## Valparaiso (9-8, 1-1 Horizon)

 Game \#18-Friday, Jan. 10-8 p.m. Wright State (9-8, 1-1 Horizon) Athletics-Recreation Center $(5,000)$ - Valparaiso, Ind.Next Up in Crusader Basketball: A rematch of the 2013 Horizon League Championship title game is on the docket Friday evening from the ARC, as Valparaiso hosts Wright State, live on ESPNU. The Crusaders swept the season series from the Raiders last season, including a 62-54 win to earn the league title.

Last Time Out: Valparaiso led Oakland Saturday evening in Rochester, Mich. $61-50$ as the clock ticked under 10 minutes to play, but the Golden Grizzlies used five 3-pointers over the last six minutes to out-score the Crusaders 25-9 the rest of the way as Valpo suffered its first Horizon League loss of the year, 75-70. Lavonte Dority led five Crusaders in double figures with 20 points.

Head Coach Bryce Drew: Bryce Drew (57-28) is in his third season at the helm of the Valparaiso men's basketball program in 2013-14. Over his first two-plus seasons, Drew has led the Crusaders to 57 victories, including a school-record 26 last season, as well as two Horizon League regular season titles and one tournament championship. The 2012 HL Coach of the Year, Drew ascended to the head coaching position on May 17, 2011 after spending six seasons as an assistant and associate head coach with the Crusaders.

Series Notes: The Crusaders and Raiders have faced off 22 times in program history, with each team winning 11 of the matchups. Valpo owns a 9-6 advantage in the series since joining the Horizon League. The Crusaders won the first three games after joining the league before Wright State won five in a row. Valpo is on a streak of winning six of the last seven matchups, including a trio of single-digit victories last season, the last of which came in the league title game. But of the four Crusaders who were part of last year's team, they only combined for 16 points over those three games (Dority 9; Capobianco 7)

## @ ValpoBasketball...

## ...and the @HorizonLeague

- @ValpoBasketball has won the \#HLMBB regular season title each of the last two years and claimed the tournament title last year.
- The Crusaders were picked to finish in sixth place in the league standings in 2013-14 in preseason polling.
- After having a pair of All-League honorees the last two years, Valpo was one of just two teams not to have a preseason AllLeague choice.
...looking back at last year
- @ ValpoBasketball won its first \#HLMBB tournament championship last year and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004.
- The Crusaders claimed their second straight Horizon League regular season title in 2012-13, going 13-3 in league play.
- Valpo earned a 14 seed in the Midwest Region of the NCAA Tournament, falling to Michigan State in second round action, 65-54.
- The Crusaders set new program records for total wins (26), home wins (16) and Division I true road wins (10) last year.
- Ryan Broekhoff was a First Team All-League and All-Region honoree, while Kevin Van Wijk earned Second Team honors both places. - Lavonte Dority was tabbed the Horizon League's Sixth Man of the Year.
...looking ahead
- @ValpoBasketball continues league play next time out on the road at Detroit on Wednesday, Jan. 15.
- The Crusaders then return to the ARC for a regionally-televised game against Milwaukee Saturday afternoon, Jan. 18.
...at the ARC
- @ ValpoBasketball has 16 regular season home games scheduled for the ARC in 2013-14. \#ValpoGameday
- The Crusaders set a new record for home victories in 2012-13, going 16-2 at the ARC last season.
- Valpo owns a 7-2 mark at home this year, with the losses coming in triple overtime to Mercer and on a buzzer-beater to Saint Louis.
- Over the last 19+ years, @ValpoBasketball owns a 228-51 (.817)
record on its home court.


## Home vs. Road Splits

- @ValpoBasketball has been a markedly more effective team at the ARC this year than when it plays on the road.
- The Crusaders score 87.8 ppg at home, shoot $51.8 \%$ FG and $40.6 \%$ 3 PT and out-rebound opponents by 10 rpg .
- Meanwhile, on the road, Valpo scores just 68.4 ppg and shoots just $44.4 \% \mathrm{FG}$ and $35.3 \%$ 3PT, contributing to a 1-6 road mark.
- Last year's Crusader team was the first in a decade to finish at or above .500 in true road games.


