Next Up in Valpo Basketball: After topping Indiana State in the first round of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament on Thursday, the Valparaiso University women's basketball team lives to see another day of Hoops in the Heartland. Ninth-seeded Valpo will face a challenging task in Friday's quarterfinal as it attempts to knock off top-seeded and nationally-ranked Drake, a team that has won this event each of the last two years.

Last Time Out: Valpo trailed by as many as 13 points, but roared from behind and eventually held on to beat Indiana State 79-77. For the second straight game, the entire Valpo starting lineup finished in double figures. Appropriately, Valpo was led by senior Meredith Hamlet, who helped extend the careers of her and her classmates by pouring in 25 points.

Following Valpo: Friday's game and every game of Hoops in the Heartland will be carried on ESPN+. Scott Warmann (play-by-play) and Laura Leonard (color commentary) will have the call for the game against the Bulldogs. The hometown radio broadcast will be available on 95.1 FM Valparaiso, WVUR and via the TuneIn Radio app with Ben Ariano (play-by-play) and Renee' Turpa (color commentary) describing the action. Links to live video, audio and stats will be available on ValpoAthletics.com.

Head Coach Mary Evans: Mary Evans is in her first year as the head coach of the Valparaiso University women's basketball program in 2018-2019. Evans, who spent the last five seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio University, became the eighth head coach in program history on April 13, 2018. She brought 15 years of Division I experience with her to Valpo. During her time on Ohio's staff under head coach Bob Boldon, Evans helped the Bobcats to three seasons of 22 wins or more, three postseason appearances and three Top 75 RPI finishes. The 2014-15 team established a school record with 27 wins, a 21-win improvement from two years earlier and an 18-win improvement from the previous season. The Bobcats won the 2014-15 MAC regular season and tournament titles and reached the NCAA Tournament. Evans has also coached at Youngstown State, Georgia Southern, South Carolina Aiken and Seton Hall.

Jan. 13: Drake 84, Valpo 53 (Des Moines, Iowa): Drake picked up the victory behind a strong first quarter in the first meeting of the year between these two teams. The Bulldogs led 31-7 after 10 minutes, but Valpo put in a quality effort for the game's duration in an 84-53 defeat. Valpo made several second-half runs including bursts of 11-0 and 9-0. Grace Hales led the team with 18 points while also establishing new career bests in steals (4) and assists (4).

Feb. 8: Drake 88, Valpo 62 (Valparaiso, Ind.): Valpo made 15 3-pointers and had two players (Ella Ellenson and Grace Hales) knock down five 3s apiece, but visiting Drake picked up an 88-62 victory at the Athletics-Recreation Center. The game got away from Valpo in the second quarter when Drake outscored the Brown \& Gold 23-5. Hales finished with a team-high 17 points, while Ellenson was not far behind with 15 .

Series Notes: Drake holds a 7-0 lead in the all-time series. Valpo did initially beat the Bulldogs on Nov. 24, 1995 80-79, but the game was later ruled a forfeit in Drake's favor due to Valpo's use of an ineligible player.

Valpo in Tournament Play: Valpo has found success in leaguetournament play in recent years. After Thursday's win over Indiana State, Valpo has won at least one game in the conference tournament in seven of the last eight seasons. Hannah Schaub, Meredith Hamlet and Allison Schofield are the first senior class in program history to win at least one conference tournament game in all four years of their career.

Quarterfinal Conundrum: Although Valpo has had great success in the opening round of the conference tournament in recent years, the second game has proved challenging. The last time Valpo won multiple conference tournament games in the same season was in the Mid-Continent Conference in 2003-04, also the last time Valpo reached an NCAA Tournament. Valpo did not win multiple conference tournament games in a year in either of its final two Mid-Con seasons, any of its 10 Horizon League seasons or its first Valley season. Valpo's first season in The Valley ended with an 8940 quarterfinal loss to Drake last year.

