Next Up in Valpo Basketball: The Valparaiso University men's basketball team is all set to host a Saturday night home game at the Athletics-Recreation Center as Incarnate Word comes to town for the first ever matchup between the two teams. The Cardinals feature several Northwest Indiana ties as head coach Carson Cunningham previously served as the high school coach at Andrean, his alma mater, while assistant coach Chris Artis played collegiately at Valpo. Ben Krikke will be recognized prior to the game for becoming the latest member of Valpo's 1,000-point club.

Last Time Out: Valpo outscored Chicago State 50-38 after halftime, but it was not enough to erase a large early deficit as the host Cougars prevailed 87-74 on Wednesday night on Chicago's south side. Ben Krikke had 27 points on 12-of-16 shooting, while Nick Edwards scored all 15 of his points in the second half.

Head Coach Matt Lottich: Matt Lottich (98-98) is in his seventh season as the head coach of the men's basketball program in 2022-2023. Twice during his tenure, Valpo has upset Top-25 opponents, defeating Drake and Rhode Island at the ARC. Valpo has four wins over AP Top 25 teams in program history, and two have come under Lottich. In 2019-2020, Valpo became the first team in the history of Arch Madness, the annual Missouri Valley Conference Tournament in St. Louis, to reach the title game after playing in the opening round by winning three games in three days. Lottich, hired as the 22nd head coach of the Valpo men's basketball program in April 2016, graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and New Trier High School (Illinois) in 2000.

Series Notes: This will mark the first matchup between Valpo and Incarnate Word.

Krikke Atop the MVC

- After tallying a career-high 28 points in the Nov. 13 home opener vs. Western Michigan, Ben Krikke followed with 27 on Nov. 16 at Chicago State. Prior to the game against the Broncos, Krikke had scored no more than 26 points in any of his 91 collegiate games. Now, he has scored 27 or more in two straight.
- Thanks to his early-season scoring surge, Krikke sits atop the Missouri Valley Conference in scoring average. In fact, the Valpo senior ranks 10th in the nation in points per game.
- Krikke's 27 points on Wednesday were the most by a Valpo player in a true road game since Javon Freeman-Liberty's 28 on Jan. 15, 2020 at UNI.
- Krikke became the first Valpo player to score 27 points or more in back-to-back games since Alec Peters did so in three straight outings in December 2016 (at Missouri State, vs. Indiana State, vs. Santa Clara).
- Entering Nov. 19 vs. Incarnate Word, Krikke has scored 1,047 career points. He is 149 points away from cracking the top 20 in program history.

Cougars Convert the Freebies

- Chicago State shot 96.4 percent from the free-throw line at 27-of-28 in the Nov. 16 game against Valpo. That marked the highest single-game free throw percentage in the nation so far this season.
- This marked the first time a Valpo opponent shot 95 percent or better at the charity stripe with 20 or more attempts since Butler on Jan. 1, 2011.
- This was Chicago State's highest free-throw percentage with a minimum of 10 attempts since going 12-of-12 vs. Loyola on Jan. 20, 2013.

Shooting for 2-0 at Home

- Valpo has a chance to start the home portion of the season with a 2-0 record for the 12th time in the last 13 seasons. The only time in that stretch that Valpo did not start 2-0 at home was last season, when the home slate began with setbacks to Toledo and UIC.
- The program is now 17-1 in its last 18 home openers with 15 of those victories coming by double figures.
- Valpo has finished with a home record of .500 or better in 30 straight seasons.

Other Notes Wrapping Up Nov. 16: Chicago State 87, Valpo 74

- Point guard Nick Edwards scored all 15 of his points after halftime, part of his first double-figure output in a Valpo uniform and the 25th such performance of his collegiate career.
- Ben Krikke's 27 points came on 12-of-16 from the field and 3-of-3 at the free-throw line. This marked his 54th career double-figure game and his 11th with 20+ points.

