Next Up in Valpo Basketball: After having last weekend off from competition due to COVID cancellations, the Valpo women's basketball team returns to action for the first time in 14 days this weekend for its final home games of the season, as the Brown and Gold host Evansville Friday and Saturday evenings. Friday's game will be the program's annual Play4Kay to raise awareness for breast cancer research, while Saturday's game will be Senior Night at the ARC.

Previously: Valpo split its home series with Bradley two weekends ago, defeating the Braves 71-66 on Feb. 4 before falling 61-51 on Feb. 5. In the victory, Valpo matched its program single-game record by knocking down 17 3-pointers, five of which came from Shay Frederick as she led the way with 17 points, nine rebounds and five assists in the win. Valpo's scheduled games against Indiana State last weekend were canceled due to positive COVID test results among the Sycamores' tier I personnel.

Head Coach Mary Evans: Mary Evans (32-45) is in her third season as head coach of the Valpo women's basketball program in 2020-21. Evans led the Valpo program to a remarkable season across the board in 2019-20, one that concluded among the nation's top turnarounds from the season before. Valpo posted a 17-12 record in Evans' second season at the helm, the 17 wins the most by a Valpo team since the 2006-07 campaign and the 10th-most in a single season in program history. Valpo improved its record by 10.5 games over the previous season in 2019-20, tied for the sixth-best improvement in Division I.

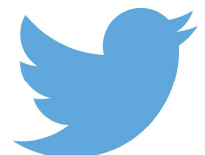
Series Notes: Valpo and Evansville have met 18 times in the all-time series, with Valpo owning a 10-8 advantage - including a 5-1 lead in the series since joining the MVC prior to the 2017-18 campaign. Last season saw Valpo sweep the Purple Aces, winning 88-66 in Evansville as it racked up a season-high 21 steals and 72-54 at the ARC behind six 3-pointers and 20 points from Grace Hales.

- Valpo has been picked to finish in seventh place in the MVC preseason poll, totaling 176 points.
- Valpo is in its fourth season as a member of the Missouri Valley Conference in 2020-21.
- The Valley was ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI in 2019-20.

...looking back at last year

- Valpo finished the 2019-20 campaign with a 17-12 overall record, a 10.5-game improvement over the previous year - good for sixth-best nationally.
- Valpo jumped 172 spots in the RPI from the previous year, the largest leap for any D-I team in the nation.
- Valpo's 17 wins marked the most by a Valpo team since 2006-07.
- The Brown and Gold finished in sixth place in the MVC standings with a 9-9 record - the program's best finish since joining The Valley.
- The .500 record in conference play was the program's first since 2008-09.
- Valpo closed the regular season strong, going 6-3 in the second half of MVC play.
- Grace Hales earned Honorable Mention All-Conference accolades, while Carie Weinman was named to the MVC All-Defensive Team.
- As a team, Valpo set the program's single-season record for free throw percentage (.792), while Hales broke the program's individual single-season record in the category (.890).

...versus Bradley - Feb. 5

- Valpo was held to 32.1% shooting from the floor and was just 7-of-26 from 3-point range, one day after matching its program single-game record with 17 triples.
- Shay Frederick led Valpo with 11 points, but was just 4-of-12 from the field.
- Caitlin Morrison finished with 10 points and a pair of blocked shots, in the process becoming just the fourth player in program history to rack up 100 career rejections.
- Valpo finished the contest +9 in the turnover. The Brown and Gold forced 21 turnovers by the Braves, matching the second-most that they've forced in a game this season.

...versus Bradley - Feb. 4

- All three of Valpo's MVC wins to date have been over teams ranked in the top-100 of the NCAA NET rankings.
- The 3-point shooting was the story of the day, as Valpo matched its program record for 3-point makes by going 17-for-39 from beyond the arc. It

is the third time in program history that Valpo has made 17 triples (Bowling Green, 12/21/18; Central Michigan, 12/8/04), but the first time it's happened within conference play.

- 10 of Valpo's 17 triples came after halftime, as the Brown and Gold went 10-for-16 from deep in the final 20 minutes.
- This marks the seventh time this season that Valpo has connected on at least 10 3-pointers in a game.
- Leading the way, both from deep and overall, was Shay Frederick. The junior finished with a team-best 17 points, hitting 5-of-9 of her 3-point attempts. Frederick also led the way with nine rebounds, matching her career high in the category, and a game-high five assists.
- Carie Weinman cashed in on three 3-pointers en route to 15 points and added five rebounds as well.
- Lauren Gunn came off the bench with a career-best 10 points to round out Valpo's trio of double-figure scorers.
- Valpo erased three separate deficits of at least 10 points, with its largest deficit coming in the first quarter at 12 points.
- Valpo has eight wins in games it has trailed by double figures since the last time it surrendered a double-digit lead in a loss.
- Valpo committed a season-low seven turnovers — its lowest total since committing just seven miscues at Loyola Jan. 6, 2019 — and held a +12 advantage in the turnover column, its biggest edge of the year. The Brown and Gold held a 27-6 edge in points off turnovers.
- Valpo also enjoyed a large 21-2 advantage in points off the bench in the win, while Bradley outscored Valpo in the paint, 32-10.

