**Next Up in Crusader Basketball:** The Valparaiso University men's basketball team looks to improve to 7-1 on the season as the Crusaders face their third consecutive road game on Saturday, playing at in-state foe Ball State. With a win, Valpo would start 7-1 through eight games for the second straight season.

**Last Time Out:** Valpo earned yet another statement victory in its early-season schedule, capping a stretch of seven games over the season's first 12 days by leading nearly start-to-finish in handling Oregon State on the road in Corvallis Tuesday night, 63-57. Head coach Bryce Drew earned his 100th career victory at the helm of the Crusader program with Tuesday's win.

**Head Coach Bryce Drew:** Bryce Drew (100-43) is in his fifth season at the helm of the Crusader men's basketball program in 2015-16. In his first four years, Drew has led Valpo to three Horizon League regular season titles, two Horizon League tournament championships and four postseason berths, including a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. The 2012 and 2015 HL Coach of the Year, Drew ascended to the head coaching position on May 17, 2011 after spending six seasons as an assistant and associate head coach with the Crusaders.

**Series Notes:** One of the most common opponents in program history, Valpo and Ball State will be meeting for the 62nd time on the hardwood. The Cardinals hold a slight 31-30 edge in the all-time series, but the Crusaders have captured the last three meetings between the two teams. Last season saw Valpo edge Ball State with a narrow 65-62 victory at the ARC, led by 23 points and 10 rebounds from Alec Peters.

## @ValpoBasketball...

### ...and the @HorizonLeague

- Valpo has been picked to win the Horizon League in preseason polling, earning 36 of the 43 first-place votes.
- The Crusaders have not finished worse than their preseason projection in the last five years.
- Junior Alec Peters was named to the preseason First Team All-League for a second straight season.
- Seniors Vashil Fernandez and Darien Walker and sophomore Trevonn Walker all earned spots on the preseason Second Team.

### ...looking back at last year

- Valpo won a program-record 28 games en route to the Horizon League regular season and tournament titles.
- The Crusaders advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time since 1996 and the 14th time overall.
- Valpo has won two of the last three Horizon League Championships and three of the last four HL regular season titles.
- The Crusaders are one of just four programs in league history to capture at least three regular season titles in a four-year span.
- Bryce Drew was named Horizon League Coach of the Year for the second time, as well as NABC District Coach of the Year.
- Alec Peters was a First Team All-League selection and an NABC First Team All-District choice.
- Vashil Fernandez was named HL Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team.
- Jubril Adekoya claimed Sixth Man of the Year honors, while Trevonn Walker earned a spot on the All-Freshman Team.

### ...notes from Oregon State

- The win over the Beavers was Valpo's second in program history over a current Pac-12 program (2008 CBI at Washington).
- The victory gave the Crusaders a 6-1 record over the opening 12 days of the season, spanning three time zones.
- Valpo took the lead for good with 3-pointers on three straight possessions starting six minutes into the game.
- The Crusaders led by nine at the half and went on an 8-2 run to start the second half.
- The lead reached as many as 17 points and was still 16 with 5:05 to play before the Beavers rallied to within six late.
- Trevonn Walker and Shane Hammink tied for team-high honors with 15 points.
- Valpo out-rebounded OSU 40-30, with Alec Peters coming up just one shy of his career high with 12 boards.

### ...looking ahead

- Valpo returns home for its lone home game in the span of a month on Thursday evening, Dec. 3 as it hosts Belmont.
- The Crusaders then play a pair of road games the next week, heading to Indiana State (Dec. 9) and Chicago State (Dec. 11).

### ...on the road

- The game against Ball State is the fourth of seven true road games for the Crusaders in the non-league slate (2-1 so far).
- Last season, Valpo went 8-4 in true road games and 13-5 overall in games away from home.

## @BallStateMBB

- Ball State enters Saturday's game at 4-2 on the season, most recently beating IU Kokomo 90-54 on Wednesday night.
- The Cardinals are coming off a 2014-15 season where they went 7-23 overall and 2-16 in MAC play.
- BSU has been led in the early season by Youngstown State transfer Ryan Weber, who averages 14.8 points per game.
- Franko House (13.7 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 62% FG%) and Bo Calhoun (11.2 ppg, 8.8 rpg) also average in double figures.