- Valpo held a 24-10 edge in transition points and a 42-30 advantage in points in the paint.
- The Beacons shot 54.3 percent in the second half and outscored the Cougars 50-38 after the break.
- Kobe King paced the team on the glass with six rebounds including four offensive boards. King scored 11 points, finishing in double figures for the third consecutive game and the 22nd time in his 26-game Valpo career.
- The Beacons shot 48.3 percent for the game but were just 2-of-11 from 3-point territory. Valpo made 14 of its 18 free throws (77.8 percent).
- Sophomore Preston Ruedinger returned to action after missing the previous two games with a back injury, but Ibra Bayu (hernia) and Cam Palesse (thumb) remained sidelined.
- In his return to the court, Ruedinger grabbed a career-high four rebounds.

Scouting the Cardinals

- Coming off an 84-47 victory over Texas Lutheran after opening the season with losses to North Dakota (65-57) and UNLV (88-63).
- Picked to finish 10th in the 10-team Southland Conference.
- Led in scoring by Charlie Yoder at 15.0 points per game.
- Finished last season with a 7-25 record and a 3-11 mark in conference play.

The 1,000-Point Club

- Valpo senior Ben Krikke reached the 1,000-career-point milestone in the Nov. 13 home-opening victory over Western Michigan.
- He became the first Valpo player to join that esteemed group since current graduate assistant Tevonn Walker did so exactly five years prior Nov. 13, 2017 vs. Trinity Christian.
- Krikke's milestone basket came at the 4:50 mark of the first half as his layup lifted his career point total into four figures. The crowd recognized the accomplishment with a loud ovation as public address announcer John Bowker communicated the news to the audience at the next dead ball.

The Dynamic Duo

- Valpo's home-opening win over Western Michigan was certainly a team effort, but make no mistake, the stars shined the brightest in the team's regular-season ARC debut with preseason all-conference selections Ben Krikke and Kobe King combining for two thirds of the team's scoring.
- Krikke's career-high 28 points outdid his previous watermark of 26 that occurred on Nov. 27, 2021 vs. Trinity Christian.
- King also turned in a career high with 26, topping his previous best of 24 that came on Feb. 5 of last season vs. Indiana State.
- This marked the first time Valpo boasted two players with 25+ points in the same game since Dec. 21, 2010 at Oakland, when Brandon Wood (35) and Cory Johnson (33) turned the trick.

Evansville vs. UCF

- Prior to Krikke and King vs. Western Michigan, the last time a pair of Valpo teammates scored 20 or more in the same contest was Jan. 22, 2017 vs. UIC (Alec Peters, 30; Shane Hammink 24).
- Krikke and King became the second set of teammates each with 25+ points in the same game against a Division-I opponent this season, joining UNC's Caleb Love and Armando Bacot.
- Krikke's 28 points were the most by a Valpo player in a single game since Thomas Kithier also had 28 on Nov. 13, 2021 vs. UIC.
- Krikke's career-high 13 made field goals were the most by a Valpo player since Javon Freeman-Liberty had 13 on Nov. 25, 2019 vs. Cincinnati.

Darius The Distributor

- Darius DeAveiro handed out a career-high 10 assists while committing just one turnover in the Nov. 13 victory over Western Michigan.
- The sophomore point guard came off the bench and finished two points shy of a double-double as he matched a career best in the scoring department with eight points, equaling his previous mark that occurred on Jan. 15, 2022 vs. Missouri State.
- The 10-assist total bested his previous personal high of eight that had occurred twice, most recently Dec. 7 of last season vs. East West.
- This marked just the third time in the last 15 seasons that a Valpo player has reached a double-figure assist total as DeAveiro joined Deion Lavender as the only Valpo players to do so in that time period. Lavender handed out 10 assists twice during the 2018-19 season, most recently Dec. 8, 2018 at George Washington.
- DeAveiro became just the 11th player in the nation this season with 10 or more assists and one turnover or fewer in a game.
- DeAveiro became just the third player in the nation this season to come off the bench and hand out 10 or more assists, joining Kentucky's Sahvir Wheeler and Delaware State's Corey Perkins.

