Next Up in Valpo Basketball: The Valparaiso University men's basketball program will recognize the man who laid the foundation for the program's tradition of excellence prior to Sunday's game against Central Michigan at the Athletics-Recreation Center. The day is dedicated to celebrating legendary head coach Homer Drew's recent enshrinement into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. A banner to commemorate the high honor will be unveiled and raised during a pregame ceremony that will begin shortly after 12:35 p.m. When the game gets going, Valpo will face off with another quality Mid-American Conference foe as Central Michigan makes its way to Northwest Indiana.

Last Time Out: Valpo trailed by as many as 12 before roaring from behind to take a six-point lead with 7:23 to go (66-60), but host Eastern Michigan delivered the last blow in an 85-79 Valpo defeat on Wednesday in Ypsilanti. Javon Freeman-Liberty had 28 points and equaled a career high with five steals as he and backcourt mate Daniel Sackey combined for nine steals. Freshman Donovan Clay turned in his second straight double-figure outing, scoring 11 points on 5-of-7 shooting.

Head Coach Matt Lottich: Matt Lottich (59-48) is in his seventh season overall at Valpo and fourth as head coach in 2019-20. Lottich led the team to 15 victories in his third season in charge in 2018-19, the program's second campaign in the Missouri Valley Conference. In his first year as head coach (2016-17), Lottich guided Valpo to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in a six-year span as he led the team to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT. Lottich, hired as the 22nd head coach of the Valpo men's basketball program in April 2016, graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and New Trier High School (Illinois) in 2000.

Series Notes: The last time Valpo and Central Michigan faced off, the man who is now celebrating his Hall of Fame enshrinement was still roaming the sidelines. Homer Drew's team fell 68-55 in Mount Pleasant on Nov. 23, 2004. Valpo did participate in the Central Michigan Tournament in 2014-15, but did not face the hosts, beating Arkansas Pine Bluff and Maine. This will mark Central Michigan's first trip to the ARC since Dec. 23, 2002, a 65-51 Valpo victory. The Chippewas hold a 4-3 edge in an all-time series that goes all the way back to the 1925-26 season.

Scouting the Chippewas (Info Entering Friday, Dec. 6)

- Enter the weekend as the No. 1 scoring team in the nation at 95.1 points per game, while allowing just 72.1 points per game. San Francisco and Illinois are tied for second nationally at 87.1 points per game.
- Have scored at least 80 points in six of their first eight games and hit 100 on four occasions.
- Picked fourth in the MAC West Division Preseason Poll. Valpo has already faced a pair of MAC West teams in Toledo and Eastern Michigan, topping the MAC West preseason favorite Rockets in the season opener.
- Senior forward Dave DiLeo was a member of the West Division Preseason All-MAC Team. Entering Friday's game against UT Martin, he's averaging 14.8 points per game, one of four Chippewas in double figures.
- Dallas Morgan and Kevin McKay share the team lead at 15.6 points per game, while Rob Montgomery is also in double figures at 13.1. Montgomery has a team-best 5.9 rebounds, entering Friday.
- Seventh-year head coach Keno Davis led the team to a 23-12 record a year ago, tying for the program's second-highest single-season win total. It was Central Michigan's fifth straight season of .500 or better, the first time the program has accomplished that feat since the early 1970s.
- Reached a postseason tournament for the fourth time in the last five years by qualifying for the College Basketball Invitational in 2018-19.

Wrapping Up Eastern Michigan (Dec. 3)

- For the fifth time in the first nine games of the season, Valpo trailed by double figures but battled back to either tie, take the lead or get within two points (at SLU). In this instance, Valpo chased by 10 at halftime and trailed by as many as 12 before grabbing a 66-60 lead with 7:23 to play in an eventual 85-79 loss.
- Eastern Michigan entered the game ranked ninth nationally in scoring defense, and Valpo posted 79 points, the most allowed by the Eagles all season.
- The Eagles entered the night leading the nation in steals per game, but it was Valpo that swiped 10 steals and won the turnover battle 18-14.
- The Valpo sophomore backcourt duo of Javon Freeman-Liberty and

Daniel Sackey combined for nine of the team's 10 steals. Freeman-Liberty equaled a career high with his second five-steal game, his first since Feb. 16 of last season against Drake. Sackey enjoyed his third career four-steal game, equaling a career watermark while setting a season high.

