally.
- Peters is also pulling down 10.3 rebounds/game and has recorded seven double-doubles - he has recorded at least nine rebounds in 12 of Valpo's 13 games.

- No college basketball player has averaged at least 26 points and 10 rebounds per game for a full season since Michael Beasley did so for Kansas State in 2007-08.

- Entering the Chicago State game, Peters ranked fourth nationally in both field goals and free throws made, 11th in free throw percentage, 19th in double-doubles and 30th in rebounding.

- Peters has been named Horizon League Player of the Week three times this season, giving him eight career weekly honors from the league.

- Peters has moved into second place in program history and is now 10th in Horizon League history in career scoring with 2,014 career points - just 24 points out of seventh position.

- Peters currently ranks second among all active players in career scoring, while his 118 consecutive games started is best among all D-I players.

20 Or More Points

- Alec Peters scored 20 or more points in each of Valpo's first 12 games this season, easily the longest streak of 20+ point games in recent Crusader history.

- Peters was held below the 20-point mark for the first time this year last time out against Chicago State, finishing with 15 points.

- Dating back to the 1994-95 season, Peters owns the two longest streaks of 20+ point games - he scored 20 or more in seven straight outings late last year.

- The longest streak of 20+ point games by somebody other than Peters in that span is five consecutive games - Bryce Drew (1996-97) and Dan Oppland (2004-05).

- The most games with 20 or more points in a single season in that span came in 2004-05, as Oppland scored at least 20 points on 18 occasions.

- Drew and Peters are the only Crusaders in that span with three separate seasons scoring 20+ points in at least 10 games.

Hammink Hammer

- Senior Shane Hammink has enjoyed a strong run of form over the last four games entering Horizon League play.

- Hammink has scored at least 15 points in all four games, including a game-high 22 points last time out in the win over Chicago State.

- Over that stretch, Hammink is averaging 19 points per game and hitting at a 62.8% clip from the field.

- After hitting just two of his first 22 3-point attempts of the year, Hammink has connected on eight of his last 18 from downtown.

Taking Advantage of Charity

- Valpo ranks among the nation's best free throw shooting teams heading into league play, hitting at a 79.6% clip from the foul line this season.

- Four of the Crusaders' top five players in free throw attempts are connecting at 74.4% or better from the foul line, led by Alec Peters' 92.9% clip.

- Through 13 games, Valpo has made just one fewer free throw (246) than its opponents have attempted (247).

- The Crusaders have connected on at least 80% of their free throw attempts in seven games this year.

Closing Out the Calendar Year

- The Crusaders are looking for their 31st win of the 2016 calendar year on Friday, as they have posted a 30-7 record since January 1st.

- Alec Peters and Shane Hammink are the only Valpo players to have played in all 37 games this year.

- Peters enters Friday's game just nine points away from finishing the 2016 calendar year with 800 points.

- A win on Friday would bookend the year with victories over UIC, as Valpo beat the Flames at the ARC on January 2.

Non-League Success

- The Crusaders enter league play with at least 10 victories under their belt for the fourth time in the last five years following Wednesday's victory.

- Valpo owns a 51-19 (.729) record in pre-league action since the Horizon League eliminated the early December league weekend prior to the 2012-13 season.

- This is the second straight year that Valpo has entered league play with a 10-3 record in the pre-league campaign.

Continued Success Within the League

- Valpo has been strong within Horizon League play since joining the league prior to the 2007-08 season.

- The Crusaders own a league record of 101-55 (.647) in their first nine years as a Horizon League member and have had just one sub-.500 season in league play.

- Valpo has captured four of the last five Horizon League regular season titles.

Beating Ranked Teams

- Valpo snapped a 40-game winless streak against nationally-ranked opposition on Nov. 29 with the win over Rhode Island.
- The Crusaders had not taken down a top-25 opponent since their win over Ole Miss in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament.
- Prior to the win over the Rams, Valpo had not earned a home win over a top-25 team since beating Notre Dame in December of 1988.