Century Mark in Sight

- Valpo head coach Matt Lottich earned his 98th career win on Nov. 13 vs. Western Michigan.
- He needs just two more victories to become the fourth head coach in program history to reach 100 career victories, joining Homer Drew, Bryce Drew and J.M Christiansen.
- Last season, Lottich moved into sole possession of fourth place in program history, surpassing the legendary Gene Bartow (1964-

Other Notes Wrapping Up Nov. 13: Valpo 81, Western Michigan 65

- Krikke turned in his 10th career game with 20 points or more, while King enjoyed his third such contest.
- The Beacons shot 50 percent from the field while holding the Broncos to 35.5 percent (22-of-62).
- The Beacons committed just eight turnovers while racking up 18 assists.
- Valpo outscored WMU 20-2 in fastbreak points and 46-24 in the paint.
- The victory came despite playing shorthanded as Cam Palesse (thumb), Preston Ruedinger (back) and Ibra Bayu (hernia) were not in uniform.
- Connor Barrett knocked down a 3-pointer in his first game action since Jan. 5 of last season.

Ben Bits

- Last season, Ben Krikke was one of three players in the Missouri Valley Conference to shoot 50 percent or better from the floor and 80 percent or better from the free-throw line, joining Isiaih Mosley of Missouri State and Malevy Leons of Bradley while owning the highest field-goal percentage of that elite group.
- Krikke entered the season with a career field-goal percentage of 53.4, a mark that ranks seventh in program history.
- Krikke had a 12-game double-figure scoring streak that was snapped in the final game of the season, the MVC Tournament quarterfinal vs. Missouri State. He totaled 22 double-figure outputs and seven performances of 20 points or more while pacing the team in scoring on 11 occasions.
- The Valpo forward entered this season having played in 90 career games with two years of eligibility remaining. The threshold to crack the program's all-time top 10 is 126 and the program record is 138 (Erik Buggs). He started the final 29 games last season after missing the first three games of the year due to an ankle injury.
 - After earning third team honors for the second straight year, Krikke became the first Valpo player to earn All-MVC accolades in two different seasons. The program's last multi-time all-conference honoree was Alec Peters, who was a first-team all-Horizon League pick in each of his final three seasons, concluding in 2016-17.
 - He earned MVC Scholar-Athlete First Team status for the second straight year. He is the only Valpo player who has been part of the MVC Scholar-Athlete First Team since the department joined the conference.

Kobe's Kingdom

- Kobe King has scored in double figures in 21 of his 25 games in a Valpo uniform, including 15 or more in each of the first two games this season.
- The former Wisconsin Mr. Basketball has scored 15 or more points

in 12 of his 25 games with the Beacons.

- King is up to 26 career double-figure scoring efforts including his tenure at Wisconsin.
- At the end of last season, King became Valpo's second All-Newcomer Team choice since joining the league and first since Bakari Evelyn in 2017-18.
- He appeared on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays after a three-quarter court buzzer-beater on Dec. 11 vs. Charlotte, a play that ranked No. 9 on the popular countdown that evening.

Top Two Scorers Back

- With both Ben Krikke (14.2 ppg) and Kobe King (14.0 ppg) back, Valpo returns its top two scorers from last season.
- The last time the program had its top two scorers back from the previous year was 2015-2016, when Alec Peters and Darien Walker both returned after finishing as the team's top two scorers in 2014-15. The 2015-16 season was a historic one, as the Brown & Gold reached the NIT championship game.
- Only four of the 12 teams in the Missouri Valley Conference have their top two scorers back from last season, as Valpo joins Drake, Southern Illinois and Indiana State.

Point Guard Prowess

- Sophomore Preston Ruedinger has been placed on scholarship after spending much of the 2021-22 season as the starting point guard while competing as a nonscholarship freshman. He initially planned to redshirt but instead used a season of eligibility, making his season debut on Dec. 20 vs. Eastern Michigan.

