- Jalen Miller and Ricardo Sanchez both had two hits, while Tommy Caufield (2), Ethan Wilder (2) and Sanchez (3) drove in multiple runs in the win.
- The staff allowed two hits and no runs... making it 5 hits and 0 runs in the two FLDS games - in game 2 five pitchers combined to shut the Crushers out.
- Zach Kirby worked four innings of one-hit ball with three strikeouts. He walked five but stranded the bases full twice.
- Dariel Fregio got the win by going six up, six down in two frames. Ryan Munoz, Alex Carrillo and Jordan DiValerio each tossed a scoreless frame to finish it.

NOTES AND NUGGETS

THE ROAD WARRIORS: The Washington Wild Things went 36-11 on the road this season and won their first nine games of the road schedule, sweeping New England, Tri-City and Evansville. They won their first eight series of the year away from home: over Florence, Gateway (twice) and Schaumburg (twice). The club lost just two road series - one at Lake Erie at the end of June and one right out of the All Star break at Evansville.

I'M THE GUY WHO DOES HIS JOB: Andrew Czech reached base in the final 32 games of the 2023 season, and after reaching base in each of the first 28 games this season he has defeated Shaun Argento's franchise on-base streak record (35, in 2002). Czech's 60-game on-base streak is now the franchise record. The streak came to an end June 13 with an 0-for-4 effort, halting it nine shy of the FL record. It ran from July 27, 2023 until June 12, 2024, officially. He was named Player of the Week after the first full week of play.

FREGIO TABBED PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Following a complete game May 23 against Evansville, Dariel Fregio was honored as Frontier League Pitcher of the Week. Fregio earned the laurels twice in his rookie season last year and now has his third honor. He went the distance for the second time in his career in the start against the Otters and allowed seven hits and two earned runs. He struck out nine with one walk.

MEEKER, BIVENS, KITCHEN MAKE MAJORS: RHP James Meeker (2018-21) had his contract selected by the Brewers Friday, June 7, becoming the 5th former Wild Thing to be on an MLB roster. Meeker finished his Wild Things career on a 34-inning scoreless streak and had his contract purchased by the Brewers on August 14, 2021. RHP Spencer Bivens (2020-21) was called up to the bigs with the San Francisco Giants Sunday. He got the win with 3 IP and 4 K with a HR allowed in June 16's game against the Angels. Bivens was with the Steel City Slammies in the COVID pod in 2020 and briefly with the Wild Things in 2021. LHP Austin Kitchen had his contract selected by the Rockies Saturday, June 23. Kitchen pitched with the Steel City Slammies under the Wild Things' umbrella in 2020 and had his contract purchased by Colorado from there. He spent time in Triple-A Albuquerque and Double-A Hartford this season as well. He was DFA by Colorado, claimed by Miami, and after a Triple-A stint was recalled by the Marlins, July 26.

FIVE WILD THINGS, A COACH SELECTED AS ALL STARS: LHP Kobe Foster, RHPs Gyeongju Kim and Zach Kirby and OF Caleb McNeely were named Frontier League All Stars for the 2024 Frontier League All Star Game and West Division. Christian James, a RHP, and pitching coach Alex Boshers were additions to the roster for the West. James and Foster worked scoreless outings and Caleb McNeely threw out the would-be tying run in the sixth inning from center and started the game in CF.

FOSTER EARNS WEEKLY HONOR: Kobe spun seven scoreless on the Fourth of July with a new career high 11 strikeouts to earn his first Frontier League Pitcher of the Week honor in his career. He's in his third season with the club. In that start, Kobe walked one batter and allowed three hits.

REED BECOMES FOURTH WEEKLY HONOR, WINS ANOTHER: Tyreque Reed homered three times and had nine RBI with 11 hits in 21 AB in the week prior to the All-Star break and was named Player of the Week in the league. Washington's second such honor this year... its fourth weekly award. Reed was also honored for an 11-for-19 week with two homers and four RBI for the week ending July 28, his second weekly award in July.

