Next Up in Crusader Basketball: Fresh off its first win in the NIT in program history, the Valparaiso University men's basketball team looks to advance to the quarterfinals on Thursday evening at the ARC as the top-seeded Crusaders host fourth-seeded Florida State at 6 p.m. The game can be seen live on ESPNews.

Last Time Out: The Valparaiso University men's basketball team earned its first postseason win since 2008 and the program's first victory ever in the Postseason NIT on Tuesday evening, leading start to finish at the ARC in an 84-73 victory over Texas Southern. Senior Vashil Fernandez tied his own program record with eight blocked shots in the winning effort, while junior Alec Peters led the way offensively, scoring 28 points.

Head Coach Bryce Drew: Bryce Drew (121-48) is in his fifth season at the helm of the Crusader men's basketball program in 2015-16. In his first five years, Drew has led Valpo to four Horizon League regular season titles, two Horizon League tournament championships and five postseason berths, including a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. The 2012, 2015 and 2016 HL Coach of the Year, Drew ascended to the head coaching position on May 17, 2011 after spending six seasons as an assistant and associate head coach with the Crusaders.

Series Notes: Thursday marks just the second meeting in program history between Valparaiso and Florida State, but the only other matchup was a special one in Crusader lore, as Valpo downed the Seminoles in overtime, 83-77, to advance to the Sweet Sixteen of the 1998 NCAA Tournament. Bill Jenkins split a pair of free throws with 30.5 seconds to play to send the game to overtime, where the Crusaders out-scored FSU, 8-2. Bryce Drew led four Valpo players in double figures with 22 points, while Kerry Thompson and Randell Jackson paced the Seminoles with 16 points each.

## @ValpoBasketball...

...in the @HorizonLeague preseason projections

- Valpo was picked to win the Horizon League in preseason polling, earning 36 of the 43 first-place votes.
- With the regular season title this year, the Crusaders have not finished worse than their preseason projection in the last six years.
- Junior Alec Peters was named to the preseason First Team All-League for a second straight season.
- Seniors Vashil Fernandez and Darien Walker and sophomore Tevonn Walker all earned spots on the preseason Second Team.


## ...notes from Texas Southern NIT game

- The Crusaders never trailed on Tuesday night, taking the lead for good 30 seconds into the game.
- Vashil Fernandez matched his own single-game blocked shots record with eight rejections, surpassing his own single-season record in the process as well. - Fernandez approached a triple-double on Tuesday, finishing with eight points and a team-high 10 rebounds in addition to his eight blocks.
- Alec Peters paced Valpo with 28 points, his fifth straight effort of at least 20 points.
- Valpo won despite getting out-rebounded 39-35, just the second time this year the Crusaders have come out victorious when being out-rebounded.
- The Crusaders finished with 16 assists against just seven turnovers - Keith Carter and Shane Hammink led the way with five assists apiece, the latter matching a season high.
- Carter set a season best as well by scoring 17 points, his sixth consecutive game in double figures.


## ...at the ARC

- Valpo had 15 regular season home games scheduled for the Athletics-Recreation Center in 2015-16 and is now 15-1 at home this year following Tuesday's win over Texas Southern.
- The Crusaders had their school-record 25-game home winning streak snapped Feb. 13 against Wright State - the winning streak dated back to Dec. 2014. - Valpo has been 15-1 at the ARC each of the last two years - 15 wins is the second-most home wins in a single season since the building opened, while the .938 home winning percentage is also the second-best in ARC history. - Over the last 21 years, the Crusaders own a 265-58 (.820) winning percentage on their home court.


## @FSUHoops

- Florida State enters Thursday night's second-round game at 20-13 overall and went 8-10 in ACC play this year.
- The Seminoles claimed an 84-74 victory over Davidson in Tallahassee Tuesday evening in the opening round of the NIT.
- FSU freshman guard Dwayne Bacon leads the team, averaging 15.8 points and 5.8 rebounds per game.
- Fellow rookie guard Malik Beasley adds 15.6 points and 5.3 rebounds per game for the Seminoles.


