Next Up in Valpo Basketball: College basketball's signature month has arrived. March begins with the season's most important game to date as the seventh-seeded Valparaiso University men's basketball team will open up Arch Madness, the annual State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament in St. Louis, on Thursday night against 10th-seeded Evansville. The winner of Thursday's opening-round game will advance to Friday's 6 p.m. MVC quarterfinal contest against second-seeded Missouri State. The last time Valpo entered Arch Madness as the No. 7 seed and played Evansville in the opening round, it became the first team in the tournament's 30-year history to play on Thursday and advance to Sunday's title game in 2020.

Last Time Out: Valpo trailed 34-13 at halftime and eventually came out on the wrong side of a 79-55 score in Saturday's regular-season finale against Bradley at Carver Arena in Peoria, Ill. The Beacons were led by 16 points apiece from Kevion Taylor and Kobe King. Valpo shot 23.1 percent (6-of-26) in the opening half before improving to a 16-of-31 clip (51.6 percent) after the break. It was a tough day from beyond the 3-point arc as Valpo went just 5-of-21 (23.8 percent). Bradley possesses the No. 1 field-goal percentage defense in the Missouri Valley Conference and their ability on the defensive end was on display on Saturday.

Madness seeding for the fourth straight year as the program continued to make positive strides in each season as a Missouri Valley Conference member. The team earned a first-round by in the State Farm MVC Tournament for the first time since joining the prestigious league. Valpo upset previously-undefeated Drake, the nation's No. 25 team, 74-57 on Feb. 7, 2021 at the ARC, the fourth win over an AP Top 25 team in program history and second under Lottich. The Bulldogs were one of three undefeated teams in the nation prior to that setback, joining Gonzaga and Baylor. Just two years removed from finishing in last place and being knocked out in the first round of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament as a first-year Valley member, Lottich's team did more than hold its own in 2019-2020, ascending into a tie for sixth in the league standings before finishing as the conference tournament runner-up. Valpo became the first team in the history of Arch Madness to reach the title game after playing in the opening round. Lottich, hired as the 22nd head coach of the Valpo men's basketball program in April 2016, graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and New Trier High School (Illinois) in 2000.

Series Notes: Evansville is Valpo's second most common opponent in program history as the two squads have matched up 94 times. Butler (103) is the only school Valpo has faced more frequently than Evansville. The Aces own a 72-22 advantage in head-to-head showdowns. Valpo dropped both matchups last season, which occurred in Evansville, but swept all three 2020 meetings, including an opening round MVC Tournament game in St. Louis. The Beacons are looking to complete a three-game sweep of the Purple Aces for the second time in three years as they prevailed in both of this year's regular-season matchups. Valpo is 5-6 in 11 games against Evansville since joining the Missouri Valley Conference.

Regular-Season Matchups

Feb. 19 – Valpo 72, Evansville 56: Boring was not a bad thing in the closing minutes of the Feb. 19 game at Evansville. A Valpo team that has been no stranger to close contests enjoyed its first win that was not hanging in the balance in the final minute of regulation in conference play this year as the team's previous four victories came either in overtime or in the final seconds of regulation. This time, the visiting Beacons surged to a 16-point halftime lead and won the game by that same margin, 72-56 at the Ford Center. Valpo withstood a pair of unanticipated injuries to starters as Thomas Kithier was scratched 10 minutes before game time with a back injury and Preston Ruedinger injured his ankle during the contest.

Feb. 21 – Valpo 74, Evansville 69: Valpo led by as many as 13 late in the first half on Feb. 21 at the ARC, but visiting Evansville scored the first 16 points of the second half to build up a 10-point lead. Valpo responded in a positive manner, rallying past the Purple

Aces 74-69 to allow the Beacons to complete a four-game Hoosier State sweep of instate foes Indiana State and Evansville for the first time since joining the Missouri Valley Conference. Valpo was led in scoring by Kevion Taylor with 23 points, while Ben Krikke had 16. In addition, Sheldon Edwards (13&12) and Kobe King (12&10) both posted double-doubles. Valpo went 9-of-10 at the free-throw line in the final 33 seconds to ice the win. This game represented the 19th time in the Matt Lottich Era (sixth season) that Valpo has erased a double-figure deficit for a victory. This game represented just the second time in the last five seasons that two Valpo players enjoyed double-doubles in the same contest. Edwards became the first Valpo player with back-to-back double-doubles since Alec Peters in January 2017. Valpo shot just 22.2 percent from 3, its lowest 3-point percentage in a win since going 0-for-10 against the Aces in the first round of the 2020 MVC Tournament.

