Next Up in Crusader Basketball: The Valparaiso men's basketball team faces a ranked opponent for the first time this season as the Crusaders fly out to Albuquerque to take on #18/20 New Mexico Saturday evening. The game can be seen live on Root Sports Rocky Mountain (DirecTV - 683; Dish - 414).

Last Time Out: Valparaiso held IPFW to just three points over an 11-plus minute stretch of the second half, a stretch in which the Crusaders pushed its advantage into double figures as Valpo went on to a 63-52 victory over the Mastodons Wednesday evening at the Athletics-Recreation Center. Ryan Broekhoff paced the Crusaders with 21 points and nine rebounds.

Head Coach Bryce Drew: Bryce Drew returns for his second season at the helm of the Valparaiso men's basketball program in 2012-2013 after leading the Crusaders to the Horizon League regular season title in his first year as head coach. Drew was named the Horizon League Coach of the Year after guiding Valpo to a 22-win campaign, including a 14-4 mark within the league to capture the title by two games. Drew ascended to the head coaching position on May 17, 2011 after spending six seasons as an assistant and associate head coach with the Crusaders.

Series Notes: Valpo and New Mexico have faced off just once before in program history, a neutral-site matchup at the Motor City Tournament in Detroit, Mich. that the Lobos won, 80-76, on Dec. 29, 1959. The Crusaders are 11-19 all-time against current members of the Mountain West Conference, with 23 of those 30 meetings coming against Air Force.

@ValpoBasketball...

...and the @HorizonLeague

- @ValpoBasketball has been picked to win the @HorizonLeague regular season title.

- The Crusaders received 40 of the 44 first-place votes in the #HLMBB preseason poll.

- This marks the first season since 2002-03 (Mid-Con) that @ValpoBasketball has been preseason league favorites.

- The Crusaders were the only team to place two players on the #HLMBB preseason First Team All-League as well.

...nationally

- @ValpoBasketball has also been tabbed the preseason @HorizonLeague favorite by @CBSSports and @AthlonSports, among others.

- The Crusaders were ranked seventh in the preseason Mid-Major Power Rankings by NBC Sports College Basketball Talk (@CBTonNBC).

- @ValpoBasketball is currently ranked 16th in the Mid-Major Top 25 poll, voted on by mid-major coaches and produced by @CollegeInsider.

- @ValpoBasketball earned 3 points in the preseason @AP_Top25 poll.

- The Crusaders had not received votes in a national poll since a 4-week stretch near the end of the 2010-11 season in the coaches poll.

...looking back at last year

- @ValpoBasketball claimed its first @HorizonLeague regular season title in 2011-12, winning the crown by two games.

- The Crusaders earned the right to host the #HLMBB postseason tournament by winning the regular season and advanced to the championship game.

- @ValpoBasketball played at Miami in the first round of the postseason NIT, the Crusaders' 11th postseason trip in the last 17 years.

- The Crusaders won 22 games overall in 2011-12, their 12th 20win season in the last 19 years.

- @ValpoBasketball boasted the #HLMBB Coach of the Year (Drew), Player of the Year (Broekhoff) and a second First Team selection (Van Wijk).

...looking ahead

- Following a week break for final exams, @ValpoBasketball will play two games in three days at Missouri State and at Oakland.

- The Crusaders then return home to take on IUPUI and Purdue Calumet before the Christmas holiday.

Lockdown Defense

- The win over IPFW was highlighted by lockdown defense from @ValpoBasketball.

- The Crusaders gave up just 3 points in an 11-plus minute stretch of the second half and just 20 total second-half points.

- Valpo is giving up just 52.4 points per game at home this year, surrendering just 0.82 points per possession in those games.

Facing Ranked Teams

- The game against New Mexico will be Valpo's first of the season against a ranked opponent.

- @ValpoBasketball has taken on at least one ranked opponent in each season since the 2000-2001 campaign.

- The Crusaders are looking for their first win over a ranked team since beating Ole Miss in the 1998 NCAA Tournament.

#WinningTrophies

- The Crusaders won the Valparaiso Division of the Joe Cipriano Nebraska Classic with their victories Thanksgiving weekend over CSU and B-CU.

- @ValpoBasketball has now claimed three in-season tournament titles over the last three seasons.

- The Crusaders previously won the Las Vegas Invitational Upper Division and the Lou Henson Award Tournament in 2010.

Taking Advantage of Charity

- The Crusaders went 34-for-41 from the free throw line in the overtime win over Kent State.

- @ValpoBasketball had not hit 34 free throws in a single game since a Feb. 8, 1997 win over Northeastern Illinois.