## Crusader Postseason History

- In its third NIT appearance (2003, 2012), the Crusaders earned their first win in the tournament with Tuesday's win over Texas Southern.
- Valpo previously lost at Iowa in 2003 and lost at Miami in 2012.
- The Crusaders' last postseason victory prior to Tuesday came in the first round of the 2008 CBI, when Valpo won at Washington.
- With a win over Florida State Thursday, the Crusaders would win two postseason games in the same year for the fourth time in program history.
- Valpo most famously won twice to reach the Sweet Sixteen of the 1998 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship, and also won two games apiece in the 1962 and 1967 NCAA College Division Championships.


## Back in the Postseason

- With the Horizon League regular season title, the Crusaders secured a berth in the postseason NIT.
- Valpo was one of the 'First Four Out' of the NCAA Tournament, assuring the Crusaders a one seed in the NIT.
- This year is the sixth straight season Valpo has appeared in postseason play and the 15th time in the last 21 years.
- Every four-year senior class since the 1995 class has made at least one postseason trip.


## Champions Again

- Valpo clinched a share of the Horizon League league regular season crown with the home win over Oakland, and secured the outright title two days later with the win over Detroit.
- The sweep of the Wisconsin road trip to close the year gave the Crusaders a 16-2 record in Horizon League play.
- Valpo won the regular season crown by three games - the first Horizon League team to claim the title by three games or more since the undefeated 2009-10 Butler squad.
- The Crusaders have now won four outright regular season titles in Bryce Drew's five years at the helm.
- Valpo has now claimed its conference regular season title in 13 of the last 22 seasons - the Crusaders now have 16 regular season league titles total in program history.


## Four in Five Years

- Valpo's stretch of four regular season titles in five years puts the Crusaders among the top spans of results in Horizon League history.
- Xavier won six regular season championships in an eight-year stretch, including five in six years (1987-88; 89-90; 90-91; 92-93; 93-94; 94-95).
- Butler won four straight regular season titles (1999-2003) and then had another five-year string of championships (2006-2011).


## All-League Honorees

- Three Crusaders were honored with Horizon League postseason awards, all of whom earned repeat accolades.
- Head coach Bryce Drew earned Coach of the Year honors for the third time in his career (2011-12; 2014-15).
- Drew joins Pete Gillen, Jim Crews, Barry Collier, Bruce Pearl and Todd Lickliter as the only coaches to be named Horizon League Coach of the Year at least three times.
- Senior Vashil Fernandez was named Defensive Player of the Year for a second straight year - the first player in league history to earned the honor twice - and also repeated as a member of the league's All-Defensive Team. - Junior Alec Peters was named a First Team All-Horizon League selection for the second straight season.


## Peters Closing With a Flourish

- Junior forward Alec Peters has been at his best for the Crusaders in the last month of the season.
- Over the last four weeks, Peters has posted five double-doubles in seven games and is averaging 24.4 points and 10.7 rebounds per game on $.546 / .468 / .860$ shooting.
- Peters was named a USBWA All-District V honoree - one of just 91 honorees nationwide - and was also a member of the Horizon League All-Tournament Team.

- Peters was named CBS Sports National Player of the Week Feb. 22 - the first player in program history to earn the honor from CBS Sports - and was chosen as American Sports Network National Player of the Week Feb. 29. - Peters earned Horizon League Player of the Week honors from both the league office and College Sports Madness both weeks.
- With his efforts over the last seven games, Peters has moved into Valpo's single-season top-10 charts in both scoring and rebounding - the only player in Crusader history to rank in the top-10 in both categories for the same season.


