Next Up in Crusader Basketball: 40 minutes stand in between Valparaiso and a trip to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004, as the Crusaders host Detroit at the Athletics-Recreation Center on Tuesday evening in the Horizon League Championship title game. The winner of Tuesday's game, which will be televised live nationally on ESPN, will earn the Horizon League's automatic bid to the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

Last Time Out: Valparaiso captured its second victory over Butler at the ARC in eight days, downing the Bulldogs 65-46 in front of a frenzied crowd Saturday evening in the second of two Horizon League Championship semifinals. The Crusaders got a monster effort from Horizon League Player of the Year Ryan Broekhoff, who posted the biggest of his 12 double-doubles on the season with game highs of 19 points and a career-high 16 rebounds.

Following the Crusaders: Every game this season will be available on the Valpo Sports Radio Network, with Tuesday's game broadcast live on WAKE ( 1500 AM, Valparaiso), WEFM (95.9 FM, Michigan City) and WJOB (1230 AM, Hammond). Todd Ickow is back for his 20th season on play-by-play, while Keaton Gillogly will join him on color commentary Tuesday. The game will also be broadcast live on ESPN, the fifth appearance for Valpo on the ESPN family of networks this season, with Mark Jones and Stephen Bardo on the call, while it also will be available nationally on the radio on Westwood One, with Dave Ryan and Pete Gillen calling the action. Links to the live VSRN audio webcast and video webcast (via ESPN3.com), as well as to live statistics and the Valpo Gameday interactive page, will also be available at www.valpoathletics.com.

Head Coach Bryce Drew: 2012 Horizon League Coach of the Year Bryce Drew made his head coaching debut at Arizona on Nov. 7, as he was named the 21 st head coach in the history of the Valparaiso men's basketball program on May 17, 2011. Just the fourth new head coach to grace the Crusader sidelines in the last 31 years, Drew had spent the last six seasons as a member of the Crusader coaching staff before earning the head position. He famously hit the game-winning shot against Ole Miss for Valpo in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament to cap an illustrious Crusader career, before going on to a seven-year professional career, six of which were spent in the NBA.

Series Notes: Valpo owns an 11-7 advantage in the all-time series over the Titans, but has been even more impressive since joining the Horizon League, winning eight of the 11 matchups, including the last five in a row. This season featured two Crusader victories, including a dramatic win at Detroit, capped by an end-to-end layup as the buzzer sounded by Erik Buggs, giving the Crusaders a $73-71$ win on Jan. 6. Will Bogan posted a career-high 23 points in that

contest, hitting 7-of-8 from behind the 3-point line. Then, at the ARC on Feb. 2, Valpo overcame a double-digit second-half deficit to come from behind for a 78-73 win, thanks in large part to a 6-of-6 effort from downtown by Ryan Broekhoff, who ended the night with a career-high 26 points.

The Road Ahead: No matter the result of Tuesday night's game, Valpo knows its season will continue in the postseason next week. The Crusaders will find out their destination on Sunday evening. With a victory against Detroit on Tuesday, Valpo will tune in to the NCAA Tournament selection show having earned the HL's automatic bid to the Big Dance. With a loss, the Crusaders would wait for the NIT pairings to come out later Sunday night to find out their next destination and opponent, as they have clinched an automatic berth into the NIT thanks to winning the regular season championship.

Scouting Detroit: The Titans enter Tuesday night's championship clash at 2113 on the season. Detroit was the third seed in the HL Championship, downing Loyola (80-71), Youngstown State (93-76) and Cleveland State (63-58) to advance to the title game. The Titans boast the highest-scoring offense in the Horizon League at 72.9 points per game, as four players average in double figures and a fifth averages better than nine points per contest. Detroit is led by First Team All-League honoree Ray McCallum, who posts 15.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game.

Title Games: Tuesday night marks Valparaiso's 11th appearance in a conference championship game at the Division I level, but the Crusaders' first since joining the Horizon League prior to the 2007-2008 campaign. All 10 of Valpo's previous title game appearances came in the Mid-Continent Conference, where it went 8-2 in the title games.

Third Time's Still the Charm: While the old coach's adage is that it is tough to beat a team three times in one year, Valparaiso has had no such problem doing so over the last 20 years. The Crusaders beat a pair of teams (Youngstown State, Detroit) in Horizon League Championship action last year that it already owned two wins against, and then this year beat Butler in the semifinals after sweeping the regular season, giving them a 17-2 record over the last 20 years when facing a team in postseason action that it defeated twice in the regular season. The Crusaders beat Detroit in both regular season matchups this year. A full list of such games can be found on page four of these notes.

