Next Up in Valpo Basketball: The Valparaiso University women's basketball team will look to make it back-to-back victories on Friday night as the team attempts to garner a road win against Southern Illinois. A victory would allow Valpo to win consecutive games for the second time this season and the first time since Nov. 29 (Chicago State) and Dec. 2 (Eastern Illinois).

Last Time Out: Valpo downed visiting Evansville 93-49 on Sunday afternoon at the Athletics-Recreation Center. Grace Hales tied a career high with 21 points, while Ella Ellenson established a new personal best with 16. Meredith Hamlet (17) and Allison Schofield (13) were also in double figures. Valpo outscored Evansville 35-7 in the third quarter and shot 85.7 percent (12-14) during that period.

Following Valpo: Sunday's game will air on ESPN3, which is available free of charge with a cable subscription. Connor Onion (play-by-play) and Kelly Burke (color commentary) will provide captions to the motion pictures. The game can also be heard as always on 95.1 FM WVUR (and online via TuneIn) with Ben Ariano (play-by-play) and Brandon Vickrey (color commentary) illustrating the action. Head Coach Mary Evans: Mary Evans is in her first year as the head coach of the Valparaiso University women's basketball program in 2018-2019. Evans, who spent the last five seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio University, became the eighth head coach in program history on April 13, 2018. She brought 15 years of Division I experience with her to Valpo. During her time on Ohio's staff under head coach Bob Boldon, Evans helped the Bobcats to three seasons of 22 wins or more, three postseason appearances and three Top 75 RPI finishes. The 2014-15 team established a school record with 27 wins, a 21-win improvement from two years earlier and an 18 -win improvement from the previous season. The Bobcats won the 2014-15 MAC regular season and tournament titles and reached the NCAA Tournament. Evans has also coached at Youngstown State, Georgia Southern, South Carolina Aiken and Seton Hall.

Series Notes: The last meeting between these two teams was a memorable one, as Valpo suffered an 88-86 double-overtime setback at the ARC. Southern Illinois had a 66-63 lead with 2.3 seconds left when Maya Meredith knocked down a half-court buzzer-beater to send the game to overtime. The play made SportsCenter's Top 10 plays the next morning. That was just the fifth double overtime game in program history and the first since 2006. Valpo fell 74-63 when the two teams locked horns in Carbondale a year ago. Valpo had not played the Salukis prior to last season.

A Major Margin: Valpo's victory over Evansville on Sunday afternoon featured a 44-point gap between the two teams (9349). It was the largest margin of victory by a Missouri Valley Conference team against a Division-I opponent this season. The only more lopsided win for a Valley squad this year was Drake's 48-point triumph over Clarke (NAIA) on Dec. 4. In addition, it was Valpo's largest margin of victory in nine years - an 80-28 win over Youngstown State on Feb. 13, 2010.

Sharp Shooting: Valpo shot 58.3 percent in the win over the Purple Aces, the team's best clip since Dec. 15, 2017 vs. IU Northwest (.590) and best against a D-I opponent since March 8, 2014 vs. Wright State (.596). Sunday's showing cracked the Top 10 in program history for single-game field goal percentage, ranking 10th all-time.

The 80s Are Awesome: After not reaching 80 points in any of the first 15 games of the season, Valpo has brought the 80 s back in style over the last two games. Valpo put up a season-high 82 points in an overtime game against Indiana State on Friday, Jan. 18 before the 93 points in regulation against Evansville on Sunday. The last time Valpo scored 80+ points in back-to-back games was at the end of the 2015-16 season, when the team beat UIC 80-74 in the regular season finale before topping Detroit Mercy 94-91 in overtime in the first round of the Horizon League Tournament. The last time Valpo hit 80 in consecutive regular season contests before this past weekend was March 2014.

Ella's Emergence: Ella Ellenson had quite a weekend as Valpo hosted instate rivals Indiana State and Evansville. The sophomore tied a career high with 15 points against the Sycamores before pouring in 16 against the Purple Aces. She has reached double figures in three straight games after doing so once over the first 14 games of the year and three times in 30 games played last season. Ellenson has had five rebounds or more in eight of her last nine games after pulling down five boards just once over the first eight games of the year. Over the first eight games of the season, Ellenson averaged 3.4 points per game and 2.5 rebounds per game. Over the last nine games, she's averaging 9.8 points and 5.3 boards. For the 2018-19
season, her 6.8 points per game are over double last year's average of 3.3. She is playing 20.6 minutes per game, a considerable jump from 8.7 a year ago. Ellenson is 20 -of- 31 from 3-point range this season after having just two attempts from distance last year.

