Next Up in Valpo Basketball: Coming off of a season series sweep of Evansville on Thursday night, the Valpo women's basketball team looks to make it a clean sweep of the state of Indiana Saturday afternoon when it welcomes Indiana State to the ARC.

Previously: Valpo overcame an 11-point first half deficit Thursday evening at the ARC against Evansville, outscoring the Purple Aces by 20 in the second half to pull away for a $72-54$ victory. Senior Grace Hales led the Valpo charge with 20 points, including a career-high six 3 -pointers made, while sophomore Shay Frederick tied her career best with eight assists.

Head Coach Mary Evans: Mary Evans (20-33) is in her second season as head coach of the Valpo women's basketball program in 2019-20. Evans' impact on the program was immediately clear in her first year, as Valpo shattered its previous program record of 224 made 3 -pointers in a single season by knocking down 276 trifectas - a mark which ranks seventh in MVC history. Valpo ranked among the top- 25 nationally in both total 3-pointers and 3-pointers per game in Evans' first season at the helm of the Valpo program.

Series Notes: Indiana State holds an $8-4$ advantage in the all-time series over Valpo and is $4-2$ in six matchups since the Brown and Gold joined the MVC prior to the 2017-18 season. Valpo has won the last two meetings, however, as it edged out ISU 79-77 in the opening round of the 2019 MVC Tournament and then earned a $75-56$ victory in Terre Haute earlier this season. Addison Stoller led three players in double figures in the latter win with 16 points, while Valpo shot $56.9 \%$ from the field for the game and scored 44 points in the paint.

- Valpo has been selected to finish in eighth place in the MVC preseason poll, totaling 126 points.
- Valpo is in its third season as a member of the Missouri Valley Conference in 2019-20.
...looking back at last year
- Valpo posted an 8-24 record last season in head coach Mary Evans' first year at the helm and went 3-15 in MVC play.
- Last year's Valpo squad was ravaged by injuries, many times dressing just nine scholarship players.
- Valpo shattered its program record for 3-pointers in a season in 2018-19, knocking down 276 triples to race past the previous record of 224.
- Valpo also moved into seventh place in a single season in MVC history in 3-pointers made.
- Shay Frederick was named to the MVC All-Freshman Team, while Meredith Hamlet was an Honorable Mention MVC Scholar-Athlete.


## ...versus Evansville

- Evansville scored the game's first five points and led by as many as eight in the first quarter. A 7-0 spurt for Valpo tied the game at 15-15 with 1:39 to play in the opening perio, but Evansville responded with the final six points of the quarter to lead 21-15 at the end of the first.
- The Purple Aces opened the second quarter by scoring six of the first seven points, earning their largest lead at 27-16 with $7: 52$ to play in the half.
- Valpo came back immediately with consecutive 3-point plays from Addison Stoller and Shay Frederick 26 seconds apart, quickly slicing the 11-point deficit to just five points.
- Evansville enjoyed a seven-point lead with three minutes to play in the half, but Frederick scored the final five points of the half to pull Valpo to within 34-32 at intermission.
- Evansville extended its lead to five points at 40-35 two minutes into the third quarter before Valpo rattled off 10 consecutive points to take the lead for good. - Valpo saw its advantage cut down to one point with three minutes to play in the third before the Crusaders ended the quarter on a 10-2 run. Grace Hales connected on a triple in the final seconds of the period to make it a 55-46 lead with 10 minutes to play.
- A 3-pointer for the Purple Aces on their first possession of the fourth quarter cut Valpo's lead to $55-49$, but the Brown and Gold held Evansville scoreless for the next 5:54. Over that stretch, Valpo rattled off 14 consecutive points including three 3-pointers from Hales - to pull out to a 20-point lead.
- The win gave Valpo a sweep of the season series with Evansville, its third sweep since joining the MVC. The 2017-18 team swept both Evansville and

Loyola in Valpo's first season of competition in the Valley.