Outrebounding UE: Over the two regular-season games against Evansville, Valpo went +15 in terms of rebounding margin on Feb. 19 at Evansville and +19 on Feb. 21 vs. Evansville. The 42-23 advantage on the boards on Feb. 21 marked the team's best rebounding margin against a Division-I opponent since going +32 vs. Samford on Nov. 21, 2017. In terms of offensive rebounds, Valpo outdid Evansville 10-2 on Feb. 21. The 10 offensive caroms tied for the team's most against D-I competition this season (vs. Eastern Michigan, at Indiana State), while the two offensive rebounds allowed tied for the fewest permitted by the Beacons all season with the Feb. 19 game at Evansville. Valpo permitted just four total offensive rebounds in the two regular-season matchups even though both of those games came without the services of leading rebounder Thomas Kithier.

Arch Madness History

- In 2020, Valpo became the first team in the history of Arch Madness to win three games in three days to reach the MVC title game. As a No. 7 seed, Valpo became the lowest seed to ever play in the title game. The Beacons led Bradley 38-36 in the title game and were 20 minutes from clinching an NCAA Tournament berth, but the Braves eventually prevailed 80-66.
- Valpo entered Arch Madness as the No. 10 seed in 2017-18, No. 9 seed in 2018-19, No. 7 in 2019-20, No. 6 in 2020-21 and now No. 7 in 2021-2022.
- Valpo is 4-4 all-time in eight Arch Madness games. Three of the four victories came during the 2019-20 run to the title game, which featured wins over Evansville, Loyola and Missouri State.
- Valpo's previous Arch Madness matchup with Evansville was a 58-55 victory on March 5, 2020. Valpo prevailed despite going 0-for-10 from 3-point territory, snapping the team's 298-game streak of making a 3. Valpo went without a made 3 for the first time since Nov. 18, 2011, an 0-for-14 performance in a 62-59 win over Akron.

Hoosier State Sweep

- Valpo went a combined 4-0 during the regular season against instate foes Evansville and Indiana State, completing a regular-season Hoosier State sweep for the first time since joining the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Valpo will look to improve to 5-0 against instate foes this season on Thursday.
- In addition, the Beacons will try to secure a three-game sweep of the Purple Aces for the second time in the last three seasons. The 3-0 record against Evansville in 2020 represented the first time Valpo recorded a three-game sweep of a conference nemesis since March 7, 2015, a 60-55 Horizon League semifinal win over Cleveland State.

Valpo in St. Louis

- Although Valpo is the new kid on the block when it comes to Arch Madness (for one final time before UIC, Murray State and Belmont join the fold next season), the program's history in the building now known as the Enterprise Center goes beyond the team's three MVC Tournament appearances.
- Valpo's Sweet Sixteen game against Rhode Island in 1998 was played in the building, which was then known as the Kiel Center.
- Valpo also appeared in the 2002 NCAA Tournament in St. Louis, but the first-round date with Kentucky was played at the Edward Jones Dome.
- Head coach Matt Lottich played at Stanford from 2000-2004 and was part of the Cardinal team that participated in the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament at the Edwards Jones Dome in 2002. His squad joined Valpo as two of the eight teams competing in St. Louis in the opening round of the tournament that year.

Injury Bug Bites: Valpo has been bitten by the injury bug more frequently than the team would have liked this season. In part for that reason, head coach Matt Lottich has used 14 different starting lineup combinations and had 11 unique lineups in conference play alone over 18 games. No Valpo player started every game this season, and only three (Kevion Taylor, Sheldon Edwards, Eron Gordon) have played in each contest. Here's a breakdown of the season-long injury report.

- Thomas Kithier: Missed the first two Missouri Valley Conference games due to COVID-19 health and safety protocols, returned on Jan. 11 at Loyola and played in four games, left on Jan. 22 at Indiana

State with a back injury, did not play in the next four games due to the back, returned on Feb. 12 at Missouri State and played in two games, then missed the final four games of the regular season with the back injury.

