Ryan Wronkowicz began at Valparaiso University in August of 2000 as the Assistant Sports Information Director. He was promoted to the Assistant Director of Athletics for Media Relations in 2005 and oversees a department that is responsible for publicity for 21 varsity sports. He has worked directly with women's basketball since the outset, and was promoted to his current position of Associate Director of Athletics for Media Relations in 2009.

A member of CoSIDA, Wronkowicz is directly responsible for women's basketball, football, baseball, women's soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, and golf at Valpo. He also works with the Hall of Fame committee and is involved with publications, historical research, and record-keeping for the Crusaders' athletic department.

Wronkowicz's 2006-2007 women's basketball media guide was named Media Guide of the Year in the Mid-Continent Conference while his 2007 women's soccer guide was chosen second in the district by CoSIDA.

Wronkowicz arrived at Valparaiso after working as an intern for the Southern California Golf Association in North Hollywood, Calif. from 1999-2000. With the SCGA he assisted with publication of *Fore* magazine, helped conduct regional golf tournaments, and assisted the handicap department while also serving on some course rating assignments.

A 1999 graduate of Bowling Green State University with a degree in sport management, Wronkowicz earned his master's degree in sports administration from Valparaiso in 2005. He and his wife Christy were married in 2008.

Credentials

Members of the media needing credentials for Crusader women's basketball need to contact Ryan Wronkowicz, Associate Director of Athletics for Media Relations. Seating is available for working media on press row either court-side on the south side of the arena or on the track level on the north side. Media guides, game notes, and updated statistics from both schools will be available in the media room along with game notes. The media room will open approximately two hours prior to tip-off with court-side seating available approximately one-and-a-half hours before the start. Following the game, a final statistical packet will be made available to media outlets and can be e-mailed to requested outlets not in attendance.

Interviews

During the week, all player and coach interviews should be coordinated through the Sports Media Relations Office at (219) 464-5232. Media planning to attend practice should call ahead to the media relations office to confirm practice time. Game-day interviews prior to the contest are not permitted. Coach Freeman and requested players will be available in the media room following the game.

Horizon League Network

The Horizon League and WebStream Productions launched the completely redesigned Horizon League Network website for 2009-2010. The site, which can be found at www.HorizonLeagueNetwork.tv, serves as a portal to hundreds of live and on-demand videos while giving its users the ability to interact on an array of social media platforms.



The new site is highly customizable, containing 10 uniquely branded channels for each Horizon League institution. These channels will sort the entire site's content so visitors who select a favorite team will only see that team's information.

In addition to the incorporation of Facebook and Twitter, the new HLN also features hundreds of photos, an integrated blog and a news aggregator. The Horizon League will allow fans to view, download and share photos from each of its 19 championships via the photo management application Flickr. The HLN Blog increases its role on the new site with student-athletes blogging alongside the HLN staff. Finally, staying current with League news is now easy with a news aggregator pulling in stories from various outlets that cover Horizon League teams.

Every Horizon League game the Crusaders play this season, as well as every home non-conference contest can be seen exclusively on the HLN.

Television/Radio

Radio Broadcasts

WVUR (95.1-FM, Valparaiso), the Valparaiso University campus radio station, will broadcast most of the Crusader women's basketball games live over the air-waves as well as online at www.valpoathletics.com. The games against Colorado State (Nov. 22) and Central Michigan (Dec. 5) may be carried live on www.sportsjuice.com only, due to other contractual obligations by the station.



Television Broadcasts

For the third straight season, Lakeshore Public Television will provide live coverage of Crusader women's basketball. The January 4 game from the ARC against Loyola (Chicago) will be shown live on Lakeshore Public Television. In addition, ESPN will broadcast the Horizon League Championship game live on March 14.



When the Valparaiso University women's basketball team takes to the hardwood in 2009-2010, head coach Keith Freeman's squad will be looking to replace more than 65% of its scoring from a year ago. A balanced roster of eight letterwinners, including two starters, and five newcomers make up the Crusader roster which will look to improve upon last season's 16-14 record overall and 10-8 Horizon League mark which saw the Crusaders finish in fourth place in the conference.

Valpo will be looking to prove the prognosticators wrong again this season, as the Brown and Gold has been tabbed to finish sixth in this year's preseason poll. A year ago the Crusaders were also picked sixth, but rose to the occasion and earned a home quarterfinal game in the conference tournament.

Gone from a year ago are four seniors, including three which rank in the top-20 on Valpo's all-time scoring list combining for more than 2,700 career points. A Horizon League All-Newcomer Team selection returns to the lineup though, in addition to four freshmen and a transfer who sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules.

Coaching Staff

Freeman returns for his 16th season at the helm of the Brown and Gold and 22nd overall coaching women's collegiate basketball. He enters the year ranked 42nd among all active Division I head coaches for career victories with 389, and will be looking to surpass the 400-win mark this season. Valpo's all-time winningest coach, Freeman has posted a 260-181 record on the Crusader bench, owning more than half of the school's victories. He surpassed the 250-win plateau with the Brown and Gold during last season, and will be building on his school-record win total in 2009-2010. In his 15 seasons at Valpo he has produced 13 winning campaigns.

Freeman's assistant coaches return from a year ago as well, and are all talented individuals that bring a great deal of experience and knowledge to the Crusader bench. Associate head coach Greg Kirby returns for his fourth season with the Brown and Gold and has over 30 years of coaching experience.

Abby Scharlow is back for year three and has helped the Crusader perimeter game since arriving at Valpo after playing professionally for several seasons. Another former professional player, Christy Smith, is back for year two on the sidelines. She has Final Four playing experience from her collegiate days at the University of Arkansas in addition to being drafted into the WNBA. In her first season at Valpo she provided fresh insight into the coaching staff.

A familiar face has been added to the staff this season as well. Aimee Litka joins the program as a student assistant after playing for the past four seasons with the Crusaders, and will be helping with a great deal of behind the scenes projects for the basketball program.

Seniors

Three senior posts will be called upon to lead the way for the 2009-2010 Crusaders. Lauren Kenney was named to the All-Newcomer Team last season after joining the Valpo program from Lincoln Trail College. She made an immediate impact for the Crusaders averaging 10.9 points and team-leading 6.0 rebounds per game while shooting better than 54% from the field. Her production was hampered midseason, as she missed six games with a foot injury. She bounced back though, tallying a season-high 26 points against Milwaukee late in the season. Kenney had five double-figure rebounding games for the Crusaders, including a 15-board effort against eighth-ranked Notre Dame. An inside force, as the team's top returning scorer, she will be relied upon heavily to lead the team.

Whitney Farris is also coming off of her best rebounding season in a Crusader uniform and will also be looked upon to provide strength in the post. Valpo's second leading rebounder a year ago grabbing a career-high 4.6 boards per game, she started approximately a third of the Crusaders' 30 contests. She also tallied 5.3 points per game as a junior, just a shade above her career average.

Another junior college transfer last season made an impact in her first year with the Brown and Gold. Sylwia Zabielewicz made 19 starts in her junior year at Valpo and averaged 3.2 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. At six-foot, six-inches, she was the tallest player in the Horizon League a year ago and took advantage, shooting nearly 48% from

the floor. She also shot 76% from the free throw line, proving that if she can take advantage of her size and get to the charity stripe more this year she should be able to bolster her scoring production.