## Century Mark for Bryce

- The win over Oregon State gave Valpo head coach Bryce Drew his 100th career victory, both overall and at the helm of the Crusaders.
- Drew is one of just three coaches in Crusader history to reach 100 wins, joining his father Homer, as well as J.M. Christiansen.
- Bryce Drew is just two wins shy of Christiansen's total of 102 for second place in program history.
- To put it into perspective, Bryce Drew reached 100 wins in just 143 games - Christiansen needed 196 games to reach 100, while Homer Drew needed 230 games.

## Defense and Rebounding

- In a couple fundamental parts of the game, the Crusaders have had great success in the early portion of the 2015-16 campaign.
- Valpo's scoring defense (55.6 ppg) ranks fifth nationally, while its field goal percentage defense (35%) is good for 21st in the nation.
- Meanwhile, on the glass, the Crusaders out-rebound their opponents by eight boards per game, best in the Horizon League.
- Valpo has surrendered more than 64 points just once this year and been out-rebounded just once, both coming in the loss at Oregon.

## Hectic Opening Stretch

- The win over the Beavers capped a crazy first two weeks of the season for the Crusaders.
- Valpo opened the year with five games in the first seven days - more than any collegiate or NBA team in the same stretch - and seven overall in 12 days over three different time zones.
- The Crusaders won each of the first five games - four by double figures - to win five in seven days for the first time in program history.
- With so many games so early in the calendar, Valpo was the first program in the nation to win four, five and six games.
- As of Friday afternoon, Valpo was joined by only Texas A&M and South Dakota State with six victories.

## Poll Thoughts

- Valpo has been receiving votes in every iteration of the Associated Press Top 25 poll this season to date.

- Most recently, the Crusaders picked up a pair of points in this Monday's poll following the loss to Oregon.

- Valpo moved up to #3 in Mid-Major Madness' Power 15 and sits at #4 in College Insider's Mid-Major Top 25.

## Look at KenPom

- Following the win over Oregon State, the Crusaders moved up to #20 in the KenPom ratings - their high-water mark this season.

- As of Friday afternoon, Valpo currently sits 22nd in the ratings.

- Valpo's adjusted defensive efficiency is currently ranked seventh in the nation.

- Valpo closed last season at #61 in the KenPom ratings - its highest year-end ranking was back in 2001-02 (#51).

- The game against the Beavers was already the Crusaders' third this year against a top-50 team in the KenPom ratings - last season's team didn't play a top-50 team until the NCAA Tournament.

## What's Back This Season

- If you said "everything", you'd be close - the Crusaders return nearly all their players from last year's record-setting squad.

- 10 of last year's 11 letterwinners are back for Valpo in 2015-16, comprising 98.8% of its scoring and rebounding and 98.3% of its minutes played from last year's squad.

- Valpo is the only D-I team in at least the last three years to return all five starters from a team which won at least 28 games.

- Forward David Chadwick, who averaged 2.3 points and 1.3 rebounds per game in 12 appearances last year, is the only loss from last season.

## What's New

- With so much returning from last year, the Crusaders have still found room for some new faces on this year's squad.

- Lexus Williams is back for the Crusaders after missing the entirety of last season with a knee injury.

- LSU transfer Shane Hammink and UMKC transfer Chandler Livingston Simon are both eligible this season after sitting out last year.

- Derrik Smits is the lone freshman on this year's team - the 7'1" center was an Indiana All-Star at Zionsville H.S.

## High Praise Entering the Year

- With the glut of returnees from last year's team, the Crusaders were on the receiving end of high praise from a myriad of national outlets entering the season.
- ESPN.com, SI.com, NBCSports.com, NCAA.com and CBSSports.com all listed Valpo at or near the top of their respective top mid-major teams during the preseason.
- The Crusaders were #35 in Ken Pomeroy's preseason ratings and were ranked #41 entering the year by CBSSports.com.
- Valpo picked up five points in the preseason AP Top 25 poll.
- Individually, head coach Bryce Drew was tabbed one of 10 Coaches on the Rise by CBSSports.com's Jon Rothstein.
- Vashil Fernandez was listed among the nation's top-seven rim protectors by NCAA.com.
- Alec Peters is one of 20 players on the watch list for the Karl Malone Award, presented to the nation's top power forward, and is also on the watch list for the Lou Henson Award.