- Valpo did most of its damage from behind the arc on Thursday, scoring 42 of its 72 points from deep as it went 14 -of- $34(41.2 \%)$ from 3-point range. The 14 triples tie a season high for the Brown and Gold for the third time and are tied for the sixth-most in a single game in program history.
- Leading the downtown barrage was Hales. After scoring just three points in the first half, the senior exploded for 17 second-half points, connecting on five triples in the final 20 minutes alone. For the game, Hales went 6-of-9 from deep, setting a career high with the six 3-pointers made.
... at UNI
- UNI closed the opening quarter with a 20-10 lead, but Valpo turned the tables to start the second quarter, reeling off a 13-2 run over the first six minutes of the period to go in front, 23-22.
- Following the run, the Brown and Gold went scoreless for more than three minutes and UNI scored seven straight points. The Panthers eventually took a 31-25 lead into halftime.
- UNI put together runs of 8-0 and 9-0 in the third quarter, the latter pushing its lead to 53-39 with one minute to go in the quarter. Valpo scored the final four points of the quarter to move within 10 .
- The Panthers scored eight of the first 10 points of the fourth period to take their largest lead of the game at 61-45.
- Valpo scored on nine of 11 possessions over a stretch of five minutes to go on a 22-9 run and pull within 70-67 with 2:46 to play.
- Valpo went scoreless on its next two trips with a chance to potentially tie the game, however, and UNI's Karli Rucker hit a 3-pointer with 1:17 to go to push the Panthers' lead to six. Valpo would not score again until three seconds to play. - Caitlin Morrison blocked three shots on one possession in the first quarter and added three more blocks to finish with six blocks, matching her career high set earlier this year against Chicago State. The six blocks again tie her for thirdmost in a single game in program history.
- All five Valpo starters scored in double figures, led by 19 points from Carie Weinman - just one off her season best.
- Valpo connected on double-digit 3-pointers for the 10th time this season with its third-best percentage from deep this year, going 10-for-21 (47.6\%). The Crusaders were just 14-for-35 inside the arc, however.
- UNI also enjoyed strong shooting days from the 3-point line (13-of-30) and the free throw line (14-of-15). Valpo held a 22-13 advantage in points off turnovers, as it forced 17 Panther miscues, but UNI turned 15 offensive rebounds into 15 second-chance points.


## ...looking ahead

- The Brown and Gold take on central Illinois next weekend, starting with a Friday night game at Bradley.
- The weekend concludes Sunday afternoon at Illinois State.


## ... at the ARC

- Saturday will be Valpo's 11 th home game of the season, as it currently owns a 6-4 record at home this year.
- Valpo swept all four of its non-conference home games, with wins over Bowling Green, UIC, Morehead State and Chicago State.
- Following the win last time out over Evansville, Valpo is 2-4 in MVC play to date at home, having also defeated Loyola. All four conference home losses have been against top-80 RPI teams.
- Valpo went 4-11 at the ARC last year in Mary Evans' first season at the helm of the program.
- Valpo was just 1-5 last season at home in non-conference action before earning a trio of home wins during MVC play.

- Indiana State enters Saturday's game at 3-19 overall this year and 1-9 in MVC play.
- The Sycamores dropped a 65-55 decision at Loyola on Thursday evening, one game after earning their lone Valley win of the year over Evansville, 68-58.
- No ISU player is averaging in double figures, as leading scorer Jamyra McChristine posts 9.7 points/game.


## Racking Up the Wins

- The victory over Evansville is already Valpo's 12th win of the season, all of which have come against Division I teams.
- The 12 wins over D-I opponents is the program's highest total since the 200809 team picked up 16 wins.


## Sweeping Indiana

- The win over Evansville secured a season sweep of the Purple Aces for Valpo.
- After winning in Terre Haute earlier this year, the Crusaders have an opportunity to sweep the season series from Indiana State as well on Saturday.
- A win on Saturday would cap a perfect 4-0 mark for this year's squad against teams from the Hoosier state.
-It would be the first Valpo team to go undefeated against fellow Indiana schools since the 2011-12 team went 5-0, beating IU Northwest, IPFW, Ball State, and Butler twice.