- Redshirt junior Nick Robinson topped the team with seven rebounds, four of which occurred on the offensive glass. Sackey gave out eight assists, matching his career best from this year's season opener against Toledo.

Freeman-Liberty Fast Facts

- Entering Friday, Dec. 6, he ranks fourth in the country in total field goals made with 75, 12th in scoring at 22.7 points per game, fourth in total points at 204 and 11th in steals with 23.
- Named the MVC Player of the Week for the second time in a three-week span on Dec. 2. Before this season, no Valpo player had earned MVC Player of the Week honors since the program joined the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Equaled a career-high five steals while pouring in 28 points on Dec. 3 at Eastern Michigan, reaching the 20-point mark for the sixth time in seven games, with the only exception a game against an NAIA opponent where he was limited to 18 minutes and scored 12 points.
- Scored 19 points or more in each of the first seven games of the season and 20 points or more in five straight prior to playing just 18 minutes and scoring 12 points in a lopsided win over Trinity Christian on Nov. 27.
- Joined Alec Peters (12 straight, 2016-17) as the only two Valpo players over the last 30 seasons to start a year with seven straight efforts of 19 points or more.
- Reached the 30-point mark for the second time this season with a career-high 32 on Nov. 25 vs. Cincinnati in the third-place game of the Paradise Jam. At that point in the season, only 45 players nationally had single-game outputs of 32 points or more.
- Became the first player in the Missouri Valley Conference with two 30-point games this season and accounted for two of the conference's first five 30-point efforts in 2019-20.
- His scoring average of 22.7 points per game through nine games is Valpo's second-best during the first nine games of a season over the last 30 years, behind Peters' 25.1 in 2016-17.
- His 32 points against Cincinnati were the most by a Valpo player in a single game since Peters had 35 against Santa Clara on Dec. 22, 2016.
- Had 13 rebounds against SIUE to go along with his 30 points, becoming the second Valpo player in the last 20 seasons with a 30&10 game, joining Alec Peters (six times).

Hall Call: Legendary Valpo head coach Homer Drew was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame on Sunday, Nov. 24 in Kansas City. Drew was a fixture on the Valpo sidelines

for more than two decades, leading the Brown & Gold to 371 victories and nine postseason appearances. Drew ended his career, which also included stints at Bethel (Ind.) and IU South Bend, with 640 career victories over 34 seasons, which ranked sixth among active Division-I coaches at the time of his retirement. The nine postseason appearances included seven trips to the NCAA Tournament, highlighted by Valpo's run to the Sweet 16 in 1998. Valpo will honor Drew with a Hall of Fame banner raising prior to Sunday's game.

November Success: Valpo finished the month of November with a 5-3 record, continuing a tradition of strong starts to seasons. November has been Valpo's best month under head coach Matt Lottich, as the team owns a 24-7 (.774) November Mark through the first four years of his tenure. This marked the 10th straight season Valpo has had a winning record in November, as the team has compiled a 56-19 (.747) November record over the last decade.

Wrapping Up Trinity Christian (Nov. 27)

- Valpo scored 98 points, its highest total since Nov. 6, 2018, a 121-65 win over Concordia Chicago.
- Valpo dished out 29 assists on 38 made baskets in a 98-71 win over Trinity Christian. That was the team's highest assist total since also dishing out 29 on Nov. 12, 2010. The Valpo record for assists in a game is 36 on Nov. 28, 2005 vs. IU South Bend. Five Valpo players had four assists or more, led by Zion Morgan with a career-high five.
- Valpo shot a season-best 54.3 percent, the team's top mark since shooting 56.3 percent last season against Purdue Northwest. The 27-point margin of victory against the Trolls was Valpo's largest since last year's 36-point win over the Pride.