## Oh Canada!

- Valpo went on an international tour this past August to Canada, spending time in Montreal and Ottawa.
- It marks the second time in program history that the Crusaders have taken advantage of the chance to take an international trip.
- Valpo went 4-1 on the trip, with wins over the Montreal All-Stars, Brookwood Elite, McGill and Ottawa, and a loss to five-time defending national champion Carleton.
- Shane Hammink scored in double figures in all five games of the trip to lead the Crusaders.

## The International Flavor

- This year's squad continues the international pipeline that Valpo has cultivated over the past two decades.
- The Crusaders boast five international players on this year's roster from four different countries.
- Represented are Canada (Joseph, T. Walker), Croatia (Skara), Jamaica (Fernandez) and Netherlands (Hammink).
- Over the past two decades, Valpo has welcomed 31 international players from 18 different countries.

## NBA Lineage

- Three members of this year's Crusader roster boast fathers who played at the highest level of pro basketball - in the NBA.
- Most notably, Derrik Smits' father, Rik, played 12 seasons with the Indiana Pacers and was an All-Star.
- Chandler Levingston Simon's father, Cliff Levingston, was an 11-year NBA vet who won two titles with the Chicago Bulls.
- Shane Hammink's father, Geert, was a 1993 first-round draft pick who played parts of three seasons in the NBA.

## Bryce Drew

- Bryce Drew is in his fifth season as head coach of @ValpoBasketball and is in his 11th season overall on the coaching staff.

- Drew was named HL Coach of the Year in 2014-15, leading Valpo to a school-record 28 victories and the league regular season and tournament titles.

- In 2013-14, Drew led the Crusaders to 18 wins and their fourth straight postseason berth.

- In 2012-13, Drew guided Valpo to its second straight regular season title, its first tournament title and a then-school record 26 wins.

- Drew was named Horizon League Coach of the Year in 2011-12 in his first season as head coach, winning 22 games and the league regular season title.

- Drew was the first Crusader men's basketball Coach of the Year since 2001-02, when dad Homer won the honor in the Mid-Con.

- Prior to coaching, Drew spent seven seasons playing professionally, including six seasons in the NBA.

- Drew was a two-time Mid-Con MVP in his playing days with Valparaiso, helping the team to three NCAA tournament appearances.

- Drew hit "The Shot", a buzzer-beating 3-pointer in the first round of the 1998 NCAA tournament, to lift the Crusaders over Ole Miss.

- "The Shot" was named one of the top-35 All-Time Madness Moments by the NCAA as part of the celebration of 75 Years of March Madness.

## #DrewFamilyDynasty

- Bryce is the third member of the Drew family to serve as head coach of the Valpo program.

- Father Homer was head coach from 1988-2002, and then returned to lead Valpo from 2003-11.

- Brother Scott (current head coach of Baylor) led the Crusaders during the 2002-03 season after nine seasons as an assistant under Homer.

- A Drew has been at the helm of the Crusaders for the last 27 years.

- The Drew family has combined to lead Valpo to 491 victories and 14 postseason appearances.

- Overall, the trio of Drews owns 992 collegiate victories over a combined 47 seasons of head coaching.

## #CoachesWhoCanPlay

- Valpo boasts one of the nation's highest-scoring staffs, as a trio of coaches combined for 4,211 points during their D-I careers.

- Head coach Bryce Drew scored 2,142 points during his four-year career with the Crusaders.

- Assistant coach Roger Powell Jr. tallied 1,178 points during his four-year career with Illinois.

- Assistant coach Matt Lottich poured in 891 points over his four-year career at Stanford.

- Assistant coach Luke Gore also played collegiately at NAIA Bethel [Tenn.] College.

