Next Up in Valpo Basketball: The Valparaiso University men's basketball team opens the second half of Missouri Valley Conference play Saturday afternoon with the first of back-to-back road games, making the trip downstate to face the Purple Aces of Evansville. Valpo, which finds itself smack dab in the middle of the tightly packed MVC standings, looks to snap a decades-long losing streak in Evansville.

Last Time Out: A back-and-forth battle between Valpo and Missouri State before an intrepid crowd at the ARC Tuesday night needed five extra minutes to determine the outcome, but in the end, the Bears' Keandre Cook hit a pair of free throws with 2.3 seconds to play in overtime as a shorthanded Valpo squad fell by a 55-54 final. Javon Freeman led Valpo with 12 points and a career-high 15 rebounds.

Head Coach Matt Lottich: Matt Lottich (51-36) is in his sixth season overall at Valpo and third as head coach in 2018-19. Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-18 and guided the the program through the transition to the MVC, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI. In his first year as head coach, Lottich guided Valpo to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in the last six years as he led the team to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT.

Series Notes: Two programs with a long history, Valpo and Evansville will meet on the hardwood for the 86th time on Saturday, as Evansville is Valpo's third most common opponent in program history. Evansville holds a 68-17 advantage in the series, including two wins in the teams' first season as MVC foes – 75-65 at the ARC and 63-59 at Evansville. Valpo is looking for its first victory at Evansville since Gene Bartow led the 1968-69 Valpo squad to a 101-95 road victory over the Purple Aces.

...and @ValleyHoops

- Valpo was selected to finish in seventh place in the MVC preseason poll with 173 points.
- Valpo has finished worse in the final standings than its preseason projection just once in the last eight years.
- Valpo is looking to buck MVC history this year - in 110 years of Valley basketball, only 28 teams have gone from last place one year to an upper division finish the following year.

...looking back at last year

- Valpo went 15-17 in its first season as a member of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- The Brown and Gold posted a 6-12 record in MVC play in a conference which ended the season ranked eighth in the nation in conference RPI.
- The 2017-18 campaign marked the first time in the last eight years that Valpo has not earned a bid to postseason tournament play.
- Sophomore Bakari Evelyn was named to the MVC's All-Newcomer Team, while sophomore Markus Golder earned a spot on the conference's All-Bench Team.

...in the loss to Missouri State

- The game was a one-possession game either way for the final 15 minutes of regulation and the entirety of overtime.
- The extra session was Valpo's second of the year, as it is now 1-1 in overtime games this season (SIUE).
- Tuesday was Valpo's lowest combined scoring overtime game and the lowest points Valpo has allowed in an overtime game since a 56-52 win at UMKC on Jan. 25, 2007.
- That game also was the last time Valpo had entered overtime with a lower score than Tuesday's 49-49 end of regulation, as the game against the Kangaroos was knotted 48-48.
- Valpo's 54 points are its fewest in an overtime game since a 58-54 double-overtime loss at UNI on Feb. 7, 1981.
- Valpo limited Missouri State to just 10-of-38 shooting inside the arc, but the Bears were 7-of-17 (41.2%) from 3-point range and 14-of-16 (87.5%) from the foul line.
- Meanwhile, Valpo shot just 38.8% from the field, was just 4-of-12 from downtown and 12-of-20 from the foul line.
- Valpo was led Tuesday by the play of Freeman, who finished with 12 points and a team season-best 15 rebounds for his first career double-double.

...in the loss to Drake

- Valpo's two leading scorers - juniors Ryan Fazekas and Derrick Smits - were sidelined due to injury, and its third leading scorer - junior Markus Golder - left the game with an injury less than five minutes into the game.
- The last 12 minutes of the first half were played within a six-point span, as it was a one-possession game the entire time. Valpo led 23-21 with 4:51 to play in the half, but Drake ended the half on an 8-3 spurt to lead 29-26 at intermission.
- Valpo evened the game at 35-35 3:28 into the second half on a steal and fast-break basket from Daniel Sackey, but that tie would last just 23 seconds and was the only time the game was tied in the second half.
- Valpo cut Drake's lead to four points on three separate occasions down the stretch, but all three times, the Bulldogs responded with points on their next possession.
- Leading the way in the scoring column Saturday were Sackey and Jaume Sorolla, who shared team-high honors with 13 points.
- Sackey matched his career high with the 13 points and also came up with a career-best four steals.
- Meanwhile, Sorolla went 6-of-7 from the field. The six field goals made matched his career best, while he set a new career high on the defensive end with five blocked shots.