- Preston Ruedinger: Returned on Feb. 26 at Bradley after missing the previous two games with an ankle injury.
- Darius DeAveiro: Suffered a thumb injury in the regular seasor finale at Bradley and is questionable for Arch Madness.
- Ben Krikke: Missed the first three games of the season with an ankle injury.
- Kobe King: Sat out the first nine games of the season in order to gain eligibility.
- Keyondre Young: Has only played in eight games and has not played since Dec. 5 due to a thumb/wrist.
 - Trevor Anderson: Was limited to 17 games and hasn't played since Jan. 26 due to a season-ending back injury.
 - Connor Barrett: Has only played in 13 games and hasn't played since Jan. 5 for undisclosed reasons.
 - Emil Freese-Vilien: Played in the first two games of the season in November, then missed 25 games due to Lyme disease before returning on Feb. 19 at Evansville.

Not Your Average Walk-On

- Entering Arch Madness, freshman point guard Preston Ruedinger has made 11 starts in his 17 games this season as a nonscholarship player.
- Ruedinger's first collegiate start came on Jan. 8 vs. SIU. He became the second nonscholarship player to start a game for Valpo during the Matt Lottich Era as John Kiser started on March 4, 2017 vs. Milwaukee at the Horizon League Tournament in Detroit as a freshman walk-on before earning a scholarship prior to his sophomore campaign.
- Although the all-conference balloting has not been completed at the time these notes were authored, Ruedinger appears to be a strong candidate for the league's all-freshman team despite his status as a walk-on. His role elevated with the aforementioned season-ending back injury to original starting point guard Trevor Anderson.
- Ruedinger owns an impressive ratio of 28 assists against just six turnovers. As of Feb. 27, he is one of just three players in the nation with more than 25 assists and fewer than 10 turnovers, joining UCLA's David Singleton and NC State's Thomas Allen. He has the fewest turnovers in that group with six.
- No Valpo player has finished a season with 25 or more assists and fewer than 10 turnovers in at least 15 years. The last Missouri Valley Conference player to achieve that feat was UNI's Hunter Rhodes (30 assists, 7 turnovers) in 2017-18.
- Ruedinger has not had more than one turnover in any of his 17 games this season while averaging 19.6 minutes per game. He's played turnover-free basketball in 11 of his 17 contests.

Krikke Approaching 1,000

- Although he was held to a rare inefficient shooting performance at 4-of-14, Ben Krikke reached double figures for the 11th consecutive game in the Feb. 26 regular-season finale at Bradley, posting 10 points to go along with seven rebounds. That marked his 50th career double-figure scoring output.
- Entering Arch Madness, the junior is 45 points away from 1,000 for his collegiate career and is within striking distance of reaching that mark this weekend should Valpo make a run in the tournament.
- During his current 11-game double-figure streak, Krikke has reached the 20-point threshold three times and scored 15 points or more on seven occasions. He has shot 50 percent or better in 18 of his last 21 games.
- During his 11-game double-figure streak, Krikke is averaging 15.6 points per game, tied with Kevion Taylor for the team's top mark during that stretch. Krikke is also pulling down 6.1 rebounds per contest over the last 11 games, a significant uptick as he was averaging just 3.6 per game through the season's first 16 contests. He has been the team's leading rebounder during this 11-game stretch.
- Entering Arch Madness, Krikke (53.9 percent FG / 84.3 percent FT) is one of four players in the Missouri Valley Conference shooting above 50 percent from the field and above 80 percent from the free-throw line. He joins Isiaih Mosley (Missouri State), Malevy Leons (Bradley) and Tate Hall (Loyola). Krikke owns the highest field-goal percentage and second-highest free-throw percentage in that elite group.
- Krikke has scored in double figures in 21 of his 27 games this season.
- Krikke's rebounding totals have been on the rise as he's squeezed five boards or more in six straight games and 10 of his last 11.

- In the Jan. 26 game against Bradley, Valpo held a two-point advantage in the 31 minutes that Krikke played but was outdone by 17 in the nine minutes that Krikke was not in the game.
- Krikke delivered the game-winning shot with six seconds remaining in the victory over Indiana State on Jan. 22, the latest Valpo game-winner since Eron Gordon's memorable buzzer-beater in the 2020 MVC quarterfinal vs. Loyola.

