Next Up in Valpo Basketball: The Valparaiso University men's basketball team opens Arch Madness Thursday evening as the tournament's ninth seed, taking on eighth-seeded Indiana State in a first-round matchup. Valpo will have to win four games in four days to claim the tournament title.

Last Time Out: Valpo held a nine-point lead with seven minutes remaining in its regular season finale at the ARC Saturday afternoon against Evansville, but the Purple Aces rallied as Valpo fell by a 65-63 final. Derrick Smits and Bakari Evelyn came off the bench to pace Valpo with 15 and 13 points, respectively.

Head Coach Matt Lottich: Matt Lottich (53-43) is in his sixth season overall at Valpo and third as head coach in 2018-19. Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-18 and guided the the program through the transition to the MVC, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI. In his first year as head coach, Lottich guided Valpo to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in the last six years as he led the team to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT.

Series Notes: The fourth-most common opponent in Valpo men's basketball history, Indiana State holds a 53-32 advantage in the all-time series. Valpo claimed non-conference wins over the Sycamores in the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, but Indiana State has won three of four meetings between the two squads in Valpo's first two years in The Valley, including a season sweep this year - 70-53 in Terre Haute and 87-82 in overtime in Valparaiso.

...in the road loss at Indiana State

- A pair of free throws from junior Markus Golder 3:34 into the game tied it at 8-8, but ISU's Tyreke Key nailed a 3-pointer on the Sycamores' next possession to give Indiana State the lead for good.
- Indiana State outscored Valpo 17-5 over a stretch of 10 minutes in the first half to extend its lead to 13 points, and would eventually lead 32-21 at the half.
- Valpo would get no closer than 10 points in the second half.
- Valpo gave up 70 points to the Sycamores on just 59 possessions, the third-worst defensive efficiency for Valpo this season, only coming in ahead of the West Virginia and Western Kentucky defeats.
- Valpo committed 14 turnovers against the Sycamores' eight as Indiana State held a 22-6 advantage in points off turnovers. ISU also outscored Valpo in the paint, 40-30.
- Derrik Smits and Golder tied for team-high honors with 14 points apiece, while Deion Lavender added 10 points and a game-high seven rebounds off the bench.

...in the home loss to Indiana State

- Neither team led by more than three points for the final nine minutes of regulation.
- Holding the lead inside the final four minutes, Valpo misfired on five consecutive free throw attempts to allow Indiana State to stay within striking distance.
- Valpo's Ryan Fazekas hit two free throws with 46 seconds to play in regulation to give the Crusaders a two-point lead, but Indiana State hit a pair with 33.4 to play to tie.
- Valpo got a pair of looks on its final possession, but could not knock either down as the game headed to overtime.
- Indiana State went on top for good 12 seconds into the extra period. The Sycamores pulled out to a seven-point advantage at 79-72 with 2:53 to play, and Valpo could get no closer than three the rest of the way.
- The overtime loss was the second in a three-game home span for Valpo, as the Crusaders fell to Missouri State in overtime on Jan. 29.
- The foul line proved to be the difference, as Valpo went just 27-for-40 (67.5%) from the stripe as compared to a 25-of-28 (89.3%) mark for Indiana State.
- Valpo also committed a season-worst 21 turnovers which the Sycamores turned into 29 points.

...looking ahead

- With a win in its first-round game, Valpo would advance to play Loyola in the quarterfinals Friday at noon.
- The Ramblers have won all four matchups with the Crusaders since Valpo joined the MVC prior to last season, including two wins this year - 71-54 in Chicago and 56-51 in Valparaiso.

...at neutral sites

- Valpo owns a 1-2 record in neutral-site games this year, beating Monmouth while falling to Western Kentucky and Wake Forest at the Myrtle Beach Invitational.

@IndStMBB

- Indiana State enters Arch Madness with a 15-15 overall record and finished tied with Valpo at 7-11 in conference play.
- The Sycamores sat at just 3-7 in MVC play through 10 games, but have played .500 ball since, going 4-4 over the final eight games of the regular season. That includes a 71-54 win last time out over UNI.
- Tyreke Key has been one of the conference's top scorers all season long and averaged a team-best 17.5 points/game within MVC-only play. That mark includes 54 points over the Sycamores' two wins against Valpo.

