## Academic Eligibility \& Progress-Toward-Degree Requirements

## Student-athletes must meet ALL of the following requirements in order to remain eligible:

- 24 semester or 36 quarter hours of academic credit prior to the start of the student-athlete's second year of collegiate enrollment (third semester, fourth quarter);
- 18 semester or 27 quarter hours of academic credit since the beginning of the previous fall term or since the beginning of the certifying institution's preceding regular two semesters or three quarters (hours earned during the summer may not be used to fulfill this requirement)
- 6 semester or 6 quarter hours of academic credit during the preceding regular academic term (e.g., fall semester, winter quarter) in which the student-athlete has been enrolled full time at any collegiate institution (see Bylaw 14.4.3.4.3 for postseason certification).
- By the beginning of your second year of enrollment, you must possess a cumulative gradepoint average that is at least $90 \%$ of the minimum GPA required for graduation.
- You must designate a major by the beginning of your third year of enrollment (fifth semester).
- By the beginning of your third year of enrollment, you must have successfully completed at least $40 \%$ of the course requirements for your degree program and must possess a cumulative grade-point average that is at least $95 \%$ of the minimum GPA required for graduation.
- By the beginning of your fourth year of enrollment, you must have successfully completed at least $60 \%$ of the course requirements for your degree program and must possess a cumulative grade-point average that is at least $100 \%$ of the minimum GPA required for graduation.
- By the beginning of your fifth year of enrollment, you must have successfully completed at least $80 \%$ of the course requirements for your degree program and must possess a cumulative grade-point average that is at least $100 \%$ of the minimum GPA required for graduation.

If a student-athlete is a transfer student from a two-year or four-year college, he or she is not eligible during his or her first academic year in residence at Valpo unless he or she meets the provisions of one of the NCAA's transfer exceptions.