Mr. 2,000 & Other Taylor Tidbits

- Kevion Taylor achieved a noteworthy milestone on Feb. 23 vs. Drake as he surpassed the 2,000-point threshold for his collegiate career. That includes 1,635 points over his four seasons at Winona State before joining Valpo prior to this season as a graduate transfer.
- A strong month of February helped Taylor reach that milestone as he averaged a team-best 16.9 points per game during the month, a scoring average that ranked sixth in the Missouri Valley Conference in that time span.
- After averaging just 9.4 points per game through the first 11 games of the season, Taylor has averaged a team-best 14.9 points per game over the last 19 contests.
- Entering Arch Madness, Taylor has scored in double figures 99 times in his collegiate career, meaning his next double-figure scoring output will be his 100th.
- Taylor became just the third player in program history to score his 2,000th collegiate point while playing for Valpo, joining program legends Alec Peters and Bryce Drew.
- He became the 27th active player at all levels of NCAA basketball to reach that milestone.
- Entering the MVC Tournament, Taylor has reached double figures 18 times in 30 games this season including 14 performances featuring 15 points or more. Furthermore, he closed out the regular season with four consecutive games in which he scored 16 points or more.
- Taylor also reached a milestone on Feb. 12 at Missouri State, when he secured six rebounds to push his career total over 700. Taylor became just the 14th active player nationally with over 1,900 points and over 700 rebounds.

Senior Stalwart

- Sixth-year senior Eron Gordon has been the one on-court constant over the last three seasons, as he's played in all 93 Valpo games since the beginning of 2019-20.
- Gordon has scored seven points or more in three of his last four games after he had reached that threshold just once in his previous 12 contests.
- The Indianapolis native is 5-for-5 at the free-throw line since Jan. 26 and has made nine of his last 10 free-throw attempts after starting the season 6-for-10.
- Gordon's shooting from the field has also seen an uptick over the last seven games, when he's hitting shots at a 48.1 percent clip and

shooting 41.7 percent from 3. Prior to that stretch, Gordon was shooting just 34.4 percent from the field and 27.3 percent from 3.

The 30-20 Club

- Entering Arch Madness, Sheldon Edwards is one of three players in the Missouri Valley Conference with 30 or more steals and 20 or more blocked shots, joining Illinois State's Kendall Lewis and Drake's Tucker DeVries. Edwards and Lewis are the only two with 25 or more blocks and 30 or more steals.
- Edwards leads the Beacons in both of those defensive categories with 34 steals and 25 rejections.
- The Florida native has a chance to become the first Valpo player to finish a season as the team leader in both steals and blocked shots since Raitis Grafs had 45 steals and 38 blocks during the 1999-2000 season.
- The sophomore is one of just six players in the nation with at least 25 blocks, 30 steals, 35 assists and 60 made 3s, as of Feb. 27.
- Edwards is just the third different Valpo player to notch 20 blocks, 30 steals, 30 assists and 50 made 3s in a season since 1992-1993, joining Ryan Broekhoff (three times) and Lubos Barton (twice).

Inside Kobe's Kingdom

- After missing the first nine games of the season in order to gain NCAA eligibility, Kobe King is averaging 14.2 points per game in 21 contests (20 starts).
- King has made 18 appearances in double figures in his 21 contests. He has scored 15 points or more in nine of his first 21 games in a Valpo uniform.
- King has reached double figures 11 times in his last 12 games.
- He enjoyed his first career double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds on Feb. 21 vs. Evansville.
- King has scored 20 points or more twice, Feb. 5 vs. Indiana State and Feb. 19 at Evansville.

Scouting the Purple Aces

- Coming off a solid showing in the regular-season finale that came up short in an 88-79 loss vs. Missouri State. That marked a massive improvement from their previous game, an 82-31 loss at Loyola.
- Have dropped seven straight since a 65-56 win at Indiana State on Feb. 8.
- Led in scoring by Shamar Givance at 13.8 points per game. Second leading scorer and top rebounder Jawaun Newton (13.3 ppg, 5.6 rpg) has been sidelined of late with an injury.
- Finished 10th in the MVC regular-season standings.

Notes Wrapping Up Feb. 26: Bradley 79, Valpo 55

- Valpo shot 100 percent at the free-throw line for the third time this season. However, unlike the other two games which featured a combined 30 attempts, Valpo got to the foul line for just six chances in the regular-season finale, a season-low for free-throw attempts.
- The 13 point first-half was Valpo's lowest-scoring period of the season. It represented Valpo's lowest-scoring half since putting up 13 points in the opening 20 minutes in the quarterfinal round of last year's State Farm MVC Tournament vs. Missouri State.
- Bradley pulled down 13 offensive rebounds to Valpo's nine, but the Beacons managed to hold a 12-9 advantage in second-chance points.
- The Braves scored 36 points in the paint as Valpo opponents have now scored 76 points in the paint over the last two contests.
- Three-point defense has been a strength of late, as Valpo has held the opponent below 30 percent in three of its last four games, including Bradley's 29.2 percent on Feb. 26. Prior to this stretch, opponents had shot above 30 percent from 3 in 12 straight games.