## Look at the Record Book

- Both senior Vashil Fernandez and junior Alec Peters are moving up the Crusader record books in a number of categories.
- Beyond his school-record block total (now at 274 total blocks), Fernandez also ranks 12th in Crusader history with 651 career rebounds.
- Matching his single-game block record with eight rejections last time out, Fernandez also surpassed his own single-season blocked shots record and now has 104 blocks this season.
- Meanwhile, Peters passed Ryan Broekhoff for sixth place in Valpo history in career scoring last time out and enters Thursday's game with 1,606 career points - just 15 points shy of Raitis Grafs for fifth position.
- Peters also ranks second in 3-point \% (43.6\%), fourth in 3-pointers made (223), seventh in free throw \% (82.5\%) and 10th in rebounding (668).
- In addition, senior Keith Carter moved into Valpo’s all-time top-20 in assists at UIC and now ranks 17th in Crusader history with 282 career assists.
- Peters has scored 603 points this year, fifth-most in a year in program history - just 10 shy of Bryce Drew's senior year (fourth) and 14 shy of Drew's junior season (third).
- He has already grabbed 277 rebounds as well, good for eighth in a single year, and has hit 83 -pointers, tied for sixth-most in a single season.
- Carter cracked the single-season top-10 for steals as well last time out and now has 52 steals on the year, tied for ninth in a single season - he has also dished out 142 assists, just one shy of the top-10 in that category.


## Rolling in the Wins

- This year's Crusader team reached 20 victories with the win at UIC - the 19th team in Valpo men's basketball history to win at least 20 games and the fourth under Bryce Drew.
- The victory over Texas Southern on Tuesday was Valpo’s 27th of the season, just the second time in program history the Crusaders have won at least 27 games.
- Last year's squad won a school-record 28 wins, finishing the year with a 28-6 overall record.
- Valpo enters Thursday's game with 27 wins, one of just 14 programs in the nation with 27 or more victories as of Tuesday's final scores.


## Challenging League Records

- This year's Crusaders have already broken a number of Horizon League records and are in position to potentially set a few others.

- Valpo set the league record for rebounds in league-only play against Detroit, surpassing 2008-09 Milwaukee's previous record of 689-the Crusaders closed out the league slate with 785 rebounds in league play.
- With the end of the regular season, the Crusaders set new league records for (Valpo final mark in parentheses):
- League-only scoring margin, +13.2, 2009-10 Butler (+14.7)
- League-only rebounding average, 43.2, 1981-82 Loyola (43.6)
- League-only rebounding margin, +11.1, 1986-87 Loyola (+13.0)
- Other records the Crusaders could challenge include (Valpo current mark in parentheses):
- Overall scoring margin, +12.6, 2001-02 Butler (+13.5)
- Overall rebounding average, 41.8, 1990-91 Dayton (41.8)


## Glance at the Rankings

- Valpo received three votes in the AP top-25 poll this week, the eighth time in the last nine weeks the Crusaders have received votes, and have received votes in the coaches top- 25 poll seven times.
- The Crusaders have received votes in 10 editions of the AP poll this season and picked up 30 points Jan. 18 - their highest total of points ever in the AP poll.
- The Crusaders earned a season-high 16 points in the Jan. 18 poll, their highest regular-season tally in poll history (Valpo finished ranked \#23 in the postseason poll in 1998).
- As of Tuesday, Valpo ranked 48th in the nation in RPI.
- Following the win over Detroit and subsequent results, the Crusaders moved up to \#18 in Ken Pomeroy's rankings - their high-water mark this season.
- As of Tuesday, Valpo ranks \#38 in the KenPom ratings.
- Valpo closed last season at \#61 in the KenPom ratings - its highest yearend ranking was back in 2001-02 (\#51).


## Getting It Done With Defense

- One of the best defensive teams in the nation last season, the Crusaders have been even stronger defensively this season.
- As of Tuesday, Valpo ranked 16th in the nation in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive efficiency.
- In traditional stats, Valpo ranks ninth nationally in scoring defense (62.5 ppg ) and fourth in field goal percentage defense (38.3\%).
- Valpo has held 12 Division I opponents to one of their three worst offensive efficiencies of the season.
- Valpo has given up 47 or fewer points six times this season - the first time the program has done that in one season since the 1946-47 campaign.
- Anchoring the defense is senior center Vashil Fernandez, who owns a school-record 274 career blocked shots.


## Crashing the Glass

- Combined with their stellar defense has been a tremendous effort on the glass, as Valpo currently ranks seventh nationally with a +9.5 rebound margin. - Valpo's +31 advantage at Youngstown State was its best against a Division I opponent in at least two decades.
- The Crusaders held the advantage on the glass in 17 of 18 Horizon League games, including a double-figure advantage 11 times.
- Valpo finished league play with an average edge on the boards of +12.9 , while Alec Peters ( 9.2 rpg ) and Vashil Fernandez ( 8.4 rpg ) ranked 2-4 in the league in rebounding in league-only action.


