Next Up in Valpo Basketball: The Valparaiso University men's basketball team continues Missouri Valley Conference play on Tuesday night with a matchup of the top two teams in the MVC standings, as Valpo travels to Loyola looking to extend its winning streak to six consecutive games. A victory would give Valpo a two-game lead in the conference standings.

Last Time Out: It was only fitting that graduate transfer Deion Lavender, returning to the home arena from his freshman year, was the one to cap off the Valparaiso University men's basketball team's win at Southern Illinois on Saturday, as Lavender converted on a layup with 13 seconds remaining to secure Valpo's 65-61 win over the Salukis. Derrik Smits paced Valpo in the winning effort with 16 points and eight rebounds.

Head Coach Matt Lottich: Matt Lottich (50-32) is in his sixth season overall at Valpo and third as head coach in 2018-19. Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-18 and guided the the program through the transition to the MVC, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI. In his first year as head coach, Lottich guided Valpo to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in the last six years as he led the team to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT.

Series Notes: Loyola holds a 36-15 advantage in the all-time series against the Crusaders - a series which dates way back to 1922. Prior to last season, the two squads had not met since February of 2013, as the Ramblers departed the Horizon League for the Missouri Valley Conference following that season. Loyola won both matchups last year, earning a 70-54 win at the ARC and an 80-71 win in Rogers Park. Prior to last season, Valpo had won four straight at the Gentile Arena.

...and @ValleyHoops

- Valpo was selected to finish in seventh place in the MVC preseason poll with 173 points.
- Valpo has finished worse in the final standings than its preseason projection just once in the last eight years.
- Valpo is looking to buck MVC history this year - in 110 years of Valley basketball, only 28 teams have gone from last place one year to an upper division finish the following year.

...looking back at last year

- Valpo went 15-17 in its first season as a member of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- The Brown and Gold posted a 6-12 record in MVC play in a conference which ended the season ranked eighth in the nation in conference RPI.
- The 2017-18 campaign marked the first time in the last eight years that Valpo has not earned a bid to postseason tournament play.
- Sophomore Bakari Evelyn was named to the MVC's All-Newcomer Team, while sophomore Markus Golder earned a spot on the conference's All-Bench Team.

...in the win at Southern Illinois

- A 12-2 run late in the first half gave Valpo the lead for good in the win over the Salukis.
- The two squads traded offensive punches early in the second half, and for the first 11 minutes of the half, Valpo's lead would fluctuate between seven and 11 points.
- Valpo extended its lead to its apex at 59-46 with 6:46 to play before SIU went on a 12-2 run over the next four minutes.
- With the score 63-61 Valpo with 40 seconds to play, SIU elected to play out the defensive possession, and Deion Lavender received a perfect pass from Derrick Smits and laid it in with under 13 seconds remaining to secure the win.
- Valpo won despite playing without leading scorer Ryan Fazekas due to injury.
- Valpo posted a season-low total of seven turnovers while forcing 13 SIU miscues. Valpo enjoyed an 18-4 advantage in points off turnovers.
- Derrick Smits led three Valpo players in double figures with 16 points - 14 of which came in the second half - and recorded a team-high eight rebounds as well.

...in the win over Bradley

- For the second straight game, a late first-half run was key, as Valpo outscored Bradley 18-2 over a nine-minute stretch to extend a one-point lead to 17 points.
- Valpo limited the Braves to just one field goal over the final 13 minutes of the first half, taking a 31-18 lead into halftime.
- The lead remained in double figures for the first 15 minutes of the second half, but a 12-2 run by the Braves cut the advantage to 50-45 with less than three minutes to play.
- Bakari Evelyn knocked down a 3-pointer on Valpo's next possession and then followed by feeding Javon Freeman for a dunk, and Bradley got no closer than eight feet the rest of the way.
- Freeman led the way with 17 points, his highest scoring output against a D-I opponent this year, on 7-of-10 shooting. He was the only Valpo player to score in double figures, but five others scored between six and nine points.
- Daniel Sackey matched his career high with six assists in the win, four of which came before the game's first media timeout.

...looking ahead

- A return home to the ARC awaits Valpo on Saturday as it hosts UNI for a 3 p.m. tipoff as part of Basketball Day Indiana.
- Valpo then heads down to Terre Haute for a matchup against the Sycamores of Indiana State next Wednesday, Jan. 23.