Valpo and Conference Tournaments

- This year is just Valpo's second appearance at Arch Madness.
- Last season, Valpo was the 10-seed and fell to seventh-seeded Missouri State in the opening round, 83-79.
- In fact, Valpo has lost its first conference tournament game in each of the last three years - the Crusaders were defeated by Green Bay in the 2016 Horizon League

Tournament semifinal, 99-92 in overtime, and by Milwaukee in the 2017 Horizon League Tournament quarterfinal, 43-41.

- Prior to that stretch, Valpo won the 2013 and 2015 Horizon League Tournaments and went 1-1 at the 2014 Horizon League Tournament.

Valpo in St. Louis

- Last year's Arch Madness game was not Valpo's first time playing in what is now known as the Enterprise Center.
- Valpo's Sweet Sixteen game against Rhode Island in 1998 was played at the building, which was then known as the Kiel Center.
- Valpo also appeared in 2002 NCAA Tournament action in St. Louis, but that year's first round game against Kentucky was played at the Edward Jones Dome.

3rd Time the Charm?

- Valpo's matchup against Indiana State is the fourth time in the last 15 years that the Crusaders have faced a team in conference tournament play it has lost to twice in the regular season.
- It's a case of history repeating itself, as Valpo played two such games in its first two years in the Horizon League (Cleveland State, 2007-08; Wright State, 2008-09) and now is playing its second in its first two years in the MVC (Missouri State, 2017-18).
- Valpo is 0-3 in those previous third matchups of the season.
- On the flip side, Valpo has played a team for a third time which it has beaten twice in the regular season 14 times in the last 15 years, and is just 8-6 in those games.

Record Book Watch

- Three Crusaders are making their mark on Valpo's record books this year.
- Junior Jaume Sorolla has blocked 30 shots this year, giving him 92 career blocked shots through three years - seventh-most in program history and just two shy of Harry Bell in sixth position.
- Junior Derrik Smits just surpassed the minimum 500 field goal attempts needed to qualify for Valpo's career field goal percentage chart last time out - his career clip of 566% over his first three years ranks third in program history.
- Smits is shooting at a 59.9% mark from the field this season, a percentage which would be seventh-best on Valpo's single-season chart should he maintain it for the duration.
- Freshman Javon Freeman broke Valpo's freshman record for steals in a season earlier this year at Drake. With 56 steals on the year, Freeman is currently tied with Stalin Ortiz's 2002-03 campaign for sixth in a single season in program history. He is just seven steals shy of Lubos Barton's single-season record of 63, set in 2001-02.

Leading the League

- Not only is Freeman on track to threaten Valpo's single-season steals mark, he also currently paces the Missouri Valley Conference with 1.8 steals/game.
- Freeman would become the first Valpo freshman to lead a conference in one of the five major statistical categories, and would also become the first Valpo player since at least 1982 to pace the conference in steals.
- Alec Peters was the last Valpo player to lead a league in a major stat category, leading the Horizon League in both scoring (23.0 ppg) and rebounding (10.0 rpg) in 2016-17.
- Vashil Fernandez was the last to post a league-best block total, averaging 3.3 bpg to lead the Horizon League in 2015-16.
- Since 1982, no Valpo player has led their conference in assists or steals.

Freeman Feats

- Javon Freeman was named MVC Newcomer of the Week on Feb. 11 after averaging 22 points per game on 66.7% shooting over the previous two games.
- Freeman's week was highlighted by a 27-point effort on 11-of-13 shooting at Illinois State, a game which included a 20-point first half.
- Freeman grabbed 15 rebounds in Valpo's home game against Missouri State, becoming the shortest Valpo player in at least 30 years with a 15-board effort.
- Freeman opened his career with five straight double-figure scoring efforts, the only Valpo freshman to do so in the last 30 years - only two others had even scored in double figures in three straight to open their careers.

- Freeman scored 22 in his debut, the highest-scoring debut by a freshman since Lubos Barton scored 27 in 1998.
- In addition to his freshman steal record, Freeman is also just 11 points and nine rebounds shy of cracking Valpo's top-five totals by freshmen in those categories as well.

Smits Stays Strong

- Junior Derrick Smits has been a consistent scorer for Valpo this season, leading the team with 12.5 points per game on 59.9% shooting from the field.
- Smits has scored in double figures a team-high 22 times this year.
- Smits also paces Valpo on the glass, averaging 5.7 rebounds per game, and is second on the team with 29 blocked shots.
- Smits enters Arch Madness second in the league in field goal percentage, ninth in blocked shots and 12th in rebounding.