...looking ahead

- Valpo remains on the road as it travels to Illinois State Tuesday night for its second matchup of the season with the Redbirds.
- Valpo then returns to the ARC Sunday, Feb. 10 to host Loyola on ESPNU.

...on the road

- Saturday is the ninth of 13 true road games for Valpo in the 2018-19 regular season, as it is currently 4-4 in true road games this year and 2-2 in MVC road games.
- Valpo has already surpassed its overall and MVC-only road win totals from last year, as it went just 3-12 in true road games last season and just 1-8 on the road in MVC play.
- Prior to last year, Valpo had finished above .500 in true road games in four of the last five seasons.

- Evansville, under first-year head coach Walter McCarty, currently sits at 9-13 overall and 3-6 in MVC play.
- The Purple Aces started out conference play 3-2, but have dropped their last four MVC games, most recently falling at home to Bradley.
- Evansville, which plays at the fastest tempo of any Valley team, has four players averaging in double figures - led by K.J. Riley, who scores 14.3 points per game.

The Conference Race

- Halfway through the MVC schedule, the standings are as jumbled as ever, and Valpo finds itself right in the heart of the jumble.
- Valpo hit the halfway mark at 5-4, in a three-way tie for third place. The Crusaders are just one game out of second and two games out of first.
- But on the flip side, Valpo is also just two games out of last, as there is currently a three-way tie for eighth place at 3-6.

Playing Shorthanded

- Valpo entered last Saturday's game against Drake without the services of its two leading scorers, Ryan Fazekas and Derrick Smits.
- Valpo then lost third-leading scorer Markus Golder to injury less than five minutes into the game, leaving it with just seven available scholarship players for the duration of the game.
- Going back 30 years, there hasn't been a single instance of Valpo's two leading scorers at the end of the year both missing the same game within that season.
- Valpo played last time out against Missouri State without both Fazekas and Golder.
- With Golder missing Valpo's last game, the Crusaders have just three players - Deion Lavender, Javon Freeman and Daniel Sackey - who have played in all 22 games this season.

Minutes Up For Grabs

- With the rotation shortened the last couple games due to injuries, minutes played have piled up for a number of players.
- Freshman Javon Freeman played the full 40 minutes against Drake, the first time a Valpo player has gone the distance in a regulation game since Will Bogan and Erik Buggs played the full 40 in the NIT at Miami in March of 2012.
- Freeman then went a team-high 42 minutes in the overtime loss to Missouri State.
- Freshman Daniel Sackey had cracked 30 minutes just once in the first 20 games of his career, but has played 37 and 40 minutes in the last two games.
- Last time out against Missouri State, senior Deion Lavender and junior Bakari Evelyn played 40 and 39 minutes as well, respectively.

Freeman Grabs All the Boards

- Freshman Javon Freeman entered last Tuesday's game against Missouri State with a season best of seven rebounds, but obliterated that mark against the Bears.
- Freeman finished the game with a Valpo season-high 15 rebounds, grabbing nine rebounds in the second half alone.
- Freeman's 15 rebounds were the most by a Valpo player since Alec Peters pulled down 16 rebounds against Green Bay on Jan. 16, 2017.
- Outside of Peters, the last Valpo player to secure 15 or more boards was Ryan Broekhoff, who recorded 16 rebounds against Butler on Mar. 3, 2012.
- Freeman is the shortest Valpo player in the last 30 years to have a 15-rebound game.

Shooting - The Highs and the Lows

- The difference in Valpo's 3-point shooting in wins versus losses this year is striking - in its 12 victories, Valpo is hitting 40.3% from the 3-point line, while in its 10 losses, Valpo is shooting just 24.2% from deep.
- Valpo has hit better than 33% from 3-point range in a loss just once this season and is averaging just 4.5 3-pointers/game in defeats.
- Valpo hit just two 3-pointers in its losses against Indiana State and Drake last week, the first time the Crusaders have been limited to that few triples in consecutive games since hitting two 3-pointers apiece against Loyola and UIC in February of 2011.
- Meanwhile, Valpo has enjoyed a number of strong shooting performances in wins, including a 15-of-27 effort from deep in its win at George Washington and a 12-of-24 performance in the win at Missouri State.
- The 15 triples were the program's highest total against a Division I opponent since going 15-of-26 from deep in a Feb. 5, 2013 win over UIC.