...looking ahead

- Valpo is scheduled to play its final five games of the regular season on the road, starting with the second half of its home-and-home with Loyola on Feb. 24.
- Next weekend sees Valpo travel to Southern Illinois for a two-game series Feb. 27-28.

...at the ARC

- Friday and Saturday are Valpo's 10th and 11th home games of the season. It currently is 4-5 at the ARC after the split with Bradley.
- Valpo finished home nonconference play 2-0 with wins over Western Michigan and Xavier.
- This marks the fewest nonconference home games since the 1994-95 team also played just two out-of-conference games at the ARC.
- Valpo was a perfect 4-0 in nonconference home games last season and finished the year with an 8-5 overall home record - the program's best mark at the ARC since 2012-13.

- Evansville enters this weekend's two-game series at 5-11 overall and 1-10 in MVC play, dropping a pair of games to Loyola after a Jan. 27 win over Indiana State.
- The Purple Aces are led by sophomore Abby Feit, who is averaging 14.6 points and 7.5 rebounds per game.
- Evansville is averaging nearly 20 turnovers per game as a team.

- Ella Ellenson, Caitlin Morrison and Marlee Profitt will be honored on Saturday night, as well as senior manager Taylor Tyndall and Addison Stoller, who graduated last year, opted not to use her final season of eligibility and is currently with the program working as its strength and conditioning coach.

- While Grace White is also a senior, she intends to take advantage of the NCAA waiver for winter sports athletes for the 2020-21 season and return for the 2021-22 campaign.

Another Extended Break

- For the third time this year, Valpo is returning to action after a break in competition of at least 10 days.

- Valpo will have gone 14 days in between games when it steps on the court Friday to take on Evansville.

- The Brown and Gold had a 18-day stretch without a game before its MVC opener, playing its final non-conference game at Wisconsin Dec. 20 before opening conference play Jan. 7 with a 63-56 win over UNI.

- Valpo later played Loyola Jan. 19 and didn't return to action for 11 days until a Jan. 30 game against #25 Missouri State, a 61-51 loss.

A Long Homestand

- While it wasn't originally scheduled as such, the cancelation of the series at Indiana State last weekend turned this current homestand into the longest homestand in program history.

- With the two games against the Purple Aces, Valpo will have played seven consecutive home games dating back to its Jan. 19 matchup with Loyola.

- Prior to this year, Valpo had played five straight home games three times, most recently in the 2015-16 season.

- Valpo will go at least a month and nine days between road games, as its last road contest came Jan. 15 at Illinois State and its next scheduled road game is Feb. 24 at Loyola.

- The program hasn't gone that long between road games since back in the 1980s, when it was common for the team to take a break of nearly or even over a month around the Christmas holiday.

A Historic Win

- Valpo's win on Feb. 4 over Bradley was historic for the program in two different ways.

- Valpo matched its program record for 3-point makes by going 17-for-39 from beyond the arc. It is the third time in program history that Valpo has made 17 triples (Bowling Green, 12/21/18; Central Michigan, 12/8/04), but the first time it's happened within conference play.

- The 17 3-pointers are also tied for fourth-most in a single game in MVC history, while the 39 3-point attempts are the fifth-most by the program in a single game all-time.

- Valpo has now made 14 or more 3-pointers in a game 16 times in program history - seven of those efforts have come in the three-year tenure of Mary Evans.

- Meanwhile, Valpo erased three separate double-digit deficits, as it overcame a 12-point first-quarter deficit and two different 10-point third-quarter deficits to earn the win.

- In the last 20 years, the Brown and Gold had never completely erased two separate double-digit deficits in a win before erasing three in the win over the Braves.

Front-Loaded Conference Slate

- With half of the MVC teams currently ranked among the top-100 in the NET, a team is going to be faced with many challenging tests throughout

the conference schedule. But for Valpo, most of those tests came at the front end of the slate.

- The games against Bradley were Valpo's seventh and eighth top-100 opponents through its first nine MVC games.
- By contrast, the second half of Valpo's MVC conference schedule will feature just two top-100 games.