- Kevin Van Wijk (13-14) and Erik Buggs (7-9) both set new career highs for free throws made against the Flashes.

- The Crusaders were outshot from the FT line for the first time this year against IPFW, hitting 72% (18-25) vs. the Mastodons' 75% (15-20).

#BeatingTheBuzzer

- Kevin Van Wijk put back a missed free throw with 1.3 seconds left to send the Crusaders into overtime with Kent State on Nov. 18.

- Erik Buggs made his first free throw with 4.7 seconds left to cut the deficit to two points before Van Wijk's putback.

- @ValpoBasketball had just a 7.5% chance to win following 2 KSU FTs with 7.2 seconds left, according to @kenpomeroy.

- It was the first buzzer-beater for @ValpoBasketball since Buggs' coast-to-coast layup to win at Detroit last season.

- The last four buzzer-beaters to win or send games to overtime for @ValpoBasketball have all come at the basket, dating back to 2007.

Gallimaufry

- @ValpoBasketball gave up just 150 points total through the season's first three games.

- The 150 points is the fewest combined given up by a Valpo team in its first three games since moving to Division I.

- Valpo allowed 50 points or less in back-to-back games for the first time since Jan. 2003 (NIU 46, Nebraska 50).

- The 50 points scored by Nebraska was the fewest @ValpoBasketball has given up in a loss since Jan. 16, 1984 vs. Western Illinois (41-40).

Valpo defeated Georgia Southern by 31 points in its opener, its largest season-opening win over a D-I school since moving to D-I.
The Crusaders followed with a 23-point win over Northern Illinois, their first back-to-back 20+ point wins since Dec. of 2009.

- With the win over Kent State, Valpo has now won three straight OT games and is 6-2 in extra time since the start of the 2010-2011 season.

- Valpo hit 13-of-24 from behind the 3-point line in each of its first two games of the season.

- Valpo hit over 50% from behind the arc in consecutive games for the first time since Jan. 2007 (11-20 vs. IUPUI, 12-16 at WIU).

@ValpoBasketball has ranked among the top-5 in the nation in 2-point pct. each of the last 2 years, both years hitting above 55%.
The Crusaders have ranked in the top-5 in the nation in 2-point pct. despite not having a regular taller than 6'8" either season.

Connections

- Saturday's game against New Mexico has a number of connections between the two squads.

Both squads are coached by former Indiana Mr. Basketball selections - Bryce Drew for Valpo and Steve Alford for New Mexico.
Valpo's Ryan Broekhoff and New Mexico's Hugh Greenwood played together at the Australian Institute of Sport.

- Alford played his collegiate basketball at Indiana, where Valpo redshirt junior Bobby Capobianco played his first two seasons.

@UNMLobos

- New Mexico enters Saturday's game a perfect 9-0 on the year, most recently earning a 75-67 win over USC on Wednesday.

- The Lobos won the Paradise Jam championship, defeating UConn in the championship game, 66-60.

- Valpo is the second Horizon League team the Lobos have taken on this year (W 66-59 over UIC at the Paradise Jam).

- New Mexico has three players averaging in double figures, led by 14.1 ppg from Kendall Williams.

- Alex Kirk adds 11.7 points per game and leads the team on the boards, grabbing 8.8 rebounds per contest.

Bryce Drew

- Bryce Drew is in his second season as head coach of @ValpoBasketball and is in his eighth season overall on the coaching staff.

- Drew was named #HLMBB Coach of the Year in 2011-12 in his first season as head coach.

- Drew was the first Crusader men's basketball Coach of the Year since 2001-02, when dad Homer won the honor in the Mid-Con.

- Drew led the Crusaders to 22 wins and the @HorizonLeague regular season title in his first year at the helm.

- Prior to coaching, Drew spent seven seasons playing professionally, including six seasons in the NBA.

- Drew was a two-time Mid-Con MVP in his playing days with @ValpoBasketball, helping the team to three NCAA tournament appearances.

- Drew hit "The Shot", a buzzer-beating 3-pointer in the first round of the 1998 NCAA tournament, to lift the Crusaders over @OleMissMBB.

#DrewFamilyDynasty

- Bryce is the third member of the Drew family to serve as head coach of @ValpoBasketball.

- Father Homer was head coach from 1988-2002, and then returned to lead Valpo from 2003-11.

- Brother Scott (current head coach of @BaylorMBB) led the Crusaders during the 2002-03 season after nine seasons as an assistant under Homer.