Facing Ranked Competition: Friday will mark Valpo's first game against a nationally-ranked team since Jan. 17, 2017 at \#RV/25 Green Bay, which was ranked 25th in the USA Today Coaches' Poll. Valpo fell 56-35. The last time Valpo played an AP Top 25 team was No. 1 Notre Dame on Dec. 4, 2016, a 114-54 defeat. This marks Valpo's first conference tournament contest against a ranked squad since March 13, 2013, an 80-59 loss to No. 20 Green Bay. Valpo has lost 20 straight against nationally-ranked teams dating back to a 71-60 win over No. $21 / 23$ Purdue on Dec. 10, 2008. Valpo is 1-41
all-time against nationally-ranked opponents.
Going Back-to-Back: Valpo's senior day victory over Loyola on Saturday and tournament win over Indiana State on Thursday marked the first time the team has won consecutive games since beating Chicago State on Nov. 29 and Eastern Illinois on Dec. 2. On Friday, Valpo is seeking its first three-game winning streak since capturing four victories in a row from Dec. 10-21, 2018. In addition, Valpo will play for a second consecutive day on Friday, the team's first back-to-back since Nov. 16-17 as part of the Vinewood Farm Classic at Morehead State. In that instance, Valpo responded well with a 78-76 win over St. Francis Brooklyn in the second game of the tournament. Valpo is 2-0 in neutral site affairs this season with that win over the Terriers and Thursday's win over Indiana State.

Conference Honors: As the Missouri Valley Conference announced its postseason awards earlier this week, Valpo was represented by Meredith Hamlet, who earned MVC Scholar-Athlete Honorable Mention, and Shay Frederick, who was named to the MVC AllFreshman Team. Frederick became the first Valpo player to garner MVC All-Freshman team honors and the first to do so in any conference since Meredith Hamlet was a member of the 2015-16 Horizon League All-Freshman Team. She finished the regular season seventh in the conference and second among freshmen with 3.2 assists per game while also ranking second in the conference and first among freshmen with an assist to turnover ratio of 2.0. Hamlet earned MVC Scholar-Athlete honorable mention for the second consecutive season. She owns a 3.55 GPA in public relations.

Familiar Face: Valpo freshman Shay Frederick and Drake freshman Maggie Negaard are close friends and former AAU teammates. Negaard has played in 16 games for the Bulldogs, while Frederick has seen action in all 31 games.

## Notes: Valpo 79, Indiana State 77

- This year's senior class became the first in program history to win a league tournament game in all four years.
- Valpo has now won eight games decided by five points or fewer, its most since 2012-13.
- Valpo is 7-1 in league tournament first-round games over the last eight years.
- Valpo snapped a five-game head-to-head losing streak to Indiana State, picking up its first win over the Sycamores since a 69-65 victory on Dec. 8, 2001. The team avenged two regular-season defeats on Thursday. In particular, this game flipped the script from the last meeting in Terre Haute, when Valpo fell after leading by eight in the second half.
- Valpo shot over 50 percent for the third time this season and did so for the second consecutive game by hitting 51.8 percent from the field. The team made 16 of its 22 shots in the second half.

- Valpo had 28 points in the third quarter, one game after tying the program record for points in a single quarter with 30 against Loyola. - This marked the second consecutive game all five Valpo starters finished in double figures. Hamlet's 25 led the way, while Stoller (13), Ellenson (13), Hales (11) and Frederick (10) joined her.
- Hamlet's 25 points came on an efficient 8 -of- 11 shooting. She also dished out a team-high five assists. This was Hamlet's highest scoring output since Jan. 18, when she had 26, also against the Sycamores.
- The Valpo men and women have defeated the same school in tournament play in the same year for the first time since the 2004 Mid-Con Tournament.
- Valpo has won back-to-back games for the first time since beating Chicago State on Nov. 29 and Eastern Illinois on Dec. 2.
- Hamlet played her 122nd career game, moving into a tie for second in program history with Jeanette Gray (1999-2003).
- Turning a 13-point deficit into a victory marked Valpo's largest comeback of the season, surpassing the team's 12-point comeback to beat St. Francis Brooklyn. In fact, this was Valpo's largest comeback since Jan. 12, 2013, when Valpo trailed by 15 and came back to beat Youngstown State 67-59. Ironically, Valpo head coach Mary Evans was on the Youngstown State bench as an assistant for that game.
- Thursday was Valpo's first win this season when trailing at halftime after going 0-14 in such instances during the regular season.