## Continued Success Within the League

- Valpo has been strong within Horizon League play since joining the league prior to the 2007-08 season.
- The Crusaders own a league record of 101-55 (.647) in nine years as a Horizon League member and have had just one sub-. 500 season in league play. - Valpo has captured four of the last five Horizon League regular season titles.
- In Bryce Drew's fifth season at the helm, the Crusaders are 65-19 (.774) within Horizon League play.


## What's Back This Season

- If you said "everything", you'd be close - the Crusaders return nearly all their players from last year's record-setting squad.
- 10 of last year's 11 letterwinners returned for Valpo in 2015-16, comprising $98.8 \%$ of its scoring and rebounding and $98.3 \%$ of its minutes played from last year's squad.
- Forward David Chadwick, who averaged 2.3 points and 1.3 rebounds per game in 12 appearances last year, was the only loss from last season.


## High Praise Entering the Year

- With the glut of returnees from last year's team, the Crusaders were on the receiving end of high praise from a myriad of national outlets entering the season.
-ESPN.com, SI.com, NBCSports.com, NCAA.com and CBSSports.com all listed Valpo at or near the top of their respective top mid-major teams during the preseason. - The Crusaders were \#35 in Ken Pomeroy's preseason ratings and were ranked \#41 entering the year by CBSSports.com.
- Valpo picked up five points in the preseason AP Top 25 poll.
- Individually, head coach Bryce Drew was tabbed one of 10 Coaches on the Rise by CBSSports.com's Jon Rothstein.
- Vashil Fernandez was listed among the nation's top-seven rim protectors by NCAA.com.
- Alec Peters is one of 20 players on the watch list for the Karl Malone Award, presented to the nation's top power forward, and is also on the watch list for the Lou Henson Award.


## The International Flavor

- This year's squad continues the international pipeline that Valpo has cultivated over the past two decades.
- The Crusaders boast five international players on this year's roster from four different countries.
- Represented are Canada (Joseph, T. Walker), Croatia (Skara), Jamaica (Fernandez) and Netherlands (Hammink).
- Over the past two decades, Valpo has welcomed 31 international players from 18 different countries.


## NBA Lineage

- Three members of this year's Crusader roster boast fathers who played at the highest level of pro basketball - in the NBA.
- Most notably, Derrik Smits’ father, Rik, played 12 seasons with the Indiana Pacers and was an All-Star.
- Chandler Levingston Simon's father, Cliff Levingston, was an 11-year NBA vet who won two titles with the Chicago Bulls.
- Shane Hammink's father, Geert, was a 1993 first-round draft pick who played parts of three seasons in the NBA.


## Bryce Drew

- Bryce Drew is in his fifth season as head coach of @ValpoBasketball and is in his 11th season overall on the coaching staff.
- Drew was named HL Coach of the Year in 2014-15, leading Valpo to a school-record 28 victories and the league regular season and tournament titles. - In 2013-14, Drew led the Crusaders to 18 wins and their fourth straight postseason berth.

- In 2012-13, Drew guided Valpo to its second straight regular season title, its first tournament title and a then-school record 26 wins.
- Drew was named Horizon League Coach of the Year in 2011-12 in his first season as head coach, winning 22 games and the league regular season title.
- Drew was the first Crusader men's basketball Coach of the Year since 2001-02, when dad Homer won the honor in the Mid-Con.
- Drew ranks second among head coaches in program history in career wins. - Prior to coaching, Drew spent seven seasons playing professionally, including six seasons in the NBA.
- Drew was a two-time Mid-Con MVP in his playing days with Valparaiso, helping the team to three NCAA tournament appearances.
- Drew hit "The Shot", a buzzer-beating 3-pointer in the first round of the 1998 NCAA tournament, to lift the Crusaders over Ole Miss.
- "The Shot" was named one of the top-35 All-Time Madness Moments by the NCAA as part of the celebration of 75 Years of March Madness.