## Second-Half Success

- Up until last game at Oakland, @ ValpoBasketball has been a much better team in the second half this year.
- Last time out against the Grizzlies, the Crusaders were up 44-33 at the half before being outscored 42-26 in teh second half.
- Trailing by eight at the half, the Crusaders outscored UIC 55-32 in the second half in last Thursday night's win.
- The Crusaders have outscored opponents by nearly nine points per game (43.1-34.5) in the second half this season.
- Valpo shoots $51.9 \% \mathrm{FG}$ and $43.3 \%$ 3PT in the second halves of games as opposed to $46.1 \% \mathrm{FG}$ and $37.1 \%$ 3PT in first halves.
- The Crusaders have also committed 60 fewer turnovers (157-97) in the second halves of games.


## 30 Points Twice

- Freshman forward Alec Peters scored 30 points for the second time this season in the @ValpoBasketball win over Loyola Marymount.
- Peters matched the Valpo Division I freshman scoring record he tied earlier this season, originally set by Raitis Grafs in 1999-2000. - Peters is one of just five Crusaders (Bryce Drew, Dan Oppland, Brandon Wood, Cory Johnson) to score 30+ points multiple times in their career over the last 18 years.
- Peters is the first of that group of five to do so as a freshman, having previously done so at Evansville as well.


## 10 More Years

- @ValpoBasketball announced last month that it had reached an agreement with Bryce Drew on a new, 10-year contract.
- The deal would keep Drew as the Crusaders' head coach through the 2022-23 campaign.
- Drew is one of just three coaches in \#HLMBB history to win regular season titles in each of their first two seasons as a head coach.
- Drew currently sits as the fourth-winningest coach in \#HLMBB history in terms of career winning percentage as well.


## Triple-Overtime Classic

- @ValpoBasketball matched the longest game in program history, going triple-overtime earlier this year in its 117-108 loss to Mercer. - The Crusaders had two previous triple-overtime games in program history: $1 / 28 / 85$ vs. SW Missouri St. and 3/7/94 vs. Western Illinois. - Valpo won both its previous 3OT games, with the win over WIU coming in the Mid-Con championship game.


## High-Scoring Affair

- The 117-108 loss to Mercer marked a number of scoring milestones @ValpoBasketball fans haven't seen for a while.
- It was the first time both teams have reached triple figures in a Valpo game since a 103-102 win at Oakland on 12/21/10.
- It marked the most points by the Crusaders against a D-I opponent since a 118-83 victory over Chicago State on 3/3/96.
- It matched the most combined points in a Valpo game since a 121104 victory over Wheaton on 3/1/69.
- The 108 points was the most by the Crusaders in a loss since falling at Ball State, 117-116, on 2/19/64.


## Fastest to \#50

- With the win over North Park, head coach Bryce Drew won his 50th game at @ ValpoBasketball, needing just 70 games to get there. - Drew is the ninth coach in @ValpoBasketball history to lead the Crusaders to at least 50 victories.
- Drew became the quickest Crusader coach to 50 wins, surpassing Loren Ellis and Gene Bartow, both of whom earned it in their 79th game.

## Change to the Lineup

- @ValpoBasketball has started five different lineups this year.
- The Crusaders have used the same starting five the last two games, going with Williams, Dority, Coleman, Peters and Fernandez.
- For Vashil Fernandez, the game against UIC marked his first career start.
- 10 of the 12 players on the Crusaders' roster have now started at least one game this season, including four of five freshmen.
- Dority and Peters have started all 17 games to date for Valpo.
- This year's roster had just five combined starts in a Crusader uniform entering the season - Dority (4) and Capobianco (1).