- Valpo had 29 assists, its highest total since Nov. 12, 2010.
- Valpo outscored the Trolls on fast-break points 33-2.
- Five Valpo players finished in double figures, the first time that has occurred this season. In fact, the last time that happened was Dec. 29, 2018, the previously mentioned 97-61 victory over Purdue Northwest.
- Three Valpo freshmen scored in double figures, with Ben Krikke (18), Donovan Clay (16) and Sigurd Lorange (11) all reaching career highs. This was the first time three Valpo freshmen finished in double figures in the same game since Nov. 30, 2013, when rookies Alec Peters (13), Clay Yeo (11) and Lexus Williams (11) all did so in a 94-58 win over Cincinnati Christian.
- Krikke's 18 points represented a team high, marking the first game this season Valpo did not have a player pour in 20+ points.

Working Overtime: The Paradise Jam third-place game on Nov. 25 marked Valpo's first overtime affair since an 87-82 setback to Indiana State on Feb. 13 at the ARC last season. Valpo has lost each of its last three overtime games.

Bearcat Bits: Valpo forced 23 turnovers in the Nov. 25 game vs. Cincinnati, but committed 18. The Brown & Gold took care of business at the free-throw line (14-15, 93.3 percent), but struggled to slow the Bearcats from the floor (31-56, 55.4 percent). This was the third time this season a Valpo opponent committed 20 or more turnovers, as Cincinnati (23) joined Toledo (21) and North Dakota (20). The game against the Bearcats marked the most turnovers committed by a Valpo opponent since UNLV's 25 on Nov. 28, 2018.

Comeback Kids: Although Valpo would love to avoid facing double-figure first-half deficits altogether, the team has showed a knack for erasing large margins this year.

- Valpo faced a 10-point halftime deficit on Dec. 3 at Eastern Michigan and chased by as many as 12 before coming back to take a 66-60 lead with 7:23 to go. The Eagles eventually prevailed 85-79.
- Valpo rallied from 12 down with 10:12 to play to force overtime in an eventual 81-77 defeat to Cincinnati on Nov. 25 in the third-place game of the Paradise Jam.
- On Nov. 12 at SIUE, Valpo was down by 10 with 13:00 minutes to play in the opening half before winning by 13. That marked the first time Valpo had come from down by double figures to win by double figures since Feb. 17, 2018, a 77-64 victory over Bradley.
- Valpo faced a 14-point deficit in the first half at Saint Louis on Nov. 9, but battled to within two by the 5:19 mark of the second half. That was as close as the team would come, however, in an 81-70 defeat.
- The most noteworthy comeback of all came on opening night, when Valpo erased a 14-point deficit to beat Toledo 79-77. It was the team's largest comeback against a Division-I opponent since Jan. 17, 2013, rallying from 22 down to beat Detroit Mercy 89-88.

It was Valpo's biggest comeback in any game since coming from 16 down to beat Trinity Christian on Nov. 12, 2016.

- In Matt Lottich's head coaching tenure (fourth season), there have already been 10 times Valpo has trailed by double figures and come away victorious. The team overcame four double-figure deficits in 2016-17 (Wright State, Cleveland State, BYU and Trinity Christian), two in 2017-18 (Bradley and UNCW) and two in 2018-19 (George Washington and Illinois State).

Strong Sackey Showing: Valpo guard Daniel Sackey usurped his career scoring watermark by halftime and finished the Nov. 9 game at Saint Louis with personal bests in points (22), made field goals (7), made 3-pointers (3) and made free throws (5). He became the first Valpo player to go perfect from beyond the arc with more than two attempts since Max Joseph on Jan. 20, 2018 vs. Drake. He and Joseph are the only two players to do so in the last four seasons. The last player to go unblemished from long range with more than three attempts was Alec Peters, who went 4-for-4 on Jan. 18, 2016 at Youngstown State. Sackey also dished out four assists on Saturday at SLU following his eight-helper showing in the Nov. 5 season opener vs. Toledo. This marks the first time in the sophomore's career that he has handed out four or more assists in back-to-back games.