WILD THINGS SWEEP WEEKLY AWARDS IN LEAGUE AUGUST 5: For the week ending August 4, RHP Jordan DiValerio was named Pitcher of the Week and IF Jalen Miller was Player of the Week. DiValerio spun a nine-inning shutout against Sussex County August 3 with five K and two hits allowed... he faced one over the minimum. For Miller, it was an 11-for-24 week with three homers, four RBI and eight runs scored.

MCNEELY IS MVP, PS ALL STAR, KIM AND REED PS ALL STARS, BOSHERS COACH OF THE YEAR: Caleb McNeely was named 2024 Frontier League MVP and postseason All Star OF. Gyeongju Kim was tabbed postseason All Star RHP and Tyreque Reed postseason All Star DH. Alex Boshers won the Darren Bush Award for coach of the year for the second time in his tenure.

Tom Vaeth enters his fourth season as the field manager of the Washington Wild Things in 2024. It's Vaeth's first managerial job in pro baseball, but he has managed in the California Winter League and on an interim basis during his tenure with the American Association's Winnipeg Goldeyes. He was named the 10th manager in Wild Things' history January 6, 2021.

Previous managers are Jeff Isom (2002-03), John Massarelli (2004-07), Greg Jelks (2008), Mark Mason (2009), Darin Everson (2010-11), Chris Bando (2012), Bart Zeller (2013-14), Bob Bozzuto (2014-15) and Gregg Langbehn (2016-20). Vaeth, when he was honored as the Roger Hanners Award winner in 2022 for Frontier League Manager of the Year, became the third skipper of the club to receive the honor, joining Isom (2002) and Massarelli (2004, 2006) in that department.

The Baltimore, Maryland, native spent 17 seasons as an assistant with the Goldeyes. He worked in player procurement and as base coach, hitting coach and bullpen coach. During his tenure with the club, Winnipeg made the playoffs 10 times and won three championships. He spent most of his time there as the hitting coach with his teams finishing top five in their leagues more than 10 times.

Before getting the Wild Things' job, he narrowly missed out on the same job with the Cleburne Railroaders (American Association) prior to the 2019 season. A back-end, last-minute deal took that job from him and he was also considered for the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs (Atlantic League) job prior to that 2019 campaign.

A catcher as a player, Vaeth played two seasons of JuCo ball before an injury derailed his playing career. He'd go on to spend four years in scouting between the Marlins and Padres. Vaeth worked for Orioles for five seasons, partly as an ambidextrous batting practice pitcher. He's also gained coaching experience at the JuCo and DI levels as well (Towson included).

He replaced Gregg Langbehn, who was with the team from 2016-2020; Langbehn retired from pro ball and left as Washington's second most tenured manager, seventh in Frontier League managerial wins (he's been passed for that position since). Gregg guided Washington to two playoff appearances, an FLCS appearance and the 2018 East Division title [team's first division crown since 2007]. He directed an MVP, Pitcher of the Year, Citizenship Award Winner, 21 All Stars and saw eight players' contract get purchased.

> **2021:** Washington was 56-40 and won the Northeast Division, def. Équipe Québec 3-2 in the FLDS, lost to Schaumburg 3-2 in the FLCS, oversaw Pitcher and Rookie of the Year (Ryan Hennen), Citizenship Award winner (Nick Ward) and Coach of the Year (Alex Boshers)

> **2022:** Washington was 62-34 and won the West Division, lost to Schaumburg 2-0 in the FLDS, oversaw Rookie of the Year (Kobe Foster) and Postseason All Star SS (Nick Ward), won Roger Hanners Award (Manager of the Year)