## Freshmen Getting Minutes

- Valpo's five freshmen have combined for $42.7 \%$ of the Crusaders' total minutes played so far this season.
- Three of the five (Jubril Adekoya, Alec Peters, Lexus Williams) have played every game and are averaging at least 16 mpg .
- Peters is just behind the team lead, averaging 29.2 mpg - no freshman has led Valpo in minutes played since the 1998-99 campaign.


## Connecting From Inside

- @ ValpoBasketball has ranked among the top-5 in the nation in 2point pct. each of the last 3 years, hitting above $55 \%$ all 3 years.
- The Crusaders have ranked in the top-5 in the nation in 2-point pct. despite not having a starter taller than $6^{\prime} 8^{\prime \prime}$ during that stretch. - Valpo is shooting at a $54.3 \%$ clip from inside the arc through this season's first 17 games.


## Looking to Reload

- @ValpoBasketball entered this season with eight newcomers after losing seven players, including six seniors, from last year's team. - In all, only $22.8 \%$ of the scoring, $27.3 \%$ of the rebounding and $24.2 \%$ of the minutes played from last year's squad returned in 2013-14.
- Only four players on this year's roster played for the Crusaders prior to this season, and all played just last year at Valpo.
-The 8 newcomers include 5 freshmen and 3 transfers - one eligible immediately, one eligible after sitting out and one who became eligible in Dec.
- This marks the first time in the last three seasons that the Crusaders have had a true freshman play for them.


## In the Crusaders' Future...

- Valpo inked a pair of Canadian guards to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period.
- Max Joseph and Tevonn Walker are currently teammates at Vanier College in the St. Laurent borough of Montreal, Quebec.
- Walker was a First Team All-RSEQ All-Star last season after aver-

## @ WSURaiders

- Wright State enters Friday's game with an identical record to Valpo - 9-8 overall, 1-1 in HL play, most recently falling 58-53 at Detroit.
- The balanced Raider team has 12 different players averaging double figure minutes and eight averaging at least 6.5 ppg .
- Senior forward AJ Pacher leads WSU, averaging 10.5 points and 4.8 rebounds per game while shooting $68.3 \%$ from the floor.


## Bryce Drew

- Bryce Drew is in his third season as head coach of @ValpoBasketball and is in his ninth season overall on the coaching staff.
- Last season, Drew guided Valpo to its second straight regular season title, its first tournament title and a school record 26 wins.
- Drew was named \#HLMBB Coach of the Year in 2011-12 in his first season as head coach.
- Drew was the first Crusader men's basketball Coach of the Year since 2001-02, when dad Homer won the honor in the Mid-Con.
- Drew led the Crusaders to 22 wins and the Horizon League regular season title in his first year at the helm.
- Prior to coaching, Drew spent seven seasons playing professionally, including six seasons in the NBA.
- Drew was a two-time Mid-Con MVP in his playing days with Valparaiso, helping the team to three NCAA tournament appearances. - Drew hit "The Shot", a buzzer-beating 3-pointer in the first round of the 1998 NCAA tournament, to lift the Crusaders over Ole Miss. - "The Shot" was named one of the top-35 All-Time Madness Moments by the NCAA as part of the celebration of 75 Years of March Madness.


## \#DrewFamilyDynasty

- Bryce is the third member of the Drew family to serve as head coach of @ ValpoBasketball.
- Father Homer was head coach from 1988-2002, and then returned to lead Valpo from 2003-11.
- Brother Scott (current head coach of @BaylorMBB) led the Crusaders during the 2002-03 season after nine seasons as an assistant under Homer. - A Drew has been at the helm of the Crusaders for the last 25 years. \#DrewFamilyDynasty
- The Drew family has combined to lead @ValpoBasketball to 448 victories and 11 postseason appearances. \#DrewFamilyDynasty
- Overall, the trio of Drews owns 907 collegiate victories over a combined 45+ seasons of head coaching. \#DrewFamilyDynasty