A Flair for the Dramatic: Valpo added a new name to its long list of late-game heroes in the program's storied history during the Nov. 5 season opener vs. Toledo as Javon Freeman-Liberty knocked down an off-balance 15-footer from the left elbow with 3.7 seconds left in a 79-77 victory at the Athletics-Recreation Center. That marked the 24th time since the start of the 1992-93 season Valpo has prevailed on a game-winner in the final five seconds. Although it was the first game of the regular season, it was already the second time Valpo has won in dramatic fashion this year as Daniel Sackey's overtime buzzer-beater lifted the team past Canadian powerhouse Carleton 83-80 in overtime on its foreign tour in August.

Nonconference Highlights: Valpo's nonconference schedule is highlighted by seven opponents that qualified for the postseason last year. Here are a few of the opponents that highlight the 13-game docket that will lead into the start of Missouri Valley Conference action.

- Toledo (Nov. 5) went 25-8 last season including a 13-5 conference mark. The Rockets went to the NIT a year ago and have won back-to-back MAC West Division titles.
- Saint Louis (Nov. 9) has made four NCAA Tournament appearances in the last decade and went 23-13 in 2018-19 on its way to the Atlantic 10 Tournament title.
- Grand Canyon (Nov. 22) went 20-14 overall and 10-6 in the WAC last season, qualifying for the postseason with a CBI berth. The Lopes have reached the WAC title game and qualified for the postseason in each of their first two years as a Division-I postseason

eligible team.

- Nevada (Nov. 24) went 29-5 and 15-3 in the Mountain West last season on the way to an NCAA Tournament appearance.
- Cincinnati (Nov. 25) posted a 28-7 (14-4 American) record last season, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament.
- Central Michigan (Dec. 8) enjoyed a 23-12 overall record and 10-8 MAC mark last season, winning two games in the MAC Tournament and qualifying for the CBI. The 23 victories tied the program's highest total in 16 years.
- Arkansas (Dec. 21) will close out Valpo's nonleague schedule in North Little Rock. The Razorbacks, members of the SEC, reached the second round of the NIT last season and finished 18-16 overall.

Wrapping Up Canada

- Valpo finished its four-game Canadian Foreign Tour from Aug. 10-14 with an unblemished mark after notching wins over McGill (84-78), Concordia (94-90), Carleton (83-80, OT) and the University of Quebec (81-68).
- Valpo battled from 90-80 down with 4:56 to play to top Concordia 94-90 in Montreal on Aug. 11 thanks to a game-closing 14-0 run.
- The highlight of the tour came on Aug. 13, when Winnipeg native Daniel Sackey drained a buzzer-beating 3-pointer to top Carleton 83-80 in overtime.
- Valpo stopped Canadian powerhouse Carleton's 15-game winning streak against NCAA Division-I teams that included triumphs over USF, Ole Miss, Providence, Cincinnati, Vanderbilt and Alabama.
- The Sackey buzzer-beater was No. 9 on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays that evening.
- Javon Freeman-Liberty scored a team-high 18.8 points per game during the Canada journey, while Donovan Clay and Mileek McMillan shared the team lead by averaging 5.3 boards apiece. Sackey averaged 15.0 points per game during the trip.

Preseason Picks

- Javon Freeman-Liberty and Ryan Fazekas both earned All-MVC Second Team honors.
- They joined Tevonn Walker (2017) as the only Valpo players to be tabbed preseason all-MVC since joining the conference.
- The last time Valpo had multiple players on the preseason all-league first or second teams in the same season was 2016, when Alec Peters and Shane Hammink were first and second team Horizon League preseason picks, respectively.
- Valpo was picked to finish ninth in the preseason poll, based on a survey of the conference's head coaches, sports information directors and media. Missouri State was named the preseason favorite.