## Raining Threes

- Passels of 3-pointers have become a familiar sight for Valpo women's basketball fans over the last couple years.
- Last time out against Evansville, the triples were raining down again, as Valpo went 14 -for-34 ( $41.2 \%$ ) from 3-point range, including 9 -for-14 after halftime from deep.
- The 14 triples tie a season high for the Brown and Gold for the third time and are tied for the sixth-most in a single game in program history.
-Five of the top-eight single-game 3-pointers totals have come in the last two years.
- The Crusaders are hitting at a $43.6 \%$ clip from three over the last two games after shooting just $28.2 \%$ from deep over the previous four contests.
- Valpo has connected on 185 3-pointers to date this season, already just four shy of the team's single-season top-10 chart.
- This year's team ranks fourth nationally in 3-point rate and 11th in percentage of points from 3-pointers.


## Hales Leads the Way

- Senior Grace Hales paced Valpo in the win over Evansville with 20 points, her season high in an MVC game.
- After scoring just three points in the first half, Hales exploded for 17 second-half points, connecting on five triples in the final 20 minutes alone. For the game, Hales went 6 -of- 9 from deep, setting a career high with the six 3 -pointers made. - Hales' final 3-pointer of the game not only set a new personal single-game best, it also gave her solo possession of eighth place on Valpo's career 3-pointers made chart with 152 career triples.
- Hales became the 16 th player in program history to reach the 1,000 -point milestone for her career with a basket in the final minute last Friday at Drake and currently ranks 15 th in program history with 1,035 career points.
- Hales reached the mark thanks to her consistency, as she has played in all 115 Valpo games since she stepped on campus. She has seen her scoring average go up year by year and is averaging a team-best 12.7 points/game this year.
- Hales also ranks among Valpo's all-time best in a pair of shooting categories, as she sits second in free throw pct. (.862) and tied for fourth in 3-point pct. (.373). - In the MVC record book, which will only count years played in the Valley, Hales currently ranks fifth all-time in free throw pct. ( 165 -of-188; .878).

## A Helping Hand

- Sophomore point guard Shay Frederick handed out eight assists in Thursday's win over Evansville to match her career best in the category for a third time.
- Frederick is currently tied for second among MVC players with 4.5 assists/ game and owns an assist rate of $33.3 \%$, good for 40th nationally.
- The sophomore has led Valpo in assists in 15 of its 21 games this season.
- Given her current average, Frederick is on pace to crack Valpo's single-season top-10 chart in the category.


## Getting It Done With Defense

- The effort on the defensive end, especially over the final three quarters, helped lift Valpo to its win over Evansville last time out.
- After surrendering 21 first quarter points, Valpo allowed the Purple Aces to score just 33 points over the final three quarters.
- Evansville's 54 points were the fewest the Crusaders have allowed in MVC play this year.
- Valpo surrendered a season-low nine 2-pointers to the Purple Aces.
- Valpo forced 20 Evansville turnovers which it turned into 22 points, the 11th time this season the Brown and Gold have forced at least 20 turnovers in a game.


## Gotta Hit the Twos

- So far this season, Valpo's 2-point percentage has been a strong indicator of whether it will emerge victorious or not from any given ballgame.
- In 12 wins this year, Valpo is shooting at a $56.3 \%$ clip from inside the arc.
- Meanwhile, in its nine losses, Valpo is shooting just 40.1\% from 2-point range.
- The difference has been even more pronounced in MVC play, as Valpo has hit $58.9 \%$ of its 2-point attempts in its four Valley wins versus maintaining its $40.1 \%$ clip over its six losses.
- Last time out against Evansville was an anomaly, however, as Valpo shot just 8-for$19(42.1 \%)$ from inside the arc. It was the team's worst 2-point percentage in a win this year and just the second time in its 12 wins it's been under $50 \%$ inside the arc.