- Ruedinger did not make more than one turnover in any of his 19 contests and played turnover-free basketball on 11 occasions.
- He finished the season with 32 assists against just eight turnovers. He was the only player in the nation with 30 or more assists and fewer than 10 turnovers, becoming the first Valpo player to finish a season with 30 or more assists and fewer than 10 turnovers in the last 15 years.
- At season's end, Ruedinger was named to the MVC All-Freshman Team, the fourth straight season Valpo has had a rookie earn that distinction.
- In addition, sophomore Darius DeAveiro finished his freshman season as one of two freshmen nationally (joining Youngstown State's Luke Chicone) with 50 or more assists and fewer than 25 turnovers. He was the only player in the MVC to achieve that feat.
- Valpo has added fifth-year senior Nick Edwards to the mix after he played at Glenville State last season. Edwards was one of eight players in the Division-II nation to post a triple-double a year ago en route to averaging 7.9 assists per game over 11 games while being limited by a foot injury.

Looking Back at 2021-2022

- The team boasted two MVC Scholar-Athlete team selections, the captain of the All-Bench Team, an MVC Most-Improved Team honoree, an All-MVC Third Team performer, an All-Newcomer team member and an All-Freshman team honoree. Valpo had seven different MVC postseason honors won by five different players.
- Valpo went a combined 5-0 against instate foes Indiana State and Evansville, sweeping the Hoosier State for the first time since joining the MVC.
- Valpo finished with a home record of .500 or better for the 30th consecutive season
- Eight of Valpo's 18 MVC games were decided by three points or fewer or required overtime.
- The Beacons overcame double-figure deficits to win on three occasions (Tulane, Eastern Michigan and Evansville), something that has occurred 19 times during the Matt Lottich Era.
- The team finished fourth in the MVC in both free-throw percentage (.759) and field-goal percentage (.459) while also finishing fourth in assists per game (12.5), steals per game (6.4) and third in assist/turnover ratio (1.1).
- Valpo played six overtime games, the program's most since tying a Division-I record with eight in 1993.

Preseason Picks

- Ben Krikke was tabbed to the Preseason All-MVC First Team, becoming the first player to earn that honor in Valpo's time in the conference.
- Prior to this season, Valpo had five preseason all-conference selections since joining The Valley in 2017-18, all second team

honorees.

- Kobe King was named to the Preseason All-MVC Third Team, making this the second time in the team's six years in The Valley that Valpo has boasted a pair of preseason all-league choices.
- Krikke, also a Preseason All-MVC Second Team choice last year, became the first Valpo player to earn Preseason All-MVC honors on multiple occasions.
- Valpo was picked to finish ninth of 12 in the preseason poll, ahead of Illinois State, UIC and Evansville.
- Drake hauled in 52 of the 54 first-place votes and finished a heavy preseason favorite, while Drake's Tucker DeVries was named MVC Preseason Player of the Year.
- In addition to the conference's honor, Krikke was named to the Preseason All-MVC First Team by Blue Ribbon Magazine

Roster Rundown

- The 2022-23 roster features eight returning letter winners, one returning player who redshirted last season and six newcomers (three freshmen, three transfers).
- Five Valpo players hail from outside of the United States two from The Netherlands, two from Canada and one from Denmark.
- Four members of the roster are natives of the state of Wisconsin, while two call Illinois home and one has remained in his home state of Indiana. The remaining players come from Georgia, Minnesota and Ohio.
- Nick Edwards is the first Georgia native to play for the program since E. Victor Nickerson in 2015-16.

Newcomer Notes

- Nick Edwards had a triple-double while playing at Glenville last season, one of eight Division-II players in the nation to achieve that feat.
- Quinton Green earned All-Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC) honors for three straight seasons. He finished with 1,288 points over four seasons at Cedarville and knocked down a teamhigh 59 3-point field goals last year.
- Ibra Bayu spent three years in the United States playing high school basketball before arriving at Valpo. He dealt with a serious medical issue during his junior season before being sidelined by two separate fractured ankles as a senior.
- Jerome Palm comes to Valpo after two junior college seasons at Hillsborough CC and Daytona State. He competed for the championship-winning Netherlands national team in the 2021 3x3 national tournament.
- Maximus Nelson was a unanimous first team all-conference and first-team all-state selection after his senior season at Appleton North High School in Appleton, Wis.