## Alec Peters

- Peters has scored in double figures in all seven games so far this year.

- Peters tallied his first double-double of the year last time out in the win at Oregon State (11 points, 12 rebounds).

- One of the nation's most efficient players last year, Peters went 10-of-16 from the field and 13-of-14 from the foul line over Valpo's first two wins.
- Peters opened the season with game highs of 24 points and seven rebounds in the win over IPFW.
- Peters was named to the preseason First Team All-Horizon League this year after earning First Team All-League honors last season.
- Peters was one of 20 players on the preseason watch list for the Karl Malone Award, given to the nation's top power forward.
- Peters was also on the watch list for the Lou Henson Award, awarded to the nation's top mid-major player.
- Peters was a First Team NABC All-District 12 honoree last year as a sophomore.
- Peters became the first player in Crusader history to reach the 1,000-point milestone by the end of his sophomore year.
- Peters led the Crusaders in 2014-15, averaging 16.8 points and 6.7 rebounds per game, both of which ranked among the top-six in the league.
- Peters finished ninth in the nation in Ken Pomeroy's Offensive Rating metric among players using at least 20% of their team's possessions.
- Peters also ranked third in the league in 3-pointers/game (2.4) and 3-point percentage (46.6%) and fourth in free throw percentage (82.9%).
- Peters was the Horizon League Championship tournament MVP last year and was an All-Freshman Team honoree in 2013-14.

## **Vashil Fernandez**

- Despite playing just 21 minutes due to foul trouble, Fernandez led Valpo with seven rebounds and four blocks at #25/rv Oregon.
- Fernandez scored in double figures against Rhode Island (12) and Trinity Christian (11).
- Fernandez finished just one block shy of his own single-game record versus Iona, registering seven blocks.
- Fernandez was named a Second Team All-Horizon League preseason honoree entering this season.
- Fernandez was granted a fourth season of athletic eligibility by the NCAA over the summer.
- Fernandez was the Horizon League Defensive Player of the Year in 2014-15, blocking a school-record 98 shots.
- Fernandez ranked 11th in the nation in blocks/game and ranked sixth nationally in block percentage.
- Fernandez enters his senior year just 58 blocks shy of the Valpo career record of 228.

## **Darien Walker**

- Walker hit three 3-pointers in an 11-point, three-steal effort at #25/rv Oregon.
- Walker led the Crusaders with 20 points versus Trinity Christian and also pulled down 10 rebounds.
- Walker was a preseason Second Team All-League choice entering this season.

- Walker was a finalist for the Riley Wallace Award last year, presented to the nation's top first-year transfer player.
- Walker averaged 10.7 points and 4.6 rebounds per game in his first year as a Crusader in 2014-15.
- Walker finished second on the team in scoring and third in rebounding, ranking among the league's top-20 in both categories.

## **Tevonn Walker**

- Walker tied for team-high honors with 15 points in the win at Oregon State and led the Crusaders with 14 points at #25/rv Oregon.
- Walker made six shots from the floor for 12 points in Valpo's win at Rhode Island.
- Walker led the Crusaders against Iona with 17 points in just 20 minutes of action.
- Walker was a preseason Second Team All-League choice entering this season.
- Walker earned a spot on the Horizon League All-Freshman Team last year, averaging 10.3 points and 3.4 rebounds per game.
- Walker ranked third on the team in scoring and paced Valpo with 37 steals.
- A two-time league Freshman of the Week, Walker scored in double figures 19 times.

## **Keith Carter**

- Carter went for eight points and seven rebounds at #25/rv Oregon.
- Carter scored in double figures in each of Valpo's first three D-I games this year, including 12 at Rhode Island.
- Carter appeared in 24 games as a junior in 2014-15, missing 10 games in the Horizon League season due to injury.
- Carter averaged 8.4 points, 3.5 rebounds and a team-high 3.7 assists/game.
- Carter paced the Crusaders in assists 15 times and scored in double figures on eight occasions.