Shooting - The Highs and the Lows

- The difference in Valpo's 3-point shooting in wins versus losses this year is striking - in its 14 victories, Valpo is hitting 40% from the 3-point line, while in its 17 losses, Valpo is shooting just 24.5% from deep.
- Valpo has hit better than 33% from 3-point range in a loss just twice this season and is averaging just 4.1 3-pointers/game in defeats.
- Meanwhile, Valpo has enjoyed a number of strong shooting performances in wins, including a 15-of-27 effort from deep in its win at George Washington, a 12-of-24 performance in the win at Missouri State, and most recently a 10-of-23 mark in the win at Illinois State.
- The 15 triples at GW were the program's highest total against a Division I opponent since going 15-of-26 from deep in a Feb. 5, 2013 win over UIC.

Similar Starts in New Conference

- Valpo's first two seasons in the Missouri Valley Conference have played out quite similar to the program's first two seasons in the Horizon League.
- In Valpo's first two seasons in the Horizon League (2007-09), the program posted a 31-36 overall record and went 14-22 in league play.
- To date, in its first two MVC seasons, Valpo owns a 29-34 overall record and a 13-23 mark in conference play.
- After its first two seasons in the Horizon League, Valpo would not finish worse than fourth place in its final eight years as a league member and claimed five league regular season titles.

Redshirts Aplenty

- Valpo boasts five players on this year's team who have redshirted.
- Derrick Smits redshirted due to injury in his first year at Valpo, while Bakari Evelyn and Ryan Fazekas each sat out as a redshirt after transferring from Nebraska and Providence, respectively.
- Deion Lavender and Markus Golder both redshirted before arriving at Valpo as well.
- Only 12 schools nationally have more redshirts on their active roster this year than Valpo's five.
- Valpo also has a pair of Division I transfers in Eron Gordon and Nick Robinson sitting out this season as redshirts as well.

Developing Pros

- Valpo has produced a myriad of professional basketball players over the last 25 years, most notably a pair of NBA players in the last two years.
- Ryan Broekhoff (class of 2013) signed a contract with the Dallas Mavericks in the summer of 2018 after spending five seasons playing internationally in Russia and Turkey.
- Broekhoff tallied a season-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the floor (3-5 3PT) in 22 minutes of action Jan. 5 in a 106-100 loss against Philadelphia.
- Alec Peters (class of 2017) was the 54th pick in the 2017 NBA Draft by the Phoenix Suns.
- Peters appeared in 20 games for the Suns in 2017-18, highlighted by a 36-point performance in the season finale against Dallas - a new single-game high by a Valpo alum in the NBA.
- Peters is currently playing for CSKA Moscow in Russia.
- 2018 Valpo graduates Tevonn Walker and Max Joseph are currently playing for Hamburg Towers in Germany and Nassjo Basket in Sweden, respectively.
- Valpo has now produced 50 pro basketball players over the last 25 years.

The International Flavor

- This year's squad continues the international pipeline that Valpo has cultivated over the past two-plus decades.
- The Crusaders boast a pair of international players on this year's roster.
- Represented are Canada (Sackey) and Spain (Sorolla).
- Over the past 22 years, the Crusaders have welcomed 34 international players from 19 different countries.

Deion Lavender

- Lavender closed the regular season with eight points and game highs of seven rebounds, four assists and three steals last time out against Evansville.
- Lavender scored 10 points, including three key baskets in the final four minutes, and led Valpo with seven rebounds in its home win over SIU.
- Lavender led Valpo with his second straight 16-point effort at Drake and also tied for team-high honors with six rebounds.
- Lavender set a season best with 16 points - just one off his career high from UAB - and added four assists against Indiana State.
- Lavender pulled down 10 rebounds to go with seven points and five assists in the win at Missouri State.
- Lavender reached 10 assists for the second time this year in the win at George Washington.
- Lavender tallied 12 points and game highs of seven rebounds and seven assists in the win over UC Riverside.
- Lavender became the first Valpo player in over a decade to reach double figures in assists and the first in 21 years to do so without committing a turnover, posting 10 assists, six rebounds and five points at West Virginia.
- Lavender was named Honorable Mention All-Tournament at Myrtle Beach.
- Lavender led all players in the win over Monmouth with 18 points and eight boards.
- Lavender is a graduate transfer who joins the Valpo program after spending the last two years at UAB.
- Lavender led UAB and ranked eighth in Conference USA with 3.4 assists/game in 2016-17, while also ranking ninth in the conference that season in assist/turnover ratio.
- Lavender played as a freshman in the MVC for Southern Illinois (2014-15), averaging 6.6 points/game and raising his scoring average to 8.6 points/game within MVC play.