Valpo's fourth senior, Kelly Peller, returns to the court after missing last season with a leg injury and will help lead the perimeter. Two years ago she started half of the games for the Brown and Gold, averaging 2.9 points per contest. A solid shooter, she knocked down 36% of her three-point attempts during her sophomore campaign.

Juniors

Four juniors also join the Crusader upperclassman ranks to provide the leadership that will be needed to help the younger players along. Ashley Varner helped contribute to the depth of Valpo's inside game averaging 3.1 points and 3.2 rebounds per game, mainly coming off of the bench last year. Her break-out game came in early January as she poured in a career-high 14 points and grabbed eight rebounds against Youngstown State one game after pulling down a career-best nine boards versus North Florida.

Another junior post player will be a newcomer for the Crusaders on the court but has been with the program for a year already. Kelly Watts had to sit out last season per NCAA transfer rules following two seasons at Eastern Michigan University. She has two years of eligibility remaining, and could prove to become a force in the Horizon League. As a sophomore in the Mid-American Conference, she averaged 7.0 points and 6.2 rebounds per game for the Eagles while grabbing 14 boards in a contest on two different occasions. She has had a year to learn the Crusader system and will look to make an immediate impact in the lineup.

With the Crusaders solid on returning post play and young with their guard play, Rashida Ray will be looked upon to help the perimeters learn the collegiate game. Ray saw action in 19 games as a sophomore off of the bench,

averaging 2.3 points per night. An outside shooting threat, she connected on 41.7% from downtown last season, including three triples on her way to a season-high 11 points at Loyola (Chicago). As a rookie she poured in 12 points at Cincinnati, showing the potential she has for offensive production.

Stephanie Thomas also returns for her third season with the Brown and Gold on the perimeter. She has seen limited action thus far in her collegiate career, but has made the most of her opportunities, averaging a point every two minutes last season. She will look to play a bigger role for Valpo this coming year.

Sophomores

Valpo's sophomore class is a small one, consisting of just guard Betsy Adams. Appearing in 23 games off of the bench during her rookie season, Adams gained a great deal of collegiate experience as a freshman. She tallied double figures on four different occasions, including a career-high 14 points against Cleveland State early in Horizon League play. A solid outside shooter, she came off of the bench to lead the Brown and Gold in scoring at Butler, tallying 12 points while draining four triples. She will be called upon for even more minutes in year two with the Crusaders, with last year's experience helping her to succeed in that role.

Freshmen

Freeman has added four freshmen, three perimeters and a forward, to the program for the 2009-2010 season. Gina Lange is the lone post added to the roster. The Wyoming, Minn. native was an Honorable Mention All-State pick after setting Forest Lake High School's career rebounding record with nearly 700 over her four-year prep career. She was also a nominee for Miss Basketball in Minnesota.

Skyler Gick arrives at Valpo after becoming the all-time leading scorer at Benton Central High School with 1,444 career points. A First Team All-State selection, the Otterbein, Ind. native is coming off of an appearance with the Indiana All-Star Team this past summer following her prep career. Gick knows how to win, leading the Bison to a 24-2 record as a senior and a semi-state appearance.

Raegan Moore also was a scoring machine for Girard High School in Girard, Pa. during her prep career. She averaged more than 18 points per game as a junior and senior, finishing her stay with the Yellow Jackets scoring 1,475 career points. A Second Team All-State selection, her team finished in the top-10 in the state of Pennsylvania twice.

The final freshman, Laura Richards, was a three-time All-Olympic Conference selection out of Connersville High School in Connersville, Ind. The school's career field goal record-holder, she set a school record with 13 assists in a game. She too played for a winning program, leading the Spartans to a 19-3 record as a junior.

Schedule

Valpo's schedule, like the last few years, is a very challenging one for the Brown and Gold. The Crusaders open the regular season on November 14 against Indiana Tech, the first of three straight home games to begin the year. The homestand marks the longest in program history to open a campaign. Visits from Southern Illinois-Edwardsville, Colorado State, and Central Michigan comprise the home portion of the non-conference slate at the Athletics-Recreation Center.

The road schedule during non-conference play consists of five games against teams that played in the postseason last year. Valpo's first road test comes November 24 at Ball State, a team that advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament one year ago.

A five-game trip in which the Crusaders will play each contest against major conferences awaits the Brown and Gold in December. The road swing begins with three straight games against Big East foes. The first two legs of the trip will see Valpo head to Pittsburgh and Notre Dame, two schools that advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2009. The Crusaders then head to Cincinnati right before the Christmas holiday.

Following a week off for the holidays, the Brown and Gold heads to San Diego, Calif. for the San Diego Surf 'n Slam where the Crusaders will face Auburn, a top-10 team from one year ago. The second day of competition out west will see Valpo face either host San Diego State, who played in "The Big Dance" or Wake Forest, a WNIT participant.

The 18-game Horizon League slate begins on January 2 at the ARC when UIC visits. The Crusaders will also close the regular season against the Flames in Chicago, Ill. on March 6 before heading into the Horizon League Tournament which runs from March 8-14.

An exciting season of Valpo hoops is right around the corner. With all of the experience in the post, one would have to figure the inside game will lead the Crusaders early in the 2009-2010 season. But with a talented pool of underclass guards looking to make their presence known, Valpo will look for another top-half finish in the Horizon League while trying to host a quarterfinal tournament game for the second straight year. With the leadership of the upperclassmen mixing with the spirited youthfulness of the newcomers, the Crusaders will prove plenty of excitement at the ARC this year as they look for their 14th winning season in the last 16 years.

Valparaiso University head coach Keith Freeman took over as the sixth head coach in the history of the Valparaiso University Crusader women's basketball program prior to the 1994-1995 season.

The school's all-time winningest coach, he enters the 2009-2010 season with a record of 260-181 (.590) at Valpo. Beginning his 22nd season of coaching women's collegiate basketball overall, Freeman owns a 389-228 (.630) lifetime mark, and enters the year 42nd among active Division I coaches for most career wins. Freeman has led the Crusaders to more than 50% of the school's victories during the program's history.

Over the past 12 seasons Freeman's squad has recorded 18 or more victories eight times. With his exceptional overall mark, his teams have won more than 70% of their games at the Athletics-Recreation Center, compiling a 140-54 (.722) home record since he took over the program.

Freeman won his 250th game at Valpo on January 3, 2009, an 86-43 triumph over Youngstown State. That same season he led the Crusaders to a fourth place finish in the Horizon League, and the Brown and Gold hosted a quarterfinal game in the Horizon League Tournament. It marked the first time Valpo had hosted a conference tournament contest since 1995.

When Valparaiso moved to the Horizon League prior to the 2007-2008 season, Freeman left the Mid-Continent Conference as the league's all-time winningest coach. He coached more games, 381, than any other coach in the league, and his 229 victories were tops in the Mid-Con as well. In addition, Freeman's .601 winning percentage ranked fourth in league history.

The 2006-2007 season saw Freeman lead his Crusaders to a 20-11 record overall, Valpo's fifth 20-win season in school history, and the fourth under his guidance. His squad finished second in the Mid-Continent Conference on the season, the seventh time in 10 years the Brown and Gold finished either first or second in the league.