Centers of Attention

- The combined play of Valpo centers Derrik Smits and Jaume Sorolla has proven crucial to winning since joining The Valley.
- Since joining the MVC, in Valpo's 11 conference wins, Smits and Sorolla have combined to average 17.7 points and 8.9 rebounds per game.
- Meanwhile, in 16 conference losses, the post duo has averaged just 10.6 points and 5.4 rebounds per game.
- The top six scoring performances from the duo have all come in MVC wins, as have the top six rebounding games from the pair.

Buzzer Beaters

- Markus Golder's buzzer-beater against Illinois State added to the lore of last-second shots in Valpo history.
- It was Valpo's first game-winner with the clock at zero since Ryan Broekhoff connected on a 3-pointer to give Valpo the 70-69 win in the 2013 Horizon League semifinal at the ARC over Green Bay.
- It was Valpo's first game-winner from beyond halfcourt since Greg Tonagel drilled a heave from the opposite 3-point line for a 71-68 win over Belmont at the ARC on Jan. 11, 1999.
- Of course, the most famous buzzer-beater in program history came courtesy of Bryce Drew in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament versus Ole Miss.
- Golder's shot came in at the top spot on SportsCenter's Top 10 on Wednesday night's countdown. He became the third different Valpo athlete over three different sports to earn a SportsCenter Top 10 spot since Valpo joined The Valley.

Earning Honors

- Junior Ryan Fazekas became the first Valpo player since the program joined the MVC to earn a weekly award from the conference office, as he was named the MVC Newcomer of the Week on Jan. 2.
- Fazekas earned the honor after leading all players in scoring with 19 points - including five 3-pointers - in Valpo's win over Purdue Northwest.
- Fazekas repeated as MVC Newcomer of the Week Jan. 7 after pouring in 10 3-pointers over Valpo's first two MVC wins over Illinois State and Missouri State.

Redshirts Aplenty

- Valpo boasts five players on this year's team who have redshirted.
- Derrick Smits redshirted due to injury in his first year at Valpo, while Bakari Evelyn and Ryan Fazekas each sat out as a redshirt after transferring from Nebraska and Providence, respectively.
- Deion Lavender and Markus Golder both redshirted before arriving at Valpo as well.
- Only 12 schools nationally have more redshirts on their active roster this year than Valpo's five.
- Valpo also has a pair of Division I transfers in Eron Gordon and Nick Robinson sitting out this season as redshirts as well.

What's Back

- Seven letterwinners return from last year's team, including three starters.
- The returnees are highlighted by MVC All-Newcomer Team honoree Bakari Evelyn and MVC All-Bench Team selection Markus Golder.
- In all, Valpo returns 63.3% of its scoring, 66.6% of its rebounding and 64.1% of its minutes played from last season in 2018-19.

What's New

- Five players have made their Valpo debuts this season.
- Valpo's lone senior is a graduate transfer, as Deion Lavender joined the program for his final season of collegiate eligibility after spending the last two years at UAB.
- Junior Ryan Fazekas is eligible this year after sitting out last season as a transfer from Providence.
- Valpo welcomed a trio of true freshmen to the fold this year: Chicago native Javon Freeman, Winnipeg product Daniel Sackey and Bowman Academy graduate Langston Stalling.

Developing Pros

- Valpo has produced a myriad of professional basketball players over the last 25 years, most notably a pair of NBA players in the last two years.
- Ryan Broekhoff (class of 2013) signed a contract with the Dallas Mavericks in the summer of 2018 after spending five seasons playing internationally in Russia and Turkey.
- Broekhoff tallied a season-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the floor (3-5 3PT) in 22 minutes of action Jan. 5 in a 106-100 loss against Philadelphia.
- Alec Peters (class of 2017) was the 54th pick in the 2017 NBA Draft by the Phoenix Suns.
- Peters appeared in 20 games for the Suns in 2017-18, highlighted by a 36-point performance in the season finale against Dallas - a new single-game high by a Valpo alum in the NBA.
- Peters is currently playing for CSKA Moscow in Russia.
- 2018 Valpo graduates Tevonn Walker and Max Joseph are currently playing for Hamburg Towers in Germany and Nassjo Basket in Sweden, respectively.
- Valpo has now produced 50 pro basketball players over the last 25 years.