Claiming Top 100 Wins

- With the MVC a top-8 conference last year by RPI and top-7 this year by NET, it gives Valpo plenty of opportunities for top-100 wins, and the team has taken advantage.
- Valpo opened MVC play this year with a win over UNI, currently ranked #72 in the NET, which is being used by the NCAA for women's basketball this year.
- Valpo then won at Illinois State Jan. 15, which entered that week ranked #37 in the NET and is currently ranked #80.
- Valpo now has four top-100 wins in MVC play over the last two years, having beaten Illinois State and UNI in the second half of last year's conference slate.
- Prior to last year's win at Illinois State, Valpo had gone nearly seven years since its last top-100 win..

Double-Digit Quarters

- Valpo has been feeding the hot hand throughout its MVC games so far, resulting in players scoring 10+ in a single period.
- Most recently, Shay Frederick scored 11 points in the third quarter of the opener against Bradley.
- Frederick now owns seven double-digit quarters in MVC play this year and has scored 10+ points in the fourth quarter four times in nine conference games.
- In the series finale against Missouri State, the third quarter saw Carie Weinman score 12 points and Grace White score 10 points.
- That weekend came to a close with Caitlin Morrison posting a 14-point fourth quarter.
- It marked the first time since the move to quarters prior to the 2015-16 season that three different Valpo players had a 10+ point quarter in the same game.
- Valpo players have combined for 13 double-digit scoring quarters in MVC play so far this year, already the most within conference play in a single season since the move to quarters.

A Normal(ish?) Nonconference

- With all that has happened this year, Valpo had about as normal a non-conference schedule as could be expected.
- All seven of the games that were announced prior to the season were played on their scheduled date, with no postponements or cancellations.
- With that, it was still a truncated nonconference slate, as Valpo played just seven games over a span of 23 days.
- The seven nonconference games are the fewest Valpo has played in a single season since first joining a conference prior to the 1987-88 campaign.
- It also is the fewest games prior to the team's first conference game since the 1999-2000 squad opened Mid-Con play with a single game in early December after just four nonconference games.
- Valpo finished the pre-conference slate with a 4-3 record after going 8-3 in pre-conference play last year. Before last season, Valpo had finished at or above .500 in pre-conference action just once in the last 10 years.

A Winning Calendar Year

- When 2020 came to a close, the program had finished with a winning calendar year.

Valpo also owns 9 wins over current Big East institutions, 2 of which came while members of the Big East - 8 versus Butler (1 while Big East member) and 1 versus Xavier

- Valpo went 9-9 in January, February and March, and then went 4-3 in November and December to post a 13-12 record.
- 2020 was the first winning calendar year for the program since going 20-10 in 2007.

A BIG Victory...and Another

- The Dec. 6 win was the second win in program history over Purdue, and the first since dropping the nationally-ranked Boilermakers at the ARC on Dec. 10, 2008.
- The win at Illinois marked Valpo's first-ever win over the Illini, as the Brown and Gold were previously 0-4 in the series - all four losses coming by at least 19 points.
- Valpo defeated multiple Big Ten teams in the same season for the first time in program history.
- The victory at Illinois was Valpo's first over a Big Ten team — or any Power Five program, for that matter — since taking down Indiana 64-52 at the ARC to open the 2012-13 campaign.
- After entering the season with just one road win all-time against Big Ten opponents, Valpo now has three such victories.
- BIG teams owned a 39-4 record in home nonconference games this year; Valpo is responsible for two of the four losses.
- Valpo is the first team with multiple nonconference road wins at Big Ten programs since 2017-18.

...and Then a Big Win

- Valpo rolled to an easy win over Western Michigan in its home opener, leading by double figures for the final 31 minutes en route to the 24-point win.
- The 24-point margin of victory was Valpo's largest over a MAC school since defeating WMU 88-54 way back in December 1996.

Taking Down Power Five Teams

- This year's squad becomes the third team in program history to defeat two teams from Power Five conferences in the same season.
- The 2001-02 team beat Wake Forest and Michigan, while the 2008-09 squad defeated Florida State in addition to Purdue.
- This year's team is the first to earn two true road wins over Power Five programs, however.
- In all, the wins over Illinois and Purdue were Valpo's ninth and 10th victories over Power Five programs in team history - see page five of the notes for a table of all 10 wins.

- The win over Xavier was the ninth in program history against a current Big East program, but victories over Butler were responsible for the other eight wins.

