Next Up in Crusader Basketball: It's only December 5th, but the Crusaders head to Louisville for their final non-league road tilt of the 2015-16 season. The Cardinals, who were ranked as high as 8th in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Polls, but staggered out of the gate to the tune of a 1-4 start, are coming off a statement win over #19 Michigan State in East Lansing on Thursday night. The 4:00 pm ET/3:00 pm CT tipoff is the back-end of a doubleheader with the Louisville men hosting Grand Canyon at 12:00 pm ET/11:00 am CT.

Last Time Out: For the second time in as many games, a valiant comeback attempt from the Crusaders just wasn't enough to erase a first-quarter hole. Miami (Ohio) outscored Valpo 22-11 in the opening period, and needed every bit of the surplus to hang on for a 75-72 victory Wednesday evening at the Athletics-Recreation Center. Dani Franklin dropped in a season-high 18 points while Jasmyn Walker produced her second straight double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

Head Coach Tracey Dorow: Tracey Dorow (23-74) is in her fourth season at the helm of the Valparaiso women's basketball program in 2015-16. She collected her 250th career victory on November 14th, 2014 after a 91-57 defeat of Butler. In her first season, Dorow led the Crusaders to eleven victories overall, including five in Horizon League play. Dorow arrived in Valparaiso after 14 seasons at Ferris State. She compiled a 232-163 record while with the Bulldogs. Furthermore, Ferris State posted the #1 grade point average in all of Division II for the 1999-2000 women's basketball season as well as the #2 ranking in 2002-03.

Series Notes: Saturday is just the third contest between Louisville and Valparaiso. The Cardinals downed the Crusaders, 96-40, in the first meeting three seasons ago at the KFC Yum! Center before upending the Brown and Gold, 86-59, at the ARC last November.

Storylines

- For the second time in its first six games, Valpo faces a Preseason AP Top 10 team (Notre Dame, Nov. 23rd).

- The Crusaders are in search of their first road win while Louisville is going for its first home victory.

- With a capacity of 22,000, the KFC Yum! Center is the largest facility in which the Valpo women's basketball team has played a game. - L ouisville's Dakota Weatherford was high school teammates with former Valpo point guard Jessica Carr.

- Ten of the combined 25 players eligible for Saturday's game are freshmen.

@ValpoWBB

- In its 44th season, @ValpoWBB is 502-592 all-time (as of Dec. 4th). - @ValpoWBB has made two NCAA Tournament appearances (2002-03, 2003-04) and earned one WNIT berth (2001-02).

- @ValpoWBB closed out the 2014-15 season slate with a 6-24 overall record, 2-14 in the Horizon League.

- @ValpoWBB was picked to finish 10th in the Horizon League in the 2015-16 Preseason Poll.

- @ValpoWBB's Dani Franklin was a Preseason Second Team All-Horizon League selection.

- @ValpoWBB returns its three leading scorers (Franklin, Jasmyn Walker, Lexi Miller) in addition to its two top rebounders (Walker, Franklin).
- @ValpoWBB brings back 1,469 points, 767 rebounds, and 4,304 minutes played from the 2014-15 squad.

@ValpoWBB in the @HorizonLeague

- Since joining the Horizon League in 2007-08, @ValpoWBB is 44-94 (through end of 2014-15 season).

- @ValpoWBB has had one First Team All-League selection (Launa Hochstetler, 2008-09) and two Second Team All-League players (Agnieszka Kulaga, 2007-08; Tabitha Gerardot, 2012-13).

- @ValpoWBB also boasts four representatives on the All-Newcomer Team (Lauren Kenney, 2008-09; Gerardot, 2010-11; Dani Franklin, 2014-15; Jasmyn Walker, 2014-15), an All-Defensive Team member (Laura Richards, 2011-12), one Freshman of the Year (Franklin, 2014-15), and one Sixth Player of the Year (Franklin, 2014-15).

@ValpoWBB vs. @theACC

- @ValpoWBB has two ACC foes on its schedule for the second time in four seasons.

- @ValpoWBB fell 110-54 to Notre Dame at the ARC on Nov. 23rd.

- @ValpoWBB has faced a current ACC team each year since 1999-2000.

- @ValpoWBB is 2-35 all-time versus ACC opponents.

- @ValpoWBB has defeated Wake Forest (Dec. 22, 2001) and Florida State (Nov. 29, 2008).

@uoflwbb

- @uoflwbb churned out a 27-7 record in 2014-15, and advanced to its third straight Sweet Sixteen.

@uoflwbb possesses a string of five consecutive 20-win seasons.
@uoflwbb occupied the No. 3 spot in the 2015-16 ACC Preseason Media Poll.

- @uoflwbb beat six AP Top 25 teams in 2014-15.

- @uoflwbb is 28-15 versus current members of the Horizon League.

- @uoflwbb does not have a Kentucky native on its roster, but does tout players from ten different states.

- @uoflwbb owns a 94-25 record versus nonconference opponents over the past nine-plus seasons.

- @uoflwbb averaged over 9,500 fans per home game last season, the third-highest figure in NCAA Division I women's basketball..