Matt Lottich

Head Coach 7th Season * Stanford, 2004 98-98 Overall and at Valpo

Matt Lottich is in his seventh season as the head coach of the men's basketball program in 2022-2023. He owned a 97-96 record over his first six seasons as head coach.

During the 2021-22 campaign, Lottich helped Valpo players earn seven different Missouri Valley Conference postseason honors won by five different players. His team finished fourth in the MVC in free-throw percentage (.759), field-goal percentage (.459), assists per game (12.5) and steals per game (6.4) while finishing third in assist/TO ratio (1.1). Numerous players reached individual accomplishments under Lottich's watch, including Kevion Taylor scoring his 2,000th career point, a pair of Valpo players finishing in the top eight in the MVC in field-goal percentage and Ben Krikke finishing as one of three MVC players with a field-goal percentage of 50 percent or better and a free-throw percentage of 80 percent or better. Freshman walk-on Preston Ruedinger finished as the only player in the nation with 30 or more assists and fewer than 10 turnovers.

During 2021-22 campaign, Lottich led Valpo to a 5-0 record against instate foes Indiana State and Evansville, its first Hoosier State sweep since joining the MVC. The Beacons overcame three double-figure deficits to prevail (Tulane, Eastern Michigan and Evansville), lifting Lottich's career double-figure comeback total to 19. In addition, Lottich climbed into fourth in program history in career victories, surpassing the legendary Gene Bartow.

The 2020-2021 season saw Valpo improve its Arch Madness seeding for the fourth straight year as the program continued to make positive strides in each season as a Missouri Valley Conference member. The team earned a first-round bye in the State Farm MVC Tournament for the first time since joining the prestigious league.

Valpo upset previously-undefeated Drake, the nation's No. 25 team, 74-57 on Feb. 7, 2021 at the ARC, the fourth win over an AP Top 25 team in program history and second under Lottich. The Bulldogs were one of three undefeated teams in the nation prior to that setback, joining Gonzaga and Baylor. Valpo came close to two other victories over ranked foes, falling 80-77 vs. No. 25 Drake on Feb. 6 and 54-52 at No. 22 Loyola on Feb. 17. In addition, Valpo extended its streak to 29 straight seasons without a sub-.500 home record.

Just two years removed from finishing in last place and being knocked out in the first round of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament as a first-year Valley member, Lottich's team did more than hold its own in 2019-2020, ascending into a tie for sixth in the league standings before finishing as the conference tournament runner-up. Valpo became the first team in the history of Arch Madness to reach the title game after playing in the opening round.

Lottich led the program to its first conference championship game appearance since 2015 during the 2019-2020 campaign, doing so after being picked to finish ninth of 10 in the preseason poll. Valpo reached the conference title game as only a third-year MVC member, becoming the first Valpo team in any sport to do so during the department's young tenure in the prestigious league. After finishing with its highest conference win total, highest overall win total and highest finish in the league standings since joining The Valley, Valpo accepted a postseason tournament invitation to play in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. The event was ultimately canceled due to COVID-19 concerns.

The 2019-2020 team's finest hour came on the biggest stage, as Lottich led the squad to three victories in as many days at Arch Madness, the 2020 State Farm MVC Men's Basketball Tournament in St. Louis. Lottich's team came from 18 down to upset Loyola in the MVC quarterfinal, tying for the second-biggest comeback in MVC Tournament history. During his time guiding the program, Lottich has instilled a no-quit attitude. The Loyola comeback marked the sixth time in 2019-2020 that Valpo came from double figures down to win. On 11 occasions, Valpo trailed by at least 10 points and eventually tied the game or took the lead. Valpo also became just the second team in the long history of the Missouri Valley Conference to come from 17 or more down to win twice in one season, joining Creighton from 2007-2008.