Splash Sisters: Meredith Hamlet and Grace Hales combined to go 15-of-17 from the floor for 38 points in Valpo's lopsided win over Evansville. Hales' 21 points matched a career high, equaling a mark established on Dec. 2 of this season against Eastern Illinois. She knocked down eight of her nine field-goal attempts against Evansville, tying for sixth in program history for single-game fieldgoal percentage with a minimum of eight attempts. She became the first player to crack the program record book in that area since Hamlet went 10-of-11 on Dec. 30, 2015 at Northern Kentucky. On Sunday, Hamlet went 7-of-8 from the floor for 17 points as she and Hales became the 18th and 19th players in program history to shoot .875 or better in a single game with a minimum of eight field goal attempts. Hales needed only 25 minutes of action to get to her career high, her fewest minutes played in the last 10 games.

Let's Talk Turnaround: Hales' and Hamlet's weekends also paralleled one another in the sense that both involved bounceback showings. Entering the game against Indiana State on Jan. 18, Hamlet had been held to six points or fewer in four of her previous five games and scored a total of three points in the previous weekend's games at UNI and Drake. However, the veteran Valpo guard broke out in a big way, scoring 26 points against the Sycamores - her third time this season above the 25-point threshold and two shy of a season high. She followed that up with an efficient 7-of-8 shooting showing on Jan. 20 against Evansville, turning in 17 points. Hales had a resilient weekend in a different fashion, rebounding from her lowest field-goal percentage of the season (besides 0-of-3 in the season opener at UIC) when she went 1-of-10 against Indiana State with her best field goal percentage of the year (8-of-9, .889) against the Purple Aces.

Entering the Scoring Column: The second half of the Jan. 20 win over Evansville saw a pair of players crack the scoring column for the first time in their collegiate careers. Nicole Johanson, who had previously scored in an exhibition game against IU Northwest, had a bucket, a block and a rebound in six minutes, all career firsts in regular season play. Valpo volleyball star turned women's basketball walk-on Katherine Carlson scored her first collegiate points in the most Katherine Carlson way possible - on a hustle play. She crashed the boards off her own 3-point miss and converted the put-back late in the third quarter for two of her eventual five points. She also had four rebounds in just 12 minutes of action.

Overtime Special: Friday's affair with Indiana State needed an extra

five minutes to be decided, marking Valpo's first overtime game of the season. This marks the second straight year Valpo has played a conference game on its home court that went beyond the regulation 40 minutes as Valpo fell 88-86 in double OT vs. Southern Illinois on Feb. 16 of last season. The last time Valpo played a single-overtime game before Friday was a memorable 94-91 win over Detroit Mercy in the first round of the Horizon League Tournament on March 11, 2016 in Green Bay. Valpo hadn't played a single-OT game at the ARC since Feb. 28, 2012, an 83-78 loss to Wright State.

Threatening the Top 10: For the third consecutive season, a Valpo player climbing the all-time scoring list is a continuous storyline. After two straight seasons of Dani Franklin moving up the Valpo ranks and eventually finishing second in program history in career points, it's Meredith Hamlet's turn. Hamlet's career total currently stands at 1,179 . She needs 16 points to crack the Top 10 in program history as Aimee Forsman (1988-1992) ranks 10th at 1,195.

Getting it Done from Distance: Valpo has equaled or bettered its opponent in made 3-pointers in 14 of the last 15 games. The only time Valpo made fewer 3s than the opponent in that stretch was Jan. 6 at Loyola. Valpo has made eight 3s or more nine times this season. The team has already surpassed last year's season total for number of games equaling or bettering the opposition's number of made 3 s .

Ten Treys: Valpo went 10-of-24 from 3-point range on Friday night against Indiana State, then 11-of-24 against Evansville, making it three straight games with $10+$ triples. The last time Valpo made 10 or more 3-pointers in consecutive games, the current Valpo seniors were still in high school. Valpo knocked down 10 triples on Nov. 20, 2014 at Northern Illinois before hitting 12 on Nov. 22 of that season vs. Tennessee Tech. This marks the first time Valpo has had $10+3 \mathrm{~s}$ in three straight games in over 19 years.