Mission Trip: This past week was certainly one that Valpo senior Katherine Carlson will never forget. The volleyball star turned women's basketball walk-on spent most of the week in Mexico City, where she took part in a mission trip called "Hope for the Poor." She went with a group from St. Teresa of Avila Catholic Student Center. Carlson returned to Valpo late on Friday night, just in time to enjoy her senior day on Saturday afternoon at the ARC.

From Roommates to Teammates: Katherine Carlson and Meredith Hamlet have been friends for all four years of college and have done a lot together. Their sports, however, were always separate, with Carlson a volleyball standout and Hamlet the same on the basketball court. However, a rash of injuries hit the women's basketball program and Carlson, an all-conference basketball player in high school, joined the team to provide depth following her senior volleyball season. Roommates since their sophomore year, Hamlet and Carlson unexpectedly got to become teammates for the first time this year.

What's Next: Here is what the four Valpo seniors plan to do after they close out their basketball careers:

- Hannah Schaub intends to remain at Valpo for another year and serve as a student coach for the women's basketball team while also being enrolled full-time in the MBA program.
- Meredith Hamlet is seeking an opportunity to serve as a women's basketball graduate assistant and pursue a master's in public relations. Her two career interests are PR and coaching.
- Katherine Carlson plans to graduate in December 2019 with degrees in business management and sports management. She will serve as a student assistant under head volleyball coach Carin Avery this fall.
- Allison Schofield will be continuing her education as she is currently part of the MBA program at Valpo. After she completes her MBA, Schofield plans to pursue medical sales.

Perfect Attendance: The Valpo program is filled with supportive parents, many of whom are frequently spotted at games, home and road. The family support was exemplified by the parents of Meredith Hamlet this season, as her father Todd did not miss a game and her mother Patti attended the vast majority. Todd Hamlet was Meredith's high school coach and Meredith is the youngest of the Hamlet's three daughters, all of whom played basketball at Valpo. Many of the trips for the Hamlets have been far from their home in McBain, Mich.

An ARC Fixture: Amid all the change that has occurred within the Valparaiso women's basketball program over the last four years, Meredith Hamlet has been a true constant. Nobody has played more Valpo basketball than Hamlet during that time. Out of 124 games during the last four seasons, Hamlet has appeared in 122 and started 120. The only two games she missed in her collegiate career were Feb. 2, 2017 (vs. Youngstown State) and Feb. 4, 2017 (vs. Cleveland State), when she was held out due to concussion protocol. Hamlet has provided much-needed durability and stability from a health standpoint for a program that has long been impacted by injuries. The first Valpo game of 2019-20 will be the first one without a Hamlet on the roster since March 11, 2013. Meredith's older sisters Elizabeth and Annemarie both played for the team.

Schaub Still Smiling: Hannah Schaub is sure to be smiling when she's spotted courtside at this week's tournament. The upbeat attitude that has been such a fixture throughout her Valpo career hasn't wavered despite a trying circumstance that saw her suffer a seasonending knee injury for the second consecutive year. Despite having her number of games played over the last four years significantly reduced by injury, Schaub sits in the Top 10 in program history in career assists.

Double Figure Tracker: Valpo has had four or more players finish in double figures on eight occasions this year after a season-high five had 10+ onFeb. 28 at Bradley, March 9 vs. Loyola and March 14 vs. Indiana State. Valpo has made a habit of balancing the scoring and getting a variety of contributors throughout the season. This is the most times in a season Valpo has had four or more players in

Rewriting the Record Book: Valpo entered the program record book in the first quarter of the Feb. 24 game vs. Southern Illinois, shattering single-season program records for 3 -pointers made and 3 -pointers attempted. In both categories, Valpo set the previous record in 1991-92 when the team attempted 676 triples and made 224. The made 3 s mark was matched in 2007-08. The new records were solidified with three regular season games and at least one MVC Tournament game to spare. Entering Friday's game against Drake, Valpo has 263 made 3s and 800 attempts this season.

- Valpo also modified program records for single-game 3-point makes and single-game 3 -point attempts this year. Not only did the 443 -point tries against Drake set the school record on Feb. 8, but it also tied the Missouri Valley Conference watermark that was set by Creighton in 2013 and matched by Drake in 2015.
- Valpo's 17 made 3s on Dec. 21 vs. Bowling Green tied a school record that had stood for 14 years and ranked tied for fourth in conference history.
- Speaking of the conference record book, Valpo cracked the Top 15 for made 3 s in a single season in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference on Feb. 28 at Bradley. The team's current total ranks tied for eighth in Valley history with the 2015-16 UNI team.
- Valpo has moved to sixth in conference history in three-pointer attempts in a single season.