The 2005-2006 campaign saw Freeman post his 200th victory at Valparaiso, a 65-31 win over UMKC on December 30, 2005.

Freeman led the Brown and Gold to its first outright Mid-Continent Conference title in school history in 2001-2002, while also leading the Crusaders to the Mid-Con Tournament title game. In addition, he orchestrated the biggest turnaround in the nation in 2001-2002 when comparing records to the previous year, and was named Mid-Con Coach of the Year for his efforts as Valpo finished 26-7.

Valpo made its first postseason appearance in school history in the 2002 Women's National Invitation Tournament, advancing to the quarterfinals after defeating Michigan and Ball State, both on the road. His Crusaders earned a home contest in the quarterfinals against Houston as well before ending their tournament run. Freeman was a finalist for the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) 2001-2002 Coach of the Year award for his efforts during the season.

The following year, 2002-2003, Freeman guided the Crusaders to their first Mid-Continent Conference Tournament title, and the Brown and Gold's first appearance ever in the NCAA Tournament as Valpo faced Purdue in the first round.

In 2003-2004 Freeman led Valpo back to the NCAA Tournament for a second time. This time the Crusaders threw a scare into nationally-ranked Kansas State in the first round as the program registered the fourth 20-win season in school history. Freeman also surpassed the 300-win plateau for his career when the Brown and Gold defeated Oral Roberts at home 65-47 on February 16, 2004.

Freeman also led the Crusaders to the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament championship game in 1999-2000, one year after winning a share of their first ever Mid-Continent Conference regular season title. That season also marked the year Freeman became Valpo's all-time winningest coach when the Crusaders defeated Illinois State on the road on December 19. He also won his 100th game on the Valpo bench on February 10 of that season against UMKC. His 200th career coaching victory also came at Valpo as he led the Crusaders to a victory over Prairie View A&M one year earlier.

Freeman was named Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year for the 1997-1998 season after leading Valpo to a 14-2 conference record and a second place finish. It marked the second time Freeman received the honor, as he was voted 1995-1996 Mid-Con Coach of the Year as well.

He has guided numerous outstanding student-athletes while at Valparaiso, including 23 All Mid-Continent Conference selections, seven of whom were named to the league's First Team. He had nine players named to either the All-Newcomer squad or the All-Freshman team, including the Newcomer of the Year during the 2001-2002 season. Freeman also instructed the league's Sixth Woman of the Year during the 2006-2007 campaign.

In two seasons coaching in the new conference, Freeman had a First Team All-Horizon League selection as well as a Second Team All-Horizon League pick. He also had a Horizon League All-Newcomer Team member for the first time in 2008-2009. In addition, Freeman has also had three players voted to the Horizon League's All-Academic Team and has he had 15 players named to the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll in the fall and/or spring semesters for having at least a 3.20 cumulative grade point average.

Freeman guided the first player to reach the WNBA from Valparaiso as well as the Mid-Continent Conference. Marlous Nieuwveen played with the Los Angeles Sparks during the 2005 season.

Freeman has international coaching experience as well, having led an Athletes In Action (AIA) squad in Poland and Germany. During the summers of 2005, 2006, and 2007, he also conducted an AIA clinic in Poland. In 2007 the clinic had over 300 participants attend the event.

In addition, Freeman has run a coaching clinic at Valparaiso University every fall for the past 15 years. He has had some of the top collegiate and high school coaches on campus to present to other area coaches.

Freeman arrived at Valpo from Saint Joseph's College in Rensselaer, Indiana, where he was the head women's basketball coach from 1990-1994, compiling a stellar four-year record of 85-28. The Great Lakes

Valley Coach of the Year in 1991-1992, Freeman's team won the Midwest Regional Championship, advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Division II National Tournament. The Lady Pumas won the GLVC Championship and were ranked as high as fifth nationally.

Third on the all-time wins list in Saint Joseph's women's basketball history, Freeman's teams were consistently ranked in the nation's top-20 throughout his tenure.

Freeman also served as Athletics Director at Saint Joseph's during the 1993-1994 academic year and as Assistant Athletics Director from 1991-1993.

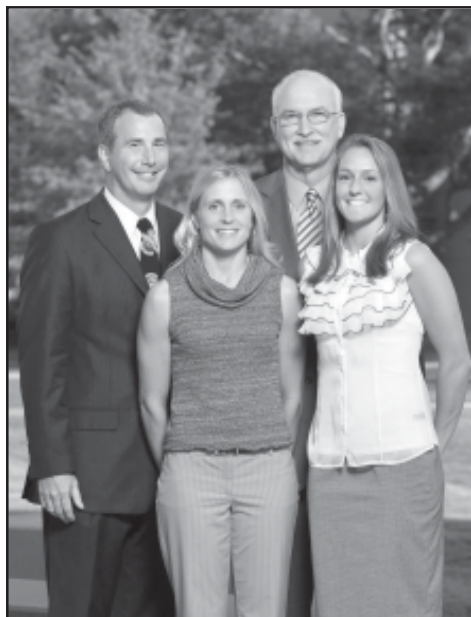
Prior to his years at Saint Joseph's, Freeman was the head men's basketball coach at Huntington (Ind.) College from 1985-1989. Freeman took over the Huntington program at age 21, making him one of the youngest college coaches in the nation.

Huntington College was also Freeman's basketball home from 1983-1985, during which time he skippered the women's basketball team. His 1983-1984 squad won the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) National Championship and finished runner-up in District 21. Freeman was named head women's coach at age 19, and he held the distinction of being the youngest collegiate coach during the 1983-1984 season.

During his two seasons as women's coach, Freeman compiled an impressive 44-19 record and was named District Coach of the Year in 1985 when Huntington won the NCCAA District 3 Championship.

Freeman graduated Cum Laude from Huntington College in May of 1986, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration. He also completed his Master of Business Administration at Ball State University in August of 1987.

Actively involved at Valpo, Freeman also is a member of the WBCA.

Greg Kirby was promoted to associate head coach for the Valparaiso University women's basketball program prior to the 2007-2008 season and is heading into his fourth season on the Crusader coaching staff.

Kirby joined the Crusader program before the 2006-2007 campaign as an assistant coach, and is responsible for instructing the defense and post players. He is the team's scouting director, and helps with recruiting in addition to serving as the team's academic monitor.

In his first three seasons with the Crusaders, five players have earned All-Conference honors, either in the Mid-Continent Conference or the Horizon League, with another being named to the Horizon League All-Newcomer Team.

Kirby's first season with the Brown and Gold saw the Crusaders earn a second place finish in the Mid-Continent Conference as Valpo posted a 20-11 season, the team's fifth 20-win season in school history.

Since Kirby's arrival, Valpo has twice been ranked in the WBCA Top-25 on the academic honor roll and the Crusaders have had 27 players earn academic honors from the conference.

Kirby arrived on the Valpo campus from across town, where he was the head girls basketball coach at Valparaiso High School for 16 seasons, beginning in 1990. During his stint with the Vikings, Kirby guided his squads to a 324-58 (.848) record, winning the Duneland Athletic Conference title 12 times. Kirby also led Valparaiso High School to 12 sectional titles, eight regional championships, and five state Final Four appearances. Twice the Vikings finished state runner-up.