A Charitable Stripe: Valpo made a season-high 28 free throws in the overtime defeat to Indiana State on Jan. 18. In fact, that was the most free throws in a single game by any team in the Missouri Valley Conference this season. Previously, Loyola (Nov. 17 at UIC), Bradley (Dec. 1 vs. Oakland) and UNI (Jan. 6 at Bradley) all shared the conference high for made free throws in a game with 27. The last time Valpo made 28 free throws in a game before Friday was an overtime loss vs. Montana State on Dec. 1, 2013 in a neutral-site game at Florida International.

Swiping It Away: Valpo is averaging 9.5 steals per game, up from 6.9 per game last season. The last time Valpo finished a season with a steals per game average as good as the team's current mark was 2001-2002 (10.0).

Lineup Tracker: Valpo has used the starting lineup of Hannah Schaub, Meredith Hamlet, Addison Stoller, Grace Hales and Ella Ellenson in each of the last nine games. Stoller, Hamlet and Schaub have been fixtures in the starting five for all 17 games this year. Schaub has started 77 of the 81 games she's played in a Valpo uniform, while Hamlet has started 106 of her 108 career games. Ellenson has started 14 times this season, while Hales has made 12 straight starts.

3-Point Watch: Meredith Hamlet has made 185 career 3-pointers, recently passing Dani Franklin (2014-2018) for fourth in program history. The mark needed to crack the top three is 215 (Carrie Myers, 2003-2007).

Ascending the Assist Chart: Redshirt junior point guard Hannah Schaub is up to 284 career assists after sliding into the Top 10 in program history on Jan. 18 vs. Indiana State. She passed Suzie Hammel (2000-2004) for 10th, while Lauren Bechtold (2002-2006) is ninth with 287 . In the same game that Schaub moved into the all-time Top 10, Meredith Hamlet made her way into the Top 20 in career assists. She dished out four helpers against the Sycamores to lift her career total to 228, bumping Stephanie Greer (224, 19871991) from the Top 20. She is currently tied for 18th with two others.

## Inside the Salukis

- Have dropped four straight games, but three of those have come by eight points or fewer.
- Coming off a 58-53 overtime loss at Bradley on Jan. 20. Southern Illinois overcame an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit to force overtime. Nicole Martin had 16 points and 11 rebounds for her third double-double of the season.
- Led in scoring by Martin at 15.3 points per game, while Mackenzie Silvey is averaging 14.5 points per contest.
- Picked to finish fourth in the MVC Preseason Poll.
- Under the direction of sixth-year head coach Cindy Stein.

- All members of Valpo's coaching staff are in their first season in 2018-19.
- Mary Gleason has returned to the collegiate ranks after a stint as the head girls basketball coach at St. Piux X High School in Houston, Texas. She was the head coach at Houston Baptist from 2010-2013, guiding the team during the transition from NAIA to NCAA Division I. She has been an assistant at Dartmouth College (2007-2010), Princeton University (2003-2007) and New York University (2000-2003).
- Gabby Johnson joined Valpo's staff after a tenure as the head coach at Dominican University in River Forest, Ill. that began in 2012. She was an assistant at Northern Kentucky from 2010-

2012. During her playing career, Johnson helped Thomas More to an impressive 99-16 record.

- Tyeasha Moss previously served as a graduate assistant at Ohio University, where Mary Evans was an assistant coach. During her playing days, Moss was a standout at Xavier, where she led the Musketeers to three A-10 regular season championships, two undefeated conference regular seasons and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2009.
- Director of Basketball Operations Sean Eaton graduated from Valpo with a master's in sports administration in May 2018 after completing his undergraduate work at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.
- Graduate assistant Kaylin Speedy served as a manager for the Purdue women's basketball program from 2014-2018 and was the head manager by the end of her time in West Lafayette.
- Athletic trainer Carrie McKiddy is in her fourth season working with the Valpo women's basketball program and previously served as an athletic trainer at the University of Illinois from 2005-2011.

Who's Next: Coopersville (Mich.) High School senior Cara VanKempen has signed her National Letter of Intent to play for Valpo next season. The two-time all-conference performer has also garnered all-area first team and all-state honorable mention recognition. As a junior last season, VanKempen averaged 14 points, six rebounds and three assists per game. The daughter of a coach who has played for her father from a young age, VanKempen became the first high school recruit to sign with Valpo under first-year head coach Mary Evans' watch.

