**Next Up in Crusader Basketball:** The Valparaiso University women's basketball team will look to extend its longest winning streak since December 2015 to four on Thursday night as Fort Wayne visits the Athletics-Recreation Center. The Crusaders will have an opportunity to garner their seventh straight home win and improve to 5-0 at the ARC this season.

Last Time Out: Senior Dani Franklin filled the stat sheet in Monday's 76-67 win at Eastern Illinois, pacing the team with a season-high 28 points to go along with a team-high eight rebounds and career highs in both steals (five) and assists (five). Grace Hales (13) and Maya Meredith (11) also finished in double figures, while Meredith Hamlet led the way in assists with a career-best six. The two teams went back and forth in the first quarter, but the Crusaders held the lead for the game's duration.

**Following the Crusaders:** Thursday's game will air on The Valley on ESPN3 with Dave Huseman (play-by-play) and Renee' Turpa (color commentary) on the call. Ben Ariano will handle the radio description on 95.1 FM Valparaiso. Links to live video, audio and stats are available on ValpoAthletics.com.

Head Coach Tracey Dorow: Tracey Dorow was named head coach of the Valparaiso women's basketball program in April of 2012. The 2017-18 season is her sixth in charge of Valpo's program. Dorow has led the Crusaders to a Horizon League tournament victory in four of her first five seasons at the helm. During the 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, Valpo boasted three all-freshman team members, a Freshman of the Year, a Sixth Player of the Year, an all-league second-team honoree and an all-defensive team member. The Crusaders have enjoyed a significant uptick in all-league recognition under Dorow's watch, as they had three total league honors in the five seasons before that three-year span. Dorow arrived at Valpo after spending 14 seasons as the head coach at Ferris State University, guiding the Bulldogs to four NCAA Division II Tournament appearances, two Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) North Division championships, and four 20-win seasons.

that hasn't been played since the 2012-13 season. Valpo has won 10 of the first 15 all-time meetings between the two teams. The Crusaders went to Fort Wayne and prevailed 82-73 on Dec. 4, 2012, the most recent matchup and the lone of the Dorow era thus far. Fort Wayne will come to the ARC for the first time since Dec. 6, 2011, a 64-43 Valpo win. The Crusaders have won six of the last seven games against the Mastodons. The two teams also met in a closed scrimmage prior to the 2016-17 season.

**Defending the ARC:** The Crusaders upped their home record to 4-0 and extended their home winning streak that dates back to last season to six with Friday's win over IU Northwest. Valpo is off to its first 4-0 home start since 2007-08 and has its longest home winning streak since 2007. A win on Thursday against Fort Wayne would allow Valpo to finish the nonconference portion of the season undefeated at home, a feat the team also achieved in 2007-08.

Starting Strong: Valpo has secured a winning record through 10 games for the first time since 2001-02, a Valpo team that finished 26-7 overall and 13-1 in conference play, winning the Mid-Continent Conference regular season title and reaching the quarterfinals of the WNIT. The victory on Monday at Eastern Illinois also gave the Crusaders their sixth nonconference victory this season, a total they hadn't reached since 2008-09. In addition, the Crusaders have won two true road games during the nonconference slate for the first time since 2006-07. A win on Thursday would give Valpo its highest nonconference win total since 2006-07.

**Winning Month:** With three games remaining in December, the Crusaders need only one more win to nail down a winning record this month. This would mark the first time Valpo has had a winning month during the regular season since going 5-3 in December 2015.

Franklin on Fire: If the question is "who's hot?", the answer is Dani Franklin. For the first time in her college career, Franklin has made 10 or more field goals in consecutive games, reaching that exact number on Friday against IU Northwest and Monday at Eastern Illinois. She has scored 20+ points in three straight games, also a first in her illustrious career. After going 10-of-30 shooting (33 percent), 3-of-12 from 3 (25 percent) and scoring 10.0 points per game during a three-game stretch against Liberty, Longwood and Purdue, Franklin has averaged 24.7 points per game over her last three contests and is shooting 51.9 percent.

Hitting from Distance: Valpo has shot above 30 percent from 3-point range in all 10 games this season and above 35 percent in eight straight. This is the first time Valpo has shot better than 30 percent from 3 in each of its first 10 games since the turn of the century. In addition, the Crusaders are the only team in The Valley

that has shot better than 30 percent from 3 every game this season.