Notes Wrapping Up Feb. 23: Drake 71, Valpo 65

- Valpo limited Drake to just 1-of-10 from 3-point territory, the worst clip by a Valpo opponent in conference play this season. This marked the second time Valpo contained an opponent to one made triple this year, joining Dec. 20 vs. Eastern Michigan.
- Valpo held Drake to its second-worst 3-point shooting day of the season (1-16, Jan. 2 vs. Missouri State).
- This marked the first time Valpo held an opponent to one made 3 or fewer in a conference game since Feb. 21, 2015 vs. Wright State.
- Valpo outscored the Bulldogs by 21 points from the 3-point arc (eight made 3s to one), but Drake owned a 40-22 advantage in terms of points in the paint.
- The Beacons had just seven turnovers, their 15th time this season with 10 or fewer.
- Drake shot 61.5 percent in the second half, attempting 24 of 26 shots from 2-point territory. They finished at 53.4 percent for the game.

Sustained Home Success

- The Athletics-Recreation Center has provided a distinct homecourt advantage over the years as Valpo has not finished with a losing mark at the ARC since 1991-92.
- Thanks to the Feb. 21 victory over Evansville, the program finished with a record of .500 or better at home for the 30th consecutive season.
- Valpo finished the season with an 8-8 home record.

Century Mark in Sight: Valpo head coach Matt Lottich earned his 96th career win on Feb. 21 vs. Evansville. He needs just four more to become the fourth head coach in program history to reach 100 career victories, joining Homer Drew, Bryce Drew and J.M Christiansen. Earlier this season, Lottich moved into sole possession of fourth place in program history, surpassing the legendary Gene Bartow (1964-1970). On a side note, Valpo assistant coach Matt Bowen worked under Bartow at UAB in 1995.

Down to the Wire & Working Overtime

- Fans prone to bite their fingernails in tense moments may have no nails left to bite as eight of Valpo's 18 Missouri Valley Conference games were decided by three points or fewer or required overtime.
- Overall this season, 13 of Valpo's 28 games against Division-I opponents have been decided by four points or fewer or needed OT.
- The two-point loss to Loyola on Feb. 16 continued a trend of close calls in the head-to-head series. That marked the sixth time in the last seven matchups between the two teams that the game was decided by three points or fewer or went to overtime.
- The Feb. 9 setback at Illinois State was Valpo's sixth game this season that went beyond the regulation 40 minutes and the fifth time in 12 conference contests that the Beacons have played overtime. Valpo is 3-3 in the six OT games this year.
- Valpo played back-to-back overtime games (Feb. 5 vs. Indiana State and Feb. 9 at Illinois State) for the first time since 1993 (Feb. 6 at UIC, Feb. 8 vs. Green Bay).
- This is the first time Valpo has played six overtime games in a single season since the program tied an NCAA Division-I record with eight overtime games in 1993. Valpo was the most recent NCAA D-I team with eight OT games in a single season as the program shares the record with Western Kentucky (1978) and Portland (1984). This year's version of the Beacons is two OT games away from tying that mark.
- When Valpo and Illinois State played beyond 40 minutes on Feb. 9, it was the sixth overtime game of the year for both teams.
- Valpo has played eight overtime periods this season (including two double OT games). Bradley owns the NCAA Division-I record for number of overtime periods in a season with 14 in 1982 (seven of those came in a single game).
- The Feb. 5 game vs. Indiana State was Valpo's second double overtime game of the season, joining Jan. 11 at Loyola. The last time the program played multiple double overtime games in the same season was 1992-1993, when the team played double overtime on three occasions.
- Both Valpo vs. Illinois State matchups this season went to overtime. The last time Valpo played multiple OT games against the same opponent in one season was 1992-1993 (UIC).