...on the road

- Saturday is the sixth of 13 true road games for Valpo in the 2018-19 regular season, as it is currently 4-2 in true road games this year and 2-0 in MVC road games.
- Valpo has already surpassed its overall and MVC-only road win totals from last year, as it went just 3-12 in true road games last season and just 1-8 on the road in MVC play.

- Prior to last year, Valpo had finished above .500 in true road games in four of the last five seasons.

@RamblerMBB

- Loyola enters Tuesday's first-place matchup at 10-7 overall and 3-1 in MVC play following a 67-64 victory over Illinois State on Saturday.
- Loyola has won nine consecutive MVC home games dating back to last season.
- The Ramblers boast a trio of players averaging better than 13 points per game - Marques Townes (14.3 ppg), Clayton Custer (13.9 ppg) and Cameron Krutwig (13.4 ppg, 7.4 rpg).

Looking For 5-0

- Valpo is looking to get to 5-0 in MVC play on Tuesday - a mark it has reached in conference play just twice this century.
- Despite winning five regular season titles in its last six seasons in the Horizon League, the 2015-16 season was the only time in that stretch Valpo won even its first two league games, starting 6-0 en route to a 16-2 league record.
- The 2002-03 Valpo squad also started 6-0 on its way to a 12-2 record and a Mid-Continent Conference regular season championship, the only other time this century Valpo has won even three straight games to open conference play.
- Last season, it took Valpo until its 16th MVC game to earn its fifth conference win.

A Winning Streak

- Valpo has reeled off five consecutive victories heading into Tuesday's contest, its longest winning streak of the season.
- Valpo has now recorded at least one winning streak of five or more games in eight of the last nine seasons.
- The last four in this five-game winning streak have all been MVC games - Valpo's longest conference winning streak since winning eight straight Horizon League games in 2016-17.

Getting Gritty on Defense

- It's been Valpo's defensive effort which has helped it get out to its 3-0 start in Missouri Valley Conference action.
- Valpo surrendered 69.8 points per game on 44.4% shooting from the floor in non-conference action.
- Meanwhile, in its first three MVC games, Valpo has given up just 58.2 points per game on 37.5% shooting.
- Digging into the analytics, Valpo has held both Illinois State (85 points per 100 possessions) and Bradley (76.4) to their respective worst offensive performances of the season.

Defending Without Fouling

- Perhaps the biggest change defensively for Valpo this season has been its ability to play defense without committing fouls and sending opponents to the foul line.
- Last year's team ranked 337th nationally (14th from last) in defensive free throw rate, while this year's squad ranks 49th nationally in the same category.
- In terms of raw numbers, last year's Valpo opponents averaged 23.2 FT/game across all games and 22.8 FT/game in conference play, while this year, opponents are averaging 15.9 FT/game overall and 13 FT/game in conference play.

The Balanced Attack

- On the offensive end, Valpo has proven to have multiple threats who can step up through the season's first 17 games.
- Entering Tuesday's game, five different players are averaging in double figures in the scoring column, led by Ryan Fazekas' 12.7 points/game.
- Six different players have led Valpo in scoring in a game this season.
- Valpo last featured five different players averaging in double figures in 2007-08, the program's first season in the Horizon League.

First-Half Runs

- Big runs in the opening period have proven key to helping Valpo claim each of its last three victories.

Freeman Delivering as a Freshman

- Freshman wing Javon Freeman has been a consistent producer for Valpo as a rookie this season.
- Freeman, who is currently averaging 11.1 points/game, has scored in double figures nine times and has scored seven or more points in all but one of Valpo's first 17 games.
- Only eight Valpo freshmen in the last 30 years have averaged in double figures - the seven who completed a full four years at Valpo all currently reside among the top-20 in program history in career scoring.
- Meanwhile, just past the midway point of the season, Freeman has tallied 31 steals - well within range to challenge Lubos Barton's program single-season record of 63 steals.
- Freeman also currently leads the MVC with 1.8 steals/game - since Valpo helped found the Mid-Continent Conference in 1982-83, only seven Valpo players have led their conference in one of the main five statistical categories. None of those seven players were freshmen, and none led their league in steals.
- Meanwhile, only three MVC freshmen in the last 40 seasons have led The Valley in one of the main stat categories as well.
- Freeman is the only Valpo freshman in the last three decades to open his career with five straight games of 10+ points - only two others had started with three straight such games.