The International Flavor

- This year's squad continues the international pipeline that Valpo has cultivated over the past two-plus decades.
- The Crusaders boast a pair of international players on this year's roster.
- Represented are Canada (Sackey) and Spain (Sorolla).
- Over the past 22 years, the Crusaders have welcomed 34 international players from 19 different countries.

Deion Lavender

- Lavender scored 10 points and led all players with seven rebounds at Indiana State.
- Lavender pulled down 10 rebounds to go with seven points and five assists in the win at Missouri State.
- Lavender reached 10 assists for the second time this year in the win at George Washington.
- Lavender tallied 12 points and game highs of seven rebounds and seven assists in the win over UC Riverside.

- Lavender became the first Valpo player in over a decade to reach double figures in assists and the first in 21 years to do so without committing a turnover, posting 10 assists, six rebounds and five points at West Virginia.
- Lavender was named Honorable Mention All-Tournament at Myrtle Beach.
- Lavender led all players in the win over Monmouth with 18 points and eight rebounds.
- Lavender is a graduate transfer who joins the Valpo program after spending the last two years at UAB.
- Lavender led UAB and ranked eighth in Conference USA with 3.4 assists/game in 2016-17, while also ranking ninth in the conference that season in assist/turnover ratio.
- Lavender played as a freshman in the MVC for Southern Illinois (2014-15), averaging 6.6 points/game and raising his scoring average to 8.6 points/game within MVC play.

Bakari Evelyn

- Evelyn connected on three 3-pointers and finished with 11 points last time out versus Missouri State.
- Evelyn scored 14 points off the bench, including three 3-pointers, in the win over UNI.
- Evelyn hit a 3-pointer and dished out an assist on back-to-back possessions inside the final three minutes in the win over Bradley, helping extend a five-point lead to 10 points.
- Evelyn knocked down a trio of 3-pointers in a 13-point effort in the win at Missouri State.
- Evelyn connected on a career-best 10 field goals, including a career-high six 3-pointers, in finishing with 27 points in the win at George Washington.
- Evelyn finished with 13 points, a team-high five assists and matched his career best with four steals in the win at UNLV.
- Evelyn notched a team-best 16 points - 15 of which came after halftime - and sent Valpo to overtime with a jumper with 11 seconds to play in the win over SIUE.
- Evelyn was an MVC All-Newcomer Team selection last year.
- Evelyn was the lone Valpo player to start all 32 games and averaged 12.6 points/game to rank second on the team.
- Evelyn led Valpo with 93 assists and averaged a team-best 14.1 points/game in MVC-only play, connecting at a 42.3% clip from 3-point range against MVC opponents.

Markus Golder

- Golder exited Valpo's game against Drake last Saturday due to injury less than five minutes in, and missed Valpo's game versus Missouri State last time out.
- Golder scored all 13 of his points in the first half in the win over UNI and added six rebounds as well.
- Golder led Valpo at Loyola with 16 points, going 6-of-8 from the field.
- Golder hit a 50-foot buzzer-beater for the win over Illinois State, a play which was number one on SportsCenter's Top 10.
- Golder also had three rebounds, a second-chance basket, a pair of free throws and drew two charges in the final 90 seconds of the win.
- Golder matched his career best with 18 points in the win over PNW, including five dunks.
- Golder matched his season best with 16 points (6-8 FG) vs. UC Riverside.
- Golder paced Valpo with 15 points and eight rebounds versus Western Kentucky.
- Golder scored 16 points in just 18 minutes off the bench in the season-opening win over Concordia.
- Golder was named to the MVC All-Bench Team last season in his first year at Valpo.
- Golder averaged 22.6 minutes/game, mainly off the bench, and finished third on the team with 9.5 points/game.
- Golder paced Valpo with 138 total rebounds on the year, and also led Valpo in both 3-point percentage (42.9%) and free throw percentage (83.1%).

Ryan Fazekas

- Fazekas exited the game against Bradley with an ankle injury seven minutes in, and has missed the last six games.
- Fazekas matched his season high with six 3-pointers, leading the team with 18 points in the win at Missouri State.
- Fazekas paced Valpo with 19 points against Ball State, and again in the win over PNW.

