Next Up in Crusader Basketball: The Valparaiso University women's basketball team faces a tough test on Thursday night, as perennial Horizon League powerhouse Green Bay visits the Athletics-Recreation Center. The Phoenix have won 18 straight Horizon League regular season titles. Valpo will play Green Bay twice in the next five games.

Last Time Out: Oakland went on an 18-0 run in the first quarter of Saturday's game at the O'rena in Rochester, Mich. and Valpo could never recover in an eventual 104-63 defeat. The Crusaders were led in scoring by Meredith Hamlet and Dani Franklin, who poured in 18 points apiece. Hamlet set a season high in scoring while also leading the team in rebounding for the first time in her Valpo career with five boards.

Following the Crusaders: Thursday's game and every game for the remainder of the season will be available on ESPN3, WatchESPN.com and the ESPN app. In addition, live audio will be available. Jake Wulbert will handle play-by-play duties, with Renee' Turpa providing color commentary. Links to live video, audio and stats can be found on ValpoAthletics.com.

Head Coach Tracey Dorow: Tracey Dorow (38-98) is in her fifth season at the helm of the Valparaiso women's basketball program in 2016-17. She collected her 250th career victory on Nov. 14, 2014 with a $91-57$ win over Butler. In her first season, Dorow led the Crusaders to 11 victories, including five in Horizon League play. Last year, Valpo again reached a double-figure win total by notching 10 triumphs, including an upset of Detroit Mercy in the Horizon League Tournament. Dorow arrived in Valparaiso after 14 seasons at Ferris State. She compiled a 232-163 record while with the Bulldogs. Ferris State posted the No. 1 grade point average in all of Division II for the 1999-2000 women's basketball season as well as the No. 2 ranking in 2002-03.

Series Notes: Green Bay holds a 35-4 lead in the all-time series. The Phoenix have won 21 consecutive meetings between the two teams, a streak that dates back to February 2008. Valpo is 2-16 all-time when the Phoenix visit the Athlet-ics-Recreation Center. Green Bay won the most recent meeting between the two squads 71-35 on Feb. 20 of last season. Green Bay's stifling defense held Valpo

to eight points or fewer in three of the four quarters. Valpo's most recent win over Green Bay came on Jan. 19, 2008 at the ARC, 90-88 in overtime. Launa Hochstetler drained a 3-pointer as time expired in overtime to propel Valpo to victory.

## Worth Noting

- Dani Franklin currently sits in 18th on Valpo's all-time scoring list and needs 14 points on Thursday to pass Aimee Litka (2005-2009) for 17 th in career scoring. Litka, now Aimee Niespodziany, is in her sixth season as the head coach at Holy Cross, a member of the NAIA Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference. Litka ranked ninth in the Horizon League as a senior at 11.8 points per game and was a member of the team that knocked off nationally ranked Purdue in 2008.
- Meredith Hamlet shot 8-of-14 from the floor on her way to a sea-son-high 18 points on Saturday at Oakland. She also pulled down five boards to lead the team in rebounding for the first time in her Valpo career. Hamlet has scored double figures in three straight games and four of the last five. In two career games at Oakland - the place where both of her sisters started their collegiate careers - Hamlet has totaled 40 points after scoring 22 at the O'rena a year ago.
- Franklin ranks 30th in the nation in scoring and leads the Horizon League at 19.5 points per game. She also leads the Horizon League and ranks 21st nationally with a 46.9 3-point shooting percentage.
- Amber Lindfors leads the league and is tied for 23rd in the nation in blocked shots at 2.5 per game. She's tied with former Wright State player Richelle van der Keijl, who transferred to New Mexico to play for Mike Bradbury.
- Valpo is attempting to dodge its fourth straight Horizon League home opening loss and will seek its first victory to open a calendar year since 2013.

- The Crusaders have had more all-freshman team honorees in the last two years (3) than they did in the previous 12 seasons combined (2). - Valpo reached double-figure wins for the first time since 2012-2013 a year ago with 10 victories. They also captured five league wins for the first time since '12-13.
- Valpo has seven players on the roster listed at 6-foot or taller. The last time Valpo had that many players measure in at 6-foot or taller was the 2010-11 season.
- The five freshmen are also Valpo's most since 2010-11.
- Since joining the Horizon League in 2007-08, Valpo is 49-108.
- Valpo has had one first team all-league selection (Launa Hochstetler, 2008-09) and two second team all-league players (Agnieszka Kulaga, 2007-08; Tabitha Gerardot, 2012-13).
- Valpo also boasts five representatives on the all-newcomer team
(Lauren Kenney, 2008-09; Gerardot, 2010-11; Dani Franklin, 2014-15; Jasmyn Walker, 2014-15; Meredith Hamlet 2015-16), an all-defensive team member (Laura Richards, 2011-12), one Freshman of the Year (Franklin, 2014-15) and one Sixth Player of the Year (Franklin, 2014-15).

## Tracey Dorow Head Coach <br> 5th Season 270-261 overall, 38-98 at Valpo Western Michigan, 1996

Tracey Dorow was named head coach of the Valparaiso women's basketball program in April of 2012. She enters her fifth season with a 33-90 record at the helm of the Crusader basketball program. For her career, Dorow is 265-253.

Dorow arrived at Valpo after spending 14 seasons as the head coach at Ferris State University, guiding the Bulldogs to four NCAA Division II Tournament appearances, two Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) North Division championships, and four 20-win seasons.

In her 14 seasons at Ferris State, Dorow compiled a 232-163 (.587) record, including a 23-7 mark in 2011-2012 while guiding the Bulldogs to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The all-time winningest coach in FSU history, she led her squad to the Sweet Sixteen in 2007.

The GLIAC Coach of the Year in 2003-2004, Dorow had five players earn a total of seven All-American honors and had seven players tally 10 total All-Region Team accolades. Her student-athletes earned All-GLIAC honors 22 times and 10 times she had players represented on the GLIAC All-Defensive Team. Under Dorow's guidance, Ferris State produced the GLIAC Player of the Year in 2000-2001, and she twice coached the GLIAC Freshman of the Year.

Dorow's student-athletes also excelled in the classroom, as three times she has led a First Team Academic All-American and 14 times her players have earned Academic All-District honors. A total of 45 different players earned GLIAC All-Academic recognition during her time at Ferris State. Ferris State posted the No. 1 grade point average in the country in Division II for the 1999-2000 women's basketball season, and her team ranked second in the nation in 2002-2003.

Dorow began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Lake Michigan Community College in Benton Harbor, Mich. where she helped lead the Indians to a 69-22 record in three seasons, winning two Western Collegiate Conference titles. Lake Michigan finished fourth in the 1997 NJCAA national tournament and held a No. 1 national ranking in February of that same season. She also spent one season as a graduate assistant at the University of Indianapolis.

A collegiate player at Illinois State from 1990-1993, she led the Redbirds in assists as a sophomore while finishing seventh in the Gateway Conference that same season. After transferring to Northern Michigan University for the 1993-1994 season, she earned Newcomer of the Year and Best Defensive Player honors for the Wildcats. Dorow had 131 assists and made 54 threes at NMU in her one season there. As a prep player, she finished third in the state of Michigan for Miss Basketball in 1990 and was named to the Detroit Free Press All-Decade Team.

Dorow earned her Bachelor of Science degree in education from Western Michigan University in 1996 and her Master of Arts degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2003 in curriculum and instruction. She has two children: Lainie and Baxter.