In 1996, Kirby was named the state of Indiana's Coach of the Year by the Girls Sports Association, an organization that named him District Coach of the Year three times. He also was named District Coach of the Year four times by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association.

Prior to arriving at Valparaiso High School, Kirby was the boys varsity coach at Portage High School for nine seasons from 1978-1987 where he posted a 115-86 mark. Combined coaching both girls and boys, Kirby has tallied a 439-144 prep record, good for a .753 winning percentage.

Kirby was a business teacher at Valparaiso High School for five years as well as the Dean of Students at the high school for 11 years, retiring in the summer of 2006.

Kirby played collegiately at Northern Michigan for one season before transferring to William Jewell.

A 1969 graduate of William Jewell with a degree in business administration, Kirby earned his Master's of Education degree from the University of Illinois in 1975.

A native of New Albany, Indiana, she has also played professionally for the San Diego Siege, helping lead the team to the National Women's Basketball League championship in 2006. She also played for Club D.C. of Kastoria in Greece in 2005.

Scharlow played collegiately at the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay from 2002-2005 where she competed on a nationally-ranked team which won three consecutive Horizon League titles and earned three straight NCAA Tournament appearances. A two-time First Team All-Horizon League selection, Scharlow was a *Street & Smith* All-America Honorable Mention pick for 2003-2004. An All-Newcomer Team pick for the Horizon League as a freshman at Cleveland State University in 2000-2001, she was also twice named to the league's All-Tournament Team, including being named the Most Valuable Player of the 2004 tournament after transferring to Green Bay.

As a prep player at New Albany High School, Scharlow was named to the Indiana All-Star Team in 2000.

Scharlow is a 2005 graduate of Green Bay with a Bachelor of Business Administration. She had an emphasis in management.

Christy Smith joined the Valparaiso University women's basketball coaching staff in August of 2008 as an assistant coach and heads into her second season on the Crusader bench.

With the Crusaders Smith assists with scouting and recruiting, and helps to coach the post players. She is responsible for all of the team's travel arrangements.

In her first season with the Brown and Gold, Smith saw a post player earn Horizon League All-Newcomer Team honors, while a perimeter player was named First Team All-Conference.

Smith arrived at Valpo after serving as the head varsity girl's basketball coach at Harrison High School in West Lafayette, Ind. during the 2007-2008 season. The previous season, she served as an assistant coach at Lafayette Jefferson High School.

Prior to beginning her coaching career, Smith spent two seasons playing in the WNBA, after being drafted #17 overall by the Charlotte Sting in 1998. She was the first player ever drafted out of the University of Arkansas, where she was a standout point guard and led the Razorbacks to the 1998 Final Four.

Smith was a four-time Honorable Mention Associated Press All-American as well as earning Second Team All-American honors by Women's Basketball News Service. She was a First Team All-Southeastern Conference selection as a senior after twice earning Second Team accolades at Arkansas. As a rookie in 1995, she was named the SEC Freshman of the Year.

Ninth all-time at Arkansas in scoring after tallying 1,459 career points, Smith also ranks third in school history with 507 career assists and second with 239 steals. She is second all-time in free throws made with 461, a mark that ranks tenth in SEC laurels as well. Smith was an 83.7% career free throw shooter, second best in Razorback history, and holds the single season mark of 89.9% set in the 1994-1995 season, a year she led the nation in that category.

A three-time team captain, she was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll three times while at Arkansas. She competed for the United States at the World University Games in Italy in 1997, winning a gold medal for her country. She also represented the North on the 1995 Olympic Festival Team.

Smith was inducted into the University of Arkansas Hall of Honor in 2005, the fifth women's basketball player at the school to receive such an honor.

A native of Oxford, Indiana, she earned her bachelor's degree in exercise science from Arkansas in 1998 and earned her master's degree from the school in 2001 in biomechanics.

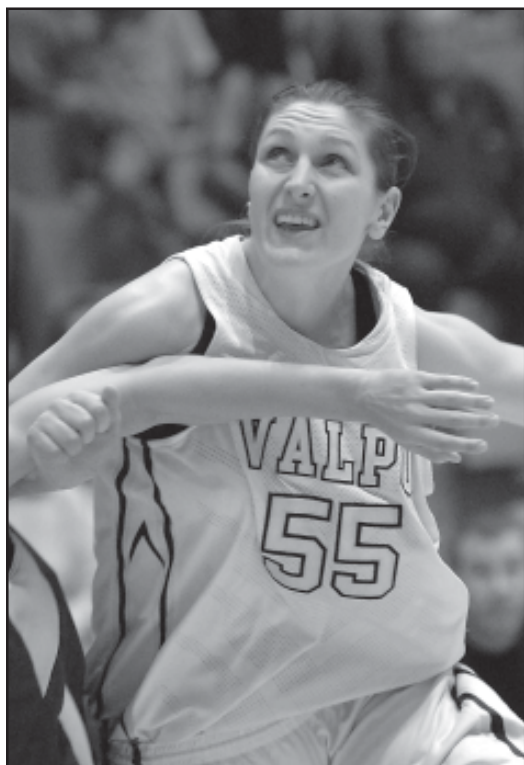

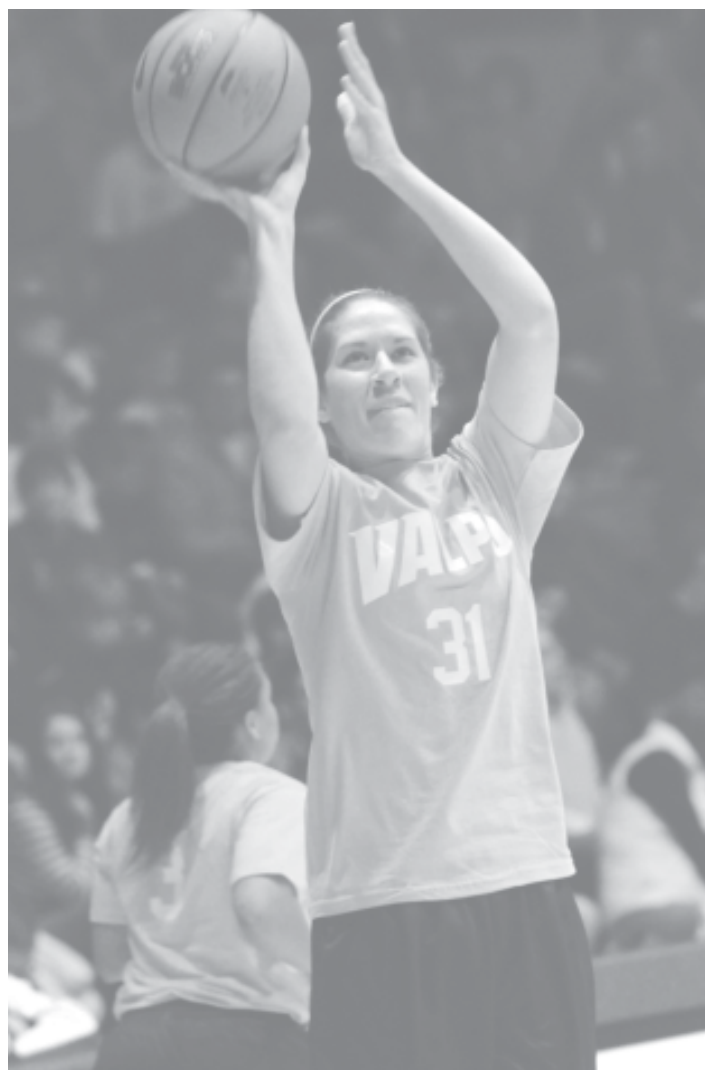

Kulaga and Litka ranked 15th and 16th respectively on the career scoring list while Launa Hochstetler also ranked among the top-20 all-time. She also finished her career fourth all-time with 368 assists. Leah Hochstetler, the fourth senior on the Crusader roster, was a valuable asset off of the bench. Her three-point shooting helped Valpo win several ball games, including seven triples in a win against Chicago State which ranks fourth on the Crusaders' single game list.