Challenging Start to Conference Play

- Valpo's schedule in the first quarter-plus of MVC play shaped up to be a tough slate entering the season.
- Valpo will face each of the conference's top four teams in the preseason poll within the first five games of MVC action.
- Valpo has already defeated Illinois State (#2) and Bradley (#4) at the ARC, and Southern Illinois (#3) on the road.

Buzzer Beaters

- Markus Golder's buzzer-beater against Illinois State added to the lore of last-second shots in Valpo history.
- It was Valpo's first game-winner with the clock at zero since Ryan Broekhoff connected on a 3-pointer to give Valpo the 70-69 win in the 2013 Horizon League semifinal at the ARC over Green Bay.
- It was Valpo's first game-winner from beyond halfcourt since Greg Tonagel drilled a heave from the opposite 3-point line for a 71-68 win over Belmont at the ARC on Jan. 11, 1999.
- Of course, the most famous buzzer-beater in program history came courtesy of Bryce Drew in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament versus Ole Miss.
- Golder's shot came in at the top spot on SportsCenter's Top 10 on Wednesday night's countdown. He became the third different Valpo athlete over three different sports to earn a SportsCenter Top 10 spot since Valpo joined The Valley.

Earning Honors

- Junior Ryan Fazekas became the first Valpo player since the program joined the MVC to earn a weekly award from the conference office, as he was named the MVC Newcomer of the Week on Jan. 2.

- Fazekas earned the honor after leading all players in scoring with 19 points - including five 3-pointers - in Valpo's win over Purdue Northwest.
- Fazekas repeated as MVC Newcomer of the Week Jan. 7 after pouring in 10 3-pointers over Valpo's first two MVC wins over Illinois State and Missouri State.

Shooting - The Highs and the Lows

- The difference in Valpo's 3-point shooting in wins versus losses this year is striking - in its 10 victories, Valpo is hitting 40% from the 3-point line, while in its six losses, Valpo is shooting just 23.8% from deep.
- Valpo has hit more than four 3-pointers just twice in its six losses and has shot better than 29% from deep in a loss just once.
- Meanwhile, Valpo has enjoyed a number of strong shooting performances in wins, including a 15-of-27 effort from deep in its win at George Washington and a 12-of-24 performance in the win at Missouri State.
- The 15 triples were the program's highest total against a Division I opponent since going 15-of-26 from deep in a Feb. 5, 2013 win over UIC.

Redshirts Aplenty

- Valpo boasts five players on this year's team who have redshirted.
- Derrick Smits redshirted due to injury in his first year at Valpo, while Bakari Evelyn and Ryan Fazekas each sat out as a redshirt after transferring from Nebraska and Providence, respectively.
- Deion Lavender and Markus Golder both redshirted before arriving at Valpo as well.
- Only 12 schools nationally have more redshirts on their active roster this year than Valpo's five.
- Valpo also has a pair of Division I transfers in Eron Gordon and Nick Robinson sitting out this season as redshirts as well.

What's Back

- Seven letterwinners return from last year's team, including three starters.
- The returnees are highlighted by MVC All-Newcomer Team honoree Bakari Evelyn and MVC All-Bench Team selection Markus Golder.
- In all, Valpo returns 63.3% of its scoring, 66.6% of its rebounding and 64.1% of its minutes played from last season in 2018-19.

What's New

- Five players have made their Valpo debuts this season.
- Valpo's lone senior is a graduate transfer, as Deion Lavender joined the program for his final season of collegiate eligibility after spending the last two years at UAB.
- Junior Ryan Fazekas is eligible this year after sitting out last season as a transfer from Providence.
- Valpo welcomed a trio of true freshmen to the fold this year: Chicago native Javon Freeman, Winnipeg product Daniel Sackey and Bowman Academy graduate Langston Stalling.

