- > Spent 17 seasons as an assistant with the Winnipeg Goldeyes and worked in player procurement, base coach, hitting coach and bullpen coach roles; a part of 10 playoff teams and three title-winning Goldeyes' squads... spent most of the time in the role of hitting coach. His teams finished top 5 in their leagues more than 10 times.
- > Narrowly missed out on the manager job with the Cleburne Railroaders (American Association) prior to the 2019 season... A back-end, last-minute deal took that job from him, was also considered for the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs job prior to that season (ATLL).
- > A catcher as a player, Vaeth played two years of JuCo ball before an injury derailed his playing career.
- > Spent four years in scouting (Marlins and Padres).
- > Worked for the Orioles for five years, part as an ambidextrous batting practice pitcher.
- > Has coaching experience at the JuCo and DI levels as well (Towson included).
- > Vaeth replaced Gregg Langbehn, who was with the team from 2016-2020; Langbehn retired from pro ball and left as Washington's 2nd most tenured manager, 7th All-Time in Frontier League Managerial wins (he's been passed for that position); guided Wild Things to two playoff appearances, an FLCS app. and the 2018 East Division title (team's first since 2007)... Directed an MVP, Pitcher of the Year, Citizenship Award Winner, 21 All Stars and saw eight players' contracts get purchased.
- > **2021:** Washington was 56-40 and won the Northeast Division, def. Équipe Québec 3-2 in the FLDS, lost to Schaumburg 3-2 in the FLCS, oversaw Pitcher and Rookie of the Year (Ryan Hennen), Citizenship Award winner (Nick Ward) and Coach of the Year (Alex Boshers)
- > **2022:** The Wild Things went 62-34 and won the West Division. Oversaw Rookie of the Year (Kobe Foster), Postseason All-Star SS (Nick Ward). 2022 Roger Hanners Award Winner for Manager of the Year. Team is in the FLDS.

2022 ROSTER RULES

Active Roster: 22 players minimum, 24 max

Offseason: Carry no more than 34 players (no classification limit) - Players signed out of Cal Winter League don't count toward the 34-player limit.

Rookie: Each club must carry a minimum of 10 rookies (combined R1 and R2 -- R1's are in their pro debut seasons or XP that doesn't meet the requirements for a full season [75 at bats, 15 games pitched or 30 innings pitched]... R2's are in their second pro season by those qualifications

Experienced: Each Club can carry a max of 14 Es/VETs (no more than four can be veterans) -- E's are in at least their third season... The Veteran classification is for a player over 29 years of age prior to October 1 of that playing season... for the 2022 season, any player born on or before 9/30/93 is a VET no matter their playing experience in pro ball

21-Year Old Exemption: Any player who is 21 years of age or younger on or after October 1 of any season and is entering his first year in the league, regardless of any other playing experience in pro ball, will be considered no higher than an R-2

Military Exemption: Players who served on active military duty will receive an exemption to the age limit to avoid veteran status of one year for each year of active duty

Position Change Exemption: Starting with 2016, position players who are switching to pitching and pitchers switching to a position will have their classifications reset to R2 provided they do not appear in any games at their previous position

Injured List Limits: Teams can have a maximum of one player on the 7-Day IL and two on the 14-Day IL. There is no limit on players to the 60-Day IL

Inactive List: Players must be on the inactive list for a minimum of 14 days before they can be activated