While the Crusaders graduated four seniors from the 2007-2008 team, there will be eight letterwinners returning for 2008-2009. They have all experienced success at the highest levels, and will be looked upon to lead Valpo into the new year. Entering its 31st season of operation in the 2009-10 academic year, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.

The Horizon League membership features 10 public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, Valparaiso University, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wright State University and Youngstown State University.

The Horizon League's primary focus is on adding value to the educational experience through its four platforms: athletic performance, academic achievement, community outreach, and personal responsibility and accountability. It is the League's belief that athletics is a powerful and visible resource tool that can be used to enhance student-athletes' collegiate experience. The Horizon League's goals are to enhance the holistic university experience for the student-athlete, to create an affiliation of institutions with similar athletic goals, and to adhere to the principals of integrity, diversity, excellence and growth.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball).

The League receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, women's volleyball, and for the first time in League history, women's golf.

The Horizon League is headquartered in Indianapolis, the "Amateur Sports Capital of the World," with offices in the Pan American Plaza (201 S. Capitol Avenue), located a block from Lucas Oil Stadium and just minutes from Conseco Fieldhouse, the State Capitol Building, Victory Field (home of the Indianapolis Indians) and the NCAA national office.

A PROUD HISTORY

Founded on June 16, 1979, as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. Charter members of the conference included current members Butler and Loyola as well as the University of Evansville, Oklahoma City University, Oral Roberts University and Xavier University.

Among other current members, Detroit joined in 1980, and Cleveland State, UIC, Green Bay, Milwaukee and Wright State came aboard in 1994 (along with Northern Illinois University) in the largest non-merger conference expansion in history. Youngstown State joined in 2001 and Valparaiso in 2007.

On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name and ushered in a new dynamic direction that has brought the League closer to its stated goal of being one of the nation's top 10 collegiate athletic conferences with a focus on enhancing the student-athletes' experience by upgrading the League's market and competitive positions.

ATHLETIC SUCCESS

In the past few years, the Horizon League has enjoyed unprecedented success on the national stage, highlighted by three Sweet Sixteen appearances (Butler 2003, 2007; Milwaukee 2005) and nine wins in the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in the past seven seasons.

In other sports, League teams have won at least one game in their respective NCAA Championships each of the last seven seasons in men's soccer (Milwaukee 2002-05, UIC 2006-08), with UIC just one win away from the College Cup in 2007. In softball, League teams won a game in the national tournament four straight years earlier in the decade (UIC 2002, 2004; Wright State 2003; Green Bay 2005) while advancing into the second round in women's soccer three of the last five seasons (Detroit 2004, Milwaukee 2005-06).

Green Bay's women's basketball team added to that résumé with a victory in the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. Butler's Victoria Mitchell became the League's first NCAA individual champion when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Horizon League student-athletes also excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to the Academic Honor Roll each of the past seven semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.2 or better, including more than 600 for the last four semesters. Twenty-five student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District teams in 2008-09, while eight earned Academic All-America honors.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

In addition to its athletics success, the Horizon League has secured a well-earned reputation for its community service initiatives. Each January, member institutions partner with local elementary schools for an art, music and essay contest highlighting the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with winners recognized at League games on the weekend of MLK Day.

The Horizon League Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) also has continued a tradition of working with youth in Indianapolis during its annual summer meeting.

In addition, several League men's basketball coaches coached barefoot to support Samaritan's Feet, and the League's schools and fans donate to Komen for the Cure for breast cancer awareness during its annual women's basketball championship.

On campus, student-athletes have raised money and awareness for such causes as breast cancer, diabetes and hurricane relief, while hosting blood drives, neighborhood clean-ups, Big Brother/Big Sister programs and more.

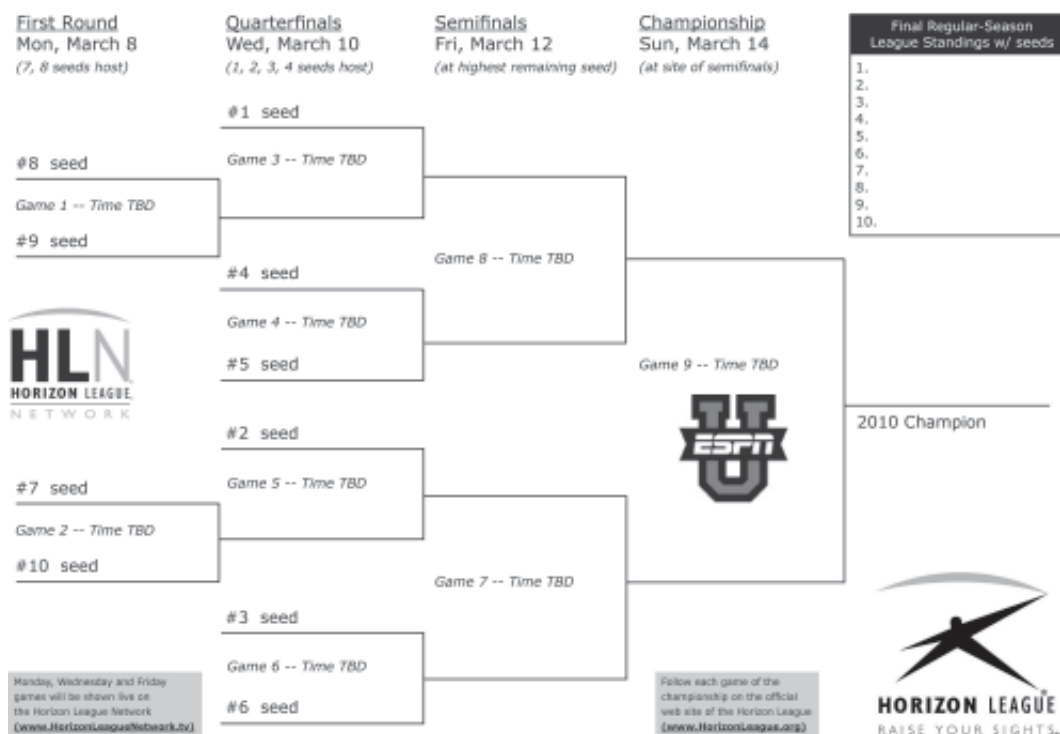

Athletics-Recreation Center

In 1978-1979, a Valparaiso University student survey circulated which identified an overwhelming student-felt need for improved recreational facilities on campus. This was the birth of the Athletics-Recreation Center (ARC). This survey was followed in 1979 by a comprehensive University-wide study by the Council on University Priorities and Planning.