Starting on a Winning Note

- Head coach Matt Lottich became the first Crusader coach in 36 years to open his head coaching tenure at Valpo with a win with the victory over SUU.
- Tom Smith was the last Valpo head coach to start his Crusader career with a win, winning three straight in six days at home to open the 1980-81 campaign.
- The Drews all faced tough competition in their head coaching debuts at Valpo: Homer at Butler, Scott at eventual national champion Syracuse, and Bryce at Arizona.
- Lottich was the first coach to start his Valpo career with a 7-1 record since Wilbur Allen started off the 1949-50 season by winning seven of the season's first eight games.

Addition to the Trophy Case

- Valpo's wins over Alabama and BYU gave the Crusaders the Heavyweight championship belt at the Men Who Speak Up Main Event.
- The title is the program's fourth in-season championship in the last seven years.
- Valpo most recently earned the championship trophy in November 2014 at the Challenge in Music City.
- The Crusaders took home top honors in November 2010 at the Las Vegas Invitational and in December 2010 at the Lou Henson Award Tournament.

Wins Over Power Conference Foes

- Valpo's win over Alabama marked its third over a power conference opponent in the last two seasons.
- The Crusaders went on the road to beat Oregon State last season and then took down Florida State at the ARC in the second round of the NIT.
- Prior to last season's win over Oregon State, Valpo had not defeated a team from the power-5 conferences since winning at Washington in the 2008 CBI.
- Nine out of Valpo's last 12 victories over opponents out of the power-5 conferences have come on neutral courts.

A Look at the Record Book

- Lexus Williams matched the program's single-game steals record with seven against Trinity Christian.
- Williams tied a record previously shared by Milo Stovall (Dec. 12, 1999 - Texas A&M-CC) and Bryce Drew (Dec. 7, 1996 - Milwaukee).
- Meanwhile, Alec Peters attempted 29 shots versus the Trolls - the most by a Crusader in at least 22 years. Peters then tossed up 28 shots last time out against Santa Clara.
- Valpo matched a program record as a team with a perfect performance at the foul line at Oregon, going 14-of-14 from the charity stripe.
- The Crusaders' 17 steals against Ball State as a team were third-most all-time, just two shy of the record of 19 (vs. Centenary, 12/10/88).
- Williams picked up six steals against the Cardinals, tied for fourth-most in a game by a single player.

What's Back

- The Crusaders welcomed back eight letterwinners from last season's 30-win squad, including a pair of starters in Alec Peters and Tevonn Walker.
- In all, Valpo returned 50% of its minutes played, 57.1% of its scoring and 47.5% of its rebounding from last year.

What's New

- Five players are in their first season of eligibility for the Crusaders this year.
- 7'2" Derrik Smits has taken the court this season for the first time after redshirting last season due to injury.
- 6'11" Spaniard Jaume Sorolla, who most recently helped the Spain U20 squad win the 2016 FIBA U20 European Championship, and guard Micah Bradford, ranked among the top-20 players in the state of Illinois, join Valpo as scholarship freshmen.
- The Crusaders also welcome a pair of walk-ons in senior Jason Karys - a three-year team manager - and freshman John Kiser.

High Praise Entering the Year

- Despite losing nearly half their scoring from last year's squad, this year's Crusader team still received quite a bit of national love entering the year.
- Valpo has been a near-unanimous choice to win the Horizon League among national media projections.
- The Crusaders entered the season receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- Valpo was ranked #51 on CBS Sports' ranking of all Division I teams, and began the season #69 in the Ken Pomeroy ratings.
- Matt Norlander of CBS Sports named Valpo one of his teams to watch as a potential March sleeper.

Peters Garners Accolades

- Coming off of a season in which he was named an Honorable Mention All-American, Alec Peters entered the 2016-17 season receiving a lot of notice as one of the nation's top players.
- Peters was tabbed a Third Team preseason All-American by Blue Ribbon Magazine and NBC Sports, among others.
- Peters earned a spot on the watch list for the Naismith Trophy and the Wooden Award, both of which are awarded to the National Player of the Year.
- In rankings of the nation's top players, Peters ranked #16 on CBS Sports' list and #29 on NBC Sports' list.
- Peters is on the Karl Malone Award watch list, awarded to the nation's top power forward, and also appears on College Insider's Lute Olson Award (national Player of the Year) and Lou Henson Award (national mid-major Player of the Year) watch lists.
- Peters topped Mark Adams' list of best players in leagues covered by the American Sports Network, and was named the #1 most complete player in the nation by Bleacher Report.
- Peters was tabbed the nation's Best Shooter by a pair of Sports Illustrated college basketball writers in their season preview materials.