High Five: Meredith Hamlet hit yet another milestone on Feb. 24 vs. Southern Illinois as she advanced into the Top 5 on Valpo's all-time scoring list. She is now up to 1,319 points after passing Amber Schober (1988-2002) and Betsy Rietema (2003-2007) in the game against the Salukis. Here's an updated look at the Top 5 on Valpo's all-time scoring list.

Other Climbs on Program Charts: Entering Friday's game, Valpo has cracked the program record book in several individual categories. - As mentioned earlier, Hamlet has 1,344 career points, fifth in program history.

- Hamlet has made 207 career 3-pointers, which ranks fourth in program history. The mark needed to crack the top three is 215 (Carrie Myers, 2003-2007).
- Redshirt junior point guard Hannah Schaub finished her season with 289 career assists and currently sits in ninth in program history. She usurped Lauren Bechtold (287, 2002-2006) for ninth on Jan. 27 at Missouri State, the final game of her career. - Hamlet also ranks in the Top 20 in career assists with 258, which puts her 12th on the all-time list. Lisa Winter (1998-2000) is 11 th at 264 .
- Grace Hales holds an .848 free throw percentage this season, which would rank fifth in program history if the season ended today.
- Hamlet has 1,167 career field goal attempts, which ranks fith in program history. Aimee Forsman (1988-1992) is fourth at 1,201. - Hamlet has 249 career made free throws and recently passed Tabitha Gerardot (2010-2013) for seventh in program history. Dani Franklin (2014-2018) ranks sixth at 260.
- Hamlet ranks third in program history in career 3-point field goals attempted with 619. Suzie Hammel (2000-2004) is second at 673.
- Hamlet's current career free-throw percentage of .766 would rank fifth in program history for a career if the season ended today. Tabitha Gerardot (2010-2013) is currently fifth at 758. - With her 122 career games played, Hamlet is tied for second in program history with Jeannette Gray (1999-2003). She is expected to take over sole possession of second on Friday vs. Drake. Kathryn Knoester (2000-2004) owns the program record at 125 .

60 Sounds Sweet: Getting to 60 is an important task for Valpo as the team is $0-13$ this season when held to 59 points or fewer. When Valpo has reached the 60 -point plateau, it has played at nearly a .500 clip at $8-9$. Valpo's most recent victory when scoring fewer than 60 points was a 56-50 triumph over Illinois State last season at the ARC. The team is a combined 1-23 when scoring fewer than 60 points over the last two seasons.

Lineup Tracker: Shay Frederick made her first career start on Feb. 1 vs. Bradley and has now made 12 career starts. Addison Stoller and Meredith Hamlet have been fixtures in the starting five for all 31 games this year. Ellenson has started 28 times this season, while Hales has made 26 straight starts. The lineup of Frederick, Stoller, Hamlet, Hales and Ellenson has been intact for each of the last 12 games.

- Led in scoring by Becca Hittner at 19.9 points per game, while Sara Rhine is averaging 18.7 points per game and a team-high 8.3 rebounds per contest.
- Received three major awards on Thursday as Hittner was named the Jackie Stiles MVC Player of Year, Rhine was named the Scholar-Athlete of the Year and Sammie Bachrodt was named the Defensive Player of the Year.
- All three of the major award winners were first team allconference selections, while Maddy Dean earned All-MVC Honorable Mention.
- Carry a 10-game winning streak that dates back to their lone blemish in regular season conference play over the last three seasons, an 85-79 loss to Missouri State on Feb. 1.
- Under the direction of Jennie Baranczyk, a former Iowa standout who took over as head coach in April 2012.

Charity Stripe Streak: Grace Hales saw her streak of consecutive made free throws come to an end on Feb. 17 at Indiana State as she had made 26 straight before finally misfiring. The streak dated all the way back to the conference opener on Jan. 6 at Loyola and included 11 consecutive games without a missed free throw. Hales had a similar stretch two years ago as a freshman, making 21 in a row at the charity stripe - a streak that spanned December, January and February.