Subsequently, a program of needs was developed by a campus committee. The Valpo Board of Directors then designated the ARC as a priority capital component of Valparaiso University, thus a national comprehensive effort to raise \$50 million in support of the University. Ground was broken for the ARC on April 23, 1983.

The \$7.25 million Athletics-Recreation Center added 84,000 square feet of new construction to the existing facility, thereby providing at one site a complex of over 142,000 square feet for physical education, athletics, and recreational activities.

The new building was designed with primary emphasis on supplementing the already existing recreational areas. It contains: seven playing floors for basketball and volleyball; a free play area for recreational basketball, volleyball, and other activities; a nine-lap per mile running track; six racquetball/handball courts; classrooms and lounges; and a coed training room.

The ARC arena currently has 5,000 seats and will accommodate 6,000. The building was designed so that expansion will permit its seating capacity to increase approximately 10,000. The arena is complemented by an attractive entrance, lobbies, ticket offices, and permanent display cases.



Since the original completion of the ARC, renovation of the existing facility has provided upgraded facilities for all Valpo students and faculty, including a new weight room, classrooms, locker rooms, and staff offices.

A cardiovascular room for students was constructed during 2005, and the Mosak Performance Center was created as a weight room facility for varsity athletes.

On Sunday afternoon, December 9, 1984 Notre Dame's Fighting Irish visited Valparaiso and provided the opposition

for the ARC's dedication game in men's basketball. The ARC was also the site of Valpo's dramatic upset of then 19th-ranked Notre Dame in 1988, played in front of 4,913 overjoyed fans.

The 1984-1985 season also marked the beginning for the women's basketball team to compete in the ARC. The volleyball team then began play during the 1985 season.

The largest crowd in ARC history witnessed a men's basketball game between the Crusaders and the visiting Bulldogs on February 5, 2008. Valpo packed 5,432 fans into the seats of the ARC.

The ARC has hosted several postseason sporting events, including the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament for both men's and women's basketball as well as volleyball as well as Horizon League Tournament games. The ARC also played host to the quarterfinal round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament in 2002.

Directions to Athletics-Recreation Center

From the east (Ohio) and west (Chicago): Take I-80/90 to exit 31 (Chesterton/Valparaiso), State Route 49 or take I-94 to exit 26 (Chesterton/Valparaiso), State Route 49. Head south on SR 49 until you reach US 30. Exit west and go about 1/2 mile to Linwood Avenue. Turn right on Linwood Avenue and proceed to Union Street. Turn right on Union and proceed to the first stop sign. Turn left on University Park and the ARC will be on the corner of University Park and Union.

From the south (Indianapolis): Take I-65 to US 30 exit in Merrillville. Exit east and take US 30 approximately 15 miles to Linwood Avenue. Turn left (road angles back) and proceed to Union Street. Turn right on Union and proceed to the first stop sign. Turn left on University Park and the ARC will be on the corner of University Park and Union.

Hilltop Gymnasium

Valpo basketball's home through 1984, Hilltop Gymnasium played host to the first 67 years of Crusader men's basketball and the first 12 seasons of women's basketball.

Seating 3,500 fans, Hilltop Gym gave way to the Athletics-Recreation Center and disappeared from a prominent role on campus until prior to the 2005-2006 season, when the Valpo athletic department renovated the ARC's upstairs facility, turning it into a practice gymnasium. The facility, which was renamed Hilltop Gymnasium, provides a practice home for both Valpo's men's and women's basketball teams.

The new Hilltop not only provides a first-class practice environment for the Crusader basketball program, it is also an homage to the great Valpo traditions. The department of athletics raised nearly \$100,000 for the renovations, and received additional contributions from the university at large. The changes include giant new windows, a new bank of lighting, a redesigned court surface, as well as a new softball practice area set up on the mezzanine.

The greatest improvement, though, was saved for last. Several giant photos honoring great Crusader teams, players, and coaches hang throughout the gymnasium. Along with the photographs are 37 championship banners, showcasing the winning tradition at Valpo.



Schrage Basketball Wing

Dedicated in 1999 as an addition to the Athletics-Recreation Center, the Schrage Basketball Wing is the operations center of Crusader basketball.

The cutting edge facility houses the men's and women's basketball coaches offices, a computer lab and study room, video rooms and team lounges. This is the most likely place to find any player while they're off the court, and is conveniently located adjacent to the main arena, training room, and locker rooms.

The women's basketball team lounge contains large leather couches and chairs, a plasma screen television, as well as a video library, and study table. In addition, new lightboards, with displays of women's basketball history, have been erected throughout the hallways of the wing.

The area is named after Paul Schrage, a Valpo alumnus who is credited with creating the Ronald McDonald character. The now retired Schrage formerly worked as the Senior Executive Vice President of McDonald's Corporation.



Strength and Conditioning

In the summer of 2005, the Valparaiso University athletic strength facilities underwent a major face lift. Thanks to a generous donation from the Mosak family, the facility's equipment was completely replaced and upgraded to reach the cutting edge.



A full line of Nautilus selectorized and plate-loaded equipment was brought in along with a full repertoire of York power racks, York solid oak platforms, York urethane plates emblazoned with the Valpo logo and four sets of dumbbells. The facility, which also includes Stairmaster stepmill and upright bikes and a complete line of bands, physioball balls, and medicine balls, has made training safer than ever before. For the entertainment of the student-athletes, the room is also equipped with two cable televisions.

The new room, named the Mosak Performance Center, is headed up by strength and conditioning coach Bob Brooks, and is exclusively used by Crusader student-athletes. Valpo's women's basketball program can be seen in the facility numerous times during the week, both in season and during the offseason.

The facility can serve as many as 40 student-athletes at one time, making sure any athlete can use the room at any time. And for the benefit of the teams and student-athletes, the room is arranged in training zones so up to four different teams

can work out simultaneously with limited wait for equipment.

In addition to the Mosak Performance Center, another weight room facility is located in Kroencke Hall, the home of the Valparaiso University football program. Due to the proximity to the football offices, most of the time the Crusader football team uses this facility for their workouts instead.

Sports Medicine

The athletic training room, located in the Athletics-Recreation Center, is available to all student-athletes to help treat injuries, go through rehabilitation, as well as prevention of mishaps throughout their careers with Valparaiso University.

With a staff of four full-time athletic trainers that are fully certified, as well as three graduate assistants and several student aids, the training room opens daily at 7:30 a.m. and remains available throughout most of the day and into early evening. Rod Moore, Valpo's head athletic trainer, has been in charge of the training room since 1967.

The room contains the latest in treatment and rehab modalities, including a new infrared system designed to treat tendon injuries. The staff works closely with the doctors and rehabilitation personnel at Lakeshore Bone and Joint Institute, Porter Memorial Hospital, and the Valparaiso University Health Center to assist with all of the student-athletes needs for both injury treatment and rehabilitation.

In addition, the sports medicine staff has a smaller training room facility located at Eastgate Field in the baseball clubhouse. This facility is used for the soccer programs as well as baseball.