Wrapping Up IU Northwest: Valpo shot 59 percent on Friday night against IU Northwest, the team's best single-game field goal percentage since Feb. 6, 2006 against Centenary. Friday's shooting clip ranks seventh in program history. The Crusaders accumulated 24 assists on Friday, the team's highest total since Feb. 6, 2006, a 91-44 win over Centenary, a game that also featured 24 assists. No Valpo player committed more than one turnover in Friday's win.

Wrapping Up Eastern Illinois: Valpo's 11 steals on Monday at Eastern Illinois marked the third time this season the Crusaders have reached double figures in that area. It also marked the team's highest steal total since Feb. 2, 2017 when they had 11 against Youngstown State. The Crusaders won the game despite being outrebounded by the Panthers, the first time Valpo has done that since Nov. 25, 2016 against Liberty, when the Crusaders won 70-68 while losing the battle on the boards 45-43.

Success at the Stripe: The Crusaders went 18-of-20 at the free-throw line on Friday against IU Northwest, the team's first time shooting 90 percent or better at the stripe since Jan. 28 of last season (93.8 percent at UIC). Valpo followed by going 86.4 percent (19-22) at the charity stripe on Monday. Free throw shooting has been indicative of the team's results so far this season, as the Crusaders have won all six games they've had a better free throw percentage than their opponent and lost all four games they've had a worse free throw percentage than their opponent. The Crusaders have shot 85 percent or better at the free-throw line back-to-back games for the first time since early January last season against Green Bay and Milwaukee.

Dropping Dimes, Breaking Records: Maya Meredith set the bar high with her first start in a Valpo uniform on Friday night against IU Northwest. The sophomore point guard's 16 assists not only shattered Shari Toelke's program record that had stood since she dished out 14 on Jan. 15, 1992 against Marquette, but that number also ranks tied for sixth in the history of the Missouri Valley Conference. Meredith became just the 10th player in conference history to register 16 assists or more in a single game. Her 16 assists rank second in the nation this season behind only Syracuse's Tiana Mangakahia, who had 17 against Vanderbilt on Nov. 24. Meredith's previous career high was five and her season best was three. In addition, Meredith played a turnover-free game, the first time Valpo's starting point guard has not committed any turnovers in a game since the season opener against IU Kokomo.

Hamlet Hits Everything Against RedHawks: When she's playing at her highest level, there's little anyone can do to stop Valpo junior

guard Meredith Hamlet. She has had one 29-point performance in each of her three seasons in a Valpo uniform, again hitting that number on Friday night against IU Northwest. Hamlet had 23 before halftime and finished the night 8-of-10 shooting, 5-of-6 from beyond the arc and 8-of-8 at the free-throw line. Since the start of the 2015-16 season, there have been 11 occasions where a Valpo player has hit 5 or more 3-pointers in a game. Hamlet has accounted for seven of those, with Dani Franklin and Hannah Schaub also having a pair of five 3-pointer games apiece.

Valpo in The Valley: Valparaiso University is competing in its first season as a member institution in the Missouri Valley Conference after a 10-year run in the Horizon League. The Valley is celebrating 25 years of women's athletics in the conference over the course of the 2017-18 academic and athletic year. Valpo head coach Tracey Dorow played at Illinois State during the first season of women's athletics in The Valley and is back for Year 25 and her first season as a head coach in the conference.

#### Dani Franklin Record Book Watch

- Dani Franklin enters this game with 1,415 career points, which ranks fourth in Valpo history. She needs 46 more points to pass Jeanette Gray and move into third.
- Franklin holds a career scoring average of 14.2 points per game, which ranks second in program history. The program record is 18.4 points per game, set by Debbie Bolen (1989-93).
- Franklin ranks third in Valpo history with 525 career made field goals. She is 71 makes away from passing Jeanette Gray for second in program history.
- Franklin has amassed 154 3-pointers in her illustrious career, a total that ranks sixth in program history. She needs 18 more to leap into fourth.
- Franklin owns a career 3-point field goal percentage of .384, which currently sits third all-time.
- Franklin has 557 career rebounds, 15th in program history. She needs 15 more to jump to 13th all-time.
- Franklin's career free-throw percentage of .868 is on pace for the program record, which currently is .838 set by Launa Hochstetler (2005-2009).