All Good Things Must End

- Kevion Taylor saw his impressive streak of consecutive games with a made 3-pointer end at 84 when he was held without a triple on Jan. 30, 2022 at Southern Illinois. In the previous game, Taylor extended the streak by the skin of his teeth with a 3 as time expired on Jan. 26 vs. Bradley.
- Taylor was held without a made 3 for the first time since Dec. 15, 2018 while playing for Winona State in a game at Concordia St. Paul. His streak, one of the longest in the history of NCAA

college basketball, started on Dec. 19, 2018 at Michigan Tech.

- The highest of the NCAA records (Division I, Division II or Division III) for consecutive games with a made 3 is 93 and belongs to Daniel Park of D-II Rollins from Jan. 26, 1994 to Feb. 28, 1997.
- If Taylor's streak came in all D-I games, it would rank third in Division-I history. The D-I record is held by Mack Smith (91), who Valpo played against on Dec. 5 at Western Michigan. Smith set the record while at Eastern Illinois. Second is Corey Bradford of Illinois (88).
- He hit at least one triple in each of the first 21 contests this season.
- Taylor became the first Valpo player since at least the start of the 1989-90 season (nearly all the way back to the addition of the 3-point line) to make a 3 in each of his first 21 games of a season. He surpassed the program's previous longest season-opening streak of 14 by Lance Barker in 1994-95. Three other Valpo players made a 3 in each of the first 13 games of a season Bryce Drew (1995-96), Casey Schmidt (1992-93) and Mike Jones (1989-90).

#SCTop10 Again: Kobe King nailed a three-quarters court shot to beat the buzzer on Dec. 11 vs. Charlotte. Although the desperation heave was not enough as Valpo fell 68-67, the play checked in at No. 9 on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays that evening. It was highlighted again two days later on ESPN's popular "SportsCenter with Scott Van Pelt" show. This marks the fourth time in a three-year span that Valpo basketball has produced an #SCTop10 play. The previous appearance came courtesy of a Sheldon Edwards dunk in a victory over No. 25 Drake on Feb. 7 of last season. Since joining the Missouri Valley Conference, Valpo Athletics has been featured on the iconic daily countdown on 10 occasions spanning five sports – men's basketball (four times), softball (twice), volleyball (twice), women's basketball and soccer.

#ChampionsInCommunity

- The Valpo basketball program received recognition from the Valparaiso University Student Philanthropy program on Sunday, Nov. 14.
- The team was recognized as part of the University's annual Generosity Awards Celebration. Head coach Matt Lottich's group was selected as the 2021 Athletic Team Awardee for the program's community service and engagement.
- The team's community engagement activities include participating in the Popcorn Fest, Valparaiso Downtown Trick or Treat, Valpo Day of Caring and beach cleanup at the Indiana Dunes National Park.
- In addition, the team hosts youth camps in the summer, working with children ages 6-14 to provide a fun and positive basketball experience.
- The program makes it a priority to attend as many Valpo Athletics events as possible to support other teams. The Beacons also make an effort to actively participate in the University community and support student organizations while also having an active presence as members of the broader City of Valparaiso and Northwest Indiana communities.
- Of the six core values that make up the foundation of the Valpo men's basketball program, servanthood and appreciation are among the most prominent.

More on 2020-21

- The 2020-21 season was highlighted by an upset victory over previously- 1996. undefeated Drake, the nation's No. 25 team, 74-57 on Feb. 7, 2021 at the Athletics-Recreation Center, the fourth win over an AP Top 25 team in program history and second under Lottich. The Bulldogs were one of three undefeated teams in the nation prior to that setback, joining Gonzaga and
- Valpo came close to two other victories over ranked foes, falling 80-77 vs. No. 25 Drake on Feb. 6 and 54-52 at No. 22 Loyola on Feb. 17.
- Valpo closed the regular season with a stretch of 16 Missouri Valley Conference games in a 39-day span. By comparison, Valpo had played three games over the previous 31 days before beginning the stretch of seemingly nonstop competition. Six of Valpo's first eight MVC games were postponed due to COVID-19, causing the backlog of makeup games during the busy stretch.

2021-22 Preseason Picks

- Ben Krikke was named to the Preseason All-MVC Second Team.
- Valpo was picked seventh in the 10-team league based on a preseason survey of the conference's head coaches, media members and sports information directors.
- Drake was tabbed the preseason favorite to win the league, while UNI's AJ Green earned Preseason Player of the Year accolades.