Wrapping Up 2018-2019

- Valpo moved up two spots in the standings from Year 1 to Year 2 in the Missouri Valley Conference while also earning its first Arch

Madness victory by beating Indiana State 77-55 in the opening round of the MVC Tournament.

- Valpo allowed 66.3 points per game, ranking 48th of 351 nationally in scoring defense.
- The team finished with 15 victories for the second straight season including nonconference triumphs over UNLV and George Washington. Valpo started 4-0 in Missouri Valley Conference play, but finished the year 15-18 overall and 7-11 in league action.

New Year, New Look

- Valpo has five returning letter winners after seven letter winners departed following the 2018-19 campaign.
- Valpo has 40.1 percent of its scoring and 35.7 percent of its rebounding back from last season.
- The five returning letter winners are Valpo's fewest since the 2013-14 campaign, when Jordan Coleman, LaVonte Dority, Bobby Capobianco and Vashil Fernandez were the only players back from the previous season.

Staff Sidebars

- Associate head coach Luke Gore is in his 18th year on staff and has served under four different head coaches. The Valpo veteran has helped the team to seven postseason berths in the last nine years and was on staff for the three winningest seasons in program history. He oversees the team's post players.
- Assistant coach Rob Holloway is back for his second season after spending the previous two years on staff at Eastern Illinois, his alma mater.
- Assistant coach Matt Bowen returned to Valpo's staff in 2018-19 after previously spending four seasons with the Brown & Gold from 2002-2006. He was the head coach at the University of Minnesota Duluth from 2012-2018.
- Director of Basketball Operations Jason Karys is in his first season in that capacity, but has been around the program in a variety of roles, spending two years as a graduate assistant, one as a walk-on player and three as a manager.
- Strength & Conditioning Coach Derek Bol is in his eighth season. He is a 2010 graduate of Iowa State.
- Graduate Assistant Peter Funk has taken that role after four years as an undergraduate manager.
- Athletic trainer Ken DeAngelis is in his first season full-time at Valpo after previously earning his master's degree from the University in 2012 while spending two years as a graduate assistant athletic trainer.

Tradition of Excellence

- Valpo has 14 NCAA Tournament appearances and four NIT berths in the program's proud history, with the team's postseason success highlighted by a Sweet Sixteen run in 1998.

- Peters won a championship with CSKA Moscow in Russia in 2018-19. He signed a one-year contract with Anadolu Efes in Turkish BSL on July 9, 2019.
- 2018 Valpo graduate Tevonn Walker plays for Hamburg in German BBL. Walker's classmate Max Joseph signed a contract with Nassjo Basket in Sweden following his time at Valpo.

- Keith Carter, who rounded out his Valpo career in 2016, played in the 2019 NBA Summer League with the Oklahoma City Thunder.
- Valpo has now produced 50 pro basketball players over the last 25 years.

#0 Javon Freeman-Liberty, So. (Chicago, Ill.)

- Poured in a team-high 28 points while equaling a career high with five steals on Dec. 3 at Eastern Michigan.
- Was named the MVC Player of the Week for the second time in a three-week span on Dec. 2.
- Started the season with seven straight games of 19 points or more, joining Alec Peters (2016-17) as the only Valpo players to accomplish that feat in that last 30 years. Saw that streak snapped when he scored 12 points in just 18 minutes on Nov. 27 vs. NAIA Trinity Christian.
- Averaged 25.0 points and 5.7 rebounds per game during three contests at the Paradise Jam event (Nov. 22-25), earning all-tournament team honors. His success came against three quality teams in Grand Canyon, Nevada and Cincinnati, including a career-high 32 points in an overtime defeat to the Bearcats on Nov. 25.