Developing Pros

- Valpo has produced a myriad of professional basketball players over the last 25 years, most notably a pair of NBA players in the last two years.
- Ryan Broekhoff (class of 2013) signed a contract with the Dallas Mavericks in the summer of 2018 after spending five seasons playing internationally in Russia and Turkey.
- Broekhoff tallied a season-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the floor (3-5 3PT) in 22 minutes of action Jan. 5 in a 106-100 loss against Philadelphia.
- Alec Peters (class of 2017) was the 54th pick in the 2017 NBA Draft by the Phoenix Suns.
- Peters appeared in 20 games for the Suns in 2017-18, highlighted by a 36-point performance in the season finale against Dallas - a new single-game high by a Valpo alum in the NBA.
- Peters is currently playing for CSKA Moscow in Russia.
- 2018 Valpo graduates Tevonn Walker and Max Joseph are currently playing for Hamburg Towers in Germany and Nassjo Basket in Sweden, respectively.
- Valpo has now produced 50 pro basketball players over the last 25 years.

The International Flavor

- This year's squad continues the international pipeline that Valpo has cultivated over the past two-plus decades.
- The Crusaders boast a pair of international players on this year's roster.
- Represented are Canada (Sackey) and Spain (Sorolla).
- Over the past 22 years, the Crusaders have welcomed 34 international players from 19 different countries.

Deion Lavender

- Lavender pulled down 10 rebounds to go with seven points and five assists in the win at Missouri State.
- Lavender reached 10 assists for the second time this year in the win at George Washington.
- Lavender tallied 12 points and game highs of seven rebounds and seven assists in the win over UC Riverside.
- Lavender became the first Valpo player in over a decade to reach double figures in assists and the first in 21 years to do so without committing a turnover, posting 10 assists, six rebounds and five points at West Virginia.
- Lavender was named Honorable Mention All-Tournament at Myrtle Beach.
- Lavender led all players in the win over Monmouth with 18 points and eight rebounds.
- Lavender is a graduate transfer who joins the Valpo program after spending the last two years at UAB.
- Lavender led UAB and ranked eighth in Conference USA with 3.4 assists/game in 2016-17, while also ranking ninth in the conference that season in assist/turnover ratio.
- Lavender played as a freshman in the MVC for Southern Illinois (2014-15), averaging 6.6 points/game and raising his scoring average to 8.6 points/game within MVC play.

Bakari Evelyn

- Evelyn hit a 3-pointer and dished out an assist on back-to-back possessions inside the final three minutes in the win over Bradley, helping extend a five-point lead to 10 points.
- Evelyn knocked down a trio of 3-pointers in a 13-point effort in the win at Missouri State.
- Evelyn connected on a career-best 10 field goals, including a career-high six 3-pointers, in finishing with 27 points in the win at George Washington.
- Evelyn finished with 13 points, a team-high five assists and matched his career best with four steals in the win at UNLV.
- Evelyn notched a team-best 16 points - 15 of which came after halftime - and sent Valpo to overtime with a jumper with 11 seconds to play in the win over SIUE.
- Evelyn was an MVC All-Newcomer Team selection last year.
- Evelyn was the lone Valpo player to start all 32 games and averaged 12.6 points/game to rank second on the team.
- Evelyn led Valpo with 93 assists and averaged a team-best 14.1 points/game in MVC-only play, connecting at a 42.3% clip from 3-point range against MVC opponents.

Markus Golder

- Golder hit a 50-foot buzzer-beater for the win over Illinois State, a play which was number one on SportsCenter's Top 10.
- Golder also had three rebounds, a second-chance basket, a pair of free throws and drew two charges in the final 90 seconds of the win.
- Golder matched his career best with 18 points in the win over PNW, including five dunks.
- Golder matched his season best with 16 points (6-8 FG) vs. UC Riverside.
- Golder paced Valpo with 15 points and eight rebounds versus Western Kentucky.
- Golder scored 16 points in just 18 minutes off the bench in the season-opening win over Concordia.
- Golder was named to the MVC All-Bench Team last season in his first year at Valpo.
- Golder averaged 22.6 minutes/game, mainly off the bench, and finished third on the team with 9.5 points/game.
- Golder paced Valpo with 138 total rebounds on the year, and also led Valpo in both 3-point percentage (42.9%) and free throw percentage (83.1%).