## \#CoachesWhoCanPlay

- @ValpoBasketball boasts one of the nation's highest-scoring staffs, as a trio of coaches combined for 4,211 points during their D-I careers.
- The Crusaders' coaching staff ranks fifth in the nation for most points scored on the Division I level as players.
- Head coach Bryce Drew scored 2,142 points during his four-year career with the Crusaders.
- Assistant coach Roger Powell Jr. tallied 1,178 points during his four-year career with Illinois.
- Assistant coach Matt Lottich poured in 891 points over his fouryear career at Stanford.
- Assistant coach Luke Gore also played collegiately at NAIA Bethel [Tenn.] College.


## Lavonte Dority

- Dority was named the Horizon League Sixth Man of the Year last year. - Dority led the Crusaders in scoring for the ninth time this season with 20 points last time out at Oakland.
- Dority matched his career high with six assists and also scored 14 points in the win over UIC.
- Dority tied for game-high honors against Saint Louis with 21 points, including the game-tying layup with 3.8 seconds to play.
- Dority played 52 minutes in the 3OT game vs. Mercer, setting new career highs with 31 points ( $7-14 \mathrm{FG} ; 14-15 \mathrm{FT}$ ), 5 rebounds and 6 assists. - Dority scored a team-high 20 points at Ohio.
- Dority went 7-of-8 from the floor, including five 3-pointers, for a career-best 21 points against North Park.
- Dority appeared in each of Valpo's last 25 games after becoming eligible last season, averaging 8.6 ppg , third-most on the team.
- Dority scored in double figures nine times and led Valpo in scoring on three occasions.
- Dority was named Horizon League Newcomer of the Week following a 20-point game at Missouri State in his Crusader debut.
- Dority transferred to Valpo from South Florida, where he appeared in 35 games, at the semester break in 2011-12.


## Bobby Capobianco

- Capobianco tallied 14 points and eight rebounds Dec. 7 against Saint Louis.
- Capobianco played 38 minutes off the bench in the 3OT game vs. Mercer, posting his first double-double with a career-high 23 points and 10 rebounds.
- Capobianco totaled 14 points, 9 rebounds, 3 blocks and 3 steals in the Crusaders' home win over UCF.
- Capobianco enters his senior year after averaging 5.9 points and 4.5 rebounds per game last year in his first season as a Crusader.
- Capobianco traveled with an Athletes in Action squad to Jamaica this past summer.
- Capobianco shot at a $55.1 \%$ clip from the field and scored in double figures six times last season.
- Capobianco was twice named Horizon League Newcomer of the Week. - Capobianco approached a triple-double off the bench (10 pts/9 reb/9 ast) against UIC, becoming first player in NCAA to post that stat line off the bench in nearly 5 years.
- Capobianco played his first two seasons at Indiana and sat out the 2011-12 season after transferring to Valpo.


## Jordan Coleman

- Coleman scored all 12 of his points in the first half last time out at Oakland.
- Coleman returned to the starting lineup with 13 points, six rebounds and three assists last time out in the win over UIC.
- Coleman scored 10 of his 12 points after halftime as the Crusaders rallied for a win over Loyola Marymount.
- Coleman scored in double figures each of Valpo's first seven games, ending the streak with a 15-point effort in the win over UCF.

- Coleman came off the bench for the first time this year vs. JMU and went 6 -of- 7 from the floor, matching his career high with 16 points.
- Coleman led Valpo at Illinois with 15 points and eight rebounds.
- Coleman set a new career high with 16 points in season-opening win over Murray State, including a perfect 8 -of- 8 effort from the foul line.
- Coleman appeared in 29 games off the bench in his first season as
a Crusader, averaging 14.9 minutes and 4.4 points per game.
- Coleman scored a season-high 15 points in his Crusader debut against Georgia Southern.
- Coleman was an All-Conference selection for SWIC during the 2011-12 season, finishing second on the team with 10.2 ppg.
- Coleman started his collegiate career as a freshman at Hawai'i.