Staff Sidebars

- Associate head coach Luke Gore is in his 20th year on staff and has served under four different head coaches. The Valpo veteran has helped the team to eight postseason berths in the last 11 years and was on staff for the three winningest seasons in program history. He serves as the team's defensive coordinator in addition to leading Valpo's scheduling and scouting efforts.
- Assistant coach Matt Bowen returned to Valpo's staff in 2018-19 after previously spending four seasons with the Brown & Gold from 2002-2006. He was the head coach at the University of Minnesota Duluth from 2012-2018. Bowen coordinates the team's offense.
- Assistant coach Rob Holloway is back for his fourth season after spending the previous two years on staff at Eastern Illinois, his alma mater.
- Director of Basketball Operations Peter Funk is in his first season in that role after spending the previous two years as a graduate assistant and the three years prior to that as a student manager.

Tradition of Excellence

- Valpo has 14 NCAA Tournament appearances and four NIT berths in the program's proud history, with the team's postseason success highlighted

- The program has produced nine All-Americans, won 18 regular season conference championships and 10 conference tournament crowns.
- Valpo also boasts eight NBA players, 10 conference players of the year and 20 20-win seasons.
- Nine of the team's NCAA appearances have come since
- Valpo has qualified for the postseason eight times in the last 11 years, including 2019-20 where Valpo accepted a postseason berth but the tournament was not played due to COVID-19.

Ryan Broekhoff (class of 2013) signed a contract with the Dallas Mavericks in the summer of 2018 after spending five seasons playing internationally in Russia and Turkey. Alec Peters (class of 2017) was the 54th pick in the 2017 NBA Draft by the Phoenix Suns. Peters appeared in 20 games for the Suns in 2017-18, highlighted by a 36-point performance in the season finale against Dallas – a new single-game high by a Valpo alum in the NBA. He has gone on to a successful career overseas with CSKA Moscow (2018-2019), Anadolu Efes (2019-2020) and Kirolbet Baskonia (2020-present).

Matt Lottich

Head Coach 6th Season * Stanford, 2004 96-95 Overall and at Valpo

Matt Lottich is in his ninth season overall at Valparaiso University and sixth as the head coach of the men's basketball program in 2021-2022.

The 2020-2021 season saw Valpo improve its Arch Madness seeding for the fourth straight year as the program continued to make positive strides in each season as a Missouri Valley Conference member. The team earned a first-round bye in the State Farm MVC Tournament for the first time since joining the prestigious league.

Valpo upset previously-undefeated Drake, the nation's No. 25 team, 74-57 on Feb. 7, 2021 at the ARC, the fourth win over an AP Top 25 team in program history and second under Lottich. The Bulldogs were one of three undefeated teams in the nation prior to that setback, joining Gonzaga and Baylor. Valpo came close to two other victories over ranked foes, falling 80-77 vs. No. 25 Drake on Feb. 6 and 54-52 at No. 22 Loyola on Feb. 17. In addition, Valpo extended its streak to 29 straight seasons without a sub-.500 home record.

Just two years removed from finishing in last place and being knocked out in the first round of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament as a first-year Valley member, Lottich's team did more than hold its own in 2019-2020, ascending into a tie for sixth in the league standings before finishing as the conference tournament runner-up. Valpo became the first team in the history of Arch Madness to reach the title game after playing in the opening round.

Lottich led the program to its first conference championship game appearance since 2015 during the 2019-2020 campaign, doing so after being picked to finish ninth of 10 in the preseason poll. Valpo reached the conference title game as only a third-year MVC member, becoming the first Valpo team in any sport to do so during the department's young tenure in the prestigious league. After finishing with its highest conference win total, highest overall win total and highest finish in the league standings since joining The Valley, Valpo accepted a postseason tournament invitation to play in the Collegelnsider.com Tournament. The event was ultimately canceled due to COVID-19 concerns.

The 2019-2020 team's finest hour came on the biggest stage, as Lottich led the squad to three victories in as many days at Arch Madness, the 2020 State Farm MVC Men's Basketball Tournament in St. Louis. Lottich's team came from 18 down to upset Loyola in the MVC quarterfinal, tying for the second-biggest comeback in MVC Tournament history. During his time guiding the program, Lottich has instilled a no-quit attitude. The Loyola comeback marked the sixth time in 2019-2020 that Valpo came from double figures down to win. On 11 occasions, Valpo trailed by at least 10 points and eventually tied the game or took the lead. Valpo also became just the second team in the long history of the Missouri Valley Conference to come from 17 or more down to win twice in one season, joining Creighton from 2007-2008.