- A Drew has been at the helm of the Crusaders for the last 24+ years. #DrewFamilyDynasty

- The Drew family has combined to lead @ValpoBasketball to 419 victories and 11 postseason appearances. #DrewFamilyDynasty

- Overall, the trio of Drews owns 850 collegiate victories over a combined 43+ seasons of head coaching. #DrewFamilyDynasty

- @ValpoBasketball boasts one of the nation's highest-scoring staffs, as a trio of coaches combined for 4,146 points during their D-I careers.

- Head coach Bryce Drew scored 2,142 points during his fouryear career with the Crusaders.

- Assistant coach Jake Diebler also suited up for four years with @ValpoBasketball, scoring 826 points.

- Assistant coach Roger Powell Jr. tallied 1,178 points during his four-year career with @IlliniHoops.

- Assistant coach Luke Gore also played collegiately at NAIA Bethel [Tenn.] College.

Ryan Broekhoff

Honors

- Ryan Broekhoff was named the #HLMBB Player of the Year in 2011-12 after helping guide @ValpoBasketball to the regular season title.

- Broekhoff was also named an Honorable Mention All-American by the @AP.

- Broekhoff has been picked as a Preseason First Team All-@HorizonLeague member entering his senior season.

- Broekhoff was chosen as a preseason Third Team Mid Major All-American by NBC Sports College Basketball Talk (@CBTonNBC).

- Broekhoff appeared on @CBSSports lists by @jeffborzello of the nation's top-30 under-the-radar players (#6) and top-50 wings (#43).

- Broekhoff also was picked as the nation's #28 shooter by @goodman_CBS on his list of top-50 shooters.

Playing Overseas

- Broekhoff was selected to the Australian Boomers squad, Australia's senior national team, in the summer of 2012.

- Broekhoff was one of 25 players called into the 2012 @aussieboomers squad to try out for the Olympic team.

- Broekhoff was on the 12-man roster for the @aussieboomers YouYi Games series against China, making his senior international debut.

- Broekhoff saw 23 minutes of action for @aussieboomers in the three-game series, scoring four points and grabbing a pair of rebounds.

- Broekhoff was one of 15 finalists for Australia's 12-man Olympic squad.

- Broekhoff previously represented Australia in the World University Games (2011) and the @FIBA U19 World Championships (2009).

This Season

- Broekhoff was named @HorizonLeague co-Player of the Week for his role in a pair of wins Thanksgiving weekend.

- Broekhoff matched his career high in the first half alone in the win over Bethune-Cookman, scoring 26 points (7-8 FG, 3-3 3PT, 9-9 FT).

- Broekhoff ended the win over the Wildcats with 30 points and seven rebounds.

- Broekhoff scored 16 of Valpo's 23 first-half points in the win over Northern Illinois, ending the game with 20 points and 13 rebounds.

- Last time out, Broekhoff led all players with 21 points and nine rebounds in the win over IPFW.

- Broekhoff is among the league's top-five in FT% (3rd, .917), rebounding (3rd, 7.4), and scoring (4th, 16.6).

- Broekhoff moved into @ValpoBasketball's all-time top-20 in career points at Saint Louis and now ranks 17th with 1,207 career points.

- Broekhoff also ranks 10th in Crusader history in rebounds (660), 7th in blocks (76), 3rd in 3-pointers (187) and 7th in FT% (.801).

Last Season

- Broekhoff led @ValpoBasketball, averaging 14.9 points and 8.5 rebounds per game in 2011-12.

- Broekhoff led the @HorizonLeague in rebounding and finished fourth in the league in scoring.

- Broekhoff's total of 290 rebounds on the year is sixth-highest in a single season in program history.

- Broekhoff became the 31st player in @ValpoBasketball history to score 1,000 career points, surpassing the milestone Feb. 17 at @LMULions.

Kevin Van Wijk

- Van Wijk was named a Preseason First Team All @HorizonLeague choice entering the 2012-13 season.

- Van Wijk set a career high with 25 points (6-8 FG, 13-14 FT) in the OT win over Kent State, including the game-tying putback.

- Van Wijk's 13 free throw makes against the Flashes also were a new career high.

- Van Wijk combined for 31 points and 16 rebounds in the Crusaders' pair of victories Thanksgiving weekend.

Van Wijk has led Valpo in four games this year - 10 points at Saint Louis, 16 points vs. Georgia Southern, 20 points at Nebraska.
Van Wijk is coming off a junior season where he was named a First Team All-League selection.

- Van Wijk ranked second on @ValpoBasketball in scoring (14.1 ppg) in 2011-12 and also averaged 5.2 rebounds per game.

- Van Wijk led all #HLMBB players with a 61.7% FG pct, good for fifth in the nation and third-best in a single season in Crusader history.