## \#DrewFamilyDynasty

- Bryce is the third member of the Drew family to serve as head coach of the Valpo program.
- Father Homer was head coach from 1988-2002, and then returned to lead Valpo from 2003-11.
- Brother Scott (current head coach of Baylor) led the Crusaders during the 2002-03 season after nine seasons as an assistant under Homer.
- A Drew has been at the helm of the Crusaders for the last 27 years.
- The Drew family has combined to lead Valpo to 512 victories and 14 postseason appearances.
- Overall, the trio of Drews owns 1,031 collegiate victories over a combined 47 seasons of head coaching.


## \#CoachesWhoCanPlay

- Valpo boasts one of the nation's highest-scoring staffs, as a trio of coaches combined for 4,211 points during their D-I careers.
- Head coach Bryce Drew scored 2,142 points during his four-year career with the Crusaders.
- Assistant coach Roger Powell Jr. tallied 1,178 points during his four-year career with Illinois.
- Assistant coach Matt Lottich poured in 891 points over his four-year career at Stanford.
- Assistant coach Luke Gore also played collegiately at NAIA Bethel [Tenn.] College.


## Alec Peters

- Peters repeated as a First Team All-Horizon League selection this year.
- Peters was named a USBWA All-District V honoree - one of just 91 honorees nationwide - and was also a member of the Horizon League All-Tournament Team. - Peters enters Thursday fourth in the nation (>20\% possessions) in Ken Pomeroy’s Offensive Rating metric.
- Peters has scored in double figures in 31 of 33 games this season, including 28 points in the Crusaders' NIT win over Texas Southern last time out.
- Peters has tallied 13 double-doubles this year, including most recently a 32-point, 12 -rebound performance in the HL semifinal against Green Bay.
- Peters closed the regular season with 25 points and 15 rebounds at Green Bay setting a new career high for rebounds.
- Peters was named Horizon League Player of the Week for a second straight week and American Sports Network National Player of the Week after averaging 24 points and 10.5 rebounds per game in wins over GB and Milwaukee.
- The previous week, Peters was named CBSSports.com National Player of the Week and Horizon League Player of the Week for a trio of double-doubles in three games, including a 32-point, 11-rebound performance in the win over Detroit.
- Peters posted 21 points and 13 rebounds in the win over Green Bay.
- Peters recorded new career highs with 39 points and 14 rebounds in the win at Detroit, earning league and mid-major Player of the Week honors.
- Peters matched a Valpo program record by going 6-of-6 from 3-point range in the win over Chicago State in a 26 -point effort.
- Peters led all players with 28 points at Ball State, hitting five 3-pointers and matching a career high with 10 field goals made.
- Peters opened the season with game highs of 24 points and seven rebounds in the win over IPFW.
- Peters was named to the preseason First Team All-Horizon League this year after earning First Team All-League honors last season.
- Peters was also on the watch list for the Lou Henson Award, awarded to the nation's top mid-major player.
- Peters was a First Team NABC All-District 12 honoree last year as a sophomore. - Peters became the first player in Crusader history to reach the 1,000-point milestone by the end of his sophomore year.
- Peters led the Crusaders in 2014-15, averaging 16.8 points and 6.7 rebounds per game, both of which ranked among the top-six in the league.
- Peters finished ninth in the nation in Ken Pomeroy's Offensive Rating metric among players using at least $20 \%$ of their team's possessions.
- Peters was the Horizon League Championship tournament MVP last year and was an All-Freshman Team honoree in 2013-14.


## Vashil Fernandez

# Bryce Drew 

## Head Coach

5th Season
121-48 overall and at Valpo
Valparaiso, 1998
A two-time Horizon League Coach of the Year, Bryce Drew was named head coach of the Valparaiso men's basketball program in May of 2011 and is in his fifth season at the helm of the program in 2015-2016.