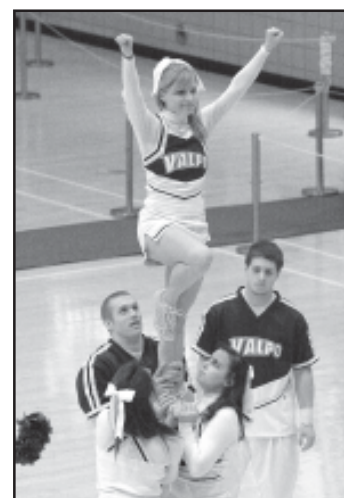

Established in 1998, The Valparaiso University Athletics Hall of Fame proudly recognizes former Valpo athletes, coaches, administrators, teams, and support personnel who have made exceptional contributions to the University's athletic programs or have distinguished themselves in their athletics careers.

Nominee eligibility for the Athletics Hall of Fame is determined by specific waiting periods. Any athlete or coach may be nominated for the Hall of Fame five years after leaving Valpo. Teams may be nominated after a ten-year waiting period. Current employees of Valpo who have completed a minimum of 20 years of service to the school may also be nominated, and former employees with less than 20 years of service to the University may be nominated five years after the completion of his or her tenure. Inductees are selected during various times of the year via a voting committee.

The charter Hall of Fame class in 1998 consisted of 14 inductees. In each succeeding year, at least four new members have been inducted, plus, at the option of the Hall of Fame selection committee, one additional posthumous honoree.

In 2008-2009, the 12th class of members was inducted into the Hall of Fame. With the addition of four individuals, there are now 89 individual members of the Hall of Fame. The 1950 football team, the 1944-45 men's basketball team, the 1968 baseball team, and the 1997-1998 men's basketball team are also in the Hall of Fame.

Valparaiso made its first NCAA appearance in West Lafayette, Ind. as the #15 seed in the East Regional and looked anything but intimidated by Purdue from the opening tip.

The Crusaders led 18-9 less than eight minutes into the game, and carried the advantage until the eight minute mark of the first half. The Boilermakers, the Big Ten Tournament champions, went on a 26-4 run over the final 11:29 of the first half though, building a 35-

22 advantage at intermission.

Valpo closed within eight, 37-29 with 16:47 to play, but 11 unanswered points by Purdue ended the Crusaders hope of springing a major upset. The Crusaders got back to within 12, 63-51, but could

not get any closer the rest of the way, falling by the score of 66-51.

Jenna Stangler led Valpo with 12 points while Jeanette Gray added 11 more, and grabbed a game-high nine rebounds for the Crusaders.

Ericka Valek led Purdue with 23 points while Shereka Wright added 15 more for the Boilermakers.

Valpo shot 35.3% from the floor compared with Purdue's 48.2%, and committed 23 turnovers, including 15 in the first half.

Meredith Baugher scored on an old-fashioned three-point play to start a 12-0 Valpo run, which brought the near capacity crowd into the game, trying to spur on the underdog Crusaders.

Jamie Gutowski led Valpo with 20 points, including four three-pointers, while Nicole Ohlde led Kansas State with 25 points, including 15 from the free throw line.

University History



Founded by the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1859 as Valparaiso Male and Female College, Valparaiso University as its known today began as one of the first coeducational colleges in the United States. Just 75 male and female students made up its first class of students and studied subjects such as math, literature, history, the sciences, and philosophy. Although the college was commended for its innovations in integrating male and female education, the effects of the Civil War, industrialization, and changes made in Indiana Legislature forced the school to close its doors in 1871.

The college reopened in 1873 as the Northern Indiana Normal School and Business Institute by enterprising educator Henry Baker Brown and soon became a flourishing proprietary institution. In 1900, Brown renamed the school Valparaiso College, and in 1906 it was renamed again as Valparaiso University. During the next 20 years, Valparaiso University achieved national recognition as a low-cost, “no frills” institution of higher learning that graduated alumni who pursued careers as highly-regarded governors, legislators, scientists, business leaders, and more. Enrollment quickly reached 5,000 students and ranked the University second in size only to Harvard, the nation’s oldest private university. Based upon its Midwestern location, low costs, and prestigious rankings, the institution soon became known as “the poor man’s Harvard.”

New challenges faced the University following President Brown’s death in 1917, including a decline in enrollment as many students left to fight in World War I and the need to invest heavily

in facilities during a time of economic stress. As a result, the Brown family eventually chose to sell the institution.

The modern history of Valparaiso University begins with its purchase in 1925 by the Lutheran University Association, a group of clergy and church laity affiliated with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) who saw a bright future for the University. Although historically linked to the LCMS, Valparaiso University operates today as an international independent Lutheran university welcoming of all faiths and committed to its mission to “prepare students to lead and serve in church and society.”

In 2008-2009, Valpo honored 150 years of tradition and excellence through a year-long sesquicentennial celebration that included the inauguration of the University’s 18th president, Mark A. Heckler. President Heckler continues to uphold Valpo’s distinguished Lutheran heritage and commitments to teaching and scholarship, faith and learning, and vocation and vision as he aims to build upon Valpo’s promise of preparing graduates to become ethical, moral, and professional leaders.



Alumni

Countless influential and successful men and women in all facets of life have attended Valparaiso University during its 150-year history. In the world of athletics, perhaps no alumnus is better recognized than Bryce Drew, son of head men’s basketball coach Homer Drew, who is now Valpo’s associate head coach. Bryce made “The Shot” in the opening round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament to beat Ole Miss, giving Valpo its first-ever tournament win. Bryce led the Crusaders to the Sweet 16 and parlayed that success into an NBA career when he was drafted by the Houston Rockets with the 16th pick in the 1998 draft. Drew played six seasons for the Rockets, Chicago Bulls and New Orleans Hornets before returning to Valpo.

Equally as successful in the world of sports is Lloyd McClendon, the bench coach for the Detroit Tigers. McClendon, a native of Gary, Ind., played at Valpo in the late 1970s before cracking the big leagues in 1987 with the Cincinnati Reds. A catcher and outfielder, McClendon also spent time with the Pittsburgh Pirates and Chicago Cubs during his playing career. After the 2000 season, he was named manager of the Pirates, a position he held through 2005.

In the business arena, alumnus Jay Christopher has enjoyed a successful career in business and marketing and worked with his wife, Doris, founder of The Pampered Chef, turning that business from a home-based operation into a \$700 million enterprise that is now part of the Berkshire Hathaway family of businesses. The Christophers have been loyal supporters of the University, and were particularly generous in supporting construction of three campus buildings: the Christopher Center for Library and Information Resources, Kallay-Christopher Hall and the Harre Union.

Numerous alumni have reached the top of the corporate ladder, including G. Allen Andreas, who is CEO of Archer Daniels Midland Co., one of the largest agricultural processors in the world, and Donald Fites, former chairman of the board and CEO of Caterpillar Inc. Alumna Kathi Seifert recently retired from her position as executive vice president of Kimberly-Clark Corp., a \$5.7 billion personal care business, and Paul Schrage retired as senior executive vice president of McDonald’s Corp., where he was creator of the Ronald McDonald mascot. The Schrage Basketball Wing of the Athletics-Recreation Center recognizes his support to the basketball program.