- Van Wijk was twice named @HorizonLeague Player of the Week (Jan. 16 and Nov. 21).

Erik Buggs

- Buggs opened the season with a career-high nine assists to go with six points in the Crusaders' win over Georgia Southern.

- Buggs tallied seven more assists in Valpo's victory over Northern Illinois, and added six assists in the win over Chicago State.

- Buggs came up just one point shy of his career high with 15 points in the OT win at Kent State.

- Buggs scored seven points and handed out three assists without a turnover in 32 minutes last time out against IPFW.

- Buggs currently is ninth in @ValpoBasketball history with 334 career assists.

- Buggs led the Crusaders last year with 103 assists, ranking tenth in the @HorizonLeague.

- Buggs also ranked among the top-10 of #HLMBB players in ast/turnover ratio (1.4, 7th) and steals/gm (1.2, 10th).

Matt Kenney

- Kenney scored all 16 of his points in the win over Northern Illinois in the second half.

- Kenney was a perfect 6-for-6 from the floor (3-for-3 from 3-point range) over a span of 9:31 against the Huskies.

- Kenney filled up the stat sheet in the OT win at Kent State, finishing with 16 points, six rebounds and five assists.

- Kenney matched his career high with seven assists while not committing a turnover in the Crusaders' win vs. Chicago State.

- Kenney currently is ranked 17th in @ValpoBasketball history with 256 career assists.

- Kenney averaged 7.3 points and 4.5 rebounds per game as a junior for the Crusaders in 2011-12.

- Kenney came off the bench for his final 19 games of the season, but still finished second on the team with 27.8 minutes/gm.

Will Bogan

- Bogan connected on three 3-pointers for 11 points in Valpo's win over Bethune-Cookman to cap the Nebraska Classic.

- Bogan started 32 games in his first season with @ValpoBasketball in 2011-12, averaging 7.2 points per game.

- Bogan ranked second among Crusaders with 61 3-pointers and hit from downtown at a 40.9% clip.

- Bogan's 3-point percentage ranked seventh in the Horizon League and is tied for ninth-best in a single season in @ValpoBasketball history.

- Bogan currently ranks tenth in Crusader history with a career 3-point percentage of 40.3%.

- Bogan was named @ValpoAthletics male newcomer of the year by Valpo's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

- Bogan made a career-high seven 3-pointers and scored 24 points in the Crusaders' win at Detroit Jan. 6, 2012.

Ben Boggs

- Boggs posted nine points and tied a caerer high with eight rebounds in the Crusaders' win over Chicago State.

- Boggs connected on back-to-back 3-pointers to give Valpo a double-digit lead for good in its win over Northern Illinois.

- Boggs became eligible after the end of the first semester last year for @ValpoBasketball and appeared in 24 games, starting 20.

- Boggs averaged 4.5 points and 3.2 rebounds per game for the Crusaders, who were 14-6 in his starts.

- Boggs shot better than 80% from the free throw line in his first season with Valpo, second-best on the team.

Bobby Capobianco

Capobianco debuted for Valpo against Chicago State after missing the Crusaders' first four regular season games due to injury.
Capobianco doubled up in his debut, posting 10 points and grabbing 11 rebounds, including six offensive, against the Cougars.
Capobianco's double-double was the first in a Valpo debut since

Mohamed Kone vs. IPFW on Nov. 23, 2005 (15 pts, 11 reb).

- Capobianco led @ValpoBasketball in scoring in both exhibitions, scoring 19 points against St. Joe's and 21 points against Robert Morris.

- Capobianco also grabbed eight rebounds in each exhibition game, leading the Crusaders in the win over Robert Morris.

- Capobianco combined to shoot 13-for-20 from inside the arc and 11-for-12 from the free throw line in the two exhibitions.

- Capobianco played his first two seasons at @IndianaMBB and sat out last season after transferring to @ValpoBasketball.

Bryce Drew Head Coach 2nd Season 27-14 overall - 27-14 at Valpo Valparaiso, 1998

Head coach Bryce Drew returns for his second season at the helm of the Valparaiso men's basketball program in 2012-2013 after leading the Crusaders to the Horizon League regular season title in his first year as head coach. Drew led Valpo to 22 victories in his rookie season at the reins, including a 14-4 mark in Horizon League play to capture the league regular season title by two games. He also guided the Crusaders to the Postseason NIT as the program earned a postseason berth for the 11th time in the last 17 seasons. Drew was honored as the Horizon

League Coach of the Year for his efforts on the bench, while he coached two First Team All-League selections in Kevin Van Wijk and Ryan Broekhoff, the latter of whom was named the league Player of the Year and an Honorable Mention All-American.