Ryan Fazekas

- Fazekas exited the game against Bradley with an ankle injury seven minutes in, and missed last game at Southern Illinois.
- Fazekas matched his season high with six 3-pointers, leading the team with 18 points in the win at Missouri State.
- Fazekas paced Valpo with 19 points against Ball State, and again in the win over PNW.
- Fazekas knocked down a career-high six 3-pointers for a career-best 22 points, 16 of which came in the second half, in the win at George Washington.
- Fazekas was nearly perfect from the floor (5-6 FG; 3-4 3PT) for 15 points at West Virginia.
- Fazekas was named Honorable Mention All-Tournament at Myrtle Beach.
- Fazekas has two years of eligibility remaining after sitting out last season following a transfer from Providence.
- Fazekas appeared in 58 games in his two years with the Friars, making 19 starts.
- Fazekas helped lead Marquette Catholic H.S. to the Indiana 1A state championship in 2014 and a repeat appearance in the state title game in 2015.

Jaume Sorolla

- Sorolla knocked down his first career 3-pointer and finished with six points and three rebounds in the win over Bradley.
- Sorolla scored nine points (4-5 FG) and grabbed six rebounds in the win at Missouri State.
- Sorolla narrowly missed a double-double in the win over PNW, finishing with 11 points and nine rebounds.

3rd Season * Stanford, 2004

50-32 Overall and at Valpo

Matt Lottich is in his sixth season overall at Valparaiso University and third season as head coach of the men's basketball program for the 2018-2019 season.

Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-2018 and guided the Crusaders through the move to the Missouri Valley Conference, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI.

In his first season at the helm of the Crusader men's basketball program, Lottich guided Valpo to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in the last six years as he led the Crusaders to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT. Lottich's inaugural season as head coach was highlighted by a home win over a nationally-ranked Rhode Island squad, as well as neutral-site wins over Alabama and BYU to capture the MGM Grand Main Event.

Lottich coached the Horizon League Player of the Year and an NABC Third Team All-American in Alec Peters, guiding the senior as he closed out one of the top careers in program history. Peters enjoyed his finest season as a senior, ranking among the top-20 in the nation in both scoring and rebounding and breaking five of Valpo's career records.

Lottich was hired as the 22nd head coach in the history of the Valpo men's basketball program in April of 2016. Lottich, who had served the previous three seasons as an assistant coach on the Crusaders' staff, became just the program's fifth head coach in the last 36 years.

Lottich arrived at Valparaiso University in summer 2013 and helped guide the Crusaders to 78 victories over his three seasons as an assistant. Valpo won two Horizon League regular season championships and one league tournament title over those three years.

The Crusaders recorded the top two victory totals in program history over Lottich's final two years as an assistant. Valpo broke the previous school record for wins in a season during the 2014-2015 campaign, winning 28 games and earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Then, the 2015-2016 season saw Valpo win a program-record 30 games and advance to the NIT championship game at Madison Square Garden.

Lottich brings nearly a decade of professional playing experience to the head coaching position at Valparaiso University. Lottich spent eight years playing professionally in Japan for the Oita Heat Devils and the Osaka Evessa, earning All-Star recognition four times. He also played one season in Germany in the Bundesliga for the Dusseldorf Giants, played one season in New Zealand in the NBL for the Harbor Heat and was a member of the New Jersey Nets' summer league team in 2004.

Lottich played collegiately at Stanford University from 2000 through 2004. As a senior in 2003-2004, he helped lead the Cardinal to the Pac-10 title while earning NABC All-Star plaudits, awarded to the top-15 seniors in college basketball. He was also a member of the Wooden Award midseason watch list and was an Honorable Mention All Pac-10 selection as a senior. Lottich was also a member of the program's conference championship squad as a freshman in 2000-2001 and still ranks among Stanford's single-season and career leaders in 3-pointers made.

Off the court, Lottich came to Valpo from the National Collegiate Scouting Association, where he started in January 2013. Lottich ascended to the position of head scout during his time with the NCSA, which helps high school athletes navigate the world of college recruiting. Lottich also co-founded the TEAM Life Skills basketball camp in 2004 and spent nine years managing and developing the camp.

Lottich played his prep basketball at New Trier [Ill.] H.S., where he was named the Chicago Tribune Athlete of the Year in 2000 and holds the distinction of being the program's all-time leading scorer. Lottich graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and currently resides in Valparaiso with his wife, Kylan, and their four children: Grace, Matthan, Christian and Landon.