### **Inside the Mastodons**

- Have played one Missouri Valley Conference team a 79-70 win over Loyola on Nov. 12.
- Picked to finish eighth of eight in the Summit League preseason poll.
- First Summit League team Valpo has played since Dec. 31, 2013, an 81-70 loss to South Dakota.
- For the third straight game, Valpo will face an opponent whose roster features at least one Northwest Indiana local. After playing

against a slew of former Region prep standouts against IU Northwest, the Crusaders took on former Highland Trojan Taylor Steele on Monday at Eastern Illinois. Now, it's Crown Point graduate Hannah Albrecht featured on Fort Wayne's roster.

- Albrecht, a sophomore guard, played her freshman year at St. Joseph's College before it closed down at the end of last year. Her brother Spike played at Michigan and Purdue.
- Senior forward KeShyra McCarver played at Whitmer High School, also the alma mater of Valpo's Bryce Blood.
- Head coach Niecee Nelson is in her second season after serving as an assistant at San Diego for 11 years. She previously was an assistant at Fort Wayne in 2004-05. The last time Nelson played Valpo was as an assistant at San Diego, a 76-60 win for the Toreros on Nov. 27, 2015 in California.
- Led in scoring by De'Jour Young, who is the only Mastodon in double figures at 12.0 points per game.

#### A Look Back at 2016-17

- Valpo had the biggest jump from the first half of league play to the second of any Horizon League squad. In first matchups against Horizon League opponents, Valpo went 0-9 before going 4-5 in second meetings. The plus-four win turnaround was the best in the Horizon League. No other team was better than plus-two.
- The Crusaders have now captured league tournament wins in five of the last six seasons.
- Valpo went 4-4 over its final eight games of the regular season, its best eight-game finish to a season of the Tracey Dorow era.
- Dani Franklin was named to the all-league second-team, becoming the first Valpo player to make the Horizon League first or second team since Tabitha Gerardot in 2012-13.
- The Crusaders had an all-league representative and an all-defensive team member in the same season for the first time since joining the Horizon League.
- Franklin finished the season with 559 points, which ranks second in program history for points in a single year. Debbie Bolen's 1991-92 season (638) is the program record.
- Franklin finished the season at 18.0 points per game, ranking fifth in program history for single-season scoring average. She also shot 85.8 percent at the free-throw line, the second-best single-season free throw percentage in program history.
- Hannah Schaub completed the season with 134 assists, ranking seventh in program history for assists in a single season.
- The Crusaders had twice as many wins in February (four) than they had in December and January combined (two).

### **Inside the 2017-18 Roster**

- Valpo has nine players on the roster listed at 6-foot or taller. This is the most players listed at 6-foot or taller on the roster in program history. Previously, the most was eight in 1990-91 and 1995-96.

- Valpo has had five freshmen on the roster each of the last two seasons. Prior to 2016-17, the Crusaders hadn't featured five true freshmen since 2010-11. This year's team has 10 freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores, the most since the 2003-04 season.
- In addition to five true freshmen, two redshirt freshmen and three sophomores, the Crusaders feature three juniors and two seniors.
- This year's version of the Crusaders includes four Indiana natives. This marks the most Hoosiers on the team since the 2013-2014 season.
- Three others are from Illinois, three from Ohio, two from Minnesota, one from Michigan, one from Iowa and one from Wisconsin. Seven states are represented on the Valpo roster.
- Freshman Ella Ellenson (Rice Lake, Wis.) is the first Valpo player from Wisconsin since Sarah Ott (Chippewa Falls, Wis.) in 2007-08.

#### **Meredith Hamlet**

- Handed out a career-high six assists on Dec. 18 at Eastern Illinois.
- Reached 29 points in a game for the third straight season on Dec. 15 against IU Northwest, setting a season high and matching her career watermark.
- Only player on Valpo's roster who has scored more than 25 points in a single game in each of the last three seasons.
- Since the start of the 2015-16 season, there have been 11 occasions where a Valpo player has hit 5 or more 3-pointers in a game. Hamlet has accounted for seven of those occasions, while Dani Franklin and Hannah Schaub have a pair of five 3-pointer games apiece.
- Has six career games scoring 20 points or more, and the first five came away from the ARC. Had her first home game with 20+ points on Dec. 15 against IU Northwest.
- Had five made 3s on Dec. 8 at Purdue, all in the first half. Scored 19 points in the game, all coming before halftime. Became the first Crusader with a 19-point half this season and the first Valpo player to hit five 3s in one half since she did so at Northern Kentucky on Dec. 3, 2016.
- Poured in 25 points on Dec. 3 at Longwood, making a career-high nine free throws.
- Posted a team-high 14 points, the 25th double-figure scoring game of her Valpo career, on Nov. 21 at Miami (Ohio). Followed by scoring 14 more in Valpo's win over Grand Canyon on Nov. 25.
- Started in Valpo's season opener for the third consecutive year.
- Reached the 500-point plateau for her collegiate career as only a sophomore on Jan. 14, 2016 at Youngstown State.
- Posted her first career double-double on Jan. 14, 2016 at Youngstown State, matching a career high with 29 points while shattering personal bests in rebounds (10) and made field goals (12). That game marked the 23rd time in program history a player has made 12 field goals or more in a single game.
- Dished out a career-best seven assists on Jan. 22, 2017 at Wright State.
- Began her collegiate career with a streak of 52 consecutive starts without missing a game, which was snapped on Feb. 2, 2017 against Youngstown State.