Matt Lottich

Head Coach 4th Season * Stanford, 2004 59-48 Overall and at Valpo

Matt Lottich enters his seventh season overall at Valparaiso University and fourth as the head coach of the men's basketball program in 2019-2020. He owns a 54-44 record in his first three seasons as head coach.

The 2018-2019 season saw Lottich lead Valpo to 15 wins. The season was headlined by road victories over UNLV and George Washington during the nonconference portion of the schedule, as well as a 4-0 start to Missouri Valley Conference play.

During 2018-2019, Lottich helped coach one of the top freshmen in program history, as Javon Freeman-Liberty was named to the MVC All-Defensive and All-Freshman Teams. Freeman-Liberty led the MVC in steals and moved into third on the program's single-season chart in the category, setting a new Valpo freshman record. Freeman-Liberty also scored the fourth-most points and grabbed the fifth-most rebounds by a freshman in program history.

Lottich led Valpo to 15 victories in his second season in charge in 2017-2018 and guided the team through the move to the MVC, which ended the campaign ranked eighth nationally in conference RPI.

In his first season at the helm of the Valpo men's basketball program, Lottich guided the team to its fifth Horizon League regular season championship in a six-year span as he led Valpo to 24 wins and an at-large berth into the NIT. Lottich's inaugural season as head coach was highlighted by a home win over a nationally-ranked Rhode Island squad as well as neutral-site triumphs over Alabama and BYU to capture the MGM Grand Main Event.

Lottich coached the Horizon League Player of the Year and an NABC Third Team All-American in Alec Peters, guiding the senior as he closed out one of the top careers in program history. Peters enjoyed his finest season as a senior, ranking among the Top 20 in the nation in both scoring and rebounding and breaking five of Valpo's career records.

Lottich was hired as the 22nd head coach of the Valpo men's basketball program in April 2016. After spending the previous three seasons on staff as an assistant coach, he became just the fifth Valpo head coach in a 36-year span.

Lottich arrived at Valparaiso University in summer 2013 and helped guide the team to 78 victories over his three seasons as an assistant. Valpo won two Horizon League regular season championships and one league tournament title over those three years.

The team recorded the top two victory totals in program history over Lottich's final two years as an assistant. Valpo broke the previous school record for wins in a season during the 2014-2015 campaign, winning 28 games and earning a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Then, the 2015-2016 season saw Valpo win a program-record 30 games and advance to the NIT championship game at Madison Square Garden.

Lottich brings nearly a decade of professional playing experience to the head coaching position at Valparaiso University. He spent eight years playing professionally in Japan for the Oita Heat Devils and the Osaka Evessa, earning All-Star recognition four times. He also played one season in Germany in the Bundesliga for the Dusseldorf Giants, played one season in New Zealand in the NBL for the Harbor Heat and was a member of the New Jersey Nets' summer league team in 2004.

Lottich played collegiately at Stanford University from 2000-2004. As a senior in 2003-2004, he helped lead the Cardinal to the Pac-10 title while earning NABC All-Star plaudits, awarded to the Top 15 seniors in college basketball. He was also a member of the Wooden Award midseason watch list and was an Honorable Mention All Pac-10 selection as a senior. Lottich was a member of the program's conference championship squad as a freshman in 2000-2001 and still ranks among Stanford's single-season and career leaders in 3-pointers made.

Off the court, Lottich came to Valpo from the National Collegiate Scouting Association, where he started in January 2013. Lottich ascended to the position of head scout during his time with the NCSA, which helps high school athletes navigate the world of college recruiting. Lottich also co-founded the TEAM Life Skills basketball camp in 2004 and spent nine years managing and developing the camp.

Lottich played his prep basketball at New Trier [III.] H.S., where he was named the Chicago Tribune Athlete of the Year in 2000 and holds the distinction of being the program's all-time leading scorer. Lottich graduated from Stanford University in 2004 and currently resides in Valparaiso with his wife, Kylan, and their four children: Grace, Matthan, Christian and Landon.