Valpo’s influence reaches far beyond the business world as well. Alumna Mary Junck is chair, president and CEO of Lee Enterprises, one of the nation’s largest newspaper chains, and other alumni include Raymond Scherer, former NBC White House correspondent, and Lowell Thomas, long-time CBS News correspondent. Alumni who rose to the top in the world of entertainment include the late Beulah Bondi, who starred in “It’s a Wonderful Life” and earned an Emmy for her role in the TV show “The Waltons.” Politicians who attended Valpo include numerous congressional representatives, U.S. Senators, governors and state legislators.

Mark A. Heckler began service as the 18th president in the 150-year history of Valparaiso University on July 1, 2008. During his first year as president, he launched the most comprehensive visioning process in the University's history, a process involving alumni, students, faculty, staff and community leaders that will chart the course for Valpo to achieve new levels of excellence over the next two decades.

President Heckler led the final year of a comprehensive fundraising campaign, begun four years earlier by his predecessor, Dr. Alan F. Harre. The "Our Valpo, Our Time" Campaign raised \$238 million – the largest ever conducted by a Lutheran university – to build the institution's endowment, fund capital projects and support ongoing operations. In January 2009, he dedicated the Harre Union, a facility that is transforming the Valpo student experience by fostering greater conversation and collaboration among students, faculty, staff and community members.

President Heckler participates actively on numerous national and regional higher education boards and commissions, including the Commission on Effective Leadership for the American Council on Education, the New American Colleges and Universities, and the Lutheran Educational Conference of North America. Regionally, he sits on the boards of the Independent Colleges of Indiana, the Indiana Campus Compact, the Horizon League, and the Quality of Life Council for Northwest Indiana.

Previously, President Heckler served the University of Colorado Denver for more than a decade, most recently as chief academic officer for the three-campus university. He joined the institution as director of the School of the Arts and a professor of theatre, later was named founding dean of the College of Arts and Media and professor of theatre, film and television, and served as acting chancellor prior to being named provost and vice chancellor for academic and student affairs in 2003. He also served as UC Denver's coordinator of the International College at Beijing, 1996-1998.

Prior to moving to Denver, he was professor of fine arts and director of theatre at Siena (N.Y.) College. Active in numerous professional and civic organizations, he is a past president of the Association for Theatre in Higher Education and founder and co-director of its Leadership Institute.

He and his wife, Veronica, grew up together in Windber, Pa., and were married while he was completing his master of fine arts degree with an emphasis in directing at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. He earned his bachelor of arts degree in communications with honors at Elizabethtown (Pa.) College.

The Hecklers are parents of four children.

Mark LaBarbera became Valparaiso University's director of athletics on July 1, 2004. In his first five years at Valparaiso, he has guided an athletic program which has seen its teams make five NCAA Tournament appearances, while individual student-athletes have earned not only All-American honors on the field, but also Academic All-American accolades each year during his reign.

The Crusaders have also received public recognition from the NCAA for placing six programs in the top 10% nationally in Academic Performance Rate. Since joining the Horizon League, Valparaiso has led the conference in student-athletes named to the Academic Honor Roll in three of the four semesters.

In the winter of 2009, LaBarbera announced the addition of three new sports programs at Valparaiso, all of which will begin during the 2009-2010 school year. He will now oversee an athletic program with 21 varsity sports with the addition of the men's and women's golf and women's bowling.

LaBarbera was instrumental in assisting with Valparaiso's move to the Horizon League, which took place on July 1, 2007, the school's first change in conference affiliation in 25 years. Over his first five years at Valpo, the department has also seen the renovation of Brown Field, including the installation of a new ProGrass playing surface, the renovation of Hilltop Gymnasium, completion of the Valparaiso University Tennis Complex as well as the Mosak Performance Center and the development of a new fitness center.

Active all around collegiate athletics, LaBarbera serves as the chair of the Horizon League's Television Task Force. He also has recently become a member of the NCAA baseball committee.

LaBarbera arrived at Valparaiso from the University of New Hampshire, where he served as an athletics administrator for a 24-sport program from 1999-2004. He joined the staff as associate director of athletics in 1999 and was promoted to senior associate director of athletics two years later.

Prior to his days at New Hampshire, LaBarbera served as an athletics administrator at North Carolina State from 1989-1999. After joining North Carolina State as an assistant director of athletics, LaBarbera was promoted to associate director of athletics in 1994. From 1984-1989 LaBarbera was the comptroller at Chicago's North Park College, his alma mater.

LaBarbera earned a B.A. in business administration in 1981 from North Park College. He went on to earn an M.B.A. from DePaul University in 1987. A native of North Tonawanda, New York, LaBarbera earned an A.A.S. in business administration from Erie Community College in Buffalo.

He also oversees recreational sports at the university and is very active around the Valparaiso community as well, serving as a member of the Valparaiso Family YMCA Board of Directors.

LaBarbera and his wife, Sally, have three children, Matthew, Tim, and Sarah.

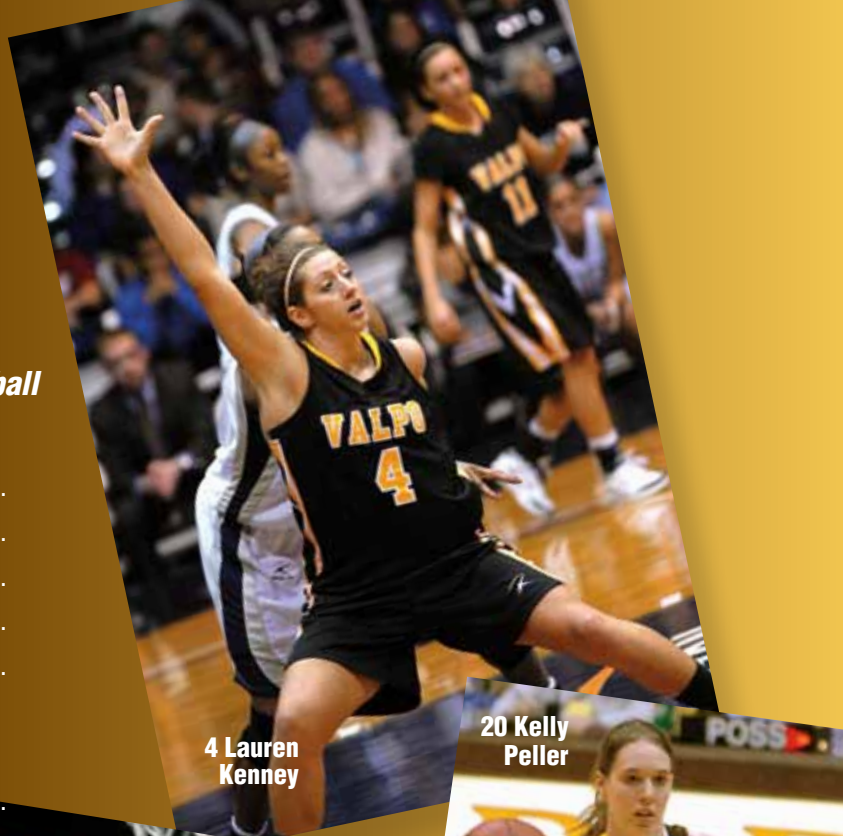