- Exploded for 29 points at Northern Kentucky on Dec. 30, 2015. Went 10-of-11 shooting, the third-highest single-game field goal percentage in program history.
- Made a game-winning layup at the buzzer to beat Chicago State on Nov. 16, 2016.
- Made 69 3-pointers as a freshman, tying for the fifth most in a single season in school history. In addition, she set the record for the most 3-pointers by a freshman.
- Was Valpo's leading returning scorer in 2016-17 after scoring 10.6 points per game in 2015-16. During her sophomore campaign, averaged 9.0 ppg.
- Named to Horizon League all-freshman team in 2015-16.
- Reached double figures in scoring 16 times as a freshman and nine times during her sophomore season.
- Third Hamlet to play under Dorow as sisters Elizabeth (2013-14) and Annemarie (2014-15 & 2015-16) both concluded their careers with the Crusaders.

#### Dani Franklin

- Had her second straight 10 field goal performance and a seasonhigh 28 points on Dec. 18 at Eastern Illinois, a game that also saw her pull down a team-high eight rebounds and reach career highs in assists (five) and steals (five).
- Had a season-high 10 made field goals on Dec. 15 against IU Northwest, scoring 23 points.
- Has now reached the following milestones -1,000 career points, 500 career rebounds and 500 career made field goals. She's joined in that elite group by Debbie Bolen, Jeanette Gray and Sarrah Stricklett as the only players in Valpo history to achieve all three of those feats.
- Had her first double-double of the season and the 10th of her career on Dec. 10 against Chicago State, pulling down a seasonhigh 11 rebounds to go along with 24 points.
- After being held to four points at Liberty on Dec. 2 and six through three quarters on Dec. 3 at Longwood, had an 11-point fourth quarter to help the Crusaders fend off the Lancers.
- Started her senior season with a game-high 26 points against IU Kokomo. She knocked down nine field goals in the win, including four 3s.
- Moved into fourth in program history in career scoring with her 23-point output on Nov. 25 against Grand Canyon. This marked the 17th time in Franklin's Crusader career that she scored 20 points or more.
- As a junior, led the team in scoring (18.0 ppg), rebounding (7.8 ppg), 3-point percentage (.430), free-throw percentage (.858) and steals (35).
- Became the first Valpo player in the last 23 years to score 500 points in a single season in 2016-17. Finished the season with 559 total points, the second most in program history.

- Scored the 1,000th point of her Valpo career on Jan. 17, 2017 at Green Bay, becoming the 14th player in program history to join the 1,000-point club.
- Enters her senior season with 1,236 career points, which already ranks sixth in program history.
- Her 2016-17 free-throw percentage was the second-best single-season free throw percentage in program history.
- Had as many double-doubles in a five-game stretch from Jan. 12-20, 2017 as she did in the first 73 games of her collegiate career.
- Got to the free-throw line more as a junior than she did in her first two collegiate seasons combined. Went 10-for-10 at the free-throw line on Jan. 28 at UIC, becoming the 10th player in program history to go perfect at the foul stripe with at least 10 attempts in a game.
- Set a career high and notched Valpo's best individual scoring performance since 1992 and fifth-best in program history with 34 points at Stetson on Nov. 12, 2016.
- Only two players in program history had reached the 34-point mark before Franklin. Debbie Bolen did so three times, while Stephanie Greer owns the all-time single-game scoring record with 39 in 1990.
- Scored 33 points on Dec. 3, 2016 against Eastern Illinois, finishing one shy of a career high. She became just the third player in program history who has scored 33 points or more in at least two games. Matched a career best with 12 made field goals.
- 2014-15 Horizon League Freshman of the Year, 2014-15 Horizon League Sixth Player of the Year, 2016-17 All-Horizon League Second Team, team's Sixth Player of the Year in 2014-15 and 2015-16, team's MVP and co-Most Improved Player in 2016-17.
- Shot 43.3 percent from 3-point range as a freshman in 2014-2015, the fourth best single-season mark in program history. Now owns two of the Top 5 single-season 3-point field goal percentage marks.
- As a junior, increased her scoring average from the previous year by nearly eight points, boosted her 3-point percentage by nearly 12 percent and over doubled her number of total rebounds and made free throws from the previous season.
- Made 199 field goals as a junior, tied for third in program history.
- Finished in double-figure scoring in 28 of the team's 31 games last season, leading the squad in scoring on 23 occasions.