Alex Boshers enters his fourth season as the pitching coach of the Washington Wild Things and his fourth as a pro baseball coach overall in 2024. A prep star in Nashville, he pitched collegiately at Tennessee-Martin before playing seven seasons of professional baseball including pitching in 15 regular-season games for Wild Things in 2021 as a player-coach. In an instant classic, the Lake Erie Crushers took down the Gateway Grizzlies 10-8 in the Wild Card Game on Tuesday to advance to the Division Series. Grizzlies Ballpark fell silent in the top of the ninth inning as designated hitter Vincent Byrd Jr. trotted around the bases on a three-run homer that gave Lake Erie the win over the Grizzlies. The Crushers took an unorthodox path to their first postseason victory since 2013, grabbing a 2-0 in the top of the first inning on a two-run blast by Byrd. For the third season in a row, the Québec Capitales will head to the Frontier League Championship Series after eliminating the Ottawa Titans 8-7 in a decisive game three on Sunday night. The crowd at Stade Canac was treated to a thriller in a rainy win-or-go-home finale to the Frontier League East Division series between Québec and Ottawa. Things started well for the defending champions, as they grabbed a 1-0 lead with an RBI single off the bat of shortstop Kyle Crowl. The Titans got things rolling in the fourth inning by loading the bases with one out on a pair of walks and a base hit. Designated hitter Jake Hjelte gave Ottawa the lead when he smacked a two-run single through the left side. After reloading the bases, catcher Michael Fuhrman repeated the effort to the same result, making it 4-1 Titans. Shortstop Aaron Castillas then put the finishing touches on the inning when he drilled an RBI base hit to shallow left-center to put Ottawa up by four. Third baseman Anthony Quirion cut the Ottawa lead in half in the bottom of the inning when he blasted a hanging breaking ball over the left field wall. Right fielder Brendan O'Donnell gave the Titans a little more cushioning in the top of the fifth with a solo homer, making it 6-3. Then, the Capitales came to life. In the bottom of the fifth, right fielder Justin Gideon widdled the deficit down to one when he drilled a two-run double into the left field corner. Catcher Ruben Castro then tied the game at 6-6 the following inning with another RBI double. Gideon came back up to the dish in the sixth and sent a base hit back through the middle to give the Capitales the lead back at 7-6. Kobe Foster is set for his 3rd pro season (second full season) after joining the Wild Things in June of 2022. Foster was 8-1 in 11 games (10 starts) for the Wild Things in 2022 and set the new franchise single-season record for ERA with an even 1.00 earned run average, surpassing the previous record of 1.29 in 2019 by Zach Strecker, the Frontier League's all-time career saves leader. Foster threw 63 innings and allowed 44 hits, eight runs, seven of which were earned, one home run and struck out 51 to 15 walks. He was named the Frontier League's Jason Simontacchi Award winner for Rookie of the Year at the end of the season, becoming the third Wild Thing to receive the honor (Casey Barnes, 2011; Ryan Hennen, 2021).

In 2023, Foster was 7-5 with a 2.66 ERA (third best in the Frontier League) in 101.1 innings. He fanned 94 and only walked 24, but was bit by the longball a bit with 10 home runs allowed.

The southpaw prepped at Huntland High School and was selected to the TBCA All-State team in 2015. He finished his high school career on the mound with 161 strikeouts in 109.1 innings with a 1.34 ERA. The Tennessee native then played two seasons at Motlow State Community College. As a freshman he appeared in 18 games (eight starts) and was 8-2 with four saves and in 66.2 innings, opponents hit just .248 against him. He had 101 strikeouts to just 24 walks that season and a 4.72 ERA. Things got a lot better the next year, as Foster was NJCAA Pitcher of the Week and TCCAA First-Team as a result of 12 games seeing him go 8-2 with a 1.61 ERA in 75.1 innings of work. He fanned 102 batters and walked only 16 while posting an opponent batting average of .143.

He transferred to Tennessee Wesleyan for the next three seasons. The lefty pitched in three games in 2020 before the season was cut short by COVID-19. In 2021, Foster was 12-0 with a 1.83 ERA in 15 games (14 starts) for TWU and had a complete game. In 88.1 innings, he punched out 106 and walked 12 with just 58 hits allowed and 20 runs (18 earned). In 2022 at TWU, he was 13-1 with a 1.42 ERA in 15 games, all starts. He threw 101.1 innings, allowed 57 hits, walked 24 and fanned 139 before coming to Washington.