Award Winners: The Horizon League announced its postseason award winners last week, and it was a haul unlike any for Valpo since the 2001-2002 campaign in the Mid-Con. Junior forward Ryan Broekhoff claimed the HL Player of the Year hardware, the first Crusader to be named Player of the Year since Lubos Barton in 01-02, while first-year head coach Bryce Drew was tabbed as Coach of the Year, Valpo's first such honor since Homer Drew earned the Mid-Con CoY award in 01-02. Meanwhile, junior forward Kevin Van Wijk joined Broekhoff on the All-League First Team, giving Valpo two First Team honorees for the first time since 01-02.

ever Valpo went 2-1 in both 2008 and 2011, advancing 2010.

Proficiency Inside the Arc: Valparaiso's success shooting from 2-point range has carried over into the 2011-2012 season. Last season, the Crusaders finished the year hitting $55.3 \%$ of their 2-point attempts, good for third nationally. So far this year, Valpo has connected at the exact same rate from inside, knocking down $55.3 \%$ of its tries from inside the arc, good for fifth nationally. In fact, of Valpo's seven rotation players who have been playing the entire season, all seven are hitting at least half of their 2-point attempts. Last time out in the semifinal victory over Butler, the Crusaders connected on 17 of their 27 attempts ( $63.0 \%$ ) from inside the arc.

Home Court Advantage: Valparaiso hopes to utilize its home court advantage to its full capacity during Tuesday's title game. In 15 regular season home games at the ARC this season, the Crusaders lost just twice, and are now 14-2 at the ARC following Saturday night's win over Butler, matching the program record for most home victories in a single season. Valpo now owns a 260-112 (.699) all-time record at the ARC, including a 207-47 (.815) mark over the last 18-plus years at home. The Crusaders are also guaranteed to finish well above .500 at home, which will mark the 19th consecutive season with at least a .500 record on their home court.

Finishing Close Games: One reason the Crusaders were able to win the league's regular season title was their ability to win the tight games. Valpo owns an 8-2 overall record this season in games decided by five or fewer points. Within Horizon League play, the Crusaders were $7-1$ in games decided by either five or fewer points or in overtime, and in fact have won their last six such games, including last Tuesday's clincher over Loyola.

Valpo Tabbed Fifth in Preseason Poll: Valparaiso was picked to finish in fifth place in the Horizon League preseason poll conducted of the league's coaches, sports information directors, and media members. The Crusaders tallied 255 points in the polling. Preseason league favorite Butler received 28 of the 50 first-place votes, while Detroit was picked second and received 19 first-place votes. Cleve-

land State ( 2 first-place votes) and Milwaukee ( 1 first-place vote) were chosen third and fourth ahead of the Crusaders, while Green Bay was just behind Valpo in sixth position. Youngstown State, Wright State, Loyola and UIC rounded out the polling in order.

A Look Back at 2010-2011: Valparaiso entered this season coming off of its tenth postseason appearance in the last 16 seasons, having earned a berth into the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT) last season. The Crusaders won 23 total games in 2010-2011, their greatest number of victories since the 20012002 season. Valpo also went 12-6 in Horizon League, posting its (then) best record in league play since entering the HL and finishing just one game out of a share of the regular season title.

High-Scoring Coaching Staff: Valparaiso boasts the third-highest scoring coaching staff in Division I basketball, as judged by points scored by the core four coaches at the Division I level. Head coach Bryce Drew scored 2,142 points at Valpo, while assistant coach Jake Diebler scored 826 points as a Crusader. Assistant coach Roger Powell Jr. added 1,178 points during his time at Illinois. Valpo's total of 4,146 Division I points trails just Tennessee and Auburn.

Shots From the Heart: Both Valpo head coach Bryce Drew and assistant coach Roger Powell Jr. participated in the 2nd Annual Shots From the Heart Tournament, in benefit of the Skip Prosser Foundation. The tournament was started

Drew was eliminated in the second round, while Powell fell in the third round.

A Lonely Banner: Each year's senior class has banners hung inside the ARC during their senior season, but this season, there is just one men's basketball banner hanging from the rafters. Walk-on guard Nick Shelton started the season as the lone member of this year's senior class, as fellow senior walk-on Nathan Stegelmann was added to the roster in mid-November.