The International Flavor

- This year's squad continues the international pipeline that Valpo has cultivated over the past two decades.
- The Crusaders boast four international players on this year's roster from three different countries.

Crusaders Sign Pair During Early Signing Period

- Hazen enters his senior year ranked #7 in his class in the state of Indiana according to ESPN.
- Hazen was an Indiana Junior All-Star following last season, as he averaged 15.8 points and 6.6 rebounds per game in helping the Eagles to their second straight sectional title.
- McMillan averaged nearly seven rebounds per game as a junior for a Merrillville team which went 22-2.
- McMillan stood out at the Indiana Top 80 camp in early October, as he was named the camp's Mr. Defender.

Head Coach

Valparaiso University President Mark A. Heckler, Ph.D., and Director of Athletics Mark LaBarbera announced Thursday, April 7, 2016 that Matt Lottich has been hired as the 22nd head coach in the history of the Valpo men's basketball program. Lottich, who has been a member of the Crusader coaching staff for the last three years, is just the program's fifth head coach in the last 36 years.

Lottich arrived at Valparaiso University in summer 2013 and has spent the last three seasons as an assistant coach on the Valpo men's basketball coaching staff, helping guide the Crusaders to 78 victories during that span. Valpo has won two Horizon League regular season championships and one league tournament title in Lottich's tenure.

The Crusaders have recorded the top two victory totals in program history in the last two seasons with Lottich on the bench. Valpo broke the previous school record for wins in a season during the 2014-2015 campaign, winning 28 games and earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament. This past season, Valpo won a program-record 30 games and advanced to the NIT championship game at Madison Square Garden.

Lottich brings nearly a decade of professional playing experience to the head coaching position at Valparaiso University. Lottich spent eight years playing professionally in Japan for the Oita Heat Devils and the Osaka Evessa, earning All-Star recognition four times. He also played one season in Germany in the Bundesliga for the Dusseldorf Giants, played one season in New Zealand in the NBL for the Harbor Heat and was a member of the New Jersey Nets' summer league team in 2004.

Lottich played collegiately at Stanford University from 2000 through 2004. As a senior in 2003-2004, he helped lead the Cardinal to the Pac-10 title while earning NABC All-Star plaudits, awarded to the top-15 seniors in college basketball. He was also a member of the Wooden Award midseason watch list and was an Honorable Mention All Pac-10 selection as a senior. Lottich was also a member of the program's conference championship squad as a freshman in 2000-2001 and still ranks among Stanford's single-season and career leaders in 3-pointers made.

Off the court, Lottich came to Valpo from the National Collegiate Scouting Association, where he started in January 2013. Lottich ascended to the position of head scout during his time with the NCSA, which helps high school athletes navigate the world of college recruiting. Lottich also co-founded the TEAM Life Skills basketball camp in 2004 and spent nine years managing and developing the camp.

Lottich played his prep basketball at New Trier [Ill.] H.S., where he was named the Chicago Tribune Athlete of the Year in 2000 and holds the distinction of being the program's all-time leading scorer. Lottich graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and currently resides in Valparaiso with his wife, Kylan, and their four children: Grace, Matthan, Christian and Landon.

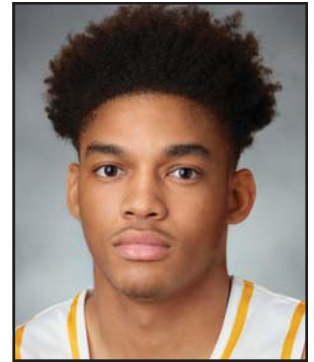

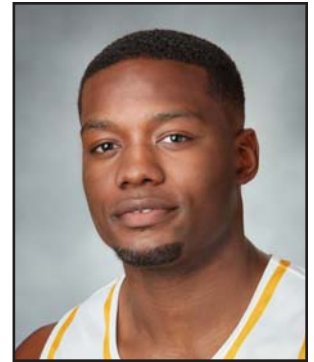