## Starters, Assemble

- Valpo has trotted out the same starting five through each of its first 19 games of the season: Shay Frederick, Carie Weinman, Grace Hales, Addison Stoller and Caitlin Morrison.
- Hales and Stoller were regular starters a season ago, while Frederick joined the starting lineup midway through last year. Morrison was a regular starter each of her first two years as well before missing last season due to injury.
- Within MVC play, the quintet has played 138:52 together and has out-scored the opposition 259-238 ( $74.6-68.6$ per 40 minutes). That includes a 33-30 advantage in 17:58 of playing time together against Missouri State, and a 24-23 edge in 12:42 together at Drake.
- Valpo has never had a season where the same five players started every single game. The 2007-08, 1997-98 and 1983-84 Valpo squads had four players who started every game of the season.
- All five starters scored in double figures in the game at UNI, the first time that has happened for Valpo this season.


## Thievery

- One area in which Valpo has been consistent all year long has been coming up with steals on the defensive end.
- Valpo has recorded at least six steals in all but one game this season and is averaging an MVC-best 10.4 steals/game, good for 26th nationally.
- The team is currently on pace to finish with its highest single-season steals total in nearly two decades.
- Valpo took the thefts to another level in the win at Evansville.
- The Brown and Gold recorded 21 steals in the win over the Purple Aces, tied
for the seventh-most in a single game in MVC history.
- 21 steals also is tied for 10th-most in a single game in program history and matches the most in a single game since 1995.


## What A Rally

- The 13-point comeback in the fourth quarter against Loyola was Valpo's largest final-quarter rally since the women's game moved to four quarters.
- Ironically, the last time Valpo rallied from that kind of deficit within the game's final 10 minutes came at Loyola on Feb. 17, 2011. The Crusaders trailed that day by 14 points with $8: 45$ to play (and later 8 points with $2: 45$ to play) and went on to a 72-68 victory.
- Valpo's largest deficit in the win over the Ramblers was a 14-point deficit late in the third quarter, the largest deficit it has come at any point in a game to win since rallying from down 15 for a 67-59 win at Youngstown State on Jan. 12, 2013.
- It was the second rally of that type this year for Valpo, as in non-conference play against BGSU, it trailed by 12 in the fourth quarter and by 8 with $3: 30$ to play before coming back to force overtime and eventually win.
- Last time out against Evansville, Valpo recovered from a double-figure deficit to win for the third time this year, but this deficit came early in the second quarter, as Valpo trailed 27-16 with 7:52 to play in the first half.


## Streak Comes to a Close

- The MVC-opening loss to Southern Illinois snapped Valpo's seven-game winning streak, just the seventh-such winning streak in program history and the first since 2002.
- It was the team's first loss since Nov. 21, a span of 43 days. Along the way, Valpo posted a perfect 5-0 record in December - just the third perfect month in program history.
- This year's squad just missed matching the 1991-92 team for the most wins before suffering its fourth loss of the season - the 1991-92 team started 9-3 before dropping its fourth game.


## Best Pre-Conference Mark

- With its win Dec. 30 at Eastern Illinois, Valpo closed pre-conference play with an 8-3 record, setting a new program standard for the best winning percentage before the start of conference action.
- The 2001-02 team held the previous best winning percentage in pre-conference play, going 9-4 before opening Mid-Continent Conference action.


## Avenging Defeats

- Valpo took full advantage of the chances it had this year to avenge defeats from last season's non-conference slate.
- Six games on this year's non-conference schedule were against teams the Crusaders lost to last year, and Valpo went 5-1 in those games - defeating North Dakota State, Bowling Green, Toledo, UIC and Morehead State, while dropping a two-point decision at North Dakota.
- Valpo improved its scoring margin in those six contests by an average of 14.7 points/game.