## Vashil Fernandez

- Fernandez earned his first career start in the win over UIC.
- Fernandez tallied his second career double-double at ETSU, scoring 10 points and grabbing a career-high 14 rebounds.
- Fernandez played the entire second half against the Bucs, going for 10 points and nine rebounds in the final 20 minutes alone.
- Fernandez posted his first career double-double in the win over Cincinnati Christian, tallying 11 points and 12 rebounds.
- Fernandez went 5-of-7 from the floor in a 14-point, 7 -rebound effort off the bench in Valpo's season-opening victory over Murray State. - Fernandez played for Jamaica in its first-ever appearance at the FIBAAmericas Championship in September.
- Fernandez appeared in four games, including a victory over Argentina, the world's third-ranked team.
- Fernandez also traveled with an Athletes in Action squad to New Zealand this past August.
- Fernandez made 27 appearances off the bench last season in his first season of action, totaling 30 points and 38 rebounds.
- Fernandez made his senior international debut in the summer of 2012 for Jamaica at the FIBA Centrobasket tournament.
- Fernandez helped Jamaica to a 3rd place finish, its best ever at Centrobasket.


## Moussa Gueye

- Gueye recorded a game-best 11 rebounds and also blocked a pair of shots last time out at Oakland.
- Gueye registered a career-high 13 rebounds to go with six points and four blocked shots Dec. 7 against Saint Louis.
- Gueye scored in double figures for the first time in his career with

10 points in the win over Cincinnati Christian.

- Gueye ripped down 11 rebounds in Valpo's win over James Madison.
- Gueye chipped in six points, four rebounds and a season-best
four blocked shots at Evansville.
- Gueye is eligible to play immediately at Valpo as a fifth-year senior after earning his bachelor's degree from Alabama.
- Gueye started 27 games as a junior last season for the Crimson Tide, helping Alabama to 23 wins and a spot in the NIT quarterfinals.
- Gueye averaged 3.9 rebounds and 1.4 blocks per game, and posted
1.9 blocks per game within SEC play, ranking third in the league.
- Gueye appeared in 12 games for Alabama as a sophomore in 201112 after recovering from an offseason injury.
- Gueye, a consensus pick as one of the top JuCo centers in the nation, was Conference Freshman of the Year at Lake Land [Ill.] College in 2009-10.


## David Chadwick

- Chadwick started the second half last time out at ETSU and played eight minutes, finishing witht wo points and three rebounds.

Bryce Drew
Head Coach
3rd Season 57-28 overall and at Valpo Valparaiso, 1998
Bryce Drew was named head coach of the Valparaiso men's basketball program in May of 2011.
Drew guided the Crusaders to their second straight Horizon League regular season title during the 2012-2013 season and also led Valpo to its first Horizon League Championship crown, returning the Crusaders to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004 - the program's 12th postseason berth in the last 18 seasons. Along the way, Valpo won a school-record 26 games, including a record 16 victories at the ARC and a Division I-best 10 true road victories. Drew guided four players this season who earned postseason honors from the Horizon League, including a pair of All-Region honorees in Ryan Broekhoff and Kevin Van Wijk.

Drew led Valpo to 22 victories in his rookie season at the helm of the program, including a $14-4$ mark in Horizon League play to capture the league regular season title by two games. He also guided the Crusaders to the Postseason NIT. Drew was honored as the Horizon League Coach of the Year for his efforts on the bench, while he coached two First Team All-League selections in Van Wijk and Broekhoff, the latter of whom was named the league Player of the Year and an Honorable Mention AllAmerican.

Drew, the most decorated player in Crusader men's basketball history, spent the six seasons prior to his hiring as head coach as a member of the Valparaiso coaching staff, including the previous five years as associate head coach. Drew, who helped guide Valpo through their transition into a top-ten league in the Horizon League, became just the fourth new head coach of the Crusader men's basketball program in the last 31 years.