Calling All Captains: With no scholarship seniors on this year's squad, Valpo looks to a trio of juniors to lead the way as the captains for the 2011-2012 team. Ryan Broekhoff, Erik Buggs and Matt Kenney will share the captaincy this season.

Short Bench: Valparaiso has had just 10 scholarship players who were eligible to play this season, and other than the games against Oakland and at Green Bay, the Crusaders have not had the full contingent of 10 all play in a single game. Prior to the Oakland game, Ben Boggs had to sit out the first semester after transferring in from Virginia Tech. The Crusaders are also without scholarship players Bobby Capobianco, who must sit out the entire season after transferring to Valpo from Indiana, and Vashil Fernandez, who will be sitting out this season.

A Set Rotation: Head coach Bryce Drew seems to have settled into a regular eight-man rotation as the Crusaders head into tournament play. Other than the disqualification of Richie Edwards after just four minutes at Milwaukee and an injury to Kevin Van Wijk at Cleveland State which forced him to miss the YSU and LMU games, over the last 16 games, all eight regulars have played at least 10 minutes in every game, while over the same stretch, only twice (Broekhoff at Wright State and against Loyola) has any Crusader been asked to play more than 35 minutes. Last time out in the victory over Butler, Broekhoff played 33 minutes, but was the only Crusader to play more than 28 minutes, as all eight regulars played at least 19 minutes each.

Player of the Year: HL Player of the Year Ryan Broekhoff leads the league in rebounding, averaging 8.7 rebounds per game, and has totaled 277 rebounds to date, already seventh-most in a single season in Crusader history and most by any Crusader since 1996. Broekhoff also ranks fourth in the league in scoring, posting 14.9 ppg , and has scored in double figures in 27 out of Valpo's 32 games. The junior forward easily leads the Horizon League with 12 doubledoubles following his monster effort against Butler, where he went for 19 points and a career-best 16 rebounds. The 12 double-doubles matches the most by a Valpo player the most by a Valpo player since Chris Ensminger had 16 such games during the 1995-1996 campaign.

Onward and Upward: Broekhoff's tremendous season also has him already moving up Valpo's all-time charts in a number of categories. The junior swatted a pair of shots Saturday against Butler and now is tied for ninth all-time at Valpo with 72 career blocked shots. Broekhoff also made two triples on Saturday, giving him 166 career 3-pointers, seventh-most all-time. With Broekhoff's career-best 16 rebounds on Saturday, he now has 588 career rebounds as well, jumping two spots on Valpo's career chart to 14th all-time.

Doing Work in the Post: First Team All-HL honoree Kevin Van Wijk has been a stalwart for the Crusaders in the paint all season long. Van Wijk ranks fifth in the league in scoring ( 14.3 ppg ) and easily leads the league in field goal percentage, hitting $62.4 \%$ of his shots, good for fifth nationally. The two-time HL Player of the Week has had just four games all season in which he hit less than half of his field goal attempts and scored in double figures on 25 occasions, including six efforts of $20+$ points. In the win over Butler on Saturday, Van Wijk went 4-for-7 from the floor for 11 points and also pulled down seven rebounds.

Buggs Picks Up Scoring Load: While Broekhoff and Van Wijk have been scoring in double figures most of the season, the Crusaders' third double-figure scorer in the win over Butler on Saturday was somewhat of a surprise. Redshirt junior guard Erik Buggs stepped up with just his third double-digit output of the season on Saturday, scoring 11 points on 4 -of- 7 shooting from the floor. Buggs, whose season high also came against Butler earlier this season (13 points) hit two of his three 3-point attempts, matching his total season output from beyond the arc entering the game.

Production From the Bench: Valpo's eight-man rotation features a trio of legitimate scoring threats coming off the bench in Richie Edwards, Jay Harris and Matt Kenney, who rank third, fourth and sixth on the team, respectively, in scoring. In the Butler win, Harris knocked down a pair of huge second half 3-pointers en route to nine points, while Edwards scored eight points. The trio has averaged 25.8 ppg for the Crusaders this season.

# Bryce Drew Head Coach 1st Season Valparaiso, 1998 

Valparaiso University director of athletics Mark LaBarbera announced at a press conference on the Valparaiso campus on May 17, 2011 that Bryce Drew has been hired as the 21st head coach in the history of the Crusader men's basketball program.