- Fazekas knocked down a career-high six 3-pointers for a career-best 22 points, 16 of which came in the second half, in the win at George Washington.
- Fazekas was nearly perfect from the floor (5-6 FG; 3-4 3PT) for 15 points at West Virginia.
- Fazekas was named Honorable Mention All-Tournament at Myrtle Beach.
- Fazekas has two years of eligibility remaining after sitting out last season following a transfer from Providence.
- Fazekas appeared in 58 games in his two years with the Friars, making 19 starts.
- Fazekas helped lead Marquette Catholic H.S. to the Indiana 1A state championship in 2014 and a repeat appearance in the state title game in 2015.

Jaume Sorolla

- Sorolla finished with three points, six rebounds and three blocked shots last time out against Missouri State.
- Sorolla scored a season-high 13 points on 6-of-7 shooting and set a career best with five blocked shots against Drake.
- Sorolla knocked down his first career 3-pointer and finished with six points and three rebounds in the win over Bradley.
- Sorolla scored nine points (4-5 FG) and grabbed six rebounds in the win at Missouri State.

51-36 Overall and at Valpo

Matt Lottich is in his sixth season overall at Valparaiso University and third season as head coach of the men's basketball program for the 2018-2019 season.

Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-2018 and guided the Crusaders through the move to the Missouri Valley Conference, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI.

In his first season at the helm of the Crusader men's basketball program, Lottich guided Valpo to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in the last six years as he led the Crusaders to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT. Lottich's inaugural season as head coach was highlighted by a home win over a nationally-ranked Rhode Island squad, as well as neutral-site wins over Alabama and BYU to capture the MGM Grand Main Event.

Lottich coached the Horizon League Player of the Year and an NABC Third Team All-American in Alec Peters, guiding the senior as he closed out one of the top careers in program history. Peters enjoyed his finest season as a senior, ranking among the top-20 in the nation in both scoring and rebounding and breaking five of Valpo's career records.

Lottich was hired as the 22nd head coach in the history of the Valpo men's basketball program in April of 2016. Lottich, who had served the previous three seasons as an assistant coach on the Crusaders' staff, became just the program's fifth head coach in the last 36 years.

Lottich arrived at Valparaiso University in summer 2013 and helped guide the Crusaders to 78 victories over his three seasons as an assistant. Valpo won two Horizon League regular season championships and one league tournament title over those three years.

The Crusaders recorded the top two victory totals in program history over Lottich's final two years as an assistant. Valpo broke the previous school record for wins in a season during the 2014-2015 campaign, winning 28 games and earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Then, the 2015-2016 season saw Valpo win a program-record 30 games and advance to the NIT championship game at Madison Square Garden.

Lottich brings nearly a decade of professional playing experience to the head coaching position at Valparaiso University. Lottich spent eight years playing professionally in Japan for the Oita Heat Devils and the Osaka Evessa, earning All-Star recognition four times. He also played one season in Germany in the Bundesliga for the Dusseldorf Giants, played one season in New Zealand in the NBL for the Harbor Heat and was a member of the New Jersey Nets' summer league team in 2004.

Lottich played collegiately at Stanford University from 2000 through 2004. As a senior in 2003-2004, he helped lead the Cardinal to the Pac-10 title while earning NABC All-Star plaudits, awarded to the top-15 seniors in college basketball. He was also a member of the Wooden Award midseason watch list and was an Honorable Mention All Pac-10 selection as a senior. Lottich was also a member of the program's conference championship squad as a freshman in 2000-2001 and still ranks among Stanford's single-season and career leaders in 3-pointers made.

Off the court, Lottich came to Valpo from the National Collegiate Scouting Association, where he started in January 2013. Lottich ascended to the position of head scout during his time with the NCSA, which helps high school athletes navigate the world of college recruiting. Lottich also co-founded the TEAM Life Skills basketball camp in 2004 and spent nine years managing and developing the camp.

Lottich played his prep basketball at New Trier [Ill.] H.S., where he was named the Chicago Tribune Athlete of the Year in 2000 and holds the distinction of being the program's all-time leading scorer. Lottich graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and currently resides in Valparaiso with his wife, Kylan, and their four children: Grace, Matthan, Christian and Landon.