## Non-Conference Challenges

- Valpo tested itself in the non-conference schedule with four matchups against programs which appeared in the postseason a year ago.
- Valpo opened the season against Ohio State (WNIT) and also played at Northwestern, a WNIT finalist, in the early going.
- Valpo's pre-Thanksgiving win at Toledo came against a program which also advanced to the second round of the 2019 WNIT, and most recently, the Brown and Gold defeated Morehead State, which also was a second round WNIT team last year.

#### Abstract

- The four contests against postseason teams from a season ago set the stage for


 an MVC slate which features two matchups apiece against three postseason teams last year: Missouri State (NCAA Sweet 16), Drake (NCAA) and UNI (WNIT).
## From Way Downtown

- Valpo showcased a new style of play a year ago in the first season under head coach Mary Evans, smashing program records offensively.
- The 2018-19 squad set a single-season record with 276 3-pointers made, shattering the previous mark of 224 shared by the 1991-92 and 2007-08 Valpo teams and moving into seventh place in a single season in MVC history.
- Last year's team also established a new watermark with 837 3-point attempts, roaring past the previous record of 676 held by the 1991-92 squad.
- The 2018-19 team boasts two of the top-five games in program history in 3-pointers made, including a record-tying 17 on Dec. 21, 2018 versus BGSU. - Last year's squad also holds five of the top-six games in terms of 3-pointers attempted, highlighted by a record-setting 44 tries from downtown on Feb. 8, 2019 against Drake. - Looking at advanced metrics, Valpo ranked seventh nationally in 3-point rate $(41.0 \%)$ - the percentage of all scoring attempts that are 3-point attempts - and eighth nationally in percentage of points from 3-point attempts ( $40.5 \%$ ).
- It was a balanced effort from beyond the arc as well, as no one player had more than 58 triples on the year. Seven different players attempted at least two 3-pointers/game, with three of those seven trying at least four triples per contest.


## What's Back

- Six letterwinners from last year's team return for Valpo in 2019-20.
- Included among the six returning letterwinners are a trio of full-time starters: senior Grace Hales, redshirt junior Addison Stoller and junior Ella Ellenson.
- Sophomore Shay Frederick started each of the last 13 games last year as well en route to MVC All-Freshman Team accolades, while senior Maya Meredith and sophomore Ilysse Pitts also return.
- In all, Valpo returns $64.0 \%$ of its minutes played, $64.4 \%$ of its scoring and $72.3 \%$ of its rebounding from last year's squad.


## Returning Wounded

- Valpo has three players on this year's roster who were on the team last year, but missed the entirety of last season due to injury.
- The trio includes redshirt juniors Caitlin Morrison and Marlee Profitt, and redshirt sophomore Nicole Konieczny.
- Morrison and Profitt returned to action in the season opener against Ohio State, with Morrison earning the start in her first game in over a year.
- In addition, a pair of injured Crusaders from a season ago are still on the bench, but not in a playing capacity: Hannah Schaub, who missed the last 13 games of the year, decided to forego her final season of eligibility and is serving as a graduate manager, while Taylor Richards has transitioned into a role as a student assistant after two seasons on the active roster.


## What's New

- Five newcomers round out the Valpo roster this year.
- Graduate transfer Alexis Cowan joined the program with one year of eligibility after spending two seasons at Florida Atlantic, including a medical redshirt last year. - A pair of transfers from Denver reunited on the court this season. Redshirt sophomore Carie Weinman is eligible after transferring in the summer of 2018 and sitting out last year, while junior Grace White is immediately eligible after transferring in May of 2019 and receiving a waiver from the NCAA.
- Two true freshmen round out the Valpo roster: St. Charles, Ill. native Zoe MacKay Zacker, who rejoins prep teammate Ilysse Pitts, and Coopersville, Mich. native Cara VanKempen.