Drew, the most decorated player in Crusader men's basketball history, spent the last six seasons prior to his hiring as head coach as a member of the Valparaiso coaching staff, including the last five years as associate head coach under outgoing head coach Dr. Homer Drew. Drew, who has helped guide Valpo through their transition into a top-ten league in the Horizon League, becomes just the fourth new head coach of the Crusader men's basketball program in the last 31 years.

Drew joined the Valparaiso coaching staff prior to the 2005-2006 season, and over his six seasons on the bench helped lead the Crusaders to 102 victories. With Drew on the staff, Valpo moved into the Horizon League in 2007-2008 and returned to the postseason with a trip to the College Basketball Invitational, where it won its first-round game at Washington. This past season, Drew helped guide the Crusaders to 23 victories, their highest win total in ten seasons. This year's Valpo squad finished just one game back of a share of the Horizon League regular season championship, and earned a postseason berth in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament while receiving votes in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll for four consecutive weeks.

Over his tenure as a member of the Crusader coaching staff, Drew has coached 13 players who have gone on to play professional basketball overseas. He has helped coach Valparaiso as it has led the Horizon League in scoring twice, while the Crusaders paced the conference this past season in defensive field goal percentage in league play. Valparaiso also set the Horizon League single-season record for 3-pointers made (330) during the 2007-2008 season. Drew has been recognized among the league's and nation's top assistant coaches by Hoop Scoop and Jeff Goodman of FoxSports.com and also has been named among the Top Recruiters of Chicago by the Chicago Sun-Times.

As a student-athlete, Drew cemented himself as the best player in Valparaiso men's basketball history. Drew, who arrived at Valpo after earning Indiana Mr. Basketball honors and being named Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year in 1994, began his career by garnering MidContinent Conference Newcomer of the Year and Mid-Con Tournament MVP honors as a freshman. Drew, a four time All-Conference honoree, shined during the conference tournaments, earning All-Tournament Team honors each of his four seasons and picking up three Mid-Continent Conference Tournament MVP awards. He was also twice decorated as Mid-Con Most Valuable Player, one of only four players to be so honored twice in their career. Drew's career culminated as a senior by being named a Third Team All-American by the Basketball Times.

In addition to his individual accolades, Drew led the Crusaders to four Mid-Continent Conference regular season championships, four tournament titles and three trips to the NCAA Tournament. Drew, the career leader in points $(2,142)$, three-point field goals (364) and assists (626) at Valpo, etched his name into the American consciousness in 1998 when he hit "The Shot" in the Opening Round of the NCAA Tournament to beat Ole Miss. The play, in which Drew caught a tip pass from teammate Bill Jenkins off a full-court feed from Jamie Skyes, won Drew an ESPY award and gave Valpo its first NCAA Tournament win in school history, propelling the Crusaders to the Sweet Sixteen.

Drew also excelled internationally during his time on the court with the Crusaders, playing for the gold-medal winning Team USA at the World University Games in 1997. Following his collegiate career, Drew again made school history when the Houston Rockets drafted him with the 16th pick in the 1998 NBA Draft, the first time a Crusader had been chosen in the first round. Drew's NBA career lasted six seasons with the Rockets, Chicago Bulls, and Charlotte and New Orleans Hornets, with his best season coming in 2000-2001 when he started 41 games for the Bulls, averaging 6.3 points and 3.9 assists per game. A prolific shooter, Drew set a Hornet record when he connected on nine consecutive threepoint attempts. Twice as a pro, he competed in the postseason, with Houston in 1999 and again in 2002 as a member of the Charlotte Hornets.

Over the course of his NBA career, Drew scored over 1,000 points and made $37 \%$ of his three-point attempts. In 1999, he was honored by the NBA with the Henry P. Iba Citizen Athlete Award for sportsmanship. Drew played alongside 12 NBA All-Stars during his time in the NBA, including three players who were named among the Top 50 NBA Players of All Time. He also played under a quintet of head coaches who have combined for five NBA Championship rings. Following his six seasons in the NBA, Drew played professionally overseas for a season, playing for Reggio Calabria (Italian Serie A) and Pamesa Valencia (Spanish Liga ACB) before returning to the States to join the Crusader coaching staff.

Drew is twice a member of the Valparaiso University Hall of Fame, as he was inducted as an individual in 2003 and as part of the 1997-1998 Sweet Sixteen team in 2009. He also has been honored as one of the 150 most influential people in Valparaiso University's 150 years.

Drew graduated from Valparaiso in 1998 with a degree in sports management and a minor in business. He and his wife Tara currently reside in Valparaiso.