Tossing Up Triples: It's become no secret that Valpo's offense entails a large number of 3-point attempts this season. The number of 3-point tries reached a new peak on Feb. 8 vs. Drake as Valpo fired off a program-record 44 3-point attempts, shattering a mark that had stood since Feb. 27, 1992. This year's team already owns four of the top five single-game 3-point attempt totals in program history. Before this season, Valpo had attempted more than 36 3s in a game just once all-time. The team has done so four times this year (vs. Bowling Green, at Drake, at Missouri State, vs. Drake).

Centier Bank Getting Its Money's Worth: Valpo converted 15 3-pointers - which are sponsored by Centier Bank at the AthleticsRecreation Center - on Feb. 8 against Drake. That marked just the fifth time in program history but already the second time this season Valpo has hit 15 or more 3 s in a game. The previous instances were March 10, 2016 vs. Detroit (at GB), Feb. 28, 2015 vs. UMKC, Dec. 8, 2004 vs. Central Michigan (17) and this season vs. Bowling Green (17). The 15 made 3 s in a game are tied for third all-time, while the performance against Bowling Green earlier this season matched the school record.

Another 3-Point Feat: Valpo accomplished yet another feat related to 3-pointers on Feb. 8 vs. Drake as two different players connected on five triples in a single game, the first time that had
happened for Valpo since March 10, 2016 when Hannah Schaub and Meredith Hamlet had five apiece in an overtime victory over Detroit Mercy in the first round of the Horizon League Tournament. Ella Ellenson had five 3s against Drake after previously having no more than two in a single game, while Grace Hales had the fourth game of her career and second this season with five triples.

Shay's Six Steals: Freshman Shay Frederick swiped six steals on Feb. 8 vs. Drake, the most by a Valpo player in a single game since Jan. 23, 2014 vs. Detroit Mercy. In that game, two players had six steals or more as Jessica Carr had seven while Abby Dean added six.

Schofield's Three-riffic Sunday: Valpo has had many accomplishments related to 3-point baskets this season, but Allison Schofield's was a new one on Feb. 3 vs. Illinois State. The senior knocked down six 3 s in a single game, becoming the first Valpo player to do so since Meredith Hamlet on Feb. 11, 2016 at Oakland. In addition, she became the first Valpo player with six triples in a home game since Betsy Adams on Jan. 20, 2010 vs. Wright State. Two others have done it on the road in recent years - Jessica Carr (March 12, 2014 at Green Bay) and Rashida Ray (Feb. 26, 2011 at Milwaukee). Schofield finished the Feb. 3 game with 22 points, rewriting her previous career high of 16 (Nov. 14, 2018 at Illinois).

A Trio of 20s: Valpo accomplished the rare feat of having three players score 20 points or more in a single game in the Feb. 1 win over Bradley. Meredith Hamlet (23), Shay Frederick (21) and Addison Stoller (20) reached that plateau in a 76-73 triumph. That was the first time in at least 20 years Valpo had three 20-point scorers in a game. Indiana State turned the trick against Grand Canyon earlier this season, though the Sycamores had the benefit of overtime. Valpo, Indiana State and Drake are the only current MVC programs that have had a game with three players scoring 20 points or more in the last two decades.

Showcasing Various Standouts: In two games over a three-day span during the first weekend of February, Valpo remarkably had five different players enjoy 20-point games. Over a span of five games in January and February, the team was led in scoring by five different players: Grace Hales (21 vs. Evansville), Addison Stoller (22 at Southern Illinois), Shay Frederick (17 at Missouri State), Meredith Hamlet ( 23 vs. Bradley) and Allison Schofield (22 vs. Illinois State).

Down to the Wire: Valpo played back-to-back games decided by exactly three points on Feb. 1 and Feb. 3, defeating Bradley 76-73 before falling to Illinois State 70-67. That marked the first time Valpo had played in consecutive games decided by three points or fewer since January 2010 (W 71-68 at Cleveland State, L 72-70(ot) vs. Detroit Mercy). Valpo has now played in seven games decided

Have Yourself a Day, Shay: With two Valpo point guards now sidelined for the remainder of the season with injuries, Valpo has turned to Shay Frederick as the team's starter. The true freshman responded in a big way in her first career start on Feb. 1 vs. Bradley, playing 38 minutes on her way to career bests in points (21) and assists (eight). Her previous watermarks in both categories came on Nov. 17 vs. St. Francis (Brooklyn), when she had 19 points and five assists. Frederick's 21 points against the Braves were the most by a Valpo freshman since current senior Meredith Hamlet had three games with 21 points or more during her rookie campaign in 2015-16.