Bakari Evelyn

- Evelyn closed the regular season with 13 points on 6-of-8 shooting against Evansville.
- Evelyn scored 11 points off the bench against Indiana State.
- Evelyn connected on three 3-pointers and finished with 11 points versus Missouri State.
- Evelyn scored 14 points off the bench, including three 3-pointers, in the win over UNI.

- Evelyn hit a 3-pointer and dished out an assist on back-to-back possessions inside the final three minutes in the win over Bradley, helping extend a five-point lead to 10 points.
- Evelyn knocked down a trio of 3-pointers in a 13-point effort in the win at Missouri State.
- Evelyn connected on a career-best 10 field goals, including a career-high six 3-pointers, in finishing with 27 points in the win at George Washington.
- Evelyn finished with 13 points, a team-high five assists and matched his career best with four steals in the win at UNLV.
- Evelyn notched a team-best 16 points - 15 of which came after halftime - and sent Valpo to overtime with a jumper with 11 seconds to play in the win over SIUE.
- Evelyn was an MVC All-Newcomer Team selection last year.
- Evelyn was the lone Valpo player to start all 32 games and averaged 12.6 points/game to rank second on the team.
- Evelyn led Valpo with 93 assists and averaged a team-best 14.1 points/game in MVC-only play, connecting at a 42.3% clip from 3-point range against MVC opponents.

Markus Golder

- Golder returned to action at Evansville, tying for team-high honors with 12 points.
- Golder exited Valpo's home game against Drake due to injury less than five minutes in, and missed Valpo's game versus Missouri State. Golder then missed Valpo's last game against SIU as well, recovering from the same injury.
- Golder scored all 13 of his points in the first half in the win over UNI and added six rebounds as well.
- Golder led Valpo at Loyola with 16 points, going 6-of-8 from the field.
- Golder hit a 50-foot buzzer-beater for the win over Illinois State, a play which was number one on SportsCenter's Top 10.
- Golder also had three rebounds, a second-chance basket, a pair of free throws and drew two charges in the final 90 seconds of the win.
- Golder matched his career best with 18 points in the win over PNW, including five dunks.
- Golder matched his season best with 16 points (6-8 FG) vs. UC Riverside.
- Golder paced Valpo with 15 points and eight rebounds versus Western Kentucky.
- Golder scored 16 points in just 18 minutes off the bench in the season-opening win over Concordia.
- Golder was named to the MVC All-Bench Team last season in his first year at Valpo.
- Golder averaged 22.6 minutes/game, mainly off the bench, and finished third on the team with 9.5 points/game.
- Golder paced Valpo with 138 total rebounds on the year, and also led Valpo in both 3-point percentage (42.9%) and free throw percentage (83.1%).

Ryan Fazekas

- Fazekas suffered a season-ending thumb injury in the game at UNI and missed the final two regular season games.
- Fazekas scored 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting at Drake.
- Fazekas returned to action versus Indiana State Feb. 13, scoring seven points in 34 minutes.
- Fazekas missed nine games after exiting the Jan. 8 game against Bradley with an ankle injury seven minutes in.
- Fazekas matched his season high with six 3-pointers, leading the team with 18 points in the win at Missouri State.
- Fazekas paced Valpo with 19 points against Ball State, and again in the win over PNW.
- Fazekas knocked down a career-high six 3-pointers for a career-best 22 points, 16 of which came in the second half, in the win at George Washington.
- Fazekas was nearly perfect from the floor (5-6 FG; 3-4 3PT) for 15 points at West Virginia.
- Fazekas was named Honorable Mention All-Tournament at Myrtle Beach.
- Fazekas has two years of eligibility remaining after sitting out last season following a transfer from Providence.
- Fazekas appeared in 58 games in his two years with the Friars, making 19 starts.
- Fazekas helped lead Marquette Catholic H.S. to the Indiana 1A state championship in 2014 and a repeat appearance in the state title game in 2015.