Drew joined the Valparaiso coaching staff prior to the 2005-2006 season, and over his six seasons on the bench as an assistant/associate helped lead the Crusaders to 102 victories. With Drew on the staff, Valpo moved into the Horizon League in 2007-2008 and returned to the postseason with a trip to the College Basketball Invitational, where it won its firstround game at Washington. In his final season as associate head coach, he helped guide the Crusaders to 23 wins and a postseason berth in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament while receiving votes in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll for four consecutive weeks.

Drew has coached 13 players who have gone on to play professional basketball overseas. He has helped coach Valparaiso as it has led the Horizon League in scoring twice, while the program also set the Horizon League single-season record for 3-pointers made (330) during the 2007-2008 season. Drew was recognized among the league's and nation's top assistant coaches by Hoop Scoop and Jeff Goodman of FoxSports.com and also has been named among the Top Recruiters of Chicago by the Chicago Sun-Times.

As a student-athlete, Drew cemented himself as the best player in Valparaiso men's basketball history. Drew, who arrived at Valpo after earning Indiana Mr. Basketball honors and being named Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year in 1994, began his career by garnering Mid-Continent Conference Newcomer of the Year and Mid-Con Tournament MVP honors as a freshman. Drew, a four time All-Conference honoree, shined during the conference tournaments, earning All-Tournament Team honors each of his four seasons and picking up three Mid-Continent Conference Tournament MVP awards. He was also twice decorated as Mid-Con Most Valuable Player, one of only four players to be so honored twice in their career. Drew's career culminated as a senior by being named a Third Team All-American by the Basketball Times.

Drew led the Crusaders to four Mid-Continent Conference regular season championships, four tournament titles and three trips to the NCAA Tournament. Drew, the career leader in points (2,142), three-point field goals (364) and assists (626) at Valpo, etched his name into the American consciousness in 1998 when he hit "The Shot" in the first round of the NCAA Tournament to beat Ole Miss. The play, in which Drew caught a tip pass from teammate Bill Jenkins off a full-court feed from Jamie Sykes, won Drew an ESPY award and gave Valpo its first NCAA Tournament win in school history, propelling the Crusaders to the Sweet Sixteen.

Drew also excelled internationally during his time on the court with the Crusaders, playing for the gold-medal winning Team USA at the World University Games in 1997. Following his collegiate career, Drew again made school history when the Houston Rockets drafted him with the 16th pick in the 1998 NBA Draft, the first time a Crusader had been chosen in the first round. Drew's NBA career lasted six seasons with the Rockets, Chicago Bulls, and Charlotte and New Orleans Hornets, with his best season coming in 2000-2001 when he started 41 games for the Bulls, averaging 6.3 points and 3.9 assists per game. A prolific shooter, Drew set a Hornet record when he connected on nine consecutive three-point attempts. He competed in the postseason twice as a pro, with Houston in 1999 and with Charlotte in 2002.

Over the course of his NBA career, Drew scored over 1,000 points and made $37 \%$ of his three-point attempts. In 1999, he was honored by the NBA with the Henry P. Iba Citizen Athlete Award for sportsmanship. Drew played alongside 12NBAAll-Stars during his time in the NBA, including three players who were named among the Top 50NBAPlayers of All Time. He also played under a quintet of head coaches who have combined for five NBA Championship rings. Following his six seasons in the NBA, Drew played professionally overseas for a season, playing for Reggio Calabria (Italian Serie A) and Pamesa Valencia (Spanish Liga ACB) before returning to the States to join the Crusader coaching staff.

Drew is twice a member of the Valparaiso University Hall of Fame, as he was inducted as an individual in 2003 and as part of the 1997-1998 Sweet Sixteen team in 2009. He also has been honored as one of the 150 most influential people in Valparaiso University's 150 years.

Drew graduated from Valparaiso in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in sports management and a minor in business. He and his wife Tara reside in Valparaiso.