### **Caitlin Morrison**

- Knocked down a pair of 3s on Dec. 18 at Eastern Illinois, her first game this season with multiple makes from beyond the arc.
- Swatted a career-high five shots on Nov. 25 against Grand Canyon, including a block of a 3-point try that would have tied the game with less than 10 seconds left. Previously hadn't had more than two blocks in any game in her career.
- Squeezed a career-high 10 rebounds on Nov. 21 at Miami, five of which came in the first quarter.

- Established career watermarks in assists (four) and steals (three) in Valpo's season opener against IU Kokomo.
- Reached double figures for the first time in her Valpo career with 10 points on 4-of-9 shooting against Grace College on Dec. 10, 2016.
- Matched her season high in rebounds and established her season high in scoring in the first round of the Horizon League Tournament, posting 11 points and eight boards to help the Crusaders to a victory over Youngstown State.
- Named the team's Rookie of the Year in 2016-17.
- Father Scott Morrison is a former Valparaiso men's basketball player.

#### Nicole Konieczny

- Missed the Dec. 15 game against IU Northwest due to illness.
- Has registered five or more assists in six of her last seven games.
- Was two assists shy of a double-double on Nov. 28 at Bowling Green, finishing with personal bests in both points (13) and assists (eight).
- Became the first Crusader to have eight or more assists and score double figures in the same game since Jessica Carr posted a double-double of 13 points and 11 assists on Jan. 21, 2015 in a 90-79 loss at Milwaukee.
- Made her first career start on Nov. 25 against Grand Canyon and dished out seven assists while scoring eight points to lift Valpo to an 80-75 win.
- Handed out six assists in the first road game of her career on Nov. 21 at Miami.
- Had six points in her collegiate debut on Nov. 16 against IU Kokomo.
- Named a 2016-17 Indiana All-Star, earning a place on the 13-player rooter.
- Led South Bend St. Joseph to the 2016-17 Indiana Class 3A state title, averaging 14.4 points per game and 3.1 assists per game during her senior season.
- Helped the Indians finish her senior campaign with a 26-2 record.
- Started her prep career at LaPorte, approximately 20 miles from Valpo, before transferring to South Bend St. Joseph before her junior season.

### **Bryce Blood**

- Made all four field-goal attempts while finishing as one of four Crusaders in double figures (10 points) on Dec. 15 against IU Northwest
- Matched a season high with five made field goals an efficient 5-of-6 shooting on Dec. 3 at Longwood on her way to 11 points, one of three Crusaders in double figures.
- Contributed nine points including 5-of-5 at the free-throw line on Nov. 28 at Bowling Green, a game played close to her hometown of Toledo.

- Chipped in nine points and five rebounds in a win over Grand Canyon on Nov. 25.
- Became the first Crusader since 2008 with a double-double in a season opener by scoring 13 points and grabbing 13 boards in her collegiate debut on Nov. 16 against IU Kokomo.
- Won over 20 regional and national titles over a five-year span while playing for the SMAC Ballers AAU program.
- Finished fourth on her school's all-time scoring list with 931 points, while finishing as the program's all-time leader in both rebounds (767) and blocks (181).