Working with a young team that featured just five returning players from the previous season, Lottich mentored a 2019-2020 First Team All-MVC selection, MVC All-Defensive Team choice, MVC All-Freshman Team honoree, MVC All-Bench pick, MVC Scholar-Athlete Second Team selection and a pair of MVC All-Tournament Team performers. Perhaps most noteworthy of all, the program's emphasis on player development paid dividends as Valpo accounted for 40 percent of the MVC Most-Improved Team.

Other noteworthy feats for Lottich's squad in 2019-2020 included making 18 3-pointers in a game against Bradley to set the league-only MVC record, holding Southern Illinois to 38 points to set the program record for the fewest allowed against a Division-I opponent since the advent of the shot clock, snapping a 22-game losing streak in games at Evansville that had dated back to 1969, breaking through with its first win over Loyola since joining The Valley after previously going 0-7 against the program's Chicagoland rival and twice turning a double-figure defeat from the first half of the MVC double-round robin into a double-figure victory in the second meeting with that opponent.

The 2018-2019 season saw Lottich lead Valpo to 15 wins. The season was headlined by road victories over UNLV and George Washington during the nonconference portion of the schedule, as well as a 4-0 start to Missouri Valley Conference play.

Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-2018 and guided the team through the move to the MVC, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI.

In his first season at the helm of the Valpo men's basketball program, Lottich guided the team to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in a six-year span as he led Valpo to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT. Lottich's inaugural season as head coach was highlighted by a home win over a nationally-ranked Rhode Island squad as well as neutral-site triumphs over Alabama and BYU to capture the MGM Grand Main Event.

Lottich coached the Horizon League Player of the Year and an NABC Third Team All-American in Alec Peters, guiding the senior as he closed out one of the top careers in program history. Peters enjoyed his finest season as a senior, ranking among the Top 20 in the nation in both scoring and rebounding and breaking five of Valpo's career records.

Lottich was hired as the 22nd head coach of the Valpo men's basketball program in April 2016. After spending the previous three seasons on staff as an assistant coach, he became just the fifth Valpo head coach in a 36-year span. Lottich arrived at Valparaiso University in summer 2013 and helped guide the team to 78 victories over his three seasons as an assistant. Valpo won two Horizon League regular season championships and one league tournament title over those three years.

Lottich brings nearly a decade of professional playing experience to the head coaching position at Valparaiso University. He spent eight years playing professionally in Japan for the Oita Heat Devils and the Osaka Evessa, earning All-Star recognition four times. He also played one season in Germany in the Bundesliga for the Dusseldorf Giants, played one season in New Zealand in the NBL for the Harbor Heat and was a member of the New Jersey Nets' summer league team in 2004.

Lottich played collegiately at Stanford University from 2000-2004. As a senior in 2003-2004, he helped lead the Cardinal to the Pac-10 title while earning NABC All-Star plaudits, awarded to the Top 15 seniors in college basketball. He was also a member of the Wooden Award midseason watch list and was an Honorable Mention All Pac-10 selection as a senior. Lottich was a member of the program's conference championship squad as a freshman in 2000-2001 and still ranks among Stanford's single-season and career leaders in 3-pointers made.

Off the court, Lottich came to Valpo from the National Collegiate Scouting Association, where he started in January 2013. Lottich ascended to the position of head scout during his time with the NCSA, which helps high school athletes navigate the world of college recruiting. Lottich also co-founded the TEAM Life Skills basketball camp in 2004 and spent nine years managing and developing the camp.

Lottich played his prep basketball at New Trier [Ill.] H.S., where he was named the Chicago Tribune Athlete of the Year in 2000 and holds the distinction of being the program's all-time leading scorer. Lottich graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and currently resides in Valparaiso with his wife, Kylan, and their four children: Grace, Matthan, Christian and Landon.