Champions in Classroom: The Valpo women's basketball team has developed a tradition of having players thrive academically. The 20172018 season saw Valpo have 11 players finish the spring semester with a GPA of 3.0 or better. Two players were named MVC Scholar-Athletes of the Week during the season and two were recognized as part of either the MVC Scholar-Athlete team or MVC Scholar-Athlete honorable mention. The 2018-2019 team has players with the following majors: biology, biomedical engineering, communications, public relations, marketing, healthcare leadership, health sciences, exercise science, psychology, finance, elementary education, business management and secondary/physical education.

Champions in Community: The program also has a commitment to serving the community. During their time on campus, players have visited elementary school students and wrote letters back and forth to encourage and promote healthy lifestyles as pen pals. In addition, Valpo women's basketball players assembled over 1,000 informational packages for runners and spectators at the Chicago Marathon as part of the team's annual Pack-a-thon. Athletes on the team engaged the greater Valparaiso community by volunteering and organizing supervision of the Valparaiso Popcorn Fest's Little Kernel Puff Run. Valpo players ran with children to the finish line of the event and helped set up the race.

Valparaiso was the hometown of Orville Redenbacher's popcorn company. Numerous Valpo players have also volunteered their time at the Valpo Boys \& Girls Club.

What's Back: Valpo returns nine of its top 10 scorers from a year ago, but the one departure was significant as leading scorer Dani Franklin graduated after finishing in the Top 10 in Valpo history in 13 statistical categories. Franklin, an allconference first team selection as a senior, finished second in program history in career scoring with 1,721 points and fifth in rebounding with 713 . In all, Valpo returns 12 letter winners and four starters from last season.

## \#RingTheBell

- Shortly after Valpo's new coaching staff was assembled, the group sat down to discuss a program hashtag. Despite being new to Valpo, the staff members were well educated on the University's history and tradition. That's how \#RingTheBell was born.
- Head Coach Mary Evans: "Ringing the bell here at Valpo is something you do when you graduate, so the concept speaks to our goal of being successful both on the court and in the classroom. We want to be one of the best programs in our conference and continue to have great success academically and in our personal lives. My message to our players is that whatever they do in life, it's important to put in the time and effort to be very good at it. That's what \#RingTheBell has become to us." - Senior Allison Schofield: "I love the idea by our coaching staff and think it's a tremendous concept. Ringing the bell is synonymous with Valparaiso University as a whole and has been for quite some time. This allows us to become closely associated with something that is University wide rather than separating ourselves as women's basketball. To me, \#RingTheBell means victory and finishing the close games that we've struggled to finish in the past."
- Senior Meredith Hamlet: "To me, \#RingTheBell is about winning games. That's our goal. We have confidence that we can win the games on our schedule and we have a fair shot to beat every team we play. The team that works the hardest is going to win."
- Redshirt Sophomore Addison Stoller: "\#RingTheBell gives us a consistent message and establishes a trend that we want to continue. As a program, we want to be consistent in everything we do, from our messaging to our play on the court. We've seen our coaches get excited about ringing the bell and that's allowed us to dedicate ourselves to it as well."

last seven years by topping Loyola in the first round of Hoops in the Heartland before falling to eventual conference champion Drake in the second round.

- The program finished with 13 wins, the team's highest win total since 2008-09, when it won 16 games. The team also equaled its highest conference win total since 2009-10 and had the most road wins in a single season since the 2011-2012 campaign.
- Valpo finished with the second-best free-throw percentage in program history at 76.0 and had its highest scoring average (65.1) since 2007-2008 (66.3).
- Senior Dani Franklin closed out her noteworthy career and was named to the 2017-18 All-MVC First Team and Scholar-Athlete First Team following the season. She finished second in program history in career points.


## Meredith Hamlet

On the court...