#### **Grace Hales**

- Made a career-high five field goals while scoring 12 points one shy of a career best in the season-opening win over IU Kokomo. Hales reached double figures for the sixth time in her career.
- Knocked down three 3s in her Crusader debut, becoming the first player to do so since Annemarie Hamlet in 2014. Hales became the first freshman to pour in three 3s in a season opener in the last decade.
- Had a streak of 21 straight made free throws that spanned three different months during her freshman year. Finished the season second on the team in free-throw percentage at 81.4.
- Scored nine points at Stetson on Nov. 12, 2016, marking the third straight year a Valpo freshman has scored nine points or more on opening night.
- Opened conference play in style with a career-high 13 points on Dec. 29, 2016 at Detroit Mercy, her second consecutive game in double figures.
- Led her team in scoring for the first time in her Valpo career on Feb. 16, 2017 against Oakland. Was the only Crusader in double figures, posting 11 points in the defeat. Scored seven of the team's 13 second-quarter points.
- Father Ross played football and basketball at Indiana University.

- Scored in double figures for the third time this season after not doing so at all a year ago by posting 11 points on Dec. 18 at Eastern Illinois.
- Shattered a program-record that had stood since 1992 in her first career start by dishing out 16 assists on Dec. 15 against IU Northwest. She became the 10th player in Missouri Valley Conference history to reach 16 assists, a mark that ranks tied for sixth in the conference's prestigious history. She also became the second player in the nation with a 16+ assist game this season.
- Had 10 of her career-high 12 points in the fourth quarter of a 71-60 win over Chicago State on Dec. 10.
- Made a pair of impressive blocks on Dec. 8 at Purdue.
- Knocked down a pair of 3s in a game for the first time in her Crusader career and finished with 11 points on Nov. 28 at Bowling Green. The 3-point makes were her first of the season, but she hasn't attempted one in either game since then.

# **Tracey Dorow**

Head Coach 6th Season 281-278 overall, 47-115 at Valpo Western Michigan, 1996

Tracey Dorow was named head coach of the Valparaiso women's basketball program in April of 2012. The 2017-18 season will be her sixth in charge of Valpo's program. In her career as a head coach, Dorow has amassed 275 victories.

Dorow has led the Crusaders to a Horizon League tournament victory in four of her first five seasons at the helm. During the 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, Valpo boasted three all-freshman team members, a Freshman of the Year, a Sixth Player of the Year, an all-league second-team honoree and an all-defensive team member. The Crusaders have enjoyed a significant uptick in all-league recognition under Dorow's watch, as they had three total league honors in the five seasons before that three-year span.

Dorow arrived at Valpo after spending 14 seasons as the head coach at Ferris State University, guiding the Bulldogs to four NCAA Division II Tournament appearances, two Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) North Division championships, and four 20-win seasons.

In her 14 seasons at Ferris State, Dorow compiled a 232-163 (.587) record, including a 23-7 mark in 2011-2012 while guiding the Bulldogs to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The all-time winningest coach in FSU history, she led her squad to the Sweet Sixteen in 2007.

The GLIAC Coach of the Year in 2003-2004, Dorow had five players earn a total of seven All-American honors and had seven players tally 10 total All-Region Team accolades. Her student-athletes earned All-GLIAC honors 22 times and 10 times she had players represented on the GLIAC All-Defensive Team. Under Dorow's guidance, Ferris State produced the GLIAC Player of the Year in 2000-2001, and she twice coached the GLIAC Freshman of the Year.

Dorow's student-athletes also excelled in the classroom, as three times she has led a First Team Academic All-American and 14 times her players have earned Academic All-District honors. A total of 45 different players earned GLIAC All-Academic recognition during her time at Ferris State. Ferris State posted the No. 1 grade point average in the country in Division II for the 1999-2000 women's basketball season, and her team ranked second in the nation in 2002-2003.

Dorow began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Lake Michigan Community College in Benton Harbor, Mich., where she helped lead the Indians to a 69-22 record in three seasons, winning two Western Collegiate Conference titles. Lake Michigan finished fourth in the 1997 NJCAA national tournament and held a No. 1 national ranking in February of that same season. She also spent one season as a graduate assistant at the University of Indianapolis.

A collegiate player at Illinois State from 1990-1993, she led the Redbirds in assists as a sophomore while finishing seventh in the Gateway Conference that same season. After transferring to Northern Michigan University for the 1993-1994 season, she earned Newcomer of the Year and Best Defensive Player honors for the Wildcats. Dorow had 131 assists and made 54 threes at NMU in her one season there. As a prep player, she finished third in the state of Michigan for Miss Basketball in 1990 and was named to the Detroit Free Press All-Decade Team.

Dorow earned her Bachelor of Science degree in education from Western Michigan University in 1996 and her Master of Arts degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2003 in curriculum and instruction. She has two children: Lainie and Baxter.