## **E. Victor Nickerson**

- Nickerson chipped in seven points in the win at Oregon State.
- Nickerson returned from offseason wrist surgery in the win over Iona, posting 10 points in 12 minutes off the bench.
- Nickerson appeared in 33 games in his first season as a Crusader in 2014-15, starting the last 17 games.
- Nickerson averaged 6.2 points per game and ranked second on the team with 64 total assists.
- Nickerson earned a spot on the Horizon League All-Tournament Team.

## **Jubril Adekoya**

- Adekoya hit all four of his field goal attempts to finish with nine points at #25/rv Oregon.
- Adekoya scored a career-high 20 points on 8-of-10 shooting in the win over IU Kokomo.
- Adekoya posted eight points and a game-high seven rebounds off the bench in the season opener against IPFW.
- Adekoya was the Horizon League Sixth Man of the Year last season.
- Adekoya averaged 4.7 points and 4.2 rebounds per game as a sophomore, and shot 59.3% from the field during league-only play.

## Shane Hammink

- Hammink tied for team-high honors with 15 points last time out in the win at Oregon State, including three monster dunks.
- Hammink has scored in double figures in four of his first five games as a Crusader.
- Hammink is eligible to play this season after sitting out last year post-transfer from LSU and has two seasons of eligibility remaining.
- Hammink scored in double figures in each of the Crusaders' five games on their summer trip to Canada.

## David Skara

- Skara finished the season opener versus IPFW with 14 points and seven rebounds off the bench.
- Skara averaged 5.4 points and 3.2 rebounds per game in 2014-15 as a freshman.
- Skara finished second on the team in free throw pct. (.809) and tied for third in assists (60) and blocked shots.
- Skara was a member of the Horizon League All-Tournament Team after pacing Valpo with 12 points in the title game win over Green Bay.

## Max Joseph

- Joseph earned his first career start versus IU Kokomo, posting six points, seven rebounds and five assists in 35 minutes of action.
- Joseph averaged 10.9 minutes per game over 28 appearances as a rookie in 2014-15.

## Bryce Drew

Head Coach

5th Season

100-43 overall and at Valpo  
Valparaiso, 1998

A two-time Horizon League Coach of the Year, Bryce Drew was named head coach of the Valparaiso men's basketball program in May of 2011 and enters his fifth season at the helm of the program in 2015-2016.

Drew navigated perhaps his toughest coaching job during the 2014-2015 season, leading the Crusaders to the top of the league despite returning less than half his scoring from the previous year and losing his incumbent starting point guard to injury over the summer. The 2014-2015 campaign saw the Crusaders set a new program single-season record with 28 wins. Along

the way, Valpo earned its third Horizon League regular season title and second league tournament crown in Drew's four seasons, earning Drew Coach of the Year honors for the second time, and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the last three years. He guided Alec Peters to a First Team All-League campaign, while also coaching the league's Defensive Player of the Year (Vashil Fernandez) and Sixth Man of the Year (Jubril Adekoya), as well as an All-Freshman selection (Tevonn Walker).

Drew reloaded the Valpo program entering the 2013-2014 campaign, as despite returning less than 25% of the scoring from the previous year's squad, the Crusaders won 18 games and earned their fourth consecutive postseason berth. Drew coached a First Team All-League and an All-District selection in Lavonte Dority, while a pair of members of the Crusaders' talented freshman class earned Horizon League All-Freshman Team accolades.

Drew guided the Crusaders to their second straight Horizon League regular season title during the 2012-2013 season and also led Valpo to its first Horizon League Championship crown, returning the Crusaders to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004. Along the way, Valpo won a school-record 26 games, including a record 16 victories at the ARC and a Division I-best 10 true road victories. Drew guided four players who earned postseason honors from the Horizon League, including a pair of All-District honorees in Ryan Broekhoff and Kevin Van Wijk.

Drew led Valpo to 22 victories in his rookie season at the helm of the program, including a 14-4 mark in Horizon League play to capture the league regular season title by two games. He also guided the Crusaders to the Postseason NIT. Drew was honored as the Horizon League Coach of the Year for his efforts on the bench, while he coached two First Team All-League selections in Van Wijk and Broekhoff, the latter of whom was named the league Player of the Year and an Honorable Mention All-American.