So You Want to be a Coach: For the second consecutive season, Valpo will have a participant in the "So You Want to be a Coach" program, hosted by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association in partnership with WeCOACH. Senior Meredith Hamlet will represent Valpo this year after 2018 alum Dani Franklin did so a year ago. This marks the 17th annual "So You Want to be a Coach" program as each member will participate in a three-day workshop with speakers provided by WeCOACH on April 3-5 in conjunction with the WBCA Convention in Tampa Bay, Fla.

## Inside the Assistants

- All members of Valpo's coaching staff are in their first season in 2018-19.
- Mary Gleason has returned to the collegiate ranks after a stint as the head girls basketball coach at St. Piux X High School in Houston, Texas. She was the head coach at Houston Baptist from 2010-2013, guiding the team during the transition from NAIA to NCAA Division I. She has been an assistant at Dartmouth College (2007-2010), Princeton University (2003-2007) and New York University (20002003).
- Gabby Johnson joined Valpo's staff after a tenure as the head coach at Dominican University in River Forest, Ill. that began in 2012. She was an assistant at Northern Kentucky from 2010-2012. During her playing career, Johnson helped Thomas More to an impressive 99-16 record.
- Tyeasha Moss previously served as a graduate assistant at Ohio

University, where Mary Evans was an assistant coach. During her playing days, Moss was a standout at Xavier, where she led the Musketeers to three A-10 regular season championships, two undefeated conference regular seasons and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2009.

- Director of Basketball Operations Sean Eaton graduated from Valpo with a master's in sports administration in May 2018 after completing his undergraduate work at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.
- Graduate assistant Kaylin Speedy served as a manager for the Purdue women's basketball program from 2014-2018 and was the head manager by the end of her time in West Lafayette. - Athletic trainer Carrie McKiddy is in her fourth season working with the Valpo women's basketball program and previously served as an athletic trainer at the University of Illinois from 2005-2011.

Who's Next: Coopersville (Mich.) High School senior Cara VanKempen has signed her National Letter of Intent to play for Valpo next season. The two-time all-conference performer has also garnered all-area first team and all-state honorable mention recognition. As a junior last season, VanKempen averaged 14 points, six rebounds and three assists per game. The daughter of a coach who has played for her father from a young age, VanKempen became the first high school recruit to sign with Valpo under first-year head coach Mary Evans' watch.

Champions in Classroom: The Valpo women's basketball team has developed a tradition of having players thrive academically. The 2017-2018 season saw Valpo have 11 players finish the spring semester with a GPA of 3.0 or better. Two players were named MVC Scholar-Athletes of the Week during the season and two were recognized as part of either the MVC ScholarAthlete team or MVC Scholar-Athlete honorable mention. The 2018-2019 team has players with the following majors: biology, biomedical engineering, communications, public relations, marketing, healthcare leadership, health sciences, exercise science, psychology, finance, elementary education, business management and secondary/physical education.

Champions in Community: The program also has a commitment to serving the community. During their time on campus, players have visited elementary school students and wrote letters back and forth to encourage and promote healthy lifestyles as pen pals. In addition, Valpo women's basketball players assembled over 1,000 informational packages for runners and spectators at the Chicago Marathon as part of the team's annual Pack-a-thon. supervision of the Valparaiso Popcorn Fest's Little Kernel Puff Run. Valpo players ran with children to the finish line of the event and helped set up the race. Valparaiso was the hometown of Orville Redenbacher's popcorn company. Numerous Valpo players have also volunteered their time at the Valpo Boys \& Girls Club.

What's Back: Valpo returns nine of its top 10 scorers from a year ago, but the one departure was significant as leading scorer Dani Franklin graduated after finishing in the Top 10 in Valpo history in 13 statistical categories. Franklin, an all-conference first team selection as a senior, finished second in program history in career scoring with 1,721 points and fifth in rebounding with 713. In all, Valpo returns 12 letter winners and four starters from last season.