Jaume Sorolla

- Sorolla returned to the starting lineup in the win over SIU, finishing with eight points and three blocked shots.
- Sorolla tallied seven points and six rebounds at Drake.
- Sorolla scored a season-high 13 points on 6-of-7 shooting and set a career best with five blocked shots against Drake.
- Sorolla scored nine points (4-5 FG) and grabbed six rebounds in the win at Missouri State.
- Sorolla narrowly missed a double-double in the win over PNW, finishing with 11 points and nine rebounds.
- Sorolla led Valpo with six rebounds in 25 minutes off the bench against Ball State.
- Sorolla made his season debut at UNLV, scoring two points and grabbing three rebounds in nine minutes of action.
- Sorolla missed Valpo's first six games of the season (ankle).
- Sorolla saw action in 30 games as a sophomore for Valpo, starting 14 times.
- Sorolla averaged 4.9 points and 3.4 rebounds per game as a sophomore and led Valpo with 32 blocked shots.

Derrick Smits

- Smits led Valpo in scoring in each of its final two regular season games, scoring 12 points at Bradley and 15 points against Evansville.
- Smits matched his career high with 23 points against Indiana State, going a perfect 7-of-7 from the floor while also grabbing 11 rebounds.
- Smits scored all 16 of his points in the second half in the win at Illinois State, going 8-of-9 from the field over the final 20 minutes.
- Smits finished with his third double-double of the year in the win over UNI, tallying 21 points and 11 rebounds.
- Smits led Valpo with 16 points, 14 of which came in the second half, and eight rebounds in the win at Southern Illinois.

Head Coach

3rd Season * Stanford, 2004

53-43 Overall and at Valpo

Matt Lottich is in his sixth season overall at Valparaiso University and third season as head coach of the men's basketball program for the 2018-2019 season.

Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-2018 and guided the Crusaders through the move to the Missouri Valley Conference, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI.

In his first season at the helm of the Crusader men's basketball program, Lottich guided Valpo to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in the last six years as he led the Crusaders to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT. Lottich's inaugural season as head coach was highlighted by a home win over a nationally-ranked Rhode Island squad, as well as neutral-site wins over Alabama and BYU to capture the MGM Grand Main Event.

Lottich coached the Horizon League Player of the Year and an NABC Third Team All-American in Alec Peters, guiding the senior as he closed out one of the top careers in program history. Peters enjoyed his finest season as a senior, ranking among the top-20 in the nation in both scoring and rebounding and breaking five of Valpo's career records.

Lottich was hired as the 22nd head coach in the history of the Valpo men's basketball program in April of 2016. Lottich, who had served the previous three seasons as an assistant coach on the Crusaders' staff, became just the program's fifth head coach in the last 36 years.

Lottich arrived at Valparaiso University in summer 2013 and helped guide the Crusaders to 78 victories over his three seasons as an assistant. Valpo won two Horizon League regular season championships and one league tournament title over those three years.

The Crusaders recorded the top two victory totals in program history over Lottich's final two years as an assistant. Valpo broke the previous school record for wins in a season during the 2014-2015 campaign, winning 28 games and earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Then, the 2015-2016 season saw Valpo win a program-record 30 games and advance to the NIT championship game at Madison Square Garden.

Lottich brings nearly a decade of professional playing experience to the head coaching position at Valparaiso University. Lottich spent eight years playing professionally in Japan for the Oita Heat Devils and the Osaka Evessa, earning All-Star recognition four times. He also played one season in Germany in the Bundesliga for the Dusseldorf Giants, played one season in New Zealand in the NBL for the Harbor Heat and was a member of the New Jersey Nets' summer league team in 2004.

Lottich played collegiately at Stanford University from 2000 through 2004. As a senior in 2003-2004, he helped lead the Cardinal to the Pac-10 title while earning NABC All-Star plaudits, awarded to the top-15 seniors in college basketball. He was also a member of the Wooden Award midseason watch list and was an Honorable Mention All Pac-10 selection as a senior. Lottich was also a member of the program's conference championship squad as a freshman in 2000-2001 and still ranks among Stanford's single-season and career leaders in 3-pointers made.

Off the court, Lottich came to Valpo from the National Collegiate Scouting Association, where he started in January 2013. Lottich ascended to the position of head scout during his time with the NCSA, which helps high school athletes navigate the world of college recruiting. Lottich also co-founded the TEAM Life Skills basketball camp in 2004 and spent nine years managing and developing the camp.

Lottich played his prep basketball at New Trier [Ill.] H.S., where he was named the Chicago Tribune Athlete of the Year in 2000 and holds the distinction of being the program's all-time leading scorer. Lottich graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and currently resides in Valparaiso with his wife, Kylan, and their four children: Grace, Matthan, Christian and Landon.