Erasing Double-Digit Deficits

- The win over Bradley Feb. 4, in which Valpo overcame three separate double-digit deficits, was the third rally from down 10+ for a win this year.
- The MVC-opening win against UNI featured Valpo rallying from an 11-point deficit to win, while against Xavier, Valpo found itself down by as many as 12 points in the first quarter before eventually earning the win.
- Nine times in Mary Evans' tenure as head coach has Valpo erased a double-figure deficit in a victory - last year's team did so four times, while the 2018-19 team did so twice. Eight of those wins have come since the last time Valpo surrendered a double-digit lead in a loss (Feb. 15, 2019).
- The speed with which Valpo has turned around and gained a lead when trailing by double figures in both this year's wins has been impressive - versus Xavier, Valpo went from down 12 to leading in just 3:10, and then in the win over UNI, Valpo went from down 10 to leading in just 3:05.
- The two third-quarter 10-point deficits versus Bradley were erased in 3:19 and 3:23.

Just Win, Baby, Win

- The 2019-20 Valpo squad had one of the top turnarounds in program history from the previous year and one of the best turnarounds in the nation.
- Last year's squad more than doubled the win total from the prior season, as the 2018-19 team went 8-24 overall, while the 2019-20 squad went 17-12.
- It was the second-largest improvement in the win column from one year to the next in program history, trailing only the 2001-02 team, which improved an astounding 19 wins from the previous season (7-22 -> 26-7).
- Valpo's 10.5 game improvement last year was sixth-best nationally, while the program's 172-spot jump in the RPI was the largest leap in the nation.
- Valpo's 17 wins made it the program's winningest campaign since 2006-07.
- The wins came in non-conference play, where Valpo posted an 8-3 record - the best pre-conference mark in program history.
- The wins came away from home, as Valpo went 9-5 in true road games - the most road wins since the 2001-02 team won nine true road games.
- The wins came when the schedule shifted to MVC action, as Valpo finished 9-9 in MVC play - its first .500 or better record in league play since 2008-09 - in a conference which finished the season ranked eighth nationally in RPI.
- The 9-9 mark in MVC play was a six-win improvement over the previous year.
- Per WarrenNolan.com, Valpo's record in games outside of quadrant 1 opponents was an impressive 17-4.

Threes and Thieves

- As head coach Mary Evans has implemented her preferred style of play on both ends of the court through her first two years at the helm, Valpo fans have come to know that they'll see 3-pointers and they'll see steals

when the team takes the floor.

- Valpo paced the Valley last season in both 3-pointers/game (8.6) and steals/game (10.3).
- Valpo finished last year ranked 14th nationally in 3-pointers/game and 27th in steals/game.
- Last year's squad made 250 3-pointers, second-most in a single season in program history - trailing only the 276 triples by the 2018-19 team.
- In Evans' first two seasons, Valpo connected on 14 or more 3-pointers in a single game five times after doing so just eight times total before her arrival.
- Valpo tallied double digits in steals 16 times last year, highlighted by a 20-steal performance at Evansville - the program's highest single-game steals total since 2003.
- With 300 steals, last year's team finished the campaign eighth in program history in the category. The 2001-02 team (330 steals) is the only Valpo team in the last quarter-century to have registered more steals.

Starters, Assemble

- A trio of Valpo starters have extensive streaks of consecutive games started which are ongoing.
- Shay Frederick has started 58 consecutive games dating back to the middle of her freshman year.
- Carie Weinman and Caitlin Morrison have both made 45 starts in a row.
- If she's in the starting five, Morrison will make her 100th career start Friday against Evansville.
- The three were members of a quintet which started every single game in the 2019-20 season - the first time in program history the same five players started every game.

What's Back

- Nine letterwinners from last year's team, including a trio of starters, return for Valpo in 2020-21.
- The three returning starters are redshirt senior Caitlin Morrison, redshirt junior Carie Weinman and junior Shay Frederick.
- Three other seniors return as well: Ella Ellenson, Marlee Proffitt and Grace White.
- Junior Ilysse Pitts and sophomores Cara VanKempfen and Zoe MacKay Zacker round out the nonet of returnees.
- In all, Valpo returned 68.5% of its minutes played, 64.2% of its scoring and 66.8% of its rebounding from last year's squad.

Who's New (Part 1)

- Five incoming freshmen joined Valpo's roster at the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Leah Earnest (Stevens Point, Wis.), Lauren Gunn (Fishers, Ind.), Jayda Johnston (Roseville, Minn.) and Ava Interrante (McHenry, Ill.) all signed NLI's in November of 2019 to join the Brown and Gold this season.
- Syria Butler (Dolton, Ill.) joined the program as a walk-on last summer.