Valparaiso University director of athletics Mark LaBarbera announced at a press conference on the Valparaiso campus on May 17, 2011 that Drew had been hired as the 21st head coach in the history of the Crusader men's basketball program. Drew, the most decorated player in Crusader men's basketball history, spent the six seasons prior to his hiring as head coach as a member of the Valparaiso coaching staff, including the previous five years as associate head coach. Drew, who helped guide Valpo through their transition into a top-ten league in the Horizon League, became just the fourth new head coach of the Crusader men's basketball program in the last 31 years.

Drew joined the Valparaiso coaching staff prior to the 2005-2006 season, and over his six seasons on the bench as an assistant/associate helped lead the Crusaders to 102 victories. With Drew on the staff, Valpo moved into the Horizon League in 2007-2008 and returned to the postseason with a trip to the College Basketball Invitational, where it won its first-round game at Washington. In his final season as associate head coach, he helped guide the Crusaders to 23 wins and a postseason berth in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament while receiving votes in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll for four consecutive weeks.

Over his tenure as a member of the Crusader coaching staff, Drew has coached 13 players who have gone on to play professional basketball overseas. He has helped coach Valparaiso as it has led the Horizon League in scoring twice, while the Crusaders paced the conference this past season in defensive field goal percentage in league play. Valparaiso also set the Horizon League single-season record for 3-pointers made (330) during the 2007-2008 season. Drew was recognized among the league's and nation's top assistant coaches by Hoop Scoop and Jeff Goodman of FoxSports.com and also has been named among the Top Recruiters of Chicago by the Chicago Sun-Times.

As a student-athlete, Drew cemented himself as the best player in Valparaiso men's basketball history. Drew, who arrived at Valpo after earning Indiana Mr. Basketball honors and being named Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year in 1994, began his career by garnering Mid-Continent Conference Newcomer of the Year and Mid-Con Tournament MVP honors as a freshman. Drew, a four time All-Conference honoree, shined during the conference tournaments, earning All-Tournament Team honors each of his four seasons and picking up three Mid-Continent Conference Tournament MVP awards. He was also twice decorated as Mid-Con Most Valuable Player, one of only four players to be so honored twice in their career. Drew's career culminated as a senior by being named a Third Team All-American by the Basketball Times.

In addition to his individual accolades, Drew led the Crusaders to four Mid-Continent Conference regular season championships, four tournament titles and three trips to the NCAA Tournament. Drew, the career leader in points (2,142), three-point field goals (364) and assists (626) at Valpo, etched his name into the American consciousness in 1998 when he hit "The Shot" in the Opening Round of the NCAA Tournament to beat Ole Miss. The play, in which Drew caught a tip pass from teammate Bill Jenkins off a full-court feed from Jamie Skyes, won Drew an ESPY award and gave Valpo its first NCAA Tournament win in school history, propelling the Crusaders to the Sweet Sixteen.

Drew also excelled internationally during his time on the court with the Crusaders, playing for the gold-medal winning Team USA at the World University Games in 1997. Following his collegiate career, Drew again made school history when the Houston Rockets drafted him with the 16th pick in the 1998 NBA Draft, the first time a Crusader had been chosen in the first round. Drew's NBA career lasted six seasons with the Rockets, Chicago Bulls, and Charlotte and New Orleans Hornets, with his best season coming in 2000-2001 when he started 41 games for the Bulls, averaging 6.3 points and 3.9 assists per game. A prolific shooter, Drew set a Hornet record when he connected on nine consecutive three-point attempts. Twice as a pro, he competed in the postseason, with Houston in 1999 and again in 2002 as a member of the Charlotte Hornets.

Over the course of his NBA career, Drew scored over 1,000 points and made 37% of his three-point attempts. In 1999, he was honored by the NBA with the Henry P. Iba Citizen Athlete Award for sportsmanship. Drew played alongside 12 NBA All-Stars during his time in the NBA, including three players who were named among the Top 50 NBA Players of All Time. He also played under a quintet of head coaches who have combined for five NBA Championship rings. Following his six seasons in the NBA, Drew played professionally overseas for a season, playing for Reggio Calabria (Italian Serie A) and Pamesa Valencia (Spanish Liga ACB) before returning to the States to join the Crusader coaching staff.

Drew is twice a member of the Valparaiso University Hall of Fame, as he was inducted as an individual in 2003 and as part of the 1997-1998 Sweet Sixteen team in 2009. He also has been honored as one of the 150 most influential people in Valparaiso University's 150 years.

Drew graduated from Valparaiso in 1998 with a degree in sports management and a minor in business. He and his wife Tara currently reside in Valparaiso.