Drew navigated perhaps his toughest coaching job during the 2014-2015 season, leading the Crusaders to the top of the league despite returning less than half his scoring from the previous year and losing his incumbent starting point guard to injury over the summer. The 2014-2015 campaign saw the Crusaders set a new program single-season record with 28 wins. Along the way, Valpo earned its third Horizon League regular season title and second league tournament crown in Drew's four seasons, earning Drew Coach of the Year honors for the second time, and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the last three years. He guided Alec Peters to a First Team AllLeague campaign, while also coaching the league's Defensive Player of the Year (Vashil Fernandez) and Sixth Man of the Year (Jubril Adekoya), as well as an All-Freshman selection (Tevonn Walker).
Drew reloaded the Valpo program entering the 2013-2014 campaign, as despite returning less than $25 \%$ of the scoring from the previous year's squad, the Crusaders won 18 games and earned their fourth consecutive postseason berth. Drew coached a First Team All-League and an All-District selection in Lavonte Dority, while a pair of members of the Crusaders' talented freshman class earned Horizon League All-Freshman Team accolades.

Drew guided the Crusaders to their second straight Horizon League regular season title during the 2012-2013 season and also led Valpo to its first Horizon League Championship crown, returning the Crusaders to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004. Along the way, Valpo won a school-record 26 games, including a record 16 victories at the ARC and a Division I-best 10 true road victories. Drew guided four players who earned postseason honors from the Horizon League, including a pair of All-District honorees in Ryan Broekhoff and Kevin Van Wijk.

Drew led Valpo to 22 victories in his rookie season at the helm of the program, including a 14-4 mark in Horizon League play to capture the league regular season title by two games. He also guided the Crusaders to the Postseason NIT. Drew was honored as the Horizon League Coach of the Year for his efforts on the bench, while he coached two First Team All-League selections in Van Wijk and Broekhoff, the latter of whom was named the league Player of the Year and an Honorable Mention All-American.
Drew, the most decorated player in Crusader men's basketball history, spent the six seasons prior to his hiring as head coach as a member of the Valparaiso coaching staff, including the previous five years as associate head coach. Drew, who helped guide Valpo through their transition into a top-ten league in the Horizon League, became just the fourth new head coach of the Crusader men's basketball program in the last 31 years.

As a student-athlete, Drew cemented himself as the best player in Valparaiso men's basketball history. Drew, who arrived at Valpo after earning Indiana Mr. Basketball honors and being named Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year in 1994, began his career by garnering Mid-Continent Conference Newcomer of the Year and Mid-Con Tournament MVP honors as a freshman. Drew, a four time All-Conference honoree, shined during the conference tournaments, earning All-Tournament Team honors each of his four seasons and picking up three Mid-Continent Conference Tournament MVP awards. He was also twice decorated as Mid-Con Most Valuable Player, one of only four players to be so honored twice in their career. Drew's career culminated as a senior by being named a Third Team All-American by the Basketball Times.

Drew led the Crusaders to four Mid-Continent Conference regular season championships, four tournament titles and three trips to the NCAA Tournament. Drew, the career leader in points (2,142), three-point field goals (364) and assists (626) at Valpo, etched his name into the American consciousness in 1998 when he hit "The Shot" in the first round of the NCAA Tournament to beat Ole Miss. The play, in which Drew caught a tip pass from teammate Bill Jenkins off a full-court feed from Jamie Sykes, won Drew an ESPY award and gave Valpo its first NCAA Tournament win in school history, propelling the Crusaders to the Sweet Sixteen.

Drew also excelled internationally during his time on the court with the Crusaders, playing for the gold-medal winning Team USA at the World University Games in 1997. Following his collegiate career, Drew again made school history when the Houston Rockets drafted him with the 16th pick in the 1998 NBA Draft, the first time a Crusader had been chosen in the first round. Drew's NBA career lasted six seasons with the Rockets, Chicago Bulls, and Charlotte and New Orleans Hornets, with his best season coming in 2000-2001 when he started 41 games for the Bulls, averaging 6.3 points and 3.9 assists per game. A prolific shooter, Drew set a Hornet record when he connected on nine consecutive three-point attempts. He competed in the postseason twice as a pro, with Houston in 1999 and with Charlotte in 2002.

Over the course of his NBA career, Drew scored over 1,000 points and made $37 \%$ of his three-point attempts. In 1999, he was honored by the NBA with the Henry P.