- Knocked down seven of her eight field-goal attempts on Jan. 20 vs. Evansville, accumulating 17 points and a team-high six boards. - Burst out of a minor slump with a 26 -point effort on Jan. 18 vs. Indiana State that also featured four assists, five rebounds and three steals. She knocked down seven shots in that game while moving into the Top 20 in program history in career assists.
- Held the outright team lead in rebounding for the first time since Jan. 14, 2017 (10 at Youngstown State) on Dec. 19 at Purdue Fort Wayne, pulling down six boards.
- Led all scorers with 15 points and pulled down a season-high eight rebounds on Dec. 16 vs. North Dakota State.
- Played in her 100th career game and made her 98th career start on Dec. 8 vs. Miami (Ohio).
- Was named the MVC Player of the Week on Dec. 3 after averaging 22.7 points per game over three games the previous week. She became the first Valpo basketball player - men's or women's - to earn a Valley Player of the Week distinction. She was the first Valpo women's player to win a conference player of the week award since 2013.
- Upped her season high to 28 points on Nov. 29 at Chicago State while also racking up five assists, four steals and draining five 3-pointers.
- Turned in a then season-high 26 points on Nov. 26 vs. Toledo, three points shy of a career high that she has reached on three occasions.
- Became the 15 th player in program history to reach the 1,000 point milestone on Nov. 17 vs. St. Francis Brooklyn. Her milestone point came on a made layup with 9:22 remaining in the third quarter. She finished the game with 18 points.
- Scored 12 of her game-high 15 points in the fourth quarter in the home opener on Nov. 11 against North Dakota.
- Started the season opener for the fourth consecutive year on Nov.

7 at UIC and swished in a career-high 12 free throws while scoring a team-high 19 points in that contest.

- Set the school record for made 3-pointers by a freshman in a single season in 2015-16 with 69, a mark that ranked fifth overall in program history.
- Named to the 2015-16 Horizon League All-Freshman Team and received 2017-18 MVC Scholar-Athlete Honorable Mention.
- Has enjoyed numerous notable single-game performances, including reaching 29 points on three occasions - Dec. 15, 2017 vs. IU Northwest, Jan. 14, 2017 at Youngstown State and Dec. 30, 2015 at Northern Kentucky. Perhaps her most memorable game, however, was Feb. 11 of last season at Loyola, when she exploded for 19 points in the fourth quarter to help Valpo to a comeback victory after being held scoreless for the first three quarters.

- Comes from a Valpo family as the third of three sisters to play women's basketball at Valpo. ## Mary Evans <br> Head Coach <br> 1st Season <br> $5-12$ overall \& at Valpo Georgia Southern, 2000

Mary Evans is in her first year as the head coach of the Valparaiso University women's basketball program in 2018-2019.

Evans, who spent the last five seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio University, became the eighth head coach in program history on April 13, 2018. She brought 15 years of Division I experience with her to Valpo.

During her time on Ohio's staff under head coach Bob Boldon, Evans helped the Bobcats to three seasons of 22 wins or more, three postseason appearances and three Top 75 RPI finishes. The 2014-15 team established a school record with 27 wins, a 21 -win improvement from two years earlier and an 18-win improvement from the previous season. The Bobcats won the 2014-15 MAC regular season and tournament titles and reached the NCAA Tournament.

Evans spent the 2012-13 season at Youngstown State University, where she helped the Penguins to a 23-10 record and a first-round win at Indiana State in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). She has also coached at Georgia Southern University (2007-2012), the University of South Carolina, Aiken (2005-2007) and Seton Hall University (2001-2005).

The five-year stint at Georgia Southern provided Evans with the opportunity to work at her alma mater. She helped guide the 2009-2010 team to a 19-12 record, the program's highest win total since 2002-2003.

During her time at Division II South Carolina, Aiken, Evans was an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator, helping the program to its first 20-win season since 2001-2002 in 2006-2007.

At Seton Hall, Evans was on staff as the Pirates reached the WNIT in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005. She was the recruiting coordinator during the 2004-2005 season.

At Aiken, Evans worked under Mike Brandt, who provided her with the opportunity to run the defense. When she returned to Georgia Southern under Rusty Cram, she was the offensive coach and had the chance to run practices. For six seasons prior to her appointment as Valpo head coach, she served on Boldon's staff, first at Youngstown State and then at Ohio.

Evans was a two-sport athlete at Georgia Southern, where she earned her Bachelor of Science degree in 2000. She won four letters in basketball (1995-1999) and three in soccer during her time as a collegiate athlete. A native of Summerville, S.C., Evans was inducted into the Summerville High School Hall of Fame in 2008. She and her husband Daryl have two children, Keegan Thomas and Zoe Mae.