- Opponents have committed 21.3 turnovers/game versus @uoflwbb.

- @uoflwbb has four players averaging 13 or more points per game. - ESPNW ranked @uoflwbb's Asia Durr as the No. 2 recruit in the nation for the class of 2015.

- Durr, who is averaging 13.0 PPG, returned to action Thursday after missing the previous three games.

- @uoflwbb's Myisha Hines-Allen (13.4 PPG in 2015-16) had the 13th-highest field-goal percentage in country last season (55.8%).

- Hines-Allen registered a game-high 21 points on 9-of-13 shooting versus Valpo last November.

- Briahanna Jackson leads @uoflwbb in minutes (31.8 MPG), assist-to-turnover ratio (18:9), steals (17), blocks (3), and is 2nd in scoring (14.7 PPG).

- @uoflwbb's Mariya Moore has posted double figures in points five times already, including three 20+ point affairs.

- Emmonnie Henderson (5.8 PPG, 4.0 RPG in 2014-15) is sitting out the 2015-16 basketball season to focus on qualifying for the 2016 U.S. Olympic Track & Field Team (shot put and discus).

@CoachJeffWalz

- @CoachJeffWalz is in his ninth season at Louisville

- @CoachJeffWalz enters Wednesday's game with a 210-81 career at Louisville, and an 88-42 mark in conference play.

- @CoachJeffWalz is the winningest coach in Cardinals' history.

- @CoachJeffWalz has guided Louisville to six Sweet Sixteen appearances.

- @CoachJeffWalz has inked five McDonald's All-Americans the last two years.

- In 2009, @CoachJeffWalz became just the second coach in NCAA history to lead a team to the national title game after two seasons at the helm.

- The Cardinals have gone 105-20 at home with @CoachJeffWalz at the helm.

- @CoachJeffWalz served as an assistant coach at Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, and Western Kentucky prior to taking over at Louisville.

- @CoachJeffWalz received his bachelor's degree from Northern Kentucky.

- Recorded most rebounds ever by a freshman (250) and the sixthmost ever in a single season in program history.
- Amassed nine double-doubles in Horizon League play in 2014-15.
- Elected to 2014-15 Horizon League All-Freshmen Team.

Tracey Dorow Head Coach 4th Season 255-237 overall, 23-74 at Valpo Western Michigan, 1996

Tracey Dorow was named head coach of the Valparaiso women's basketball program in April of 2012.

The 2014-2015 season saw Dani Franklin flourish under Dorow's tutelage. The newcomer averaged 14.0 points per game in just 22.4 minutes of action to earn Horizon League Freshman of the Year honors in addition to Sixth Player of the Year accolades. Fellow rookie Jasmyn Walker was also named to the Horizon League All-Freshman Team after setting a program record for rebounds by a freshman with 250.

Dorow arrived at Valpo after spending 14 seasons as the head coach at Ferris State University, guiding the Bulldogs to four NCAA Division II Tournament appearances, two Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) North Division championships, and four 20-win seasons.

In her 14 seasons at Ferris State, Dorow compiled a 232-163 (.587) record, including a 23-7 mark in 2011-2012 while guiding the Bulldogs to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The all-time winningest coach in FSU history, she led her squad to the Sweet Sixteen in 2007.

The GLIAC Coach of the Year in 2003-2004, Dorow had five players earn a total of seven All-American honors and had seven players tally 10 total All-Region Team accolades. Her student-athletes earned All-GLIAC honors 22 times and 10 times she had players represented on the GLIAC All-Defensive Team. Under Dorow's guidance, Ferris State produced the GLIAC Player of the Year in 2000-2001, and she twice coached the GLIAC Freshman of the Year.

Dorow's student-athletes also excelled in the classroom, as three times she has led a First Team Academic All-American and 14 times her players have earned Academic All-District honors. A total of 45 different players earned GLIAC All-Academic recognition during her time at Ferris State. Ferris State posted the No. 1 grade point average in the country in Division II for the 1999-2000 women's basketball season, and her team ranked second in the nation in 2002-2003.

Dorow began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Lake Michigan Community College in Benton Harbor, Mich. where she helped lead the Indians to a 69-22 record in three seasons, winning two Western Collegiate Conference titles. Lake Michigan finished fourth in the 1997 NJCAA national tournament and held a No. 1 national ranking in February of that same season. She also spent one season as a graduate assistant at the University of Indianapolis.

A collegiate player at Illinois State from 1990-1993, she led the Redbirds in assists as a sophomore while finishing seventh in the Gateway Conference that same season. After transferring to Northern Michigan University for the 1993-1994 season, she earned Newcomer of the Year and Best Defensive Player honors for the Wildcats. Dorow had 131 assists and made 54 threes at NMU in her one season there. As a prep player, she finished third in the state of Michigan for Miss Basketball in 1990 and was named to the Detroit Free Press All-Decade Team.

Dorow earned her Bachelor of Science degree in education from Western Michigan University in 1996 and her Master of Arts degree from the University of Indianapolis in 2003 in curriculum and instruction. She married her husband, Rob, in August of 2007. The Dorows have two children: Lainie, 6, and Baxter, 4.