Who's New (Part 2)

- In an unusual year, Valpo has added three players to the team in the middle of the season.
- Maya Dunson (Dayton, Ohio) joined the program as a graduate transfer after graduating from Loyola in December.
- Molly Sheehan (Hinsdale, Ill.) and Katie Beyer (McHenry, Ill.) both joined the program for the spring semester - both signed NLI's in November 2020, but completed their high school graduation requirements early.

Head Coach

3rd Season * Georgia Southern, 2000
32-45 overall and at Valpo

Hired as the eighth head coach in the history of the Valpo women's basketball program in April 2018, Mary Evans enters her third year at the helm of the program in 2020-21.

Evans led the Valpo program to a remarkable season across the board in 2019-20, one that concluded among the nation's top turnarounds from the season before. Valpo posted a 17-12 record in Evans' second season at the helm, the 17 wins the most by a Valpo team since the 2006-07 campaign and the 10th-most in a single season in program history. Valpo improved its record by 10.5 games over the previous season in 2019-20, tied for the sixth-best improvement in Division I. Even more impressively, Valpo jumped by 171 spots in the RPI in Evans' second season as head coach, the nation's largest RPI jump.

With the 17 victories came many notable accomplishments throughout the season. Nine of the 17 wins came on the road, giving Valpo its highest number of true road wins since the 2001-02 season. Valpo concluded the non-conference portion of the schedule with an 8-3 record, the best pre-conference mark by winning percentage in program history. That non-conference slate ended with seven straight wins, which was Valpo's longest winning streak since the 2001-02 team won 10 straight and was just the seventh winning streak of at least seven consecutive games in program history.

Conference play brought more of the same for Evans and the 2019-20 Valpo squad. Valpo posted a 9-9 record in MVC play, finishing the regular season with both its highest win total and its best conference finish (6th) since joining the MVC. Most impressively, this record came in a conference which finished the year ranked eighth among Division I leagues, matching its best-ever finish and trailing just the Power Five, the Big East and the Ivy League.

Under Evans' guidance, Valpo was again one of the nation's most prolific shooting teams. For the second straight season, Valpo averaged 8.6 3-pointers made per game, a mark which led the MVC and ranked 15th nationally. With 250 total made 3-pointers, the 2019-20 season moved into second place in a single season in program history. Valpo was also exceptional from the free throw line, setting a single-season record with a team free throw percentage of .792, a clip which was good for fourth in the nation.

Evans' defensive style also was on full display in 2019-20. Valpo's aggressive switching defense resulted in a conference-high 10.3 steals/game to rank 27th nationally. Valpo also boasted the MVC's steals leader in Carie Weinman, a member of the conference's All-Defensive Team.

In her first season at the helm, Evans' impact was immediately clear. She led Valpo to its best 3-point shooting season in program history as the team shattered the program record for made 3s in a season with 276, breaking the previous mark of 224 that had stood since 1991-1992 and moving into seventh in MVC history. Under Evans' guidance, Valpo had two 400-point scorers in the same season for the first time since 2007-2008 in 2018-2019 as Addison Stoller and Meredith Hamlet each surpassed that mark.

Evans instructed a Missouri Valley Conference All-Freshman Team honoree in her first season as Shay Frederick became the first Valpo player to garner that recognition in The Valley and the first to do so in any conference since Meredith Hamlet was a member of the 2015-2016 Horizon League All-Freshman Team.

Prior to coming to Valpo, Evans spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio, helping the Bobcats to three seasons of 22 wins or more, three post-season appearances and three Top 75 RPI finishes. The 2014-15 team established a school record with 27 wins, a 21-win improvement from two years earlier and an 18-win improvement from the previous season. The Bobcats won the 2014-15 MAC regular season and tournament titles and reached the NCAA Tournament.

Evans spent the 2012-13 season at Youngstown State University, where she helped the Penguins to a 23-10 record and a first-round win at Indiana State in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). She has also coached at Georgia Southern University (2007-2012), the University of South Carolina, Aiken (2005-2007) and Seton Hall University (2001-2005).

Evans was a two-sport athlete at Georgia Southern, where she earned her Bachelor of Science degree in 2000. She won four letters in basketball (1995-1999) and three in soccer during her time as a collegiate athlete. A native of Summerville, S.C., Evans was inducted into the Summerville High School Hall of Fame in 2008. She and her husband Daryl have two children, Keegan Thomas and Zoe Mae.

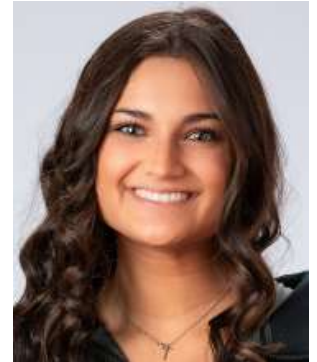