Working with a young team that featured just five returning players from the previous season, Lottich mentored a 2019-2020 First Team All-MVC selection, MVC All-Defensive Team choice, MVC All-Freshman Team honoree, MVC All-Bench pick, MVC Scholar-Athlete Second Team selection and a pair of MVC All-Tournament Team performers. Perhaps most noteworthy of all, the program's emphasis on player development paid dividends as Valpo accounted for 40 percent of the MVC Most-Improved Team. Two of the program's five returning players found themselves honored on the five-player most-improved squad.

Lottich's team committed just 12.7 turnovers per game in 2019-2020 while ranking second in the league with 72.3 points per game, second with 7.7 steals per game and first with 15.2 assists per contest, leading a league in that category for the first time since 2011-12.

Other noteworthy feats for Lottich's squad in 2019-2020 included making 18 3-pointers in a game against Bradley to set the league-only MVC record, holding Southern Illinois to 38 points to set the program record for the fewest allowed against a Division-I opponent since the advent of the shot clock, snapping a 22-game losing streak in games at Evansville that had dated back to 1969, breaking through with its first win over Loyola since joining The Valley after previously going 0-7 against the program's Chicagoland rival and twice turning a double-figure defeat from the first half of the MVC double-round robin into a double-figure victory in the second meeting with that opponent.

The 2018-2019 season saw Lottich lead Valpo to 15 wins. The season was headlined by road victories over UNLV and George Washington during the nonconference portion of the schedule, as well as a 4-0 start to Missouri Valley Conference play.

Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-2018 and guided the team through the move to the MVC, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI.

In his first season at the helm of the Valpo men's basketball program, Lottich guided the team to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in a six-year span as he led Valpo to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT. Lottich's inaugural season as head coach was highlighted by a home win over a nationally-ranked Rhode Island squad as well as neutral-site triumphs over Alabama and BYU to capture the MGM Grand Main Event.

Lottich coached the Horizon League Player of the Year and an NABC Third Team All-American in Alec Peters, guiding the senior as he closed out one of the top careers in program history. Peters enjoyed his finest season as a senior, ranking among the Top 20 in the nation in both scoring and rebounding and breaking five of Valpo's career records.

Lottich was hired as the 22nd head coach of the Valpo men's basketball program in April 2016. After spending the previous three seasons on staff as an assistant coach, he became just the fifth Valpo head coach in a 36-year span.

Lottich arrived at Valparaiso University in summer 2013 and helped guide the team to 78 victories over his three seasons as an assistant. Valpo won two Horizon League regular season championships and one league tournament title over those three years.

The team recorded the top two victory totals in program history over Lottich's final two years as an assistant. Valpo broke the previous school record for wins in a season during the 2014-2015 campaign, winning 28 games and earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Then, the 2015-2016 season saw Valpo win a program-record 30 games and advance to the NIT championship game at Madison Square Garden.

Lottich brings nearly a decade of professional playing experience to the head coaching position at Valparaiso University. He spent eight years playing professionally in Japan for the Oita Heat Devils and the Osaka Evessa, earning All-Star recognition four times. He also played one season in Germany in the Bundesliga for the Dusseldorf Giants, played one season in New Zealand in the NBL for the Harbor Heat and was a member of the New Jersey Nets' summer league team in 2004.

Lottich played collegiately at Stanford University from 2000-2004. As a senior in 2003-2004, he helped lead the Cardinal to the Pac-10 title while earning NABC All-Star plaudits, awarded to the Top 15 seniors in college basketball. He was also a member of the Wooden Award midseason watch list and was an Honorable Mention All Pac-10 selection as a senior. Lottich was a member of the program's conference championship squad as a freshman in 2000-2001 and still ranks among Stanford's single-season and career leaders in 3-pointers made.

Off the court, Lottich came to Valpo from the National Collegiate Scouting Association, where he started in January 2013. Lottich ascended to the position of head scout during his time with the NCSA, which helps high school athletes navigate the world of college recruiting. Lottich also co-founded the TEAM Life Skills basketball camp in 2004 and spent nine years managing and developing the camp.

Lottich played his prep basketball at New Trier [Ill.] H.S., where he was named the Chicago Tribune Athlete of the Year in 2000 and holds the distinction of being the program's all-time leading scorer. Lottich graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and currently resides in Valparaiso with his wife, Kylan, and their four children: Grace, Matthan, Christian and Landon.