## Grace Hales

- Hales led all players with 20 points last time out in the win over Evansville, going 6-of-9 from 3-point range to set a career high for 3-pointers made.
- Hales posted 15 points (3-4 3PT) and six rebounds at UNI.
- Hales reached the 1,000-point milestone for her career as she paced Valpo with 15 points at Drake.
- Hales tallied 14 points (5-7 FG; 2-4 3PT) in the win at Indiana State.
- Hales went 5-for-6 from 3-point range for a team-high 17 points against MSU, in the process cracking Valpo's top- 20 for career points scored.
- Hales set a career high with 25 points (7-13 FG; 4-8 3PT; 7-7 FT) and grabbed six rebounds as well in the win at EIU.
- Hales led Valpo with 17 points in the win at UDM, including connecting on all four of her 2-point attempts.
- Hales scored 21 points (7-10 FG; 7-7 FT), including a key 3-point play in the final minute of overtime, and grabbed seven rebounds in the win over BGSU.
- Hales nearly posted a double-double in the win at NDSU, tying a career high with nine rebounds and scoring 14 points.
- Hales became a full-time starter last season after playing off the bench her first two years, ranking third on the team with 10.9 ppg .
- Hales scored in double figures 19 times, including three efforts of 20+ points.
- Hales led Valpo with a . 377 3-point percentage in 2018-19.


## Maya Meredith

- Meredith scored a basket, grabbed a rebound and tallied a steal last time out in the win over Evansville.
- Meredith scored five points at Drake, making a pair of field goals.
- Meredith knocked down a 3-pointer in the win at Indiana State.
- Meredith tied her career high with three steals and scored two points as well in the win at UIC.
- Meredith tallied two points, one rebound and one steal in six minutes off the bench in the season opener versus Ohio State.
- Meredith battled through injuries last year to appear in 16 games off the bench.
- Meredith set Valpo's single-game record for assists on Dec. 15, 2017 against IU Northwest, dishing out 16 assists.


## Alexis Cowan

- Cowan knocked down a free throw and also tallied an assist and a steal last time out in the win over Evansville.
- Cowan made her first appearance since the season opener Jan. 31 at Drake, blocking a shot.
- Cowan made her Valpo debut and appeared in a competitive game for the first time since Feb. 25, 2018 in the season opener versus Ohio State.
- Cowan joined the Valpo program this year as a graduate transfer from FAU.
- Cowan was a medical redshirt last year at FAU after appearing in 17 games for the Owls as a junior in 2017-18, averaging 4.2 ppg.
- Cowan was an NJCAA Division I Third Team All-American as a sophomore at State Fair C.C. in 2016-17, ranking second nationally as she connected at a $50 \%$ clip from 3-point range.


## Addison Stoller

- Stoller posted 16 points, including a perfect 3 -for- 3 mark from deep, and led Valpo with seven points and three steals last time out in the win over Evansville.
- Stoller scored 13 points, including a 6-of-6 effort at the foul line, tied for game-high honors with seven rebounds and matched her career high with four assists at UNI.
- Stoller scored 11 of her 13 points in the first quarter at Drake.
- Stoller posted 11 points, a team-high eight rebounds, four assists and three steals in the come-from-behind win over Loyola.
- Stoller scored a game-high 16 points (6-8 FG; 2-2 3PT) and tied for game-high honors with five rebounds in the win at Indiana State.
- Stoller tallied 13 points and led Valpo with six rebounds versus MSU.
- Stoller led all players with 18 points in the win over Morehead State (5-8 FG; 7-8 FT) and also tied for team-high honors with four boards.
- Stoller scored 13 points and tied for game-high honors with seven rebounds - five of which were offensive - in the win at UDM.
- Stoller led all players and was one point off her career high with 23 points at North Dakota, while also grabbing nine rebounds - six offensive.

- Stoller scored a game-high 21 points in the win over NDSU, including three 3 -pointers (3-for-5) to tie a career high.
- Stoller opened the season with an 11-point, six-rebound effort against Ohio State Nov. 10, leading Valpo in both categories.
- Stoller took a giant step forward as a redshirt sophomore last year, leading Valpo in scoring ( 12.8 ppg ), rebounding ( 6.6 rpg ) and steals (67).