Drew, the most decorated player in Crusader men's basketball history, spent the six seasons prior to his hiring as head coach as a member of the Valparaiso coaching staff, including the previous five years as associate head coach. Drew, who helped guide Valpo through their transition into a top-ten league in the Horizon League, became just the fourth new head coach of the Crusader men's basketball program in the last 31 years.

As a student-athlete, Drew cemented himself as the best player in Valparaiso men's basketball history. Drew, who arrived at Valpo after earning Indiana Mr. Basketball honors and being named Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year in 1994, began his career by garnering Mid-Continent Conference Newcomer of the Year and Mid-Con Tournament MVP honors as a freshman. Drew, a four time All-Conference honoree, shined during the conference tournaments, earning All-Tournament Team honors each of his four seasons and picking up three Mid-Continent Conference Tournament MVP awards. He was also twice decorated as Mid-Con Most Valuable Player, one of only four players to be so honored twice in their career. Drew's career culminated as a senior by being named a Third Team All-American by the Basketball Times.

Drew led the Crusaders to four Mid-Continent Conference regular season championships, four tournament titles and three trips to the NCAA Tournament. Drew, the career leader in points (2,142), three-point field goals (364) and assists (626) at Valpo, etched his name into the American consciousness in 1998 when he hit "The Shot" in the first round of the NCAA Tournament to beat Ole Miss. The play, in which Drew caught a tip pass from teammate Bill Jenkins off a full-court feed from Jamie Sykes, won Drew an ESPY award and gave Valpo its first NCAA Tournament win in school history, propelling the Crusaders to the Sweet Sixteen.

Drew also excelled internationally during his time on the court with the Crusaders, playing for the gold-medal winning Team USA at the World University Games in 1997. Following his collegiate career, Drew again made school history when the Houston Rockets drafted him with the 16th pick in the 1998 NBA Draft, the first time a Crusader had been chosen in the first round. Drew's NBA career lasted six seasons with the Rockets, Chicago Bulls, and Charlotte and New Orleans Hornets, with his best season coming in 2000-2001 when he started 41 games for the Bulls, averaging 6.3 points and 3.9 assists per game. A prolific shooter, Drew set a Hornet record when he connected on nine consecutive three-point attempts. He competed in the postseason twice as a pro, with Houston in 1999 and with Charlotte in 2002.

Over the course of his NBA career, Drew scored over 1,000 points and made 37% of his three-point attempts. In 1999, he was honored by the NBA with the Henry P. Iba Citizen Athlete Award for sportsmanship. Drew played alongside 12 NBA All-Stars during his time in the NBA, including three players who were named among the Top 50 NBA Players of All Time. He also played under a quintet of head coaches who have combined for five NBA Championship rings. Following his six seasons in the NBA, Drew played professionally overseas for a season, playing for Reggio Calabria (Italian Serie A) and Pamesa Valencia (Spanish Liga ACB) before returning to the States to join the Crusader coaching staff.

Drew is twice a member of the Valparaiso University Hall of Fame, as he was inducted as an individual in 2003 and as part of the 1997-1998 Sweet Sixteen team in 2009. He also has been honored as one of the 150 most influential people in Valparaiso University's 150 years.

Drew graduated from Valparaiso in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in sports management and a minor in business. He and his wife Tara reside in Valparaiso with their son, Bryson.

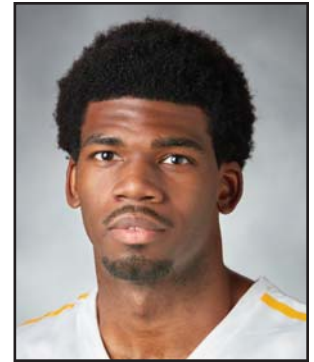

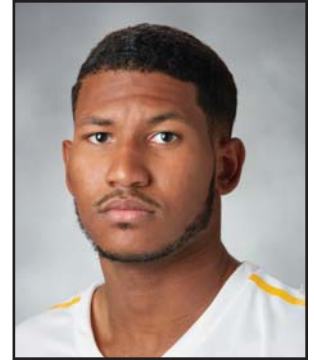