## \#RingTheBell

- Shortly after Valpo's new coaching staff was assembled, the group sat down to discuss a program hashtag. Despite being new to Valpo, the staff members were well educated on the University's history and tradition. That's how \#RingTheBell was born.
- Head Coach Mary Evans: "Ringing the bell here at Valpo is something you do when you graduate, so the concept speaks to our goal of being successful both on the court and in the classroom. We want to be one of the best programs in our conference and continue to have great success academically and in our personal lives. My message to our players is that whatever they do in life, it's important to put in the time and effort to be very good at it. That's what \#RingTheBell has become to us."
- Senior Allison Schofield: "I love the idea by our coaching staff and think it's a tremendous concept. Ringing the bell is synonymous with Valparaiso University as a whole and has been for quite some time. This allows us to become closely associated with something that is University wide rather than separating ourselves as women's basketball. To me, \#RingTheBell means victory and finishing the close games that we've struggled to finish in the past."
- Senior Meredith Hamlet: "To me, \#RingTheBell is about winning games. That's our goal. We have confidence that we can win the games on our schedule and we have a fair shot to beat every team we play. The team that works the hardest is going to win."
- Redshirt Sophomore Addison Stoller: "\#RingTheBell gives us a consistent message and establishes a trend that we want to continue. As a program, we want to be consistent in everything we do, from our messaging to our play on the court. We've seen our coaches get excited about ringing the bell and that's allowed us to dedicate ourselves to it as well."


## A Look Back at 2017-18

- Valpo won a league tournament game for the sixth time in the last seven years by topping Loyola in the first round of Hoops in the Heartland before falling to eventual conference champion Drake in
the second round.
- The program finished with 13 wins, the team's highest win total since 2008-09, when it won 16 games. The team also equaled its highest conference win total since 2009-10 and had the most road wins in a single season since the 20112012 campaign.
- Valpo finished with the second-best free-throw percentage in program history at 76.0 and had its highest scoring average (65.1) since 2007-2008 (66.3).
- Senior Dani Franklin closed out her noteworthy career and was named to the 2017-18 All-MVC First Team and ScholarAthlete First Team following the season. She finished second in program history in career points.

## Mary Evans <br> Head Coach <br> 1st Season $8-23$ overall \& at Valpo Georgia Southern, 2000

Mary Evans is in her first year as the head coach of the Valparaiso University women's basketball program in 2018-2019.

Evans, who spent the last five seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio University, became the eighth head coach in program history on April 13, 2018. She brought 15 years of Division I experience with her to Valpo.

During her time on Ohio's staff under head coach Bob Boldon, Evans helped the Bobcats to three seasons of 22 wins or more, three postseason appearances and three Top 75 RPI finishes. The 2014-15 team established a school record with 27 wins, a 21 -win improvement from two years earlier and an 18-win improvement from the previous season. The Bobcats won the 2014-15 MAC regular season and tournament titles and reached the NCAA Tournament.

Evans spent the 2012-13 season at Youngstown State University, where she helped the Penguins to a 23-10 record and a first-round win at Indiana State in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). She has also coached at Georgia Southern University (2007-2012), the University of South Carolina, Aiken (2005-2007) and Seton Hall University (2001-2005).

The five-year stint at Georgia Southern provided Evans with the opportunity to work at her alma mater. She helped guide the 2009-2010 team to a 19-12 record, the program's highest win total since 2002-2003.

During her time at Division II South Carolina, Aiken, Evans was an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator, helping the program to its first 20-win season since 2001-2002 in 2006-2007.

At Seton Hall, Evans was on staff as the Pirates reached the WNIT in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005. She was the recruiting coordinator during the 2004-2005 season.

At Aiken, Evans worked under Mike Brandt, who provided her with the opportunity to run the defense. When she returned to Georgia Southern under Rusty Cram, she was the offensive coach and had the chance to run practices. For six seasons prior to her appointment as Valpo head coach, she served on Boldon's staff, first at Youngstown State and then at Ohio.

Evans was a two-sport athlete at Georgia Southern, where she earned her Bachelor of Science degree in 2000. She won four letters in basketball (1995-1999) and three in soccer during her time as a collegiate athlete. A native of Summerville, S.C., Evans was inducted into the Summerville High School Hall of Fame in 2008. She and her husband Daryl have two children, Keegan Thomas and Zoe Mae.