## Mary Evans <br> Head Coach <br> 2nd Season * Georgia Southern, 2000 20-33 overall and at Valpo

Mary Evans completed her first year as the head coach of the Valparaiso University women's basketball program in 2018-19.
In her first season at the helm, Evans' impact was immediately clear. She led Valpo to its best 3-point shooting season in program history as the team shattered the program record for made 3 s in a season with 276 , breaking the previous mark of 224 that had stood since 1991-92. Not only did the 3-point barrage set school history, but it cracked the Missouri Valley Conference record book. The team's total number of made 3 s was the seventh-most in the rich history of The Valley. Valpo finished in the top- 25 nationally by averaging 8.6 made 3-pointers per game and ranked 20th in the nation in total made 3-pointers.

Entering the 2018-19 season, Valpo had made 13 or more 3s in a game 17 times in the entire history of the program. That feat occurred six times in Evans' first season alone. Valpo had $15+3 \mathrm{~s}$ in a game only three times in program history before Evans took over and reached that mark twice in her first season. One of those games with $15+$ made 3 s came on Dec. 21 vs. Bowling Green, when the squad swished 17 triples to match a single-game program record that had stood since 2004.

Under Evans' guidance, Valpo had two 400-point scorers in the same season for the first time since 2007-08 in 2018-19 as Addison Stoller and Meredith Hamlet each surpassed that mark. Stoller joined Dani Franklin and Tabitha Gerardot as the only Valpo players in a decade's time with 400+ points and 200+ rebounds in the same season. Stoller had the most steals by a Valpo player since 2011-12 with 67 and the most made free throws by a Valpo individual since 2007 with 109.

Evans instructed a Missouri Valley Conference All-Freshman Team honoree in her first season as Shay Frederick became the first Valpo player to garner that recognition in The Valley and the first to do so in any conference since Meredith Hamlet was a member of the 2015-16 Horizon League All-Freshman Team.

Evans, who spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio University before coming to Valpo, became the eighth head coach in program history on April 13, 2018. She brought 15 years of Division I experience with her to Northwest Indiana.

During her time on Ohio's staff under head coach Bob Boldon, Evans helped the Bobcats to three seasons of 22 wins or more, three postseason appearances and three Top 75 RPI finishes. The 2014-15 team established a school record with 27 wins, a 21 -win improvement from two years earlier and an 18 -win improvement from the previous season. The Bobcats won the 2014-15 MAC regular season and tournament titles and reached the NCAA Tournament.

Evans spent the 2012-13 season at Youngstown State University, where she helped the Penguins to a 23-10 record and a first-round win at Indiana State in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). She has also coached at Georgia Southern University (2007-2012), the University of South Carolina, Aiken (2005-2007) and Seton Hall University (2001-2005).

The five-year stint at Georgia Southern provided Evans with the opportunity to work at her alma mater. She helped guide the 2009-10 team to a 1912 record, the program's highest win total since 2002-03. During her time at Division II South Carolina, Aiken, Evans was an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator, helping the program to its first 20-win season since 2001-02 in 2006-07.

At Seton Hall, Evans was on staff as the Pirates reached the WNIT in 2003-04 and 2004-05. She was the recruiting coordinator during the 2004-05 season.
At Aiken, Evans worked under Mike Brandt, who provided her with the opportunity to run the defense. When she returned to Georgia Southern under Rusty Cram, she was the offensive coach and had the chance to run practices. For six seasons prior to her appointment as Valpo head coach, she served on Boldon's staff, first at Youngstown State and then at Ohio.

Evans was a two-sport athlete at Georgia Southern, where she earned her Bachelor of Science degree in 2000. She won four letters in basketball (19951999) and three in soccer during her time as a collegiate athlete. A native of Summerville, S.C., Evans was inducted into the Summerville High School Hall of Fame in 2008. She and her husband Daryl have two children, Keegan Thomas and Zoe Mae.
